**Last Game: Sunday, Nov. 8 – Portland 116, Minnesota 93**

Andre Miller tallied 21 points and LaMarcus Aldridge added 17 of his 19 in the first half as Portland cruised to a 116-93 victory over the Timberwolves on Sunday night at the Rose Garden. The Blazers shot 68 percent in the opening quarter to build a 33-24 lead, and reeled off six unanswered points to swell the margin to 15 early in the second. Back-to-back 3-pointers from Jonny Flynn and Corey Brewer briefly stalled Portland's momentum, but Aldridge's jumper made it 60-41 with 1:51 to play in the half and the Wolves could get no closer than 13 after intermission. The Blazers outscored Minnesota 14-4 over the final 2:25 of the third quarter, highlighted by 3-pointers from Travis Outlaw and Martell Webster, and took their biggest lead of the night with another Outlaw trey hiked it to 102-74 with 6:10 left. The game marked the first of three meetings between Portland and Minnesota in a two-week stretch, with the Blazers slated for a Target Center visit on Wednesday. Joel Przybilla had 13 rebounds and Outlaw chipped in 19 points for Portland, while the Wolves were topped by Nathan Jawai's career-high 16 points and 15 from Ryan Gomes.

**Previous Game: Friday, Nov. 6 – Milwaukee 87, Minnesota 72**

Andrew Bogut tallied 17 points and 10 rebounds, and Milwaukee used a big third quarter to pull away from the Timberwolves, 87-72, on Friday night at Target Center. Minnesota held the Bucks to just one basket over a five-minute span in building a 24-16 lead after one quarter, but opened the second period without a field goal for more than six minutes themselves. Ersan Ilyasova's late 3-pointer pulled Milwaukee to within five by halftime, and Hakim Warrick converted a three-point play to give the Bucks their first lead of the night at 42-41 early in the third. Warrick had 11 points in the quarter and Luke Ridnour capped a 9-0 run that stretched Milwaukee's advantage to 64-52 entering the fourth. The margin reached 17 before Jonny Flynn sparked a rally that got the Wolves as close as 77-67 with 4:27 left, but consecutive baskets from Bogut and Ridnour snuffed the comeback bid as the Bucks won for just the second time in their past 11 visits to Minnesota. Ridnour finished with 16 points and Warrick chipped in 12 with seven rebounds for Milwaukee, while the Wolves were topped by Flynn's 20 points and 13 from Corey Brewer.

**CRUNCH TIME:** Minnesota outscored New Jersey 24-6 in the game's final 6:39 on Opening Night, holding the Nets to 1-for-9 from the floor in that span while creating five turnovers and posting a 9-4 rebounding edge. **WOLF TRACKS:** The Blazers handed Minnesota its sixth consecutive loss with Sunday's 116-93 decision at the Rose Garden, beating the Wolves for the ninth straight time overall and eighth in a row in Portland... *It was the first of three November meetings between the clubs;* they'll square off again Wednesday at Target Center, while Minnesota makes a return visit to Oregon on Nov. 21... Milwaukee claimed an 87-72 triumph last Friday, the 2nd-biggest margin ever for the Bucks vs. Minnesota (111-93 on Nov. 3, 1990) and just the second victory in their past 11 trips to Target Center... The 72 points represent the Wolves' lowest total since a 93-70 home loss to Cleveland last Dec. 17, *and ties the 9th-lowest output in franchise history.* Minnesota kicked off its two-game homestand with last Wednesday's 92-90 loss to Boston; the Wolves shot a season-high 52.0% in that game... Minnesota slips to 1-2 in one-possession games (decided by three or less), having suffered a 93-90 loss to the Clippers on Nov. 2 at Staples Center; a year ago, the Wolves finished 6-8 in one-possession contests... Tonight's contest wraps up the second of 20 sets of back-to-back outings scheduled in 2009-10, *as well as the second of three separate trips to the West Coast this month for the Wolves.*

**WITHOUT LOVE:** Portland outboarded the Wolves 49-39 on Sunday, Minnesota's second consecutive double-figure deficit; they faced a 51-38 disadvantage Friday vs. Milwaukee, after outrebounding Boston 40-36 last Wednesday... Overall, the Wolves stand 9th in the NBA in offensive rebound percentage (.272) as well as 21st in total rebound percentage (.490)... Meanwhile, Minnesota swiped 15 steals Oct. 28 vs. New Jersey, the 15th time in club history (and just second in the past six years) they've come up with 15+; the club single-game record is 17, set most recently at New Jersey on Mar. 24, 2000... *The Wolves currently rank 3rd in steals (8.86 spg), behind only the L.A. Lakers (10.14) and Boston (10.00);* however, they're last in the NBA in blocked shots (3.29 bpg)...

**THE CASE OF THE DISAPPEARING FREE THROWS:** Minnesota went 12-for-21 (a season-low 57.1%) from the line in Sunday's loss at Portland, with the Blazers finishing 27-for-30... Since compiling a 26-for-35 effort in the Opening Night victory over New Jersey, the Wolves are converting an average of just 12.5 free throws per game (while attempting 17.7 per contest) during their current six-game drought... Overall, *Minnesota is receiving 15.8% of its scoring (101 of 639) from free throws during the regular season* (ranking 27th; league average is currently 19.5%)... That figure was an NBA-leading 29.8% (240 of 805) in eight preseason outings... The Wolves are 23rd in FT accuracy (71.6%) and 27th in FTs attempted (20.1 per game); a year ago, they ranked 15th and 19th, respectively...

**ABOVE & BEYOND:** New Jersey and Minnesota combined to shoot just 1-for-15 from beyond the arc on Oct. 28, with Brian Cardinal (7:10, 3rd) providing the only made trey... *That marks the fewest three-pointers made in an NBA game in nearly four years,* since Denver (1-for-6) beat New Orleans (0-for-13) on Nov. 16, 2005... Meanwhile, Phoenix finished 14-for-26 on Nov. 1, equaling the 6th-highest total of three-pointers ever allowed by Minnesota; the Suns have also authored two of the top five (16, Mar. 20, 2007; 15, Jan. 29, 2007)... Through the season's first two weeks, *the Wolves rank 27th in three-point accuracy (29.3%) and 28th in treys made (3.43 per game).* They're allowing the opposition to convert 37.9% from beyond the arc, good for 19th in the NBA...

**OPENING ACT:** The Wolves began the 2009-10 regular season by slipping past New Jersey, 95-93, on Oct. 28... New Jersey built a 19-point lead (72-53) midway through the third period before Minnesota rallied; *it's the 8th-biggest comeback in franchise history,* and the largest 2nd-half deficit the Wolves have overcome since spotting Dallas a 24-point advantage before roaring back to win 113-110 in overtime on Jan. 17, 1998 at Reunion Arena... They've now won 14 of their past 15 home openers, having a 12-game winning streak in that category snapped with a 99-91 loss to Denver on Nov. 2, 2007... All-time, Minnesota improves to 13-8 on Opening Night, *having started 12 of the past 14 seasons with wins* (also losing 100-95 in 1999 vs. Sacramento in Tokyo); they're 15-6 in home openers...

Minnesota finished with a 3-5 record, having also bested Milwaukee (117-103) on Oct. 4 in Mankato; the triumph at Detroit halted a five-game skid... Denver handed Minnesota its biggest loss of the preseason (129-100) on Oct. 20 at the Pepsi Center; the Wolves kicked off their four-game road trip with a 94-90 loss at Chicago on Oct. 16, then were handed a 101-87 setback one night later in Milwaukee... The United Center loss wrapped up a home-and-home set between the Wolves and Bulls, who posted a 99-94 win on Oct. 14 at Target Center... Minnesota suffered its first preseason loss with a 112-97 home setback Oct. 9 vs. Toronto... The Wolves had finished 2008 with a 6-2 preseason mark, their best record since going 6-1 in 2001; they're now 78-78 all-time in exhibition outings...

**MARGINAL DATA:** The Wolves opened the 2009 preseason with a 117-103 triumph vs. Milwaukee on Oct. 4 in Mankato, fueled by a 50-for-56 performance from the line and a 49-24 rebounding advantage... They followed by outboarding Toronto 45-36 on Oct. 9, before coming up short in five of their final six appearances; the Wolves faced a -5.5 rpg (40.8-46.3) deficit during that stretch, but still ranked 9th overall in rebound percentage (.512)... Minnesota was 6th on the offensive glass (.273), and led all teams in second-chance points (16.0 ppg) while ranking 6th in fast-break scoring (16.4 ppg)... It was their second 50%+ effort this month; they hit 50.8% in the Oct. 4 opener vs. Milwaukee in Mankato... Minnesota had slipped to 38.3% during its five-game losing streak, including a preseason-low 34.1% Oct. 16 at Chicago... The Wolves have now missed the postseason in five consecutive seasons, after advancing to the NBA Playoffs every year from 1996-97 through 2003-04 (eight)... *The current absence matches Charlotte and New York for the longest active playoff drought*; Portland had sat out five straight years before qualifying last spring... Minnesota opened 4-15 before Randy Wittman was relieved of his coaching duties on Dec. 8, then went 20-43 under Kevin McHale... Following the Opening Night win over Sacramento, the Wolves dropped their next eight starts; they endured four separate losing streaks of 7+ games last winter, including a 10-game drought from Feb. 20-Mar. 9... The coaching change occurred in the midst of a season-high 13-game losing streak (Nov. 29-Dec. 23) that dropped the Wolves' overall record to 4-23... However, beginning with the Dec. 26 victory at New York, *Minnesota rebounded to go 12-4 over its next 16 starts*, putting together separate winning streaks of five (Jan. 2-10), two (Jan. 16-19) and three (Jan. 23-26) games...
