Last Game: Sunday, Apr. 4 – Oklahoma City 116, Minnesota 108

Kevin Durant scored half of his 40 points in the opening quarter, and Russell Westbrook handed out a career-high 16 assists as Oklahoma City dealt the Timberwolves a 116-108 setback on Sunday night at the Ford Center. Back-to-back 3-pointers from Thabo Sefolosha and Jeff Green broke a 16-16 tie, and Durant tallied the Thunder's final eight points for a 43-25 lead after one. The margin hovered between 16 and 25 throughout the second period, ending with Oklahoma City on top 72-50 on a late Westbrook basket. Ryan Gomes had nine points during a 13-2 Minnesota rally that cut the deficit to nine midway through the third, and Jonny Flynn's buzzer-beating trey kept the Wolves within 90-81 entering the fourth quarter. Al Jefferson converted a three-point play as Minnesota cut it to 100-93 with 6:01 to play, but Durant and Krstic combined to score the Thunder's next dozen points to fend off the Wolves' comeback bid and complete a sweep of the four-game season series. Green finished with 16 points and 10 rebounds for Oklahoma City, while Flynn and Gomes tallied 22 points apiece for Minnesota and Corey Brewer chipped in 18.

Previous Game: Saturday, Apr. 3 – Miami 97, Minnesota 84

Dwyane Wade scored 39 points and Miami held the Timberwolves scoreless for over five minutes of the third quarter in extending its winning streak to eight games with a 97-84 victory on Saturday night at Target Center. Kevin Love put Minnesota in front 18-11 eight minutes into the contest, but the Heat closed to within two by quarter's end. Dorell Wright's 3-pointer with 4:05 left in the 2nd broke a 38-38 tie, and Wade scored Miami's next eight points to help build a 53-44 halftime cushion. Following an Al Jefferson basket early in the third, the Heat ran off 11 unanswered points and took their largest lead of the night when Wade made it 69-48 at the 5:12 mark. Minnesota missed five shots (and four free throws) while committing four turnovers during the drought. Sasha Pavlovic and Ramon Sessions keyed an 11-2 start to the fourth quarter that brought the Wolves to within six with 9:01 remaining, but Michael Beasley and Wade countered with jumpers and Minnesota could get no closer than seven after that. Udonis Haslem collected 13 points and 17 rebounds for Miami, while Sessions and Jefferson scored 12 points apiece and Love snared 11 rebounds.

Golden State has won nine of the past 12 meetings. The 41-point loss on Nov. 9 equaled the Wolves' biggest setback in franchise history.

First Meeting: Kelenna Azubuike's 31 points led eight double-figure scorers and Stephen Jackson dished a career-high 15 assists as Golden State rolled to a 146-105 victory on Nov. 9 at Oracle Arena. Monta Ellis contributed 18 points and 10 rebounds for the Warriors. Jonny Flynn's 20 points led Minnesota, with Al Jefferson and Sasha Pavlovic adding 18 and 17 points, respectively.

Second Meeting: Corey Maggette contributed 12 of his 28 points in the fourth quarter, and Monta Ellis added 20 points, seven rebounds and six assists as Golden State claimed a 107-101 win over the Timberwolves on Jan. 6 at Target Center. Al Jefferson finished with 26 points and 14 rebounds for Minnesota, with Kevin Love contributing 23 points, 16 rebounds and six assists.

First Meeting: Pau Gasol registered 17 points, a career-high 20 rebounds and seven assists, and Kobe Bryant overcame a broken index finger to score 20 points as L.A. beat the Wolves, 104-92, on Dec. 11 at Staples Center. Minnesota was led by 24 points and 13 rebounds from Al Jefferson, with Ramon Sessions adding 15 points and Kevin Love hauling down a career-high 19 rebounds.

Second Meeting: Kobe Bryant netted 22 points and a season-high 13 assists, and Los Angeles withstood a third-quarter Wolves rally to notch a 104-96 victory on Mar. 19 at Staples Center. Pau Gasol had 17 points and 14 rebounds for the Lakers. Jonny Flynn's 20 points led Minnesota, while Kevin Love (19 points, 11 rebounds) and Darko Milicic (16, 12) collected double-doubles.

DOUBLE-DOUBLE DUO: Wolves center Al Jefferson hauled down a franchise-record 26 rebounds in the triple-OT loss at Houston on Jan. 13, part of his fifth career 20/20 effort. His 23 defensive rebounds are the most by any NBA player since Kevin Garnett grabbed 23 for Minnesota vs. Orlando on Jan. 12, 2005. Jefferson also becomes just the ninth player in the past 15 years to collect 25+ points and 25+ rebounds in the same game. Meanwhile, *forward Kevin Love totaled 23 points and a career-high 22 rebounds Mar. 28 vs. Phoenix*, becoming the first NBA player in 12 years to register a 20+ point/20+ rebound night off the bench:

JEFFERSON, LOVE TO DON RED, WHITE & BLUE: USA Basketball announced on Feb. 10 that forwards Al Jefferson and Kevin Love are among 27 NBA players named to the 2010-2012 Men's National Team Program. Players from the program will be selected to represent the United States in international basketball competitions over the next three summers, including the 2010 FIBA World Championships in Turkey and the 2012 Summer Olympics in London. The Timberwolves are one of six teams to place two players on the preliminary roster, along with Denver (Carmelo Anthony, Chauncey Billups), the L.A. Lakers (Kobe Bryant, Lamar Odom), Memphis (Rudy Gay, O.J. Mayo), Oklahoma City (Kevin Durant, Russell Westbrook) and Utah (Carlos Boozer, Deron Williams).

SOMETHING'S BREWING: Corey Brewer went 0-for-3 from beyond the arc Mar. 19 at the Lakers, halting his club-record string of consecutive games with a made three-pointer at 33. Isaiah Rider held the previous mark with 21 (set Dec. 20, 1994-Feb. 3, 1995), which Brewer surpassed in the Feb. 23 victory at Miami. He shot 41.8% (59-for-141) from long distance during the streak; 19 of those featured two or more treys, including a 4-for-5 performance at New York on Jan. 26. The NBA's longest such streak this season belongs to Houston guard Aaron Brooks, whose 39-game run also came to an end on Mar. 19 (vs. Boston).

WOLF TRACKS: Oklahoma City finished off a sweep of its four-game season series by holding off the Wolves, 116-108, on Sunday; the Thunder have now beaten Minnesota in 12 of their past 15 overall, dating back to their time in Seattle... Miami extended its winning streak to eight games by dealing the Wolves a 97-84 loss on Saturday, gaining a split of the season set after Minnesota had notched a 91-88 victory on Feb. 23 in Florida... The Wolves snapped their club-record-tying 16-game losing streak with last Wednesday's 108-99 victory over Sacramento; the Kings become the third team Minnesota has beaten twice this season, joining New Jersey and Utah... The victory was Minnesota's first since the Feb. 23 triumph at Miami, and the first at Target Center since handing Memphis a 109-102 setback on Feb. 6 (ending a 10-game skid)... It also permitted the Wolves to avoid their first winless month in club history (finishing March at 1-13)... They began the three-game homestand with a 111-105 loss to Phoenix on Mar. 28; the Suns completed a sweep of the four-game season set... The Phoenix defeat was Minnesota's 60th of the season; it's their second 60-loss campaign in the past three (22-60 in 2007-08) and the seventh in franchise history... Orlando claimed a 106-97 victory on Mar. 26 at Amway Arena; the two-game East Coast trip began with a 108-95 loss on Mar. 24 in Charlotte... Toronto handed the Wolves a 106-100 defeat on Mar. 22; Minnesota had completed a winless four-game West Coast trip with the 104-96 loss to the Lakers on Mar. 19...

SCHEDULE NOTES: Sunday's game concluded Northwest Division play for the season; the Wolves ended up 3-13 against division rivals, matching last year's record... Sunday's loss also wrapped up the 19th of 20 sets of back-to-backs for the Wolves this season; the final one begins Sunday in New Orleans... Minnesota is 3-16 on the tail end of back-to-backs, defeating Utah (Dec. 5), New Jersey (Dec. 23) and Memphis (Feb. 6); they finished 6-16 a year ago... The Mar. 26 loss at Orlando was the Wolves' final road game vs. the East for 2009-10; they have one left at home (Apr. 14 vs. Detroit)... The Mar. 28 loss to Phoenix ended a five-week grind that saw Minnesota play 19 of 20 vs. teams with .500+ records, a run that began Feb. 19 vs. Chicago... The Feb. 27 game vs. Portland rounded out their third (and final) four-games-in-five-nights set that began with the Feb. 23 win in Miami... The 117-108 victory in Dallas on Feb. 5 ended a nine-game road losing streak, dating to the victory at New Jersey (the current drought has reached 10 games)...

THE IRON RANGE: Minnesota hit 56.1% in last Wednesday's win over Sacramento, its 2nd-best percentage this year and 14th 50+% effort; the Wolves shot a season-high 57.1% vs. Utah on Dec. 5... Minnesota's 53.2% outing on Mar. 3 in Dallas marked its highest percentage in a loss since shooting 56.1% on Mar. 21, 2008 at Indiana... The Wolves shot 55.6% Feb. 6 vs. Memphis, their 3rd-best percentage of the season and their franchise-record fourth straight 50%+ game (53.0% on Feb. 5 at Dallas, 50.0% on Jan. 31 vs. New York, 52.4% on Jan. 29 vs. the Clippers)... Minnesota had shot 45% or better in 13 straight home games (a combined 48.0%) prior to the 38.9% showing vs. Denver on Mar. 10... They hit a season-low 32.6% vs. Dallas on Nov. 13, one of 15 sub-40% nights; however, they've finished shy of 40% only three times in the last 30 games, most recently a 39.4% effort Mar. 28 vs. Phoenix... The 37.4% effort vs. Washington on Dec. 26 marked the first time Minnesota has won with a sub-40% night since Mar. 19, 2008 vs. Memphis... The Wolves rank 24th in FG accuracy (44.8%) and 21st in scoring (98.2 ppg); they were 29th (44.1%) and 21st (97.8 ppg) last year...

AT THE OTHER END: The Wolves limited Sacramento to 99 points last Wednesday, ending a streak of 15 consecutive games in which they'd allowed 100+; Minnesota permitted 113.6 ppg and 49.3% shooting in those 15... Minnesota held Miami to 88 points on Feb. 23, their 2nd-best defensive total of the year (87 by Milwaukee, Nov. 6) and the first time they'd kept a team below 100 away from Target Center since the 103-99 victory at New Jersey on Dec. 23... Phoenix exploded for 152 points on Mar. 16, the most ever allowed by the Wolves; they've surrendered 146 twice, most recently at Golden State on Nov. 9... The final 38-point spread at Phoenix equals the fourth-biggest loss ever suffered by Minnesota... The Wolves have allowed 120+ on 15 occasions, including Utah's 122-point flurry on Mar. 17, and have lost 12 games by 20+ points... Oklahoma City finished at 50.5% on Sunday, the 14th time in 33 starts the Wolves have given up 50%+; seven of those have been 55%+ (including Phoenix' 56.1% effort on Mar. 16)... Minnesota is 29th in scoring defense (107.5 ppg) and 26th in defensive FG percentage (47.8%); they ranked 22nd (102.7 ppg) and 26th (47.4%) a year ago...

ALL YOU NEED IS...: Oklahoma City racked up a 48-34 rebounding edge on Sunday, one night after the Wolves had faced a 48-38 deficit vs. Miami... Minnesota closed March with back-to-back double-digit board advantages (46-33 vs. Sacramento last Wednesday, 58-41 vs. Phoenix on Mar. 28), their 12th and 13th such efforts this season... Entering the Phoenix game, the Wolves had faced double-digit deficits in five of their prior eight starts; they were outboarded by -8.0 rpg (39.3-47.3) in those eight, after racking up margins of 10+ in three of their first four March outings... Minnesota outrebounded New York 58-36 on Jan. 31, their third spread of 20+ (56-36 vs. Indiana, Jan. 8; 49-29 vs. New Orleans, Dec. 9)... The Wolves collected 65 rebounds in the triple-OT game at Houston on Jan. 15, tying the franchise single-game record set vs. Philadelphia on Feb. 3, 1991 (double-OT)... Minnesota ranks 13th in the NBA in offensive rebound percentage (.269) and 18th in total rebound percentage (.503), having crested at 7th and 7th, respectively, in January... Minnesota ranks 4th in the NBA in second-chance points (14.4 ppg); they finished 3rd in that category last year (14.6 ppg)...

TURNOVER TROUBLE: Dallas converted 26 Timberwolves miscues into 32 points on Mar. 8, while committing just nine TOs of its own (leading to eight Minnesota points)... Over their past 17 starts, the Wolves are facing an -7.8 ppg deficit (13.4-21.2) in points off TOs... They're averaging 16.5 TOs in those 17, while forcing just 12.6 per contest (including a season-low seven Mar. 16 at Phoenix)... The Wolves committed 28 turnovers Nov. 9 at Golden State, one short of the franchise single-game record; they coughed it up 29 times at New Jersey on Nov. 4, 2002... Meanwhile, the Warriors' 22 steals on Nov. 9 mark the highest total in an NBA game in over 12 years, since Atlanta swiped 23 at Philadelphia on Apr. 9, 1997... The Wolves collected 15 steals Oct. 28 vs. New Jersey, the 15th time in club history they've come up with 15+; the franchise single-game mark is 17, set most recently at New Jersey on Mar. 24, 2000... Minnesota is 12th in steals (7.31 spg); they're 29th in blocked shots (3.73 bpg), but had a season-high 10 blocks Mar. 31 vs. Sacramento...

LONG-RANGE PLANS: New York finished 17-for-40 from beyond the arc on Jan. 26, equaling the highest total of three-pointers ever allowed by Minnesota (Golden State, Apr. 12, 1995); Orlando hit 15-for-37 on New Year's Day, while Indiana finished 16-for-32 a week later (Jan. 8)... The Knicks' 40 attempts are also the most ever by a Wolves opponent... Minnesota has allowed 10+ three-pointers on 22 occasions (most recently Phoenix' 10-for-27 effort on Mar. 28), permitting a league-leading average of 7.55 treys per night (6th-highest average in NBA history)... The Wolves sank a season-high 12 treys (in 22 attempts) Feb. 5 at Dallas, and hit a season-best 60.0% (9-for-15) from beyond the arc Mar. 14 at Sacramento... They're allowing a combined 36.4% (ranking 25th), including 42.0% (50-for-119) over the last six games; offensively, the Wolves have risen to 25th in three-point accuracy (33.8%)...

NO FREE LUNCH: The Wolves were 33-for-45 from the line Jan. 8 vs. Indiana, their busiest night in nearly four years (since a 40-for-51 outing vs. New York on Mar. 26, 2006) and just the third time in 10 years they've attempted 45+... Minnesota saw its FT frequency rise to 24.9 attempts per game in 14 March starts, after averaging just 20.4 trips in February... Toronto's 40-for-48 effort on Dec. 8 marks the most prolific night by a Wolves opponent in nearly 10 years (since Phoenix went 43-for-49 on Mar. 14, 2000) and just the 9th time an opponent has converted 40+ FTs... Minnesota sank all 18 of its FT attempts Nov. 21 at Portland, the 17th perfect night in franchise annals; the club record for most FTs made without a miss is 24 (at Phoenix, Apr. 5, 2003)... They rank 22nd in FT accuracy (74.4%) and 23rd in FTs attempted (23.4 per game); a year ago, Minnesota ended 15th (76.9%) and 19th (23.9 per game)...

WRITING IN THE MARGINS: The Jan. 29 win over the Clippers marked the second game this year in which the Wolves never trailed (also Dec. 18 vs. Sacramento), while their 23-point, 3rd-quarter lead represents the biggest they've enjoyed at any point this season... New York jumped to a 15-0 lead on Jan. 26, the most consecutive points allowed by the Wolves to start a game... Meanwhile, the Kings ran off 23 unanswered points on Mar. 14 (from 56-49 in the late second to 79-49 in the mid-third quarter), the longest such string ever by a Minnesota opponent; Charlotte put together a 20-0 second-quarter blitz (from 34-43 to 54-43) on Mar. 24... The 112-109 loss at Dallas on Mar. 3 dropped Minnesota's record to 3-9 in one-possession games (decided by three points or less); they finished 6-8 a year ago... The Jan. 18 home win vs. Philadelphia was Minnesota's second overtime game in six days and 100th all-time (44 wins, 56 losses)... Houston beat the Wolves 120-114 on Jan. 13 at the Toyota Center, the first triple-overtime game in franchise history...
