Last Game: Sunday, Jan. 31 – Minnesota 112, New York 91

Kevin Love scored a career-high 25 points and Al Jefferson added 22 as the Timberwolves notched their biggest winning margin of the season with a 112-91 triumph over New York on Sunday night at Target Center. David Lee's basket capped a 22-7 start for the Knicks, but eight points from Ryan Hollins helped Minnesota shave the deficit to three by quarter's end and Love put the Wolves on top 27-26 early in the second. Trailing by three at halftime, New York used back-to-back 3-pointers from Jared Jeffries and Chris Duhon to jump back in front 56-52 early in the third. However, Minnesota finished the quarter by outscoring the Knicks 15-6 for a 10-point cushion, then doubled that when Wayne Ellington's trey made it 95-75 with 8:06 remaining. The lead crested at 23 following a long-range strike from Love as the Wolves limited New York to one field goal over the first six minutes of the fourth quarter, and Minnesota went on to avenge a 132-105 loss to the Knicks five nights earlier at Madison Square Garden. Love and Jefferson grabbed 11 rebounds apiece for the Wolves, while Wilson Chandler topped New York with 27 points.

Previous Game: Friday, Jan. 29 – Minnesota 111, L.A. Clippers 97

Corey Brewer's 20 points led six double-figure scorers and the Timberwolves withstood a 23-point third quarter from Baron Davis to hand Los Angeles a 111-97 defeat on Friday night at Target Center. Minnesota shot a blistering 70 percent in the first period, scoring the game's first nine points en route to a 34-20 lead. Brewer and Ramon Sessions fueled an 18-4 second-quarter outburst that hiked the margin to 23 before settling for a 56-37 halftime cushion. Davis scored the Clippers' final 10 points of the third, including a layup at the buzzer, to help chisel the deficit to nine, and L.A. held Minnesota without a basket for four minutes in the fourth quarter to help cut it to 95-90 on Marcus Camby's dunk with 5:32 remaining. However, Brewer and Ryan Gomes responded with jumpers on the Wolves' next two possessions, and the Clippers misfired on eight of their final 10 shots as Minnesota put the game away on free throws from Al Jefferson and Ryan Hollins, who ended with a career-high 19 points. Jefferson had 14 points and 16 rebounds for the Wolves, while Davis collected 28 points for Los Angeles and Camby pulled down 19 rebounds.

LOVE, FLYNN MAKE ALL-STAR PLANS: The NBA announced on Jan. 27 that Wolves forward Kevin Love and guard Jonny Flynn are among 18 players selected for the 2010 T-Mobile Rookie Challenge, to be played next Friday (Feb. 12) at the American Airlines Center in Dallas as part of All-Star Weekend. Participants were chosen by the NBA's assistant coaches, with each team submitting one ballot. DOUBLE-DOUBLE DUO: Wolves center Al Jefferson hauled down a franchise-record 26 rebounds in the triple-OT loss at Houston on Jan. 13, part of his fifth career 20/20 effort. His 23 defensive rebounds are the most by any NBA player since Kevin Garnett grabbed 23 for Minnesota vs. Orlando on Jan. 12, 2005. Jefferson also becomes just the ninth player in the past 15 years to collect 25+ points and 25+ rebounds in the same game. Meanwhile, forward Kevin Love tallied a career-high 25 points and 11 rebounds Sunday vs. New York, the 24th time in 29 games this year he's reached double figures (including 21 point/rebound double-doubles):

WOLF TRACKS: Minnesota completed a 2-0 weekend homestand by defeating New York 112-91 on Sunday, avenging a 132-105 loss to the Knicks five nights earlier at MSG... Coupled with last Friday's 111-97 victory over the Clippers, it marks the second time this year that the Wolves have put together back-to-back victories (also Dec. 23-26)... Sunday's final 21-point spread marks Minnesota's biggest winning margin of the season; they'd posted a 112-96 win over Sacramento on Dec. 18... The victory over the Clippers snapped a five-game losing streak for Minnesota; they also dropped five in a row from Dec. 29-Jan. 6, and endured a 15-game skid from Oct. 30-Nov. 27... Prior to the homestand, the Wolves were 2-14 in their previous 16 starts, capped by a 109-95 loss at Cleveland last Wednesday... The Knicks' victory on Jan. 26 represented their biggest win and highest point total ever vs. Minnesota... Milwaukee completed a sweep of its two-game season set vs. Minnesota by winning 127-94 on Jan. 23; the 33-point spread is the Bucks' largest win ever in the series... New Orleans picked up its second buzzer-beating Target Center victory of the season with the 96-94 win on Jan. 22; the Hornets also slipped past Minnesota 97-96 on Dec. 9... Minnesota opened the three-game homestand by snapping its four-game losing streak with a come-from-behind 108-103 OT win over Philadelphia on Jan. 18... Memphis beat the Wolves for the third time this season on Jan. 15; the Grizzlies' 135 points represent the third-highest total ever allowed by Minnesota...

WRITING IN THE MARGINS: Last Friday's win over the Clippers marked the second game this year in which the Wolves never trailed (also Dec. 18 vs. Sacramento), while their 23-point, 3rd-quarter lead represents the biggest they've enjoyed at any point this season... On the other hand, the Jan. 26 setback at New York was the third time Minnesota never led; the Knicks jumped out to a 15-0 lead, the most consecutive points ever allowed by the Wolves to start a game... The 96-94 home loss vs. New Orleans on Jan. 22 dropped Minnesota to 2-6 in one-possession games (decided by three points or less); they finished 6-8 in that category a year ago... Meanwhile, Sunday's win over New York was their fourth double-digit victory of 2009-10... The Wolves have now won 13 of their last 15 MLK Day contests, following the Jan. 18 home win over Philadelphia; that outing was also Minnesota's second OT game in six days and 100th all-time (44 wins, 56 losses)... Houston beat the Wolves 120-114 on Jan. 13, the first triple-overtime game in franchise history...

SCHEDULE NOTES: Tonight's game kicks off the 13th of 20 sets of back-to-back outings for 2009-10; they're 2-10 on the tail end of back-to-backs, beating Utah (Dec. 5) and New Jersey (Dec. 23), having finished 6-16 a year ago... Minnesota has dropped nine consecutive road games since beating New Jersey 103-99 on Dec. 23... The Jan. 27 setback at Cleveland completed a three-game Eastern trip for the Wolves, winding down a 10-game stretch that featured seven away from Target Center... The Jan. 2 game at Indiana completed Minnesota's second four-games-in-five-nights set this year; they have three such groupings slated in 2009-10 (next is Feb. 23-27), up from one a year ago... The Wolves have won seven of their last 12 vs. sub-.500 teams; on the flipside, the Jan. 27 loss in Cleveland was their 11th in a row vs. opponents with winning records, dating to the 110-108 victory at Utah on Dec. 14...

LONG-RANGE PLANS: New York finished 17-for-40 from beyond the arc on Jan. 26, equaling the highest total of three-pointers ever allowed by Minnesota (Golden State, Apr. 12, 1995); Orlando hit 15-for-37 on New Year's Day, while Indiana finished 16-for-32 a week later (Jan. 8)... The Knicks' 40 attempts also mark the most ever by a Minnesota opponent... For their part, the Wolves sank a season-high nine treys (in 17 attempts) at New York, and are shooting 36.4% (99-for-272) in their past 19 starts... Minnesota has surrendered 10+ three-pointers on 18 occasions (including Milwaukee's 11-for-23 showing on Jan. 23), allowing a league-leading average of 7.86 treys per night (3rd-highest average in NBA history)... They're allowing a combined 36.8% (ranking 28th), including 39.5% (196-for-496) over the last 23 games... The Wolves stand 27th in three-point accuracy (31.8%) and 26th in treys made (4.20 per game)...

NO FREE LUNCH: The Wolves finished 33-for-45 from the line Jan. 8 vs. Indiana, their busiest night in nearly four years (since a 40-for-51 outing vs. New York on Mar. 26, 2006) and just the third time in 10 years they've attempted 45+... Minnesota has boosted its frequency to 26.5 attempts per game over its past 26 games, after averaging just 20.0 in its first 23 starts... Toronto's 40-for-48 effort on Dec. 8 marks the most prolific night by a Wolves opponent in nearly 10 years (since Phoenix went 43-for-49 on Mar. 14, 2000) and just the 9th time an opponent has converted 40+ FTs... Minnesota sank all 18 of its FT attempts Nov. 21 at Portland, the 17th perfect night in franchise annals; the club record for most FTs made without a miss is 24 (at Phoenix, Apr. 5, 2003)... They rank 20th in FT accuracy (74.5%) and 23rd in FTs attempted (23.4 per game); a year ago, Minnesota ended 15th (76.9%) and 19th (23.9 per game)...

ALL YOU NEED IS...: Minnesota outrebounded New York 58-36 on Sunday, its eighth double-digit margin of the season and the third spread of 20+; the Wolves outboarded Indiana 56-36 on Jan. 8 and New Orleans 49-29 on Dec. 9... Minnesota has held the board edge in 19 of its past 32 starts, compiling a +3.6 rpg (45.7-42.1) margin in that span; they'd come up short in 11 of their first 16 (facing a -4.4 rpg shortfall)... The Wolves collected 65 rebounds in the triple-OT game at Houston on Jan. 15, tying the franchise single-game record set vs. Philadelphia on Feb. 3, 1991 (double-OT)... Minnesota has climbed to 7th in the NBA in offensive rebound percentage (.281) and 6th in total rebound percentage (.512), after sitting just 18th and 25th, respectively, in late November... Phoenix outboarded the Wolves 45-35 on Nov. 27, the seventh time in the season's first 16 games they'd faced a double-digit deficit... Minnesota ranks 3rd in the NBA in second-chance points, averaging 15.1 ppg; they finished 3rd in that category a year ago, as well (14.6 ppg)...

THE IRON RANGE: The Wolves shot 52.4% in last Friday's victory over the Clippers, and followed up with a 50.0% effort in beating New York on Sunday; the last time they topped 50% in three consecutive games was Mar. 14-15-17, 2008... Last Friday's outing was their top percentage for January and the first time they'd cracked 50% since beating Indiana on Jan. 8 (11 games)... Minnesota has shot better than 46% in six straight home games (a combined 48.9%), but has been held below 40% in five of its past nine away from Target Center (a combined 41.6%), most recently a 38.9% effort last Wednesday at Cleveland... The Wolves shot 57.1% in the Dec. 5 triumph over Utah, their highest percentage since hitting 59.0% vs. Phoenix on Jan. 29, 2007... They hit a season-low 32.6% vs. Dallas on Nov. 13, one of 11 sub-40% outings to date; a year ago, they finished below 40% on 11 occasions, going 0-11... The 37.4% effort vs. Washington on Dec. 26 marked the first time Minnesota has won when shooting below 40% since Mar. 19, 2008 vs. Memphis... The Wolves rank 25th in FG accuracy (44.3%) and 23rd in scoring (97.6 ppg); they were 29th (44.1%) and 21st (97.8 ppg) last year...

AT THE OTHER END: The 27-point setback in New York on Jan. 26 marked the 12th time this season the Wolves have permitted 120+ points and their 11th loss by 20+ points; a year ago, Minnesota allowed 120 points on four occasions and suffered 10 losses by 20+... Over their past four road starts, the Wolves are being outscored by an average of 24.8 ppg (101.0-125.8) while allowing the opposition to shoot a combined 55.2% (191-for-346)... At Target Center, however, Minnesota is 6-6 in its last 12 outings, with four of the six losses coming by six points or less (including consecutive two-point defeats vs. Oklahoma City and New Orleans on Jan. 20-22)... They've kept each of their past four home opponents below 100 (an average of 94.5 ppg)... For the season, Minnesota ranks 28th in scoring defense (106.7 ppg) and 27th in defensive FG percentage (47.3%); they were 22nd (102.7 ppg) and 26th (47.4%) a year ago...

ONE FOR THE BOOKS: Golden State's 146-point explosion on Nov. 9 equaled the top single-game total ever by a Wolves opponent; the Warriors posted a 146-109 victory on Apr. 1, 1994 in Oakland... The final 41-point spread also matches the biggest losing margin in club history; Minnesota suffered a 113-72 defeat at Miami on Mar. 5, 1996... The Wolves committed 28 turnovers at Golden State, one short of the franchise single-game record; they coughed it up 29 times at New Jersey on Nov. 4, 2002... Meanwhile, the Warriors' 22 steals on Nov. 9 mark the highest total in an NBA game in over 12 years, since Atlanta swiped 23 at Philadelphia on Apr. 9, 1997... The Wolves collected 15 steals Oct. 28 vs. New Jersey, the 15th time in franchise history (second in the last six years) they've come up with 15+; the club single-game mark is 17, set most recently at New Jersey on Mar. 24, 2000... Minnesota ranks 9th in steals (7.59 spg); however, they're last in both blocked shots (3.51 bpg) and turnovers (16.2 per game)...

OPENING ACT: The Wolves began the 2009-10 regular season by slipping past New Jersey, 95-93, on Oct. 28... New Jersey built a 19-point lead (72-53) midway through the third period before Minnesota rallied; it's the 8th-biggest comeback in franchise history, and the largest 2nd-half deficit the Wolves have overcome since spotting Dallas a 24-point advantage before roaring back to win 113-110 in overtime on Jan. 17, 1998 at Reunion Arena... They've now won 14 of their past 15 home openers, having a 12-game winning streak in that category snapped with a 99-91 loss to Denver on Nov. 2, 2007... All-time, Minnesota improves to 13-8 on Opening Night, having started 12 of the past 14 seasons with wins (also losing 100-95 in 1999 vs. Sacramento in Tokyo); they're 15-6 in home openers...
