**Last Game: Sunday, Apr. 11 – New Orleans 114, Minnesota 86**

Emeka Okafor scored 23 points and Marcus Thornton added 22 as New Orleans rolled to a 114-86 victory over the Timberwolves on Sunday night at the New Orleans Arena. Ryan Gomes put Minnesota in front 17-11 with 5:00 left in the opening quarter, but Okafor's three-point play started a 10-0 counter and the Hornets led 25-21 after 12 minutes. Wolves coach Kurt Rambis was ejected in the midst of another 10-0 burst early in the second that built the margin to 12. New Orleans then scored the final 11 points of the half, triggered by James Posey's 3-pointer, to boost its lead to 58-39. Minnesota was held without a basket for over four minutes of the third quarter, and the Hornets took their biggest lead of the night when Okafor made it 74-46 at the 4:48 mark. The Wolves managed to cut that down to 18 early in the fourth period before another Posey trey started things back in the opposite direction as Minnesota went on to suffer its 1000th regular-season loss. Darren Collison totaled 17 points and 11 assists for New Orleans, while David West pulled in 12 rebounds. The Wolves were led by 18 points from Ryan Gomes and 17 from Ramon Sessions.

**Previous Game: Friday, Apr. 9 – L.A. Lakers 97, Minnesota 88**

Pau Gasol contributed 29 points and 15 rebounds, and Los Angeles built an 18-point halftime lead before hanging on to defeat the Timberwolves, 97-88, on Friday night at Target Center. Consecutive 3-pointers from Ron Artest and Shannon Brown keyed a 13-2 Lakers surge in the first quarter, and L.A. closed out the first half with eight unanswered points to open a 52-34 lead. Minnesota cut that deficit in half by scoring the first nine points after intermission, capped by Darko Milicic's tip-in. Jonny Flynn sank his fifth trey of the game to get the Wolves within 62-55 at the 4:31 mark, and Milicic converted a three-point play to keep the margin in single digits entering the fourth. Minnesota held the Lakers scoreless for nearly four minutes and Milicic teamed up with Ramon Sessions on an 8-0 rally that made it 84-80 with 5:14 left. A costly turnover at the 2:04 mark prevented the Wolves from getting closer than four as L.A. scored on its final four possessions to secure the Western Conference's top playoff seed. Flynn's 19 points led Minnesota, while Kevin Love hauled down 18 rebounds and Milicic added 13 points, nine boards and five assists.

**First Meeting:** Richard Jefferson scored 24 points and Manu Ginobili finished one rebound short of a triple-double as San Antonio posted a 117-99 win on Dec. 29 at the AT&T Center. Tim Duncan had 17 points and 10 boards for the Spurs, while Ginobili tacked on 14 points, 10 assists and nine rebounds. Al Jefferson's 20 points led Minnesota, with Kevin Love adding 18 points and 12 boards.

**Second Meeting:** George Hill and Richard Jefferson scored 19 points apiece and San Antonio beat the Timberwolves for the 11th straight time with a 103-85 victory on Mar. 12 at Target Center. Wayne Ellington's season-high 17 points topped Minnesota, which suffered its eighth consecutive home loss, while Al Jefferson added 13 points and nine rebounds.

**DOUBLE-DOUBLE DUO:** Wolves center Al Jefferson hauled down a franchise-record 26 rebounds in the triple-OT loss at Houston on Jan. 13, part of his fifth career 20/20 effort. His 23 defensive rebounds are the most by any NBA player since Kevin Garnett grabbed 23 for Minnesota vs. Orlando on Jan. 12, 2005. Jefferson also becomes just the ninth player in the past 15 years to collect 25+ points and 25+ rebounds in the same game. Meanwhile, *forward Kevin Love totaled 23 points and a career-high 22 rebounds Mar. 28 vs. Phoenix*, becoming the first NBA player in 12 years to register a 20+ point/20+ rebound night off the bench:

**SOMETHING'S BREWING:** Corey Brewer went 0-for-3 from beyond the arc Mar. 19 at the Lakers, halting his club-record string of consecutive games with a made three-pointer at 33. Isaiah Rider held the previous mark with 21 (set Dec. 20, 1994-Feb. 3, 1995), which Brewer surpassed in the Feb. 23 victory at Miami. He shot 41.8% (59-for-141) from long distance during the streak; 19 of those featured two or more treys, including a 4-for-5 performance at New York on Jan. 26. The NBA's longest such streak this season belongs to Houston guard Aaron Brooks, whose 39-game run also came to an end on Mar. 19 (vs. Boston).

**JEFFERSON, LOVE TO DON RED, WHITE & BLUE:** USA Basketball announced on Feb. 10 that forwards Al Jefferson and Kevin Love are among 27 NBA players named to the 2010-2012 Men's National Team Program. Players from the program will be selected to represent the United States in international basketball competitions over the next three summers, including the 2010 FIBA World Championships in Turkey and the 2012 Summer Olympics in London. The Timberwolves are one of six teams to place two players on the preliminary roster, along with Denver (Carmelo Anthony, Chauncey Billups), the L.A. Lakers (Kobe Bryant, Lamar Odom), Memphis (Rudy Gay, O.J. Mayo), Oklahoma City (Kevin Durant, Russell Westbrook) and Utah (Carlos Boozer, Deron Williams).

**WOLF TRACKS:** New Orleans extended the Wolves' current losing streak to five games with Sunday's 114-86 decision... The loss was the 1000th regular-season defeat in franchise history for Minnesota; they've now lost 21 of 22 overall, and are 2-27 since the Feb. 6 triumph over Memphis that capped a season-best four-game winning streak... The Lakers completed a sweep of their three-game season set with Minnesota by notching a 97-88 victory on Friday... Golden State presented Don Nelson with his NBA-record 1333rd coaching victory by beating the Wolves, 116-107, last Wednesday at Target Center, sweeping the three-game season set... Oklahoma City finished off a sweep of its four-game series by holding off Minnesota, 116-108, on Apr. 4... Miami dealt the Wolves a 97-84 loss on Apr. 3, gaining a split after Minnesota had notched a 91-88 victory on Feb. 23 in Florida... The Wolves snapped their club-record-tying 16-game losing streak with the 108-99 victory over Sacramento on Mar. 31; the Kings become the third team Minnesota has beaten twice this season, joining New Jersey and Utah... The victory was Minnesota's first since the Feb. 23 triumph at Miami, and the first at Target Center since handing Memphis a 109-102 setback on Feb. 6 (ending a 10-game skid)... It also permitted the Wolves to avoid their first winless month in franchise history (finishing March at 1-13)... Minnesota began the homestand with a 111-105 loss to Phoenix on Mar. 28; that defeat was the Wolves' 60th of the season, their second 60-loss campaign in the past three (22-60 in 2007-08) and the seventh total... Minnesota needs one win to avoid tying the lowest single-season total in club history (15-67 in 1991-92)...



**SCHEDULE NOTES:** Tonight's game wraps up the last of 20 sets of back-to-backs for the Wolves this season... Minnesota is 3-16 on the tail end of back-to-backs, defeating Utah (Dec. 5), New Jersey (Dec. 23) and Memphis (Feb. 6); they finished 6-16 a year ago... The Apr. 4 game at Oklahoma City concluded Northwest Division play for the season; the Wolves ended up 3-13 vs. division rivals, matching last year's record... Meanwhile, the Mar. 26 setback at Orlando was the Wolves' final road game vs. the East for 2009-10; they have one left at home (Wednesday vs. Detroit)... The Mar. 28 loss to Phoenix ended a five-week grind that saw Minnesota play 19 of 20 vs. teams with .500+ records, a string that began Feb. 19 vs. Chicago... The Feb. 27 game vs. Portland rounded out their third (and final) four-games-in-five-nights set that began with the Feb. 23 win in Miami... The 117-108 victory in Dallas on Feb. 5 snapped a nine-game road losing streak, dating to the win at New Jersey (the current drought has reached 11 games)...

**THE IRON RANGE:** Minnesota hit 56.1% in the Mar. 31 victory over Sacramento, its 2nd-best percentage this season and 14th 50+% effort; the Wolves shot a season-high 57.1% vs. Utah on Dec. 5... Minnesota's 53.2% outing on Mar. 3 in Dallas marked its highest percentage in a loss since shooting 56.1% on Mar. 21, 2008 at Indiana... The Wolves shot 55.6% Feb. 6 vs. Memphis, their 3rd-best percentage of the season and their franchise-record fourth straight 50%+ game (53.0% on Feb. 5 at Dallas, 50.0% on Jan. 31 vs. New York, 52.4% on Jan. 29 vs. the Clippers)... Minnesota had shot 45% or better in 13 straight home games (a combined 48.0%) prior to the 38.9% showing vs. Denver on Mar. 10... They hit a season-low 32.6% vs. Dallas on Nov. 13, one of 15 sub-40% nights; however, they've finished shy of 40% only four times in the last 33 games, most recently a 39.4% outing Sunday in New Orleans... The 37.4% effort vs. Washington on Dec. 26 marked the first time Minnesota has won with a sub-40% night since Mar. 19, 2008 vs. Memphis... The Wolves rank 25th in FG accuracy (44.8%) and 20th in scoring (98.0 ppg); they were 29th (44.1%) and 21st (97.8 ppg) last year...

**AT THE OTHER END:** The Wolves limited Sacramento to 99 points on Mar. 31, ending a streak of 15 consecutive games in which they'd allowed 100+; Minnesota permitted 113.6 ppg and 49.3% shooting in those 15... The Wolves held Miami to 88 points on Feb. 23, their 2nd-best defensive total of the year (87 by Milwaukee, Nov. 6) and the first time they'd kept a team below 100 away from Target Center since the 103-99 victory at New Jersey on Dec. 23... Phoenix exploded for 152 points on Mar. 16, the most ever allowed by the Wolves; they've surrendered 146 twice, most recently at Golden State on Nov. 9... The final 38-point spread at Phoenix equals the fourth-biggest loss ever suffered by Minnesota... The Wolves have allowed 120+ on 15 occasions, including Utah's 122-point flurry on Mar. 17, and have lost 13 games by 20+ points... New Orleans hit 52.4% on Sunday, the 16th time in 36 starts the Wolves have given up 50%+; eight of those have been 55%+ (including Golden State's 56.1% effort last Wednesday)... Minnesota ranks 29th in scoring defense (107.5 ppg) and 26th in defensive FG percentage (47.9%); they ranked 22nd (102.7 ppg) and 26th (47.4%) a year ago...

**ALL YOU NEED IS...:** New Orleans racked up a 49-30 rebounding edge on Sunday, the largest deficit Minnesota has faced this year (8th double-digit spread in the last 15 games, 16th overall)... They've been outboarded in all five April starts thus far, facing an average deficit of -9.4 rpg (36.6-46.0) in that span... Minnesota had closed March with back-to-back double-digit board advantages (46-33 vs. Sacramento on Mar. 31, 58-41 vs. Phoenix on Mar. 28), their 12th and 13th such efforts this season... Minnesota outrebounded New York 58-36 on Jan. 31, their third spread of 20+... The Wolves collected 65 rebounds in the triple-OT game at Houston on Jan. 15, tying the franchise single-game record set vs. Philadelphia on Feb. 3, 1991 (double-OT)... Minnesota is 15th in the NBA in offensive rebound percentage (.267) and 19th in total rebound percentage (.502), having crested at 7th and 7th, respectively, in January... Minnesota ranks 4th in the NBA in second-chance points (14.4 ppg); they finished 3rd in that category last year (14.6 ppg)...

**TURNOVER TROUBLE:** Dallas converted 26 Timberwolves miscues into 32 points on Mar. 8, while committing just nine TOs of its own (leading to eight Minnesota points)... Over their past 20 starts, the Wolves are facing a -6.8 ppg deficit (13.9-20.7) in points off TOs... They're averaging 16.6 TOs in those 20, while forcing just 13.2 per contest (including a season-low seven Mar. 16 at Phoenix)... The Wolves committed 28 turnovers Nov. 9 at Golden State, one short of the franchise single-game record; they coughed it up 29 times at New Jersey on Nov. 4, 2002... Meanwhile, the Warriors' 22 steals on Nov. 9 mark the highest total in an NBA game in over 12 years, since Atlanta swiped 23 at Philadelphia on Apr. 9, 1997... The Wolves collected 15 steals Oct. 28 vs. New Jersey, the 15th time in club history they've come up with 15+; the franchise single-game mark is 17, set most recently at New Jersey on Mar. 24, 2000... Minnesota is 13th in steals (7.31 spg); they're 29th in blocked shots (3.69 bpg), but had a season-high 10 blocks Mar. 31 vs. Sacramento...

**LONG-RANGE PLANS:** New York finished 17-for-40 from beyond the arc on Jan. 26, equaling the highest total of three-pointers ever allowed by Minnesota (Golden State, Apr. 12, 1995); Orlando hit 15-for-37 on New Year's Day, while Indiana finished 16-for-32 a week later (Jan. 8)... The Knicks' 40 attempts are also the most ever by a Wolves opponent... Minnesota has allowed 10+ three-pointers on 22 occasions (most recently Phoenix' 10-for-27 effort on Mar. 28), permitting a league-leading average of 7.50 treys per night (6th-highest average in NBA history)... The Wolves sank a season-high 12 treys (in 22 attempts) Feb. 5 at Dallas, and hit a season-best 60.0% (9-for-15) from beyond the arc Mar. 14 at Sacramento... They're allowing a combined 36.4% (ranking 25th), including 40.1% (69-for-172) over the last nine games; offensively, the Wolves have risen to 25th in three-point accuracy (33.9%)...

**NO FREE LUNCH:** The Wolves were 33-for-45 from the line Jan. 8 vs. Indiana, their busiest night in nearly four years (since a 40-for-51 outing vs. New York on Mar. 26, 2006) and just the third time in 10 years they've attempted 45+... Minnesota saw its FT frequency rise to 24.9 attempts per game in 14 March starts, after averaging just 20.4 trips in February... Toronto's 40-for-48 effort on Dec. 8 marks the most prolific night by a Wolves opponent in nearly 10 years (since Phoenix went 43-for-49 on Mar. 14, 2000) and just the 9th time an opponent has converted 40+ FTs... Minnesota sank all 18 of its FT attempts Nov. 21 at Portland, the 17th perfect night in franchise annals; the club record for most FTs made without a miss is 24 (at Phoenix, Apr. 5, 2003)... They rank 22nd in FT accuracy (74.4%) and 22nd in FTs attempted (23.4 per game); a year ago, Minnesota ended 15th (76.9%) and 19th (23.9 per game)...
