**Last Game: Tuesday, Mar. 16 – Phoenix 152, Minnesota 114**

Jason Richardson's 27 points led eight double-figure scorers, and Phoenix hit 67 percent in the first half en route to a record-setting 152-114 win over the Timberwolves on Tuesday night at US Airways Center. The Suns led 38-33 after one quarter behind 15 points from Richardson, and peeled off nine unanswered points early in the second to increase their lead to 11. After Corey Brewer's dunk and 3-pointer brought Minnesota to within 64-56 at the 3:14 mark, the Suns closed the half with a 15-5 barrage to make it 79-61. The Wolves could get no closer than 16 after intermission, and Phoenix reached the Century Mark on a pair of Steve Nash free throws with 4:12 left in the third quarter. Leading 114-88 entering the fourth, the Suns opened their biggest margin when Louis Amundson made it 144-103 with 3:28 to play, and Leandro Barbosa's layup two minutes later pushed Phoenix past the previous high point total ever allowed by the Wolves. Amar'e Stoudemire finished with 25 points, Amundson added a career-high 20 and Nash handed out 14 assists for the Suns. Brewer's 21 points paced Minnesota, while Ryan Gomes chipped in 18.

**Previous Game: Sunday, Mar. 14 – Sacramento 114, Minnesota 100**

Tyreke Evans finished one rebound short of his second triple-double in five days as Sacramento coasted to a 114-100 victory over the Timberwolves on Sunday night at ARCO Arena. A Jonny Flynn jumper put Minnesota ahead 18-13 midway through the first, but the Kings countered with nine straight points and led 32-25 before Damien Wilkins' halfcourt buzzer-beater. Evans scored the first half's final eight points, including a pair of three-point plays, as Sacramento's lead ballooned to 64-49. That margin was promptly doubled when the Kings opened the third quarter with 15 unanswered points before Ryan Gomes scored at the 6:41 mark. The Wolves misfired on 12 straight attempts and committed four turnovers during the 23-0, nine-minute drought that bridged halftime. Evans' jumper with 4:30 left gave Sacramento its largest lead of the night at 88-54, and the margin stayed at 33 entering the fourth before a late Minnesota surge pared the final number. Evans totaled 29 points, 11 rebounds and nine assists for the Kings, while Donte Greene added 19 points. Al Jefferson's 22 points and 10 boards topped Minnesota.

Kevin Love tallied 18 points and 10 rebounds for Minnesota while Al Jefferson had 15 points and 11 boards. Carlos Boozer led the Jazz with 21 points and 13 rebounds, with Deron Williams collecting 18 points and 11 assists.

**Second Meeting:** Jonny Flynn scored 28 points, including the game-winning layup with :03 left, as the Wolves edged Utah, 110-108, on Dec. 14 at EnergySolutions Arena. Al Jefferson had 23 points and 12 rebounds for Minnesota, while Deron Williams led the Jazz with 38 points and 13 assists.

**Third Meeting:** Deron Williams netted 21 points and 12 assists as Utah withstood a late Timberwolves rally to post a 107-103 victory on Dec. 30 at Target Center. Carlos Boozer had 16 points and 12 rebounds for the Jazz, while Al Jefferson led Minnesota with 21 points and Love finished one assist short of a triple-double (17 points, 11 rebounds).

**DOUBLE-DOUBLE DUO:** Wolves center Al Jefferson hauled down a franchise-record 26 rebounds in the triple-OT loss at Houston on Jan. 13, part of his fifth career 20/20 effort. His 23 defensive rebounds are the most by any NBA player since Kevin Garnett grabbed 23 for Minnesota vs. Orlando on Jan. 12, 2005. Jefferson also becomes just the ninth player in the past 15 years to collect 25+ points and 25+ rebounds in the same game. Meanwhile, forward Kevin Love totaled a team-high 20 points and 11 rebounds Mar. 6 vs. Houston; he's grabbed 10+ boards in 33 of his 46 outings this year (including 30 point/rebound double-doubles):

**JEFFERSON, LOVE TO DON RED, WHITE & BLUE:** USA Basketball announced on Feb. 10 that forwards Al Jefferson and Kevin Love are among 27 NBA players named to the 2010-2012 Men's National Team Program. Players from the program will be selected to represent the United States in international basketball competitions over the next three summers, including the 2010 FIBA World Championships in Turkey and the 2012 Summer Olympics in London. The Timberwolves are one of six teams to place two players on the preliminary roster, along with Denver (Carmelo Anthony, Chauncey Billups), the L.A. Lakers (Kobe Bryant, Lamar Odom), Memphis (Rudy Gay, O.J. Mayo), Oklahoma City (Kevin Durant, Russell Westbrook) and Utah (Carlos Boozer, Deron Williams).

**SOMETHING'S BREWING:** Corey Brewer's long-range strike midway through the 2nd quarter Feb. 23 at Miami extended his run of consecutive games with a made three-pointer to 22, breaking the previous franchise record of 21 held by Isaiah Rider (set Dec. 20, 1994-Feb. 3, 1995). Brewer began his streak Jan. 8 vs. Indiana, and is shooting 41.9% (57-for-136) from beyond the arc during the now-32-game run; 18 of those have featured two or more treys, including a 4-for-5 performance at New York on Jan. 26. The NBA's longest such streak this season belongs to Houston guard Aaron Brooks, whose current 38-game run began on Dec. 22.

**WOLF TRACKS:** Phoenix handed the Wolves their 10th consecutive loss (and 16th in their past 17 games) with Tuesday's 152-114 decision, the Suns' biggest win ever vs. Minnesota... They're 3-0 vs. the Wolves this season, and will close out the season series with a Mar. 28 stop at Target Center... Minnesota kicked off the current four-game road trip with Sunday's 114-100 defeat in Sacramento; the Kings will repay the visit on Mar. 31... The current drought is the Wolves' 2nd-longest of the season (eighth double-digit losing streak in franchise history); they endured a 15-game skid in November that was halted by a 106-100 victory at Denver (Nov. 29)... The Wolves completed their longest homestand of the season with an 0-4 mark following last Friday's 103-85 setback vs. San Antonio... Denver notched a 110-102 win on Mar. 8; two nights earlier, the Wolves suffered a 125-112 loss to Dallas, their second in six nights against the Mavericks (112-109 on Mar. 3 at the American Airlines Center)... Minnesota began its four-game homestand with a 112-98 loss to Houston on Mar. 6, enabling the Rockets to complete their third straight season sweep (11th consecutive win vs. the Wolves)... The Wolves are 1-16 in their past 17 starts, with the lone victory a 91-88 decision at Miami on Feb. 23; the Feb. 6 win over Memphis capped a season-best four-game winning streak that also featured victories at Dallas (Feb. 5), vs. New York (Jan. 31) and vs. the Clippers (Jan. 29)... Minnesota closed February at 3-9 following the Feb. 27 loss to Portland (their 12th straight vs. the Blazers)... The Feb. 23 victory in Miami marked the second straight season the Wolves have claimed a win at AmericanAirlines Arena (111-104 last Feb. 18)...

**SCHEDULE NOTES:** Tonight's game wraps up 18th of 20 sets of back-to-back outings for the Wolves in 2009-10; the next one begins Apr. 3 vs. Miami... Minnesota is 3-14 on the tail end of back-to-backs, beating Utah (Dec. 5), New Jersey (Dec. 23) and Memphis (Feb. 6); they finished 6-16 a year ago... Last Friday's loss to San Antonio ended a three-week stretch that saw Minnesota play 12 straight vs. teams with .500+ records, a run that began Feb. 19 vs. Chicago... The Wolves are also in the midst of a 10-game slice against Western Conference rivals, capped by this week's four-game West Coast swing (Mar. 14-19)... The Feb. 27 game vs. Portland rounded out their third (and final) four-games-in-five-nights set that began with the Feb. 23 victory in Miami... That win improved the Wolves' record to 2-10 on the road vs. Eastern Conference opponents; their only other success was Dec. 23 at New Jersey... The 117-108 win in Dallas on Feb. 5 ended a nine-game road losing streak, dating to the win at New Jersey... It was also the Wolves' first victory vs. a .500+ team since beating Utah 110-108 on Dec. 14; all three of Minnesota's February wins were against teams with winning records...

**WRITING IN THE MARGINS:** The Jan. 29 win over the Clippers marked the second game this year in which the Wolves never trailed (also Dec. 18 vs. Sacramento), while their 23-point, 3rd-quarter lead represents the biggest they've enjoyed at any point this season... New York jumped to a 15-0 lead on Jan. 26, the most consecutive points allowed by the Wolves to start a game... Meanwhile, the Kings ran off 23 unanswered points on Sunday (from 56-49 in the late second to 79-49 in the mid-third quarter), the longest such string ever by a Minnesota opponent... The 112-109 loss at Dallas on Mar. 3 dropped Minnesota's record to 3-9 in one-possession games (decided by three points or less); they finished 6-8 a year ago... The Jan. 31 triumph over New York was their fourth double-digit victory of 2009-10... The Jan. 18 home win vs. Philadelphia was Minnesota's second overtime game in six days and 100th all-time (44 wins, 56 losses)... Houston beat the Wolves 120-114 on Jan. 13 at the Toyota Center, the first triple-overtime game in franchise history...

**FINDING THE RANGE:** Minnesota hit 53.2% on Mar. 3 in Dallas, its highest percentage in a loss since shooting 56.1% on Mar. 21, 2008 at Indiana (a 124-113 defeat)... The Wolves shot 55.6% Feb. 6 vs. Memphis, their 2nd-best percentage this year and the fourth straight game they'd hit 50%+ (53.0% on Feb. 5 at Dallas, 50.0% on Jan. 31 vs. New York, 52.4% on Jan. 29 vs. the Clippers)... Minnesota had shot 45% or better in 13 straight home games (a combined 48.0%) prior to last Wednesday's 38.9% effort vs. Denver... The Wolves shot 57.1% in the Dec. 5 win over Utah, their highest percentage since hitting 59.0% vs. Phoenix on Jan. 29, 2007... They hit a season-low 32.6% vs. Dallas on Nov. 13, one of 14 sub-40% nights... The 37.4% effort vs. Washington on Dec. 26 marked the first time Minnesota has won with a sub-40% night since Mar. 19, 2008 vs. Memphis... The Wolves currently rank 25th in FG accuracy (44.7%) and 21st in scoring (98.1 ppg); they were 29th (44.1%) and 21st (97.8 ppg) last year...

**AT THE OTHER END:** Phoenix exploded for 152 points on Tuesday, the most ever allowed by the Wolves; they've surrendered 146 twice, most recently at Golden State on Nov. 9... It's just the fifth 150+ performance by an NBA team in a regulation game over the past 15 years; the final 38-point spread equals the fourth-biggest loss ever suffered by Minnesota... The Wolves have allowed 120+ points on 14 occasions, including Dallas' 125-point outburst on Mar. 8, and have lost 11 games by 20+... Phoenix shot 56.1% on Tuesday, the 10th time in 24 games Minnesota has permitted 50%+ and the seventh time this season they've allowed 55% or better... The Wolves have now allowed 45%+ shooting in nine consecutive games, beginning with Oklahoma City's 54.3% outing on Feb. 26... Opponents have also cracked the Century Mark in each of those nine; the Wolves are permitting 116.3 ppg and 49.6% shooting in the past nine... Minnesota limited Miami to 88 points on Feb. 23, their 2nd-best defensive total of the year (87 by Milwaukee, Nov. 6) and the first time they've held an opponent below 100 away from Target Center since the 103-99 win at New Jersey on Dec. 23... Over their last 14 road starts, the Wolves are allowing a combined 50.9% (614-for-1207) while surrendering an average of 115.1 ppg... Minnesota is 29th in scoring defense (107.4 ppg) and 25th in defensive FG percentage (47.7%); they were 22nd (102.7 ppg) and 26th (47.4%) a year ago...

**ALL YOU NEED IS...** Phoenix posted a 47-37 rebounding edge on Tuesday, the second double-figure deficit Minnesota has faced in the past three games; San Antonio piled up a 48-38 advantage last Friday, the Wolves' first 10+ deficit since Feb. 10 vs. Charlotte... They're being outboarded by -8.3 rpg (41.7-50.0) in those three, after racking up margins of 10+ in three of their first March contests (a +8.8 rpg advantage)... The Wolves outrebounded Dallas 54-39 on Mar. 8 and followed up by posting a 53-43 margin vs. Denver two nights later (10th and 11th double-digit advantages of the year)... They outrebounded New York 58-36 on Jan. 31, their third spread of 20+ (56-36 vs. Indiana, Jan. 8; 49-29 vs. New Orleans, Dec. 9)... The Wolves collected 65 rebounds in the triple-OT game at Houston on Jan. 15, tying the franchise single-game record set vs. Philadelphia on Feb. 3, 1991 (double-OT)... Minnesota ranks 12th in the NBA in offensive rebound percentage (.272) and 13th in total rebound percentage (.506), having crested at 7th and 7th, respectively, in January... Minnesota is 4th in the NBA in second-chance points (14.5 ppg); they finished 3rd in that category last year (14.6 ppg)...

**TURNOVER TROUBLE:** Dallas converted 26 Timberwolves miscues into 32 points on Mar. 8, while committing just nine TOs of its own (leading to eight Minnesota points)... Over their past eight games, the Wolves are facing a -12.0 ppg deficit (11.4-23.4) in points off turnovers... They're averaging 17.5 TOs in those eight, while forcing only 10.5 per night (including a season-low seven at Phoenix)... The Wolves committed 28 turnovers Nov. 9 at Golden State, one short of the franchise single-game record; they coughed it up 29 times at New Jersey on Nov. 4, 2002... Meanwhile, the Warriors' 22 steals on Nov. 9 mark the highest total in an NBA game in over 12 years, since Atlanta swiped 23 at Philadelphia on Apr. 9, 1997... The Wolves collected 15 steals Oct. 28 vs. New Jersey, the 15th time in club history they've come up with 15+; the franchise single-game mark is 17, set most recently at New Jersey on Mar. 24, 2000... Minnesota ranks 14th in steals (7.28 spg); however, they're last in both blocked shots (3.56 bpg) and turnovers (16.3 per game)...

**LONG-RANGE PLANS:** New York finished 17-for-40 from beyond the arc on Jan. 26, equaling the highest total of three-pointers ever allowed by Minnesota (Golden State, Apr. 12, 1995); Orlando hit 15-for-37 on New Year's Day, while Indiana finished 16-for-32 a week later (Jan. 8)... The Knicks' 40 attempts are also the most ever by a Wolves opponent... Minnesota has allowed 10+ three-pointers on 20 occasions (including Phoenix' 15-for-31 effort on Tuesday), permitting a league-leading average of 7.54 treys per night (6th-highest average in NBA history)... The Wolves sank a season-high 12 treys (in 22 attempts) Feb. 5 at Dallas, and hit a season-best 60.0% (9-for-15) from beyond the arc Sunday at Sacramento... They're allowing a combined 36.4% (ranking 24th), but have cut that to 33.8% (88-for-260) over the last 13; offensively, the Wolves stand 23rd in three-point accuracy (33.9%)...

**NO FREE LUNCH:** The Wolves finished 33-for-45 from the line Jan. 8 vs. Indiana, their busiest night in nearly four years (since a 40-for-51 outing vs. New York on Mar. 26, 2006) and just the third time in 10 years they've attempted 45+... Minnesota has seen its FT frequency rise to 28.0 attempts per game in seven March starts, after averaging just 20.4 trips last month... Toronto's 40-for-48 effort on Dec. 8 marks the most prolific night by a Wolves opponent in nearly 10 years (since Phoenix went 43-for-49 on Mar. 14, 2000) and just the 9th time an opponent has converted 40+ FTs... Minnesota sank all 18 of its FT attempts Nov. 21 at Portland, the 17th perfect night in franchise annals; the club record for most FTs made without a miss is 24 (at Phoenix, Apr. 5, 2003)... They rank 22nd in FT accuracy (74.2%) and 24th in FTs attempted (23.4 per game); a year ago, Minnesota ended 15th (76.9%) and 19th (23.9 per game)...
