Last Game: Friday, Jan. 15 – Memphis 135, Minnesota 110

Rudy Gay scored 21 points while Zach Randolph and O.J. Mayo added 20 apiece as Memphis blitzed the Timberwolves, 135-110, on Friday night at the FedExForum. Randolph's jumper capped a 13-0 surge that gave the Grizzlies an early 11-point cushion, but Al Jefferson beat the first-quarter buzzer to pull Minnesota within 35-30. The Wolves tied it on six separate occasions in the second, and a three-point play from Jefferson kept it at 58-57 with 2:04 to play. However, Marc Gasol started an 8-2 finish as Memphis rebuilt its lead to seven at halftime, and Gay and Mike Conley hit 3-pointers during an 8-2 open to the third as the margin swelled to 74-61. The Grizzlies piled up 40 points (on 71 percent shooting) for the third quarter, scoring on nine of their final 10 possessions to widen their lead to 106-81. A pair of Sam Young free throws with 2:52 remaining gave Memphis its largest lead of the night at 132-101, en route to the third-largest point total ever surrendered by the Wolves. Conley finished with 18 points and eight assists for the Grizzlies, while Minnesota was topped by 22 points from Corey Brewer and 21 from Jefferson.

Previous Game: Wednesday, Jan. 13 – Houston 120, Minnesota 114 (3OT)

Aaron Brooks scored a career-high 43 points and Houston overcame Al Jefferson's 26-point, franchise-record 26-rebound effort to outlast the Timberwolves, 120-114, in triple overtime on Wednesday night at the Toyota Center. The Rockets blitzed Minnesota with 17 straight points to open a 30-13 lead after one quarter, but 12 second-quarter points from Ryan Gomes helped the Wolves narrow the gap to 53-44 by halftime. Minnesota got as close one briefly in the third period and went ahead 78-77 on a Jefferson jumper with 4:45 left in the fourth. After Carl Landry's free throw made it 89-86 with 2.4 seconds to play, Corey Brewer forced overtime by hitting from beyond midcourt as time expired. Trailing 105-102 in the second extra session, the Wolves bought five additional minutes with a late trey from Wayne Ellington. However Shane Battier's 3-pointer doubled Houston's lead to 115-109 with 1:55 left in the third OT, and Brooks and Kyle Lowry sealed the victory with free throws. Chuck Hayes pulled down a career-high 17 rebounds for the Rockets, while Gomes tallied 18 points and Ellington finished with a season-high 17 for Minnesota.

Second Meeting: Thaddeus Young scored 29 points and back-to-back treys from Royal Ivey keyed a fourth-quarter surge as Philadelphia rallied past the Wolves, 96-88, on Mar. 25 at the Wachovia Center. Andre Iguodala had 15 points, seven boards and six assists for the Sixers. Rodney Carney hit seven 3-pointers en route to a 21-point night for Minnesota, while Craig Smith added 20 points.

DOUBLE-DOUBLE DUO: Wolves center Al Jefferson hauled down a franchise-record 26 rebounds in last Wednesday's triple-OT loss at Houston, part of his fifth career 20/20 effort. His 23 defensive rebounds are the most by any NBA player since Kevin Garnett grabbed 23 for Minnesota vs. Orlando on Jan. 12, 2005. Jefferson also becomes just the ninth player in the past 15 years to collect 25+ points and 25+ rebounds in the same game. Meanwhile, forward Kevin Love claimed 13 rebounds last Wednesday, the 20th time in 23 games this season he's reached double-figures (including 17 point/rebound double-doubles):

WOLF TRACKS: Minnesota fell for the ninth time in 10 games with Friday's 135-110 defeat in Memphis, their third loss to the Grizzlies this season... *Memphis' 135 points represent the third-highest total ever allowed by the Wolves*; Golden State has scored 146 on two separate occasions (Nov. 9, 2009 and Apr. 1, 1994)... Friday's loss marks the 10th time this season the Wolves have permitted 120+ points and their ninth loss by 20+ points; a year ago, Minnesota allowed 120 points on four occasions and suffered 10 losses by 20+... Houston handed the Wolves a 120-114 setback last Wednesday, *the first triple-overtime game in club history*... It's Minnesota's first OT contest this season and 99th all-time (43 wins, 56 losses); they've gone double-OT on 13 occasions, most recently a 129-125 loss to San Antonio on Nov. 5, 2008... The Wolves suffered a 105-94 defeat at Denver last Monday; they'd handed the Nuggets a 106-100 loss in their first trip to the Pepsi Center this season (Nov. 29)... Minnesota began the four-game road trip with a 110-96 loss in Chicago on Jan. 9; *they ended a five-game losing streak with the 116-109 victory over Indiana one night earlier*, avenging a 122-111 loss to the Pacers on Jan. 2 at Conseco Fieldhouse... The Wolves tallied a season-high 116 points vs. Indiana; they've cracked the Century Mark in 12 of their past 18 starts, after clearing 100 in just five of their first 23 outings... Meanwhile, the Wolves have given up 105+ points in each of their past 10 starts, allowing an average of 113.8 ppg; they'd held seven of their previous 14 foes below 100...

SCHEDULE NOTES: Friday's loss at Memphis wrapped up a season-high four-game road trip for the Wolves (also Mar. 14-19); *they kick off a three-game homestand this afternoon vs. Philadelphia*... The Jan. 9 loss at Chicago wrapped up the 10th of 20 sets of back-to-back outings for 2009-10; the next one begins Jan. 22 vs. New Orleans... They're 2-8 on the tail end of back-to-backs, beating Utah (Dec. 5) and New Jersey (Dec. 23), having gone 6-16 a year ago... The Jan. 2 game at Indiana concluded the Wolves' second four-games-in-five-nights set this year; Minnesota has three such groupings slated in 2009-10, up from one a year ago... The Wolves have won four of their past seven vs. sub-.500 opponents; on the flipside, *Friday's loss at Memphis was their eighth in a row vs. teams with winning records*... This afternoon's game begins a five-week stretch that sees the Wolves play 12 of their next 18 against the East...

ALL YOU NEED IS...: Minnesota collected 65 rebounds in last Wednesday's triple-OT game at Houston, tying the club single-game record set vs. Philadelphia on Feb. 3, 1991 (double-OT)... The Wolves outboarded Indiana 56-36 on Jan. 8, their seventh double-digit margin of the season; they piled up a 49-29 edge Dec. 9 vs. New Orleans... *Minnesota has held the board edge in 16 of its last 25 starts, compiling a +4.0 rpg (46.8-42.8) margin in that span*; the Wolves had come up short in nine of their previous 11 appearances... Phoenix outrebounded Minnesota 45-35 on Nov. 27, the seventh time they've faced a double-digit deficit... *The Wolves have climbed to 6th in the NBA in offensive rebound percentage (.282) and 7th in total rebound percentage (.510)*, after sitting just 18th and 25th, respectively, in late November... The Wolves swiped 15 steals Oct. 28 vs. New Jersey, the 15th time in club history (second in the last six years) they've come up with 15+; the club single-game mark is 17, set most recently at New Jersey on Mar. 24, 2000... *Minnesota currently ranks 11th in steals (7.59 spg)*; however, they're last in both blocked shots (3.46 bpg) and turnovers (16.3 per game)...

NO FREE LUNCH: The Wolves finished 33-for-45 from the line Jan. 8 vs. Indiana, their busiest night in nearly four years (since a 40-for-51 outing vs. New York on Mar. 26, 2006) and just the third time in 10 years they've attempted 45+... *Minnesota has boosted its frequency to 28.4 attempts per game over the past 18 games*, after averaging just 20.0 in its first 23 starts... Toronto's 40-for-48 effort on Dec. 8 marks the most prolific night by a Wolves opponent in nearly 10 years (since Phoenix went 43-for-49 on Mar. 14, 2000) and just the 9th time an opponent has converted 40+ FTs... Minnesota sank all 18 of its FT attempts Nov. 21 at Portland, the 17th perfect night in franchise annals; the club record for most FTs made without a miss is 24 (at Phoenix, Apr. 5, 2003)... *They rank 22nd in FT accuracy (73.9%) and 22nd in FTs attempted (23.7 per game)*; a year ago, Minnesota ended 15th (76.9%) and 19th (23.9 per game)...

FINDING THE RANGE: Minnesota shot 57.1% in the Dec. 5 win over Utah, their highest percentage since hitting 59.0% vs. Phoenix on Jan. 29, 2007 (a 121-112 win)... *The Wolves have cleared 50% in seven of their past 25 starts*, most recently a 50.0% effort in the Jan. 8 win over Indiana; they'd hit 50%+ just once in their first 16 outings (52.0% vs. Boston, Nov. 2)... A year ago, Minnesota put together back-to-back 50%+ nights twice; the last time they topped that mark in three straight games was Mar. 14-15-17, 2008... The Wolves shot a season-low 32.6% vs. Dallas on Nov. 13, one of nine sub-40% outings to date; a year ago, they finished below 40% on 11 occasions, going 0-11... The 37.4% effort vs. Washington on Dec. 26 marked the first time Minnesota has won when shooting below 40% since Mar. 19, 2008 vs. Memphis... The Wolves currently stand 25th in FG accuracy (44.0%) and 25th in scoring (96.9 ppg)...

LONG-RANGE PLANS: Indiana finished 16-for-32 from beyond the arc on Jan. 8, equaling the 2nd-highest total of three-pointers ever allowed by Minnesota (franchise record: 17 by Golden State, Apr. 12, 1995); Orlando hit 15-for-37 on New Year's Day... For their part, *the Wolves sank a season-high eight treys (in 18 attempts) vs. Orlando*, and are shooting 34.4% (54-for-157) in their past 11 starts... Minnesota has surrendered 10+ three-pointers on 16 occasions (including Memphis' 11-for-23 effort on Friday), allowing a league-high average of 7.80 per night; the Sixers (7.33) are second... They're allowing a combined 37.2% (good for 26th), *including 42.3% (131-for-310) over the last 15*... Meanwhile, the Wolves stand 28th in three-point accuracy (30.3%) and 27th in treys made (3.93 per game)...
