Last Game: Tuesday, Jan. 26 – New York 132, Minnesota 105

David Lee scored 28 points, Al Harrington added 26 and New York bounced back from a 50-point home loss to Dallas on Sunday by shellacking the Timberwolves, 132-105, on Tuesday night at Madison Square Garden. The Knicks never trailed, scoring the game's first 15 points and extended their lead to 40-16 after one quarter as Lee and Wilson Chandler combined for 25 points. Corey Brewer sank a pair of late 3-pointers to help shave a 31-point deficit to 68-45 at halftime, and Jonny Flynn capped an 8-0 comeback that got Minnesota to within 17 with 4:54 left in the third. However, Harrington's jumper ignited an 18-3 finish that rebuilt New York's cushion to 96-64 entering the fourth. A 3-pointer from Jonathan Bender provided the Knicks with their largest lead of the night at 126-90 with 2:48 left, and the Wolves went on to suffer their eighth consecutive road loss, the last three by 25+ points. Lee and Harrington each grabbed 10 rebounds, Chandler tallied 20 points and Chris Duhon dealt 13 assists for New York. Minnesota was led by 22 points from Corey Brewer, with Ramon Sessions chipping in 20 and Sasha Pavlovic adding 16.

Previous Game: Saturday, Jan. 23 – Milwaukee 127, Minnesota 94

Carlos Delfino collected 24 points, eight rebounds and eight assists, while Brandon Jennings finished with 18 points and 13 assists as Milwaukee recorded its biggest win ever vs. the Timberwolves with a 127-94 decision on Saturday night at the Bradley Center. Al Jefferson's layup gave Minnesota its final lead at 13-12 before a 3-pointer from Delfino triggered a 14-0 Bucks onslaught. Hakim Warrick had 10 points in the second quarter and Milwaukee took a 55-45 lead into the break, then Delfino and Jennings sank treys during an 8-0 start to the third period. The Bucks took an 18-point advantage into the fourth, when nine unanswered points swelled the margin to 110-81 following a Jodie Meeks jumper with 6:09 remaining, and the final score represented Milwaukee's largest lead of the evening. The Bucks shot a blistering 63 percent after intermission, and their 42-point fourth quarter matched the highest total ever allowed by Minnesota in the final period. Warrick totaled 18 points for Milwaukee, while Jonny Flynn's 20 points led the Wolves, with Corey Brewer adding 18 and Kevin Love contributing 17 points and 12 rebounds.

His 23 defensive rebounds are the most by any NBA player since Kevin Garnett grabbed 23 for Minnesota vs. Orlando on Jan. 12, 2005. Jefferson also becomes just the ninth player in the past 15 years to collect 25+ points and 25+ rebounds in the same game. RUBIO FEATURED ON NBA TV: Timberwolves first-round draft pick Ricky Rubio and his Spanish team, Regal F.C. Barcelona, begin the Euroleague postseason by facing Greek club Maroussi BC in a game scheduled to air on NBA TV this Saturday (Jan. 30) at 12:00 p.m. CST. Rubio, the fifth overall selection in the 2009 NBA Draft, has appeared in 29 games with 27-2 Barcelona (ACB and Euroleague combined), averaging 6.8 ppg, 5.2 apg and 2.17 spg in 20.3 mpg. He's shooting 44.3% from three-point range and 85.1% from the FT line, with an assist/TO ratio of 2.9-to-1. NBA TV televises a Euroleague Game of the Week every Saturday.

WOLF TRACKS: New York dealt the Wolves their fourth consecutive loss with Tuesday's 132-105 verdict at Madison Square Garden; the teams meet again on Sunday evening at Target Center... Minnesota is now 2-13 over its past 15 starts, after enjoying a 4-3 stretch in late December that included wins over Utah, Sacramento, New Jersey and Washington... Milwaukee completed a sweep of its two-game season set vs. Minnesota by winning 127-94 on Saturday; the final 33-point spread represents the Bucks' largest win ever in the series... New Orleans picked up its second buzzer-beating Target Center win of the season with last Friday's 96-94 victory; the Hornets also slipped past Minnesota 97-96 on Dec. 9... Oklahoma City notched its 24th win of the season (surpassing its final 2008-09 total) with last Wednesday's 94-92 win... Minnesota opened the three-game homestand by snapping its four-game losing streak with a come-from-behind 108-103 OT win over Philadelphia on Jan. 18.... Memphis beat the Wolves for the third time this season on Jan. 15; the Grizzlies' 135 points represent the third-highest total ever allowed by the Wolves... Minnesota suffered a 105-94 defeat at Denver on Jan. 11; they'd handed the Nuggets a 106-100 loss in their first trip to the Pepsi Center this season (Nov. 29)...

WRITING IN THE MARGINS: Tuesday's 27-point setback marks the 12th time this season the Wolves have permitted 120+ points and their 11th loss by 20+ points; a year ago, Minnesota allowed 120 points on four occasions and suffered 10 losses by 20+... Over their past three road outings, the Wolves are being outscored by an average of 28.3 ppg (103.0-131.3) while allowing the opposition to shoot a combined 55.5% (151-for-272)... They've given up 100+ points in 13 of 15 starts overall (surrendering an average of 112.7 ppg)... Last Friday's 96-94 home loss vs. New Orleans drops Minnesota to 2-6 in one-possession games (decided by three points or less); they finished 6-8 in that category a year ago... The Wolves have now won 13 of their last 15 MLK Day contests, following the Jan. 18 home win over Philadelphia; that outing was also Minnesota's second OT game in six days and 100th all-time (44 wins, 56 losses)... Houston beat the Wolves 120-114 on Jan. 13, the first triple-overtime game in franchise history...

SCHEDULE NOTES: Tonight's game concludes a three-game Eastern Conference road trip for the Wolves, winding down a 10-game stretch that has featured seven away from Target Center... Minnesota has dropped eight consecutive road games since beating New Jersey 103-99 on Dec. 23.... Tonight's game also wraps up the 12th of 20 sets of back-to-back outings for 2009-10; they're 2-9 on the tail end of back-to-backs, beating Utah (Dec. 5) and New Jersey (Dec. 23), having finished 6-16 a year ago... The Jan. 2 game at Indiana completed the Wolves' second four-games-in-five-nights set this year; Minnesota has three such groupings slated in 2009-10, up from one a year ago... The Wolves have won five of their past 10 vs. sub-.500 teams; on the flipside, last Friday's loss to Oklahoma City was their 10th in a row vs. opponents with winning records, dating to the 110-108 victory at Utah on Dec. 14...

FINDING THE RANGE: Minnesota shot 57.1% in the Dec. 5 win over Utah, their highest percentage since hitting 59.0% vs. Phoenix on Jan. 29, 2007 (a 121-112 win)... The Wolves have cleared 50% in seven of their past 30 starts, most recently a 50.0% effort in the Jan. 8 win over Indiana; they'd hit 50%+ just once in their first 16 outings (52.0% vs. Boston, Nov. 2)... A year ago, Minnesota put together back-to-back 50%+ nights twice; the last time they topped that mark in three straight games was Mar. 14-15-17, 2008... The Wolves shot a season-low 32.6% vs. Dallas on Nov. 13, one of 10 sub-40% outings to date; a year ago, they finished below 40% on 11 occasions, going 0-11... The 37.4% effort vs. Washington on Dec. 26 marked the first time Minnesota has won when shooting below 40% since Mar. 19, 2008 vs. Memphis... The Wolves currently stand 26th in FG accuracy (44.1%) and 25th in scoring (97.0 ppg)...

LONG-RANGE PLANS: New York finished 17-for-40 from beyond the arc on Tuesday, equaling the highest total of three-pointers ever allowed by Minnesota (Golden State, Apr. 12, 1995); Orlando hit 15-for-37 on New Year's Day, while Indiana finished 16-for-32 a week later (Jan. 8)... The Knicks' 40 attempts also mark the most ever by a Minnesota opponent... For their part, the Wolves sank a season-high nine treys (in 17 attempts) at New York, and are shooting 35.6% (79-for-222) in their past 16 starts... Minnesota has surrendered 10+ three-pointers on 18 occasions (including Milwaukee's 11-for-23 effort last Saturday), allowing a league-high average of 7.96 per night; Toronto (7.22) is second... They're allowing a combined 37.3% (ranking 29th), including 41.3% (177-for-429) over the last 20 games... The Wolves stand 28th in three-point accuracy (31.2%) and 28th in treys made (4.04 per game)...

ALL YOU NEED IS...: Milwaukee outboarded the Wolves 45-35 last Saturday, the eighth time they've faced a double-digit deficit (first since Nov. 27)... Minnesota has held the board edge in 18 of its past 30 starts, compiling a +3.2 rpg (45.6-42.4) margin in that span; the Wolves had come up short in 11 of their first 16... Minnesota collected 65 rebounds in the triple-OT game at Houston on Jan. 15, tying the club single-game record set vs. Philadelphia on Feb. 3, 1991 (double-OT)... The Wolves outboarded Indiana 56-36 on Jan. 8, their seventh double-digit margin of the season; they piled up a 49-29 edge Dec. 9 vs. New Orleans... Minnesota has risen to 9th in the NBA in offensive rebound percentage (.280) and 8th in total rebound percentage (.511), after sitting just 18th and 25th, respectively, in late November... The Wolves swiped 15 steals Oct. 28 vs. New Jersey, the 15th time in club history (second in the last six years) they've come up with 15+; the club single-game mark is 17, set most recently at New Jersey on Mar. 24, 2000... Minnesota currently ranks 8th in steals (7.65 spg); however, they're last in both blocked shots (3.48 bpg) and turnovers (16.4 per game)...

NO FREE LUNCH: The Wolves finished 33-for-45 from the line Jan. 8 vs. Indiana, their busiest night in nearly four years (since a 40-for-51 outing vs. New York on Mar. 26, 2006) and just the third time in 10 years they've attempted 45+... Minnesota has boosted its frequency to 26.9 attempts per game over its past 23 games, after averaging just 20.0 in its first 23 starts... Toronto's 40-for-48 effort on Dec. 8 marks the most prolific night by a Wolves opponent in nearly 10 years (since Phoenix went 43-for-49 on Mar. 14, 2000) and just the 9th time an opponent has converted 40+ FTs... Minnesota sank all 18 of its FT attempts Nov. 21 at Portland, the 17th perfect night in franchise annals; the club record for most FTs made without a miss is 24 (at Phoenix, Apr. 5, 2003)... They rank 21st in FT accuracy (74.3%) and 23rd in FTs attempted (23.5 per game); a year ago, Minnesota ended 15th (76.9%) and 19th (23.9 per game)...

OPENING ACT: The Wolves began the 2009-10 regular season by slipping past New Jersey, 95-93, on Oct. 28... New Jersey built a 19-point lead (72-53) midway through the third period before Minnesota rallied; it's the 8th-biggest comeback in franchise history, and the largest 2nd-half deficit the Wolves have overcome since spotting Dallas a 24-point advantage before roaring back to win 113-110 in overtime on Jan. 17, 1998 at Reunion Arena... They've now won 14 of their past 15 home openers, having a 12-game winning streak in that category snapped with a 99-91 loss to Denver on Nov. 2, 2007... All-time, Minnesota improves to 13-8 on Opening Night, having started 12 of the past 14 seasons with wins (also losing 100-95 in 1999 vs. Sacramento in Tokyo); they're 15-6 in home openers...

ONE FOR THE BOOKS: Golden State's 146-point explosion on Nov. 9 equaled the top single-game total ever by a Wolves opponent; the Warriors posted a 146-109 victory on Apr. 1, 1994 in Oakland... The final 41-point spread also matches the biggest losing margin in club history; Minnesota suffered a 113-72 defeat at Miami on Mar. 5, 1996... The Wolves committed 28 turnovers at Golden State, one short of the franchise single-game record; they coughed it up 29 times at New Jersey on Nov. 4, 2002... Meanwhile, the Warriors' 22 steals on Nov. 9 mark the highest total in an NBA game in over 12 years, since Atlanta swiped 23 at Philadelphia on Apr. 9, 1997...
