**Last Game: Friday, Feb. 26 – Oklahoma City 109, Minnesota 92**

Kevin Durant scored 25 points and Russell Westbrook collected 18 points and a career-high 15 assists as Oklahoma City beat the Timberwolves for the second time in six days with a 109-92 victory on Friday night at the Ford Center. The Thunder never trailed, opening a 30-19 lead after one quarter behind 10 points from Durant. Minnesota rallied back to within 37-35 on a Kevin Love basket with 4:31 left in the second, but Oklahoma City finished the half with an 18-6 burst to rebuild its lead to 14. After Ryan Gomes cut the deficit to 10 early in the third period, the Thunder countered by outscoring them 19-4 over the next five minutes and took their biggest lead of the night when Westbrook made it 76-51 at the 4:24 mark. Facing a 19-point spread entering the fourth, the Wolves could get no closer than 15 the rest of the way, and Oklahoma City went on to post its 10th win in 12 contests overall while beating Minnesota for the fourth consecutive time. Serge Ibaka finished with 14 points and Jeff Green added 13 for the Thunder. Kevin Love led the Wolves with 19 points and grabbed eight rebounds, while Al Jefferson chipped in 12 points.

**Previous Game: Wednesday, Feb. 24 – Atlanta 98, Minnesota 92**

Josh Smith scored 10 of his season-high 27 points in the fourth quarter and added 10 rebounds as Atlanta held off a Timberwolves rally to win, 98-92, on Wednesday night at Philips Arena. Al Jefferson's basket put Minnesota in front 19-14 midway through the first quarter, but the Hawks responded with a 13-2 surge that extended into the second period and took a 50-42 lead into halftime on Smith's dunk in the closing seconds. Mike Bibby nailed back-to-back 3-pointers to double Atlanta's lead to 12 early in the third and Maurice Evans converted a three-point play to make it 77-61 with 2:05 left in the quarter. However, the Wolves chipped the margin to 12 entering the fourth, when Damien Wilkins scored eight points during a 10-0 blitz that brought Minnesota to within 78-76. Al Horford's three-point play ended the Hawks' drought, and Atlanta then held the Wolves without a field goal for nearly eight minutes in rebuilding its lead to double figures. Joe Johnson finished with 21 points and Horford hauled in 13 rebounds for the Hawks. Minnesota was paced by 19 points and 12 rebounds from Kevin Love, with Ryan Hollins chipping in 18 points.

Joel Przybilla hauled down 13 rebounds and Travis Outlaw chipped in 19 points for the Blazers, while Minnesota was topped by Nathan Jawai's career-high 16 points and 15 from Ryan Gomes.

**Second Meeting:** Greg Oden tallied 18 points and 11 rebounds, while Brandon Roy and LaMarcus Aldridge combined to score 19 points in the pivotal third quarter as Portland thumped the Wolves, 107-84, on Nov. 11 at Target Center. Martell Webster chipped in 16 points and Rudy Fernández added 15 for Portland, with Joel Przybilla totaling 11 rebounds and four blocks. Jonny Flynn's 15 points led Minnesota, while Al Jefferson contributed 14.

**Third Meeting:** Martell Webster scored 19 of his 21 points during a second-half barrage that lifted Portland to a 106-78 rout of the Timberwolves on Nov. 21 at the Rose Garden. Webster also had 13 rebounds while Brandon Roy tallied 18 points and Joel Przybilla added 14 points and 11 boards for the Blazers. Al Jefferson led Minnesota with 20 points and 10 rebounds.

**DOUBLE-DOUBLE DUO:** Wolves center Al Jefferson hauled down a franchise-record 26 rebounds in the triple-OT loss at Houston on Jan. 13, part of his fifth career 20/20 effort. His 23 defensive rebounds are the most by any NBA player since Kevin Garnett grabbed 23 for Minnesota vs. Orlando on Jan. 12, 2005. Jefferson also becomes just the ninth player in the past 15 years to collect 25+ points and 25+ rebounds in the same game. Meanwhile, forward Kevin Love totaled a team-high 19 points and 12 rebounds Wednesday in Atlanta; he's grabbed 10+ boards in 30 of 40 outings this year (including 27 point/rebound double-doubles):

**SOMETHING'S BREWING:** Corey Brewer's long-range strike midway through the 2nd quarter Tuesday at Miami extended his run of consecutive games with a made three-pointer to 22, breaking the previous franchise record of 21 held by Isaiah Rider (set Dec. 20, 1994-Feb. 3, 1995). Brewer began his streak Jan. 8 vs. Indiana, and is shooting 43.1% (44-for-102) from beyond the arc over the last 24 games; 14 of those have featured two or more treys, including a 4-for-5 performance at New York on Jan. 26. The NBA's longest such streak this season belongs to Houston guard Aaron Brooks, whose current 30-game run began on Dec. 22.

**WOLF TRACKS:** The Wolves finished a three-game road trip with Friday's 109-92 loss in Oklahoma City... It's the Thunder's third win over Minnesota this season, and second in six days; they recorded a 109-107 victory last Sunday at Target Center... Atlanta swept the season series from the Wolves by winning 98-92 on Wednesday... Minnesota snapped its six-game losing streak with Tuesday's 91-88 triumph in Miami... It's the second straight year the Wolves have claimed a win at AmericanAirlines Arena (111-104 last Feb. 18)... Oklahoma City extended its winning streak to nine games with Sunday's 109-107 decision at Target Center... Chicago completed a sweep of its two-game season series vs. Minnesota with last Friday's 100-94 triumph; the Bulls had recorded a 110-96 victory on Jan. 9 at the United Center... Washington beat the Wolves 108-99 on Feb. 17 at the Verizon Center, gaining a split of the season set after Minnesota had notched a 101-89 triumph on Dec. 26 at Target Center... During the six-game skid, the Wolves' offense plummeted to 95.7 ppg; they'd averaged 104.5 ppg in their prior 17 starts... They began a two-game Eastern swing by suffering a 108-85 setback Feb. 16 at Detroit, their lowest point total since scoring 78 at Portland on Nov. 21... Minnesota headed into the All-Star Break with a 93-92 home defeat vs. Charlotte on Feb. 10, one night after suffering a 119-97 loss at Philadelphia that ended the Wolves' season-best four-game winning streak... It was the first time Minnesota had put together four consecutive wins since last January, when they began 2009 with five in a row... The Wolves rallied for a 109-102 win over Memphis on Feb. 6, salvaging the series finale vs. the Grizzlies... One night earlier, Minnesota snapped a 13-game, four-year drought vs. Dallas with a 117-108 decision at the American Airlines Center... Minnesota completed a two-game homestand by defeating New York 112-91 on Jan. 31, having sustained a 132-105 loss to the Knicks five nights earlier at MSG; the final 21-point spread marks the Wolves' biggest winning margin of the season...

**NO FREE LUNCH:** The Wolves finished 33-for-45 from the line Jan. 8 vs. Indiana, their busiest night in nearly four years (since a 40-for-51 outing vs. New York on Mar. 26, 2006) and just the third time in 10 years they've attempted 45+... Minnesota has seen its FT frequency tumble to 21.5 attempts per game over its past 20, after averaging 28.6 trips in the previous 17... Toronto's 40-for-48 effort on Dec. 8 marks the most prolific night by a Wolves opponent in nearly 10 years (since Phoenix went 43-for-49 on Mar. 14, 2000) and just the 9th time an opponent has converted 40+ FTs... Minnesota sank all 18 of its FT attempts Nov. 21 at Portland, the 17th perfect night in franchise annals; the club record for most FTs made without a miss is 24 (at Phoenix, Apr. 5, 2003)... They rank 25th in FT accuracy (73.9%) and 26th in FTs attempted (23.0 per game); a year ago, Minnesota ended 15th (76.9%) and 19th (23.9 per game)...

**LONG-RANGE PLANS:** New York finished 17-for-40 from beyond the arc on Jan. 26, equaling the highest total of three-pointers ever allowed by Minnesota (Golden State, Apr. 12, 1995); Orlando hit 15-for-37 on New Year's Day, while Indiana finished 16-for-32 a week later (Jan. 8)... The Knicks' 40 attempts are also the most ever by a Minnesota opponent... Meanwhile, the Wolves sank a season-high 12 treys (in 22 attempts) Feb. 5 at Dallas, and are shooting 38.2% (171-for-448) in their last 30 starts... Minnesota has surrendered 10+ three-pointers on 18 occasions (including Milwaukee's 11-for-23 showing on Jan. 23), allowing a league-leading average of 7.43 treys per night (3rd-highest average in NBA history)... They're allowing a combined 36.4% (ranking 25th), but have shaved that to 29.6% (32-for-108) over the last seven... The Wolves stand 25th in three-point accuracy (33.8%) and 26th in treys made (4.63 per game)...

**SCHEDULE NOTES:** Wednesday wrapped up a 16-day run that saw the Wolves play seven of eight vs. Eastern Conference foes... Beginning tonight, Minnesota's next 10 games will be against Western rivals, capped by a four-game West Coast swing (Mar. 14-19)... Tonight's contest also ends the 17th of 20 sets of back-to-back outings for 2009-10; Minnesota is 3-13 on the tail end of back-to-backs, beating Utah (Dec. 5), New Jersey (Dec. 23) and Memphis (Feb. 6), having finished 6-16 a year ago... The Wolves conclude their third (and final) four-games-in-five-nights set tonight; the stretch began with Tuesday's victory in Miami... That win improved the Wolves' record to 2-10 on the road vs. Eastern opponents; their only other success was Dec. 23 at New Jersey... The 117-108 win in Dallas on Feb. 5 ended a nine-game road losing streak, dating to the win at New Jersey... It was also the Wolves' first victory vs. a .500+ team since beating Utah 110-108 on Dec. 14; all three of Minnesota's wins this month have been against teams with winning records... On the flipside, the Wolves have won seven of their last 14 vs. sub-.500 teams...

**FINDING THE RANGE:** The Wolves shot 55.6% Feb. 6 vs. Memphis, their 2nd-best percentage of the season and the fourth straight game they'd hit 50%+... Minnesota finished at 53.0% one night earlier in Dallas, 50.0% on Jan. 31 vs. New York and 52.4% on Jan. 29 vs. the Clippers... The latter outing was their top percentage for January and the first time they'd cracked 50% since beating Indiana on Jan. 8 (11 games)... Minnesota has shot 45% or better in 10 straight home games (a combined 48.5%), but has been held below 40% in five of its past 16 away from Target Center, most recently a 38.9% effort Jan. 27 at Cleveland... The Wolves shot 57.1% in the Dec. 5 win over Utah, their highest percentage since hitting 59.0% vs. Phoenix on Jan. 29, 2007... They hit a season-low 32.6% vs. Dallas on Nov. 13, one of 11 sub-40% nights; a year ago, they were below 40% on 11 occasions, going 0-11 in those... The 37.4% effort vs. Washington on Dec. 26 marked the first time Minnesota has won with a sub-40% night since Mar. 19, 2008 vs. Memphis... The Wolves currently rank 25th in FG accuracy (44.7%) and 22nd in scoring (97.6 ppg); they were 29th (44.1%) and 21st (97.8 ppg) last year...

**AT THE OTHER END:** Oklahoma City shot 54.3% on Friday, the seventh time in 16 games Minnesota has permitted 50%+; Philly's 57.5% effort on Feb. 9 marked the sixth time overall they've given up 55% or better... Minnesota limited the Heat to 88 points on Tuesday, their 2nd-best defensive total of the year (87 by Milwaukee, Nov. 6) and the first time they've held an opponent below 100 away from Target Center since the 103-99 victory at New Jersey on Dec. 23... Over their past 11 road starts, the Wolves are allowing a combined 50.9% (470-for-924) while surrendering an average of 112.2 ppg... The 27-point setback in New York on Jan. 26 marked the 12th time this season the Wolves have permitted 120+ points and one of 13 losses by 20+ points; a year ago, Minnesota allowed 120 points on four occasions and suffered 10 losses by 20+... At Target Center, the Wolves are 7-9 in their last 16, with seven of the losses coming by six or less (including consecutive two-point defeats vs. Oklahoma City and New Orleans on Jan. 20-22)... They've kept five of their past eight home opponents below 100 (an average of 97.8 ppg)... Overall, Minnesota ranks 28th in scoring defense (106.1 ppg) and 26th in defensive FG percentage (47.5%); they were 22nd (102.7 ppg) and 26th (47.4%) a year ago...

**ALL YOU NEED IS...** The Wolves outrebounded Miami 47-36 on Tuesday, marking the only time in 11 February outings they've held the board advantage... Minnesota is being outrebounded by an average of -3.9 rpg (39.5-43.5) this month, after piling up a +3.6 rpg (45.7-42.1) edge in December and January combined... Charlotte outrebounded the Wolves 45-34 on Feb. 10, their first double-digit deficit since Nov. 27 vs. Phoenix... Minnesota outrebounded New York 58-36 on Jan. 31, its eighth double-digit margin of the year and third spread of 20+; they outboarded Indiana 56-36 on Jan. 8 and New Orleans 49-29 on Dec. 9... The Wolves collected 65 rebounds in the triple-OT game at Houston on Jan. 15, tying the club single-game record set vs. Philadelphia on Feb. 3, 1991 (double-OT)... Minnesota is now 11th in the NBA in offensive rebound percentage (.273) and 12th in total rebound percentage (.506), having crested at 7th and 7th, respectively, in January... Minnesota is grabbing just 9.9 offensive rpg this month (13.1 in January), but still ranks 5th in the NBA in second-chance points, averaging 14.6 ppg; they finished 3rd in that category last year (14.6 ppg)...

**WRITING IN THE MARGINS:** The Jan. 29 win over the Clippers marked the second game this year in which the Wolves never trailed (also Dec. 18 vs. Sacramento), while their 23-point, 3rd-quarter lead represents the biggest they've enjoyed at any point this season... On the other hand, Friday's loss at Oklahoma City was the fifth time Minnesota hasn't led... The Knicks jumped out to a 15-0 lead on Jan. 26, the most consecutive points allowed by the Wolves to start a game... Tuesday's 91-88 win at Miami improved Minnesota's record to 3-8 in one-possession games (decided by three points or less); they finished 6-8 in that category a year ago... Meanwhile, the Jan. 31 win over New York was their fourth double-digit victory of 2009-10... The Wolves have won 13 of their last 15 MLK Day contests, following the Jan. 18 home win over Philadelphia; that outing was also Minnesota's second OT game in six days and 100th all-time (44 wins, 56 losses)... Houston beat the Wolves 120-114 on Jan. 13, the first triple-overtime game in franchise history...

**ONE FOR THE BOOKS:** Golden State's 146-point explosion on Nov. 9 equaled the top single-game total ever by a Wolves opponent; the Warriors posted a 146-109 victory on Apr. 1, 1994 in Oakland... The final 41-point spread also matches the biggest losing margin in club history; Minnesota suffered a 113-72 defeat at Miami on Mar. 5, 1996... The Wolves committed 28 turnovers at Golden State, one short of the franchise single-game record; they coughed it up 29 times at New Jersey on Nov. 4, 2002... Meanwhile, the Warriors' 22 steals on Nov. 9 mark the highest total in an NBA game in over 12 years, since Atlanta swiped 23 at Philadelphia on Apr. 9, 1997... The Wolves collected 15 steals Oct. 28 vs. New Jersey, the 15th time in franchise history (second in the last six years) they've come up with 15+; the club single-game mark is 17, set most recently at New Jersey on Mar. 24, 2000... Minnesota ranks 11th in steals (7.48 spg); however, they're last in both blocked shots (3.55 bpg) and turnovers (16.1 per game)...
