Last Game: Saturday, Jan. 2 – Indiana 122, Minnesota 111

Roy Hibbert and Luther Head scored 21 points apiece and Indiana rolled to a 28-point halftime lead before hanging on to defeat the Timberwolves, 122-111, on Saturday night at Consecro Fieldhouse. The Pacers led 32-26 after one quarter before blitzing Minnesota with a 17-2 start to the second that was capped by 3-pointers from Brandon Rush, A.J. Price and Head. Another Rush trey boosted the margin to 29 at the 1:51 mark, with Indiana settling for a 73-45 halftime bulge. Minnesota outscored the Pacers 20-6 to finish the third period, with Ramon Sessions netting the last six points to cut the deficit to 98-85. Still trailing by 15 with 5:40 to play, the Wolves began their final push with three straight Wayne Ellington jumpers and a long-range strike from Jonny Flynn. Kevin Love's three-point play with 52.9 seconds left narrowed the gap to 115-111, but Indiana countered with Hibbert feeding Earl Watson for the game-clinching basket. Rush tallied 16 points and Watson dished nine assists for the shorthanded Pacers, who snapped an eight-game losing streak. Al Jefferson's 23 points led Minnesota, while Ellington and Love chipped in 16 apiece.

Previous Game: Friday, Jan. 1 – Orlando 106, Minnesota 94

Rashard Lewis scored 21 points and Orlando drilled six of its 15 three-pointers in the fourth quarter to pull away to a 106-94 victory over the Timberwolves on Friday night at Target Center. The Magic scored the game's first eight points, but Nathan Jawai's late jumper put Minnesota in front 26-24 after one quarter. Al Jefferson gave the Wolves their largest lead of the night at 33-28 early in the second before 11 unanswered points helped Orlando claim a 51-45 halftime lead. Corey Brewer capped an 8-0 rally that eased Minnesota back on top briefly at 56-55, and Jefferson beat the third-quarter buzzer to keep the Wolves within two. Wayne Ellington sank back-to-back treys as Minnesota took a 77-75 lead with 10:08 to play, but the Magic countered with 3-pointers on each of their next four possessions -- three from Ryan Anderson -- and Minnesota was held without a field goal for four minutes down the stretch as Orlando expanded its lead to as many as 15. Matt Barnes had 17 points and 11 rebounds for the Magic, while Dwight Howard hauled in 15 boards. Jonny Flynn's 23 points led the Wolves, with Kevin Love adding 17 points and 10 rebounds.

WOLF TRACKS: The Wolves slipped to 0-4 since their Boxing Day win over Washington with Saturday's 122-111 loss at Indiana... The Pacers opened a 73-45 halftime lead, the largest for a Minnesota opponent since Golden State built a 66-37 advantage last Mar. 3 at Target Center... Orlando handed the Wolves a 106-94 defeat last Friday, dropping them to 2-3 all-time on New Year's Day... Prior to the current four-game skid, Minnesota had gone 4-3 in their previous seven starts, beginning with a 110-108 win at Utah on Dec. 14... The Jazz beat Minnesota for the first time in three December meetings with last Wednesday's 107-103 decision; Minnesota had also posted a 108-101 triumph on Dec. 5... San Antonio snapped the Wolves' first two-game winning streak of the season with a 117-99 decision on Dec. 29, beating Minnesota for the 10th straight time overall and 11th in a row in Texas... Minnesota handed Washington a 101-89 defeat on Dec. 26 at Target Center; combined with the 103-99 win at New Jersey on Dec. 23, it marked the time they'd put together back-to-back victories since last Apr. 7-8 (at L.A. Clippers, at Golden State)... Minnesota notched a 112-96 win over Sacramento on Dec. 18 at Target Center, its first double-digit triumph of the year... The Clippers recorded their third win of the season vs. Minnesota with a 120-95 verdict on Dec. 16... That loss is one of eight times the Wolves have permitted 120+, and one of eight losses by 20 or more; a year ago, Minnesota allowed 120 points on four occasions and suffered 10 losses by 20+...

DOUBLING DOWN: The Dec. 9 loss vs. New Orleans marked the third time in a five-game span that Minnesota let a double-digit lead slip away, having squandered 11-point advantages vs. Memphis (a 97-95 loss on Dec. 2) and at New Orleans (a 98-89 defeat on Dec. 4)... On the other hand, the Wolves have rallied from deficits of at least 11 points in four of their seven wins this season, most recently spotting Utah an 11-point cushion before winning on Dec. 14... The Nuggets led by as many as 17 points and enjoyed a 64-50 halftime cushion before the Wolves rallied on Nov. 29; that equals the largest halftime deficit Minnesota has overcome since beating the Lakers 113-108 on Dec. 2, 2005 at Staples Center (trailed 60-45 at the break)... Seven of Minnesota's last 19 games have been decided by six points or less; that's on the heels of an 11-game stretch that saw the Wolves suffer 10 double-figure losses (five by 20+)...

FINDING THE RANGE: Minnesota shot 57.1% in the Dec. 5 win over Utah, their highest percentage since hitting 59.0% vs. Phoenix on Jan. 29, 2007 (a 121-112 win)... The Wolves have cleared 50% in six of their past 19 starts, most recently a 52.6% effort in the Dec. 30 loss to Utah; they'd hit 50%+ just once in their first 16 outings (52.0% vs. Boston, Nov. 2)... A year ago, Minnesota put together back-to-back 50%+ nights twice; the last time they topped that mark in three straight games was Mar. 14-15-17, 2008... The Wolves shot a season-low 32.6% vs. Dallas on Nov. 13, one of seven sub-40% outings to date; a year ago, they finished below 40% on 11 occasions, going 0-11... The 37.4% effort vs. Washington on Dec. 26 marked the first time Minnesota has won when shooting below 40% since Mar. 19, 2008 vs. Memphis... The Wolves currently stand 25th in FG accuracy (44.1%) and 26th in scoring (95.4 ppg)...

SCHEDULE NOTES: Saturday's loss at Indiana stopped the Wolves' three-game winning streak vs. sub-.500 opponents, while last Friday's home setback vs. Orlando was their fifth in a row against teams with winning records... The Indiana game also wrapped up the ninth of 20 sets of back-to-back outings for Minnesota in 2009-10; the next one begins Friday vs. the Pacers at Target Center... They're 2-7 on the tail end of back-to-backs, beating Utah (Dec. 5) and New Jersey (Dec. 23), having gone 6-16 a year ago... Saturday's game also concluded the Wolves' second four-games-in-five-nights set this year; Minnesota has three such groupings slated in 2009-10, up from one a year ago... The Dec. 18 win over Sacramento ended a string of six straight vs. the West; they're currently in the midst of a three-week run that sees them play eight of 11 vs. Eastern foes... The Dec. 8 outing at Toronto ended a stretch of 14 consecutive vs. Western rivals, and represented the Timberwolves' first road game vs. an Eastern Conference opponent this season...

LONG-RANGE PLANS: Orlando finished 15-for-37 from beyond the arc last Friday, equaling the 5th-highest total of three-pointers ever allowed by Minnesota; the last time an opponent sank 15+ was Indiana's 16-for-27 effort on Mar. 21, 2008... For their part, the Wolves hit a season-high eight treys vs. Orlando, and are at 38.0% (27-for-71) over their last five starts; that's on the heels of a five-game slide at 22.4% (11-for-49)... Minnesota has surrendered 10+ three-pointers on 13 occasions, allowing an average of 7.57 per night; only the Sixers (7.67) have given up more... They're allowing a combined 36.5% (good for 23rd), including 43.2% (76-for-176) in the past nine... Meanwhile, the Wolves stand 28th in three-point accuracy (30.0%) and 27th in treys made (3.83 per game)...

ALL YOU NEED IS...: The Wolves outboarded Washington 56-45 on Dec. 26, their fifth double-digit margin of the month (sixth overall); they piled up a 49-29 edge Dec. 9 vs. New Orleans... Minnesota has held the board edge in 12 of its last 19 starts, compiling a +4.2 rpg (46.0-41.8) margin in that span; the Wolves had come up short in nine of their previous 11 appearances... Phoenix outrebounded Minnesota 45-35 on Nov. 27, the seventh time they've faced a double-digit deficit... The Wolves have climbed to 8th in the NBA in offensive rebound percentage (.279) and 11th in total rebound percentage (.506), after sitting just 18th and 25th, respectively, in late November... The Wolves swiped 15 steals Oct. 28 vs. New Jersey, the 15th time in club history (second in the last six years) they've come up with 15+; the franchise single-game mark is 17, set most recently at New Jersey on Mar. 24, 2000... Minnesota currently ranks 9th in steals (7.69 spg); however, they're last in blocked shots (3.40 bpg) and 28th in turnovers (16.2 per game)...

NO FREE LUNCH: Toronto's 40-for-48 effort on Dec. 8 marks the most prolific night by a Wolves opponent in nearly 10 years (since Phoenix went 43-for-49 on Mar. 14, 2000) and just the 9th time an opponent has converted 40+ FTs vs. Minnesota... At the other end, the Wolves have boosted their frequency to 27.6 attempts per game over the past 12 (including a season-high 39 FTAs Dec. 26 vs. Washington), after averaging just 20.0 in their first 23 starts... Minnesota sank all 18 of its FT attempts Nov. 21 at Portland, the 17th perfect night in franchise annals; the club record for most FTs made without a miss is 24 (at Phoenix, Apr. 5, 2003)... The Wolves were a season-low 6-for-9 from the FT line Nov. 14 at Memphis... Overall, Minnesota is receiving 17.4% of its scoring (580 of 3342) from free throws during the regular season; that figure was an NBA-best 29.8% in eight preseason starts... The Wolves are 25th in FT accuracy (73.3%) and 26th in FTs attempted (22.6 per game); a year ago, they ranked 15th (76.9%) and 19th (23.9 per game), respectively...

OPENING ACT: The Wolves began the 2009-10 regular season by slipping past New Jersey, 95-93, on Oct. 28... New Jersey built a 19-point lead (72-53) midway through the third period before Minnesota rallied; it's the 8th-biggest comeback in franchise history, and the largest 2nd-half deficit the Wolves have overcome since spotting Dallas a 24-point advantage before roaring back to win 113-110 in overtime on Jan. 17, 1998 at Reunion Arena... They've now won 14 of their past 15 home openers, having a 12-game winning streak in that category snapped with a 99-91 loss to Denver on Nov. 2, 2007... All-time, Minnesota improves to 13-8 on Opening Night, having started 12 of the past 14 seasons with wins (also losing 100-95 in 1999 vs. Sacramento in Tokyo); they're 15-6 in home openers...

ONE FOR THE BOOKS: Golden State's 146-point explosion on Nov. 9 equaled the top single-game total ever by a Wolves opponent; the Warriors posted a 146-109 victory on Apr. 1, 1994 in Oakland... The final 41-point spread also matches the biggest losing margin in club history; Minnesota suffered a 113-72 defeat at Miami on Mar. 5, 1996... The Wolves committed 28 turnovers at Golden State, one short of the franchise single-game record; they coughed it up 29 times at New Jersey on Nov. 4, 2002... Meanwhile, the Warriors' 22 steals on Nov. 9 mark the highest total in an NBA game in over 12 years, since Atlanta swiped 23 at Philadelphia on Apr. 9, 1997...

BOARD PRODIGY: Timberwolves forward Kevin Love finished 2008-09 as only the fifth rookie in NBA history to collect in excess of 20 percent of all rebounds available during his minutes on the floor. According to Basketball-Reference.com, Love's Rebound Percentage of 21.0% is the 7th-most-prolific single-season NBA figure ever among players 22 or younger (min. 50 Games Played):

Denver handed Minnesota its biggest loss of the preseason (129-100) on Oct. 20 at the Pepsi Center; the Wolves kicked off their four-game road trip with a 94-90 loss at Chicago on Oct. 16, then were handed a 101-87 setback one night later in Milwaukee... The United Center loss wrapped up a home-and-home set between the Wolves and Bulls, who posted a 99-94 win on Oct. 14 at Target Center... Minnesota suffered its first preseason loss with a 112-97 home setback Oct. 9 vs. Toronto... The Wolves had finished 2008 with a 6-2 preseason mark, their best record since going 6-1 in 2001; they're now 78-78 all-time in exhibition outings...

MARGINAL DATA: The Wolves opened the 2009 preseason with a 117-103 triumph vs. Milwaukee on Oct. 4 in Mankato, fueled by a 50-for-56 performance from the line and a 49-24 rebounding advantage... They followed by outboarding Toronto 45-36 on Oct. 9, before coming up short in five of their final six appearances; the Wolves faced a -5.5 rpg (40.8-46.3) deficit during that stretch, but still ranked 9th overall in rebound percentage (.512)... Minnesota was 6th on the offensive glass (.273), and led all teams in second-chance points (16.0 ppg) while ranking 6th in fast-break scoring (16.4 ppg)... Meanwhile, they finished 2nd in the NBA in FTs made (30.0 per game) and attempted (39.0), trailing just Denver (30.4 and 42.4) in both categories...
