**Last Game: Saturday, Mar. 6 – Houston 112, Minnesota 98**

Kevin Martin tallied 30 points and Luis Scola added 25 with a career-high 21 rebounds as Houston downed the Timberwolves, 112-98, on Saturday night at Target Center. Minnesota rallied from an early nine-point deficit to pull ahead 21-20 on Damien Wilkins' jumper, but the Rockets peeled off 14 unanswered points to open a 38-22 lead early in the second period. The Wolves narrowed the gap to 60-50 by halftime thanks to 10 points from Ramon Sessions, and got as close as seven on Corey Brewer's 3-pointer with 4:31 left in the third. However, Martin capped a 9-0 finish to the quarter and the Rockets held Minnesota without a field goal for more than eight minutes, taking their largest lead when Aaron Brooks made it 95-75 with 8:27 to play. Sessions ended the Wolves' drought at the 7:14 mark, triggering a 17-4 burst that cut the margin to seven when Jonny Flynn scored with 2:45 left. Consecutive jumpers from Scola and Martin thwarted the comeback, and Houston went on to beat the Wolves for the 11th straight time. Brooks had 25 points and nine assists for the Rockets, while Kevin Love led Minnesota with 20 points and 11 rebounds.

**Previous Game: Wednesday, Mar. 3 – Dallas 112, Minnesota 109**

Jason Terry scored 26 points despite suffering a broken nose, and Dirk Nowitzki added 22 as Dallas held off the Timberwolves, 112-109, on Wednesday night at the American Airlines Center. Minnesota led throughout the first period until Rodrigue Beaubois' trey put the Mavericks on top 27-24. A 3-pointer by Terry started an 18-4 second-quarter tear that extended Dallas' lead to 54-41, but the Wolves chipped that down to seven by intermission and pulled within 62-60 following Kevin Love's long-range strike early in the third. After the Mavericks rebuilt their lead to 12 later in the quarter, Minnesota ran off 10 unanswered points to narrow the gap to 89-87 with 12 minutes left. The Wolves edged in front three times in the fourth, the final one coming when a Jonny Flynn trey made it 98-97 with 6:34 to play. Nowitzki reclaimed the lead on Dallas' next possession, and the Mavericks sank nine of 10 free throws down the stretch to thwart Minnesota's comeback bid. Beaubois and Shawn Marion netted 17 points apiece for Dallas. Corey Brewer led the Wolves with 24 points, while Flynn tallied 19 and Love registered 14 points and 14 rebounds.

The Feb. 5 victory ended the Wolves' 13-game losing streak vs. Dallas, dating to their 91-78 triumph on Jan. 4, 2006 at Target Center.

**First Meeting:** Dirk Nowitzki collected 15 of his 20 points in the third quarter and Dallas went on to hand the Wolves an 89-77 loss on Nov. 13 at Target Center. Nowitzki pulled in 11 rebounds while Shawn Marion added 15 points for the Mavericks. Jonny Flynn's 11 points topped Minnesota, who also received 10 points apiece from Corey Brewer, Ryan Gomes and Nathan Jawai.

**Second Meeting:** Jonny Flynn had 19 points and seven assists, and scored the go-ahead basket with 1:39 to play as the Wolves notched a 117-108 victory over Dallas on Feb. 5 at the American Airlines Center. Dirk Nowitzki's 21 points led the Mavericks and Jason Terry added 20.

**Third Meeting:** Jason Terry scored 26 points and Dirk Nowitzki added 22 as Dallas held off the Timberwolves, 112-109, on Mar. 3 at the American Airlines Center. Rodrigue Beaubois and Shawn Marion netted 17 points apiece for the Mavericks. Corey Brewer led Minnesota with 24 points, while Jonny Flynn tallied 19 and Kevin Love registered 14 points and 14 rebounds.

**First Meeting:** Carmelo Anthony's 22 points paced seven double-figure scorers and Nenê collected 17 points, eight rebounds and six assists as Denver rolled past the Wolves, 124-111, on Nov. 25 at Target Center. Corey Brewer led Minnesota with a career-high 22 points and 13 rebounds, while Jonny Flynn added 20 points and Ryan Hollins chipped in a career-high 19.

**DOUBLE-DOUBLE DUO:** Wolves center Al Jefferson hauled down a franchise-record 26 rebounds in the triple-OT loss at Houston on Jan. 13, part of his fifth career 20/20 effort. His 23 defensive rebounds are the most by any NBA player since Kevin Garnett grabbed 23 for Minnesota vs. Orlando on Jan. 12, 2005. Jefferson also becomes just the ninth player in the past 15 years to collect 25+ points and 25+ rebounds in the same game. Meanwhile, forward Kevin Love totaled a team-high 20 points and 11 rebounds Saturday vs. Houston; he's grabbed 10+ boards in 32 of 43 outings this year (including 29 point/rebound double-doubles):

**ZEROING IN:** After shooting less than 30 percent from beyond the arc through December, Minnesota has seen its three-point accuracy rise dramatically in the New Year. **SOMETHING'S BREWING:** Corey Brewer's long-range strike midway through the 2nd quarter Feb. 23 at Miami extended his run of consecutive games with a made three-pointer to 22, breaking the previous franchise record of 21 held by Isaiah Rider (set Dec. 20, 1994-Feb. 3, 1995). Brewer began his streak Jan. 8 vs. Indiana, and is shooting 43.8% (49-for-112) from beyond the arc during the now-27-game run; 16 of those have featured two or more treys, including a 4-for-5 performance at New York on Jan. 26. The NBA's longest such streak this season belongs to Houston guard Aaron Brooks, whose current 34-game run began on Dec. 22.

**DOUBLING DOWN:** Minnesota spotted Philadelphia a 51-31 advantage late in the 2nd quarter before rallying to win in OT on Jan. 18, matching the fifth-biggest deficit the Wolves have ever overcome (eighth 20+ overall). They've made up double-figure spreads in eight of their 14 wins, while letting leads of 10+ points get away on six occasions. A look at the Wolves' "volatility factor" for 2009-10:

**WOLF TRACKS:** Houston extended the Wolves' losing streak to five games with Saturday's 112-98 decision, beating Minnesota for the 11th straight time and completing a third consecutive season sweep... The Wolves opened March with a 112-109 loss at Dallas last Wednesday; their previous trip to the American Airlines Center saw Minnesota snap a 10-game losing streak vs. the Mavericks by posting a 117-108 victory... The Wolves are now 1-11 over their past 12 starts, on the heels of a season-best four-game winning streak that featured the Feb. 5 victory at Dallas... Minnesota closed February with a 3-9 record following the 110-91 home loss to Portland on Feb. 27, their 12th straight setback (and third consecutive season series sweep) suffered at the hands of the Blazers... The Wolves finished a three-game road trip with the 109-92 loss in Oklahoma City on Feb. 26... It's the Thunder's third win over Minnesota this season, and second in a six-day span; they posted a 109-107 victory Feb. 21 at Target Center... Atlanta swept the season series from the Wolves by winning 98-92 on Feb. 24... Minnesota snapped its six-game losing streak with the 91-88 triumph in Miami on Feb. 23... It's the second straight year the Wolves have claimed a win at AmericanAirlines Arena (111-104 last Feb. 18)... Chicago completed a sweep of its two-game season series vs. Minnesota with the Feb. 19 triumph; two nights earlier, Washington beat the Wolves 108-99 at the Verizon Center... Minnesota headed into the All-Star Break with a 93-92 home defeat vs. Charlotte on Feb. 10, one night after suffering a 119-97 loss at Philadelphia that ended the Wolves' season-best four-game winning streak... It was the first time Minnesota had put together four consecutive wins since last January, when they began 2009 with five in a row...

**WRITING IN THE MARGINS:** The Jan. 29 win over the Clippers marked the second game this year in which the Wolves never trailed (also Dec. 18 vs. Sacramento), while their 23-point, 3rd-quarter lead represents the biggest they've enjoyed at any point this season... The Knicks jumped to a 15-0 lead on Jan. 26, the most consecutive points allowed by the Wolves to start a game... Last Wednesday's 112-109 loss at Dallas dropped Minnesota's record to 3-9 in one-possession games (decided by three points or less); they finished 6-8 in that category a year ago... Meanwhile, the Jan. 31 triumph over New York was their fourth double-digit victory of 2009-10... The Jan. 18 home win vs. Philadelphia was Minnesota's second overtime game in six days and 100th all-time (44 wins, 56 losses)... Houston beat the Wolves 120-114 on Jan. 13 at the Toyota Center, the first triple-overtime game in franchise history...

**LONG-RANGE PLANS:** New York finished 17-for-40 from beyond the arc on Jan. 26, equaling the highest total of three-pointers ever allowed by Minnesota (Golden State, Apr. 12, 1995); Orlando hit 15-for-37 on New Year's Day, while Indiana finished 16-for-32 a week later (Jan. 8)... The Knicks' 40 attempts are also the most ever by a Minnesota opponent... Meanwhile, the Wolves sank a season-high 12 treys (in 22 attempts) Feb. 5 at Dallas, and are shooting 37.6% (187-for-498) in their last 33 starts... Minnesota has surrendered 10+ three-pointers on 19 occasions (including Houston's 11-for-26 showing on Saturday), allowing a league-leading average of 7.52 treys per night (3rd-highest average in NBA history)... They're allowing a combined 36.8% (ranking 29th), including 44.4% (28-for-63) over the last three... The Wolves stand 23rd in three-point accuracy (33.7%) and 26th in treys made (4.67 per game)...

**SCHEDULE NOTES:** Tonight's game continues a three-week stretch that sees Minnesota play 11 straight games against opponents with .500+ records... That run began with the Feb. 19 contest vs. Chicago and ends Mar. 12 vs. San Antonio... The Wolves are also in the midst of a 10-game slice against Western Conference rivals, which is capped by a four-game West Coast swing (Mar. 14-19)... The Feb. 24 loss in Atlanta completed a 16-day run that saw the Wolves play seven of eight vs. Eastern Conference foes... The Feb. 27 home loss to Portland ended the 17th of 20 sets of back-to-back outings for 2009-10; Minnesota is 3-14 on the tail end of back-to-backs, beating Utah (Dec. 5), New Jersey (Dec. 23) and Memphis (Feb. 6), having finished 6-16 a year ago... The Portland game also rounded out their third (and final) four-games-in-five-nights set that began with the Feb. 23 victory in Miami... That win improved the Wolves' record to 2-10 on the road vs. Eastern opponents; their only other success was Dec. 23 at New Jersey... The 117-108 win in Dallas on Feb. 5 ended a nine-game road losing streak, dating to the win at New Jersey... It was also the Wolves' first victory vs. a .500+ team since beating Utah 110-108 on Dec. 14; all three of Minnesota's February wins were against teams with winning records... On the flipside, the Wolves have won seven of their last 14 vs. sub-.500 teams...

**FINDING THE RANGE:** Minnesota finished at 53.2% last Wednesday at Dallas, its highest percentage in a loss since shooting 56.1% on Mar. 21, 2008 at Indiana (a 124-113 defeat)... The Wolves shot 55.6% Feb. 6 vs. Memphis, their 2nd-best percentage this year and the fourth straight game they'd hit 50%+... Minnesota finished at 53.0% one night earlier in Dallas, 50.0% on Jan. 31 vs. New York and 52.4% on Jan. 29 vs. the Clippers... The latter outing was their top percentage for January and the first time they'd cracked 50% since beating Indiana on Jan. 8 (11 games)... Minnesota has shot 45% or better in 12 straight home games (a combined 48.0%), but has been held below 40% in five of its past 17 away from Target Center, most recently a 38.9% effort Jan. 27 at Cleveland... The Wolves shot 57.1% in the Dec. 5 win over Utah, their highest percentage since hitting 59.0% vs. Phoenix on Jan. 29, 2007... They hit a season-low 32.6% vs. Dallas on Nov. 13, one of 11 sub-40% nights; a year ago, they were below 40% on 11 occasions... The 37.4% effort vs. Washington on Dec. 26 marked the first time Minnesota has won with a sub-40% night since Mar. 19, 2008 vs. Memphis... The Wolves currently rank 23rd in FG accuracy (44.9%) and 22nd in scoring (97.7 ppg); they were 29th (44.1%) and 21st (97.8 ppg) last year...

**AT THE OTHER END:** Dallas shot an even 50.0% last Wednesday, the eighth time in 19 games the Wolves have permitted 50%+; Philly's 57.5% effort on Feb. 9 marked the sixth time overall they've given up 55% or better... Minnesota limited the Heat to 88 points on Feb. 23, their 2nd-best defensive total of the year (87 by Milwaukee, Nov. 6) and the first time they've held an opponent below 100 away from Target Center since the 103-99 victory at New Jersey on Dec. 23... Over their past 12 road starts, the Wolves are allowing a combined 50.8% (513-for-1010) while surrendering an average of 112.2 ppg... The 27-point setback in New York on Jan. 26 marked the 12th time this season the Wolves have permitted 120+ points and one of 13 losses by 20+ points; a year ago, Minnesota allowed 120 points on four occasions and suffered 10 losses by 20+... At Target Center, the Wolves have won seven of 18, with seven of the 11 losses coming by six or less (including consecutive two-point defeats vs. Oklahoma City and New Orleans on Jan. 20-22)... They've kept five of their past 10 home opponents below 100 (an average of 100.4 ppg)... Overall, Minnesota ranks 29th in scoring defense (106.4 ppg) and 25th in defensive FG percentage (47.5%); they were 22nd (102.7 ppg) and 26th (47.4%) a year ago...

**ALL YOU NEED IS...:** The Wolves outrebounded Dallas 49-30 last Wednesday, their ninth double-digit advantage of the year but just the second time in the past 14 they've held the edge (47-36 at Miami, Feb. 23)... Minnesota is being outboarded by an average of -2.5 rpg (40.4-42.9) since Feb. 1, after piling up a +3.6 rpg (45.7-42.1) edge in December and January combined... Charlotte outrebounded the Wolves 45-34 on Feb. 10, their first double-digit deficit since Nov. 27 vs. Phoenix... Minnesota outrebounded New York 58-36 on Jan. 31, its third spread of 20+; they outboarded Indiana 56-36 on Jan. 8 and New Orleans 49-29 on Dec. 9... The Wolves collected 65 rebounds in the triple-OT game at Houston on Jan. 15, tying the club single-game record set vs. Philadelphia on Feb. 3, 1991 (double-OT)... Minnesota is now 13th in the NBA in offensive rebound percentage (.273) and 12th in total rebound percentage (.506), having crested at 7th and 7th, respectively, in January... Minnesota grabbed just 9.8 offensive rpg in February (13.1 in January), but still ranks 4th in the NBA in second-chance points, averaging 14.6 ppg; they finished 3rd in that category last year (14.6 ppg)...

**NO FREE LUNCH:** The Wolves finished 33-for-45 from the line Jan. 8 vs. Indiana, their busiest night in nearly four years (since a 40-for-51 outing vs. New York on Mar. 26, 2006) and just the third time in 10 years they've attempted 45+... Minnesota has seen its FT frequency tumble to 21.5 attempts per game over its past 22, after averaging 28.4 trips in the previous 18... Toronto's 40-for-48 effort on Dec. 8 marks the most prolific night by a Wolves opponent in nearly 10 years (since Phoenix went 43-for-49 on Mar. 14, 2000) and just the 9th time an opponent has converted 40+ FTs... Minnesota sank all 18 of its FT attempts Nov. 21 at Portland, the 17th perfect night in franchise annals; the club record for most FTs made without a miss is 24 (at Phoenix, Apr. 5, 2003)... They rank 22nd in FT accuracy (74.0%) and 25th in FTs attempted (22.9 per game); a year ago, Minnesota ended 15th (76.9%) and 19th (23.9 per game)...

**ONE FOR THE BOOKS:** Golden State's 146-point explosion on Nov. 9 equaled the top single-game total ever by a Wolves opponent; the Warriors posted a 146-109 victory on Apr. 1, 1994 in Oakland... The final 41-point spread also matches the biggest losing margin in club history; Minnesota suffered a 113-72 defeat at Miami on Mar. 5, 1996... The Wolves committed 28 turnovers at Golden State, one short of the franchise single-game record; they coughed it up 29 times at New Jersey on Nov. 4, 2002... Meanwhile, the Warriors' 22 steals on Nov. 9 mark the highest total in an NBA game in over 12 years, since Atlanta swiped 23 at Philadelphia on Apr. 9, 1997... The Wolves collected 15 steals Oct. 28 vs. New Jersey, the 15th time in franchise history (second in the last six years) they've come up with 15+; the club single-game mark is 17, set most recently at New Jersey on Mar. 24, 2000... Minnesota ranks 11th in steals (7.44 spg); however, they're last in both blocked shots (3.60 bpg) and turnovers (16.3 per game)...
