Last Game: Friday, Jan. 8 – Minnesota 116, Indiana 109

Al Jefferson scored 25 points and the Timberwolves used a big third-quarter scoring run to end their five-game losing streak with a 116-109 win over Indiana on Friday night at Target Center. Troy Murphy and Roy Hibbert staked the Pacers to a 19-11 lead midway through the first, but Minnesota drew even by quarter's end. The second period featured 13 lead changes before Murphy's fifth trey of the half helped Indiana go in front 62-61 at intermission. Danny Granger converted a three-point play with 10:09 left in the third to put the Pacers up 67-63, only to see the Wolves score 17 unanswered points and take their biggest lead when Jonny Flynn made it 84-69 at the 4:36 mark. Indiana opened the fourth quarter with seven in a row and later cut the deficit to 98-97 following Granger's long-range strike with 7:07 left. However, Corey Brewer sank a 3-pointer to start Minnesota on a 7-0 counter, and Granger misfired on the tying trey attempt with 15 seconds left, leading to Damien Wilkins' game-clinching dunk. Kevin Love had 18 points and 13 rebounds for the Wolves, while Murphy and Granger scored 21 and 19 points, respectively, for Indiana.

Previous Game: Wednesday, Jan. 6 – Golden State 107, Minnesota 101

Corey Maggette scored 12 of his 28 points in the fourth quarter, and Monta Ellis added 20 points, seven rebounds and six assists as Golden State claimed a 107-101 win over the Timberwolves on Wednesday night at Target Center. The Warriors spotted Minnesota an 8-2 lead before peeling off 12 unanswered points, and Maggette sparked a late 7-0 push that helped extend Golden State's lead to 34-22 after one quarter. The margin swelled to 17 by halftime and Stephen Curry's jumper early in the third gave the Warriors their biggest lead of the night at 65-46. Minnesota stormed back, with Al Jefferson and Corey Brewer scoring all the points in a 13-0 blitz that cut the margin to six. Trailing 78-67 entering the fourth, the Wolves rallied to within four on Wayne Ellington's 3-pointer with 4:40 left, then a Jonny Flynn basket whittled the gap to 96-93 with 2:40 remaining. However, Golden State scored on its final six possessions and sealed the victory with free throws from Maggette and Anthony Morrow. Jefferson finished with 26 points and 14 rebounds for Minnesota, with Kevin Love contributing a season-high 23 points, 16 rebounds and six assists.

WOLF TRACKS: Minnesota stopped its five-game losing streak with Friday's 116-109 victory over Indiana, avenging a 122-111 loss to the Pacers last Saturday at Conseco Fieldhouse... The skid began with a 117-99 setback Dec. 29 at San Antonio, and included losses vs. Utah (107-103 on Dec. 30), vs. Orlando (106-94 on New Year's Day), at Indiana and vs. Golden State (107-101 on Wednesday)... The Wolves tallied a season-high 116 points on Friday, the 10th time in 14 starts they've cracked the Century Mark; they'd cleared 100 in just five of their first 23 outings... Before Friday, Minnesota's most recent victory was a 101-89 home triumph over Washington on Dec. 26, capping a two-week stretch that saw them go 4-3... The San Antonio loss snapped the Wolves' first two-game winning streak of the season; they'd picked up a 103-99 victory at New Jersey on Dec. 23 before beating the Wizards... Minnesota has given up 100+ points in each of its past six games, surrendering an average of 111.3 ppg; they'd held seven of their previous 14 foes below 100... The Clippers recorded their third win of the season vs. Minnesota with a 120-95 verdict on Dec. 16 (also winning on Nov. 2 and Nov. 23 at Staples Center)... The most recent loss to L.A. is one of eight times the Wolves have permitted 120+, and one of eight losses by 20 or more; a year ago, Minnesota allowed 120 points on four occasions and suffered 10 losses by 20+ points...

SCHEDULE NOTES: Tonight's contest opens a season-high four-game road trip for the Wolves (also Mar. 14-19); seven of their next 10 are away from Target Center, finishing on Jan. 27 in Cleveland... Tonight's game wraps up the 10th of 20 sets of back-to-back outings for Minnesota in 2009-10; the next one begins Jan. 22 vs. New Orleans... They're 2-7 on the tail end of back-to-backs, beating Utah (Dec. 5) and New Jersey (Dec. 23), having gone 6-16 a year ago... Last Saturday's game at Indiana concluded the Wolves' second four-games-in-five-nights set this year; Minnesota has three such groupings slated in 2009-10, up from one a year ago... The Wolves have won four of their past six vs. sub-.500 opponents, beginning with the Dec. 18 win over Sacramento; on the flipside, the New Year's Day loss to Orlando was their fifth in a row against teams with winning records... Tonight's game concludes a three-week run that has seen Minnesota play eight of 11 vs. Eastern foes; beginning Monday, five of their next six are against the West...

DOUBLING DOWN: The Dec. 9 loss vs. New Orleans marked the third time in a five-game span that Minnesota let a double-digit lead slip away, having squandered 11-point advantages vs. Memphis (a 97-95 loss on Dec. 2) and at New Orleans (a 98-89 defeat on Dec. 4)... On the other hand, the Wolves have rallied from deficits of at least 11 points in four of their eight wins this season, most recently spotting Utah an 11-point cushion before winning on Dec. 14... The Nuggets led by as many as 17 points and enjoyed a 64-50 halftime cushion before the Wolves rallied on Nov. 29; that equals the largest halftime deficit Minnesota has overcome since beating the Lakers 113-108 on Dec. 2, 2005 at Staples Center (trailed 60-45 at the break)... Eight of Minnesota's last 21 games have been decided by six points or less; that's on the heels of an 11-game stretch that saw the Wolves suffer 10 double-figure losses (five by 20+)...

ALL YOU NEED IS...: The Wolves outboarded Indiana 56-36 on Friday, their seventh double-digit margin of the season; they piled up a 49-29 edge Dec. 9 vs. New Orleans... Minnesota has held the board edge in 14 of its last 21 starts, compiling a +5.1 rpg (46.7-41.6) margin in that span; the Wolves had come up short in nine of their previous 11 appearances... Phoenix outrebounded Minnesota 45-35 on Nov. 27, the seventh time they've faced a double-digit deficit... The Wolves have climbed to 8th in the NBA in offensive rebound percentage (.281) and 7th in total rebound percentage (.510), after sitting just 18th and 25th, respectively, in late November... The Wolves swiped 15 steals Oct. 28 vs. New Jersey, the 15th time in club history (second in the last six years) they've come up with 15+; the franchise single-game mark is 17, set most recently at New Jersey on Mar. 24, 2000... Minnesota currently ranks 11th in steals (7.51 spg); however, they're last in blocked shots (3.46 bpg) and 29th in turnovers (16.3 per game)...

NO FREE LUNCH: The Wolves finished 33-for-45 from the line Friday vs. Indiana, their busiest night in nearly four years (since a 40-for-51 outing vs. New York on Mar. 26, 2006) and just the third time in 10 years they've attempted 45+... Minnesota has boosted its frequency to 29.2 attempts per game over the past 14 games, after averaging just 20.0 in its first 23 starts... Toronto's 40-for-48 effort on Dec. 8 marks the most prolific night by a Wolves opponent in nearly 10 years (since Phoenix went 43-for-49 on Mar. 14, 2000) and just the 9th time an opponent has converted 40+ FTs vs. Minnesota... Minnesota sank all 18 of its FT attempts Nov. 21 at Portland, the 17th perfect night in franchise annals; the club record for most FTs made without a miss is 24 (at Phoenix, Apr. 5, 2003)... The Wolves were a season-low 6-for-9 from the FT line Nov. 14 at Memphis... They rank 24th in FT accuracy (73.5%) and 22nd in FTs attempted (23.5 per game); a year ago, Minnesota finished 15th (76.9%) and 19th (23.9 per game), respectively...

FINDING THE RANGE: Minnesota shot 57.1% in the Dec. 5 win over Utah, their highest percentage since hitting 59.0% vs. Phoenix on Jan. 29, 2007 (a 121-112 win)... The Wolves have cleared 50% in seven of their past 21 starts, most recently a 50.0% effort in Friday's win over Indiana; they'd hit 50%+ just once in their first 16 outings (52.0% vs. Boston, Nov. 2)... A year ago, Minnesota put together back-to-back 50%+ nights twice; the last time they topped that mark in three straight games was Mar. 14-15-17, 2008... The Wolves shot a season-low 32.6% vs. Dallas on Nov. 13, one of seven sub-40% outings to date; a year ago, they finished below 40% on 11 occasions, going 0-11... The 37.4% effort vs. Washington on Dec. 26 marked the first time Minnesota has won when shooting below 40% since Mar. 19, 2008 vs. Memphis... The Wolves currently stand 25th in FG accuracy (44.3%) and 26th in scoring (96.1 ppg)...

LONG-RANGE PLANS: Indiana finished 16-for-32 from beyond the arc on Friday, equaling the 2nd-highest total of three-pointers ever allowed by Minnesota (club record: 17 by Golden State, Apr. 12, 1995); Orlando shot 15-for-37 on New Year's Day... For their part, the Wolves hit a season-high eight treys vs. Orlando, and are at 36.3% (33-for-91) over their last seven starts; that's on the heels of a five-game slide at 22.4% (11-for-49)... Minnesota has surrendered 10+ three-pointers on 14 occasions, allowing a league-high average of 7.68 per contest; the Sixers (7.49) are second... They're allowing a combined 36.8% (good for 26th), including 43.0% (95-for-221) over the last 11... Meanwhile, the Wolves stand 28th in three-point accuracy (30.0%) and 27th in treys made (3.78 per game)...

OPENING ACT: The Wolves began the 2009-10 regular season by slipping past New Jersey, 95-93, on Oct. 28... New Jersey built a 19-point lead (72-53) midway through the third period before Minnesota rallied; it's the 8th-biggest comeback in franchise history, and the largest 2nd-half deficit the Wolves have overcome since spotting Dallas a 24-point advantage before roaring back to win 113-110 in overtime on Jan. 17, 1998 at Reunion Arena... They've now won 14 of their past 15 home openers, having a 12-game winning streak in that category snapped with a 99-91 loss to Denver on Nov. 2, 2007... All-time, Minnesota improves to 13-8 on Opening Night, having started 12 of the past 14 seasons with wins (also losing 100-95 in 1999 vs. Sacramento in Tokyo); they're 15-6 in home openers...

ONE FOR THE BOOKS: Golden State's 146-point explosion on Nov. 9 equaled the top single-game total ever by a Wolves opponent; the Warriors posted a 146-109 victory on Apr. 1, 1994 in Oakland... The final 41-point spread also matches the biggest losing margin in club history; Minnesota suffered a 113-72 defeat at Miami on Mar. 5, 1996... The Wolves committed 28 turnovers at Golden State, one short of the franchise single-game record; they coughed it up 29 times at New Jersey on Nov. 4, 2002... Meanwhile, the Warriors' 22 steals on Nov. 9 mark the highest total in an NBA game in over 12 years, since Atlanta swiped 23 at Philadelphia on Apr. 9, 1997...

BOARD PRODIGY: Timberwolves forward Kevin Love finished 2008-09 as only the fifth rookie in NBA history to collect in excess of 20 percent of all rebounds available during his minutes on the floor. According to Basketball-Reference.com, Love's Rebound Percentage of 21.0% is the 7th-most-prolific single-season NBA figure ever among players 22 or younger (min. 50 Games Played):

MARGINAL DATA: The Wolves opened the 2009 preseason with a 117-103 triumph vs. Milwaukee on Oct. 4 in Mankato, fueled by a 50-for-56 performance from the line and a 49-24 rebounding advantage... They followed by outboarding Toronto 45-36 on Oct. 9, before coming up short in five of their final six appearances; the Wolves faced a -5.5 rpg (40.8-46.3) deficit during that stretch, but still ranked 9th overall in rebound percentage (.512)...
