Last Game: Sunday, Nov. 29 – Minnesota 106, Denver 100

Ryan Gomes scored a season-high 27 points and the Timberwolves erased a 14-point halftime deficit to beat Denver, 106-100, on Sunday night at the Pepsi Center. Carmelo Anthony's 19-point outburst helped stake the Nuggets to a 40-25 lead after one quarter, and the margin grew to 17 on a Nenê dunk midway through the second. Trailing 64-50, Minnesota opened the third period with 14 unanswered points, pulling even on Jonny Flynn's layup at the 8:55 mark. Chauncey Billups halted the Denver drought with a trey, but the Wolves went in front to stay at 73-71 following a Corey Brewer jumper with 4:58 left. Minnesota took a five-point lead into the fourth, and doubled that to 92-82 on the heels of two straight Gomes baskets. The Nuggets rallied to within four before Brewer converted a three-point play with 2:42 to play, and free throws by Flynn and Damien Wilkins in the final minute secured Minnesota's first victory since Opening Night. Brewer and Flynn tallied 16 points apiece for the Wolves, while Wilkins added 15 points and a career-high 12 rebounds. Anthony's 32 points led Denver, with Kenyon Martin netting 16 with 14 rebounds.

Previous Game: Friday, Nov. 27 – Phoenix 120, Minnesota 95

Jason Richardson tallied 22 points and Grant Hill scored 14 of his 17 in the first half as Phoenix pummeled the Timberwolves, 120-95, on Friday night at Target Center. Hill's three-point play started a 7-0 burst that put the Suns on top by 10 midway through the first quarter. Ramon Sessions helped Minnesota whittle a 15-point deficit to 40-31 with 6:54 left in the second, but two straight baskets by Richardson started Phoenix on a 15-2 barrage that rebuilt the margin to 60-39 by intermission. The Wolves could get no closer in the second half, with 3-pointers from Hill and Richardson highlighting a 10-2 start and a pair of long-range strikes from Channing Frye giving the Suns their largest lead of the night at 84-52 with 4:23 left in the third quarter. The margin bounced between 23 and 32 points the rest of the way as Phoenix finished the night shooting 59.3% from the floor in handing Minnesota its 15th consecutive loss. Earl Clark chipped in 14 points off the bench for the Suns, while Steve Nash dealt 11 assists. The Wolves were led by Sessions' season-high 23 points, with Al Jefferson adding 20 and Jonny Flynn netting 18 with six assists.

First Meeting: Al Jefferson collected 24 points and 14 rebounds, and Randy Foye hit back-to-back 3-pointers down the stretch as the Timberwolves rallied for a 116-108 victory over New Orleans on Jan. 23 at Target Center. Foye totaled 24 points and eight assists for Minnesota. James Posey's 24 points led the Hornets, while Chris Paul contributed 23 points and 12 assists.

Second Meeting: Rasual Butler had 23 points and Sean Marks added a career-high 18 -- including the go-ahead dunk with 7.9 seconds left -- as New Orleans grabbed a 101-97 win on Feb. 8 at the New Orleans Arena. Al Jefferson led Minnesota with 25 points and 14 rebounds before suffering a season-ending knee injury in the closing moments, while Ryan Gomes added 21 points.

Third Meeting: Chris Paul scored 26 points and set up David West for the go-ahead dunk with 12.6 seconds remaining as New Orleans escaped with a 94-93 win over the Timberwolves on Mar. 18 at the New Orleans Arena. Paul also collected 10 assists and five steals for the Hornets, with West

and Rasual Butler chipping in 14 points apiece. Kevin Love led Minnesota with 23 points and 11 rebounds, while Ryan Gomes tallied 17 points.

WOLF TRACKS: Minnesota stopped its 15-game losing streak with Sunday's 106-100 comeback win at Denver, avenging a 124-111 loss to the Nuggets last Wednesday at Target Center... The drought was the 3rd-longest in club history; the franchise record is 16, set on two occasions (Feb. 29-Mar. 29, 1992; Apr. 8-Nov. 12, 1994)... Denver led by as many as 17 points on Sunday and enjoyed a 64-50 halftime advantage before the Wolves rallied; that equals the largest halftime deficit Minnesota has overcome since beating the Lakers 113-108 on Dec. 2, 2005 at Staples Center (trailed 60-45 at the break)... The Wolves improve to 2-15 on the season, still matching their slowest-ever start through 17 games; they opened 2-15 in 2007-08... Phoenix dealt Minnesota a 120-95 setback last Friday; the Suns also posted a 120-112 victory on Nov. 1 at the US Airways Center (the second loss in the Wolves' 15-game slide)... Minnesota opened its two-game holiday homestand with the Nov. 25 loss to Denver, and has now dropped its last eight at Target Center; that ties the 5th-longest home drought in franchise history... The Wolves' 91-87 defeat Nov. 23 at the Clippers ended a run of eight straight double-digit losses, dating to the 92-90 home setback vs. Boston on Nov. 4; the average margin of those eight was -20.6 ppg (85.0-105.6)...

WITHOUT LOVE: Phoenix outboarded the Wolves 45-35 last Friday, the seventh time in 12 games Minnesota has faced a double-digit deficit... Portland racked up a 41-29 margin on Nov. 11 and a 49-39 edge on Nov. 8, while Houston finished with a 46-36 surfeit on Nov. 18... Minnesota collected just three offensive rebounds vs. Portland on Nov. 11, tying a club record low (ninth time total, most recently Nov. 26, 2007 at New Orleans)... The Wolves outboarded Golden State 53-38 on Nov. 9 (including 19-3 in the 4th quarter), their lone double-figure advantage... Minnesota ranks 20th in the NBA in offensive rebound percentage (.260) and 27th in total rebound percentage (.486), after finishing 10th and 3rd, respectively, a season ago... The Wolves swiped 15 steals Oct. 28 vs. New Jersey, the 15th time in club history (second in the past six years) they've come up with 15+; the club single-game record is 17, set most recently at New Jersey on Mar. 24, 2000... The Wolves currently rank 3rd in steals (8.65 spg); however, they're last in blocked shots (3.53 bpg)...

NO FREE LUNCH: Before compiling a 19-for-28 effort Nov. 25 vs. Denver, the Wolves had totaled just 55 attempts (making 46) in their previous four; meanwhile, the Nuggets' 30 FTAs on Sunday mark the sixth time an opponent has attempted 30+ this year... Minnesota sank all 18 of its FT attempts Nov. 21 at Portland, the 17th perfect night in franchise annals; the club record for most FTs made without a miss is 24 (at Phoenix, Apr. 5, 2003)... The Wolves sank a season-low 6-for-9 from the line Nov. 14 at Memphis... Overall, Minnesota is receiving 16.0% of its scoring (248 of 1553) from free throws during the regular season (ranking 27th; league average is 18.7%)... That figure was an NBA-leading 29.8% (240 of 805) in eight preseason outings... The Wolves stand 21st in FT accuracy (73.8%) and last in FTs attempted (19.8 per game); a year ago, they ranked 15th (76.9%) and 19th (23.9 per game), respectively...

LONG-RANGE PLANS: New Jersey and Minnesota combined to sink just 1-for-15 from beyond the arc on Oct. 28, with Brian Cardinal (7:10, 3rd) providing the only made trey... That marks the fewest three-pointers made in an NBA game in nearly four years, since Denver (1-for-6) beat New Orleans (0-for-13) on Nov. 16, 2005... Meanwhile, Phoenix finished 14-for-26 on Nov. 1, equaling the 6th-highest total of three-pointers ever allowed by Minnesota; the Suns have also authored two of the top five (16, Mar. 20, 2007; 15, Jan. 29, 2007)... Through the season's first month, the Wolves are last in three-point accuracy (26.0%) and 27th in treys made (3.59 per contest)... They're allowing the opposition to convert 36.8% from beyond the arc, good for 23rd in the NBA...

OPENING ACT: The Wolves began the 2009-10 regular season by slipping past New Jersey, 95-93, on Oct. 28... New Jersey built a 19-point lead (72-53) midway through the third period before Minnesota rallied; it's the 8th-biggest comeback in franchise history, and the largest 2nd-half deficit the Wolves have overcome since spotting Dallas a 24-point advantage before roaring back to win 113-110 in overtime on Jan. 17, 1998 at Reunion Arena... They've now won 14 of their past 15 home openers, having a 12-game winning streak in that category snapped with a 99-91 loss to Denver on Nov. 2, 2007... All-time, Minnesota improves to 13-8 on Opening Night, having started 12 of the past 14 seasons with wins (also losing 100-95 in 1999 vs. Sacramento in Tokyo); they're 15-6 in home openers...

ONE FOR THE BOOKS: Golden State's 146-point explosion on Nov. 9 equaled the top single-game total ever by a Wolves opponent; the Warriors posted a 146-109 victory on Apr. 1, 1994 in Oakland... The final 41-point spread also matches the biggest losing margin in club history; Minnesota suffered a 113-72 defeat at Miami on Mar. 5, 1996... The Wolves committed 28 turnovers at Golden State, one short of the franchise single-game record; they coughed it up 29 times at New Jersey on Nov. 4, 2002... Meanwhile, the Warriors' 22 steals on Nov. 9 mark the highest total in an NBA game in over 12 years, since Atlanta swiped 23 at Philadelphia on Apr. 9, 1997...

* * *

ROSTER NOTES: On Oct. 26, the Timberwolves announced their 15-man Opening Night roster, having reached the limit by waiving guard Antonio Daniels on Oct. 23 and center Jared Reiner two days earlier... Of the 15 players who finished 2008-09 with the Wolves, only five are back this year... Ten new faces dot Minnesota's roster, including 2009 Draft choices Jonny Flynn (1st round, 6th overall) and Wayne Ellington (1st/28th)... Center Nathan Jawai, guard Damien Wilkins and forward Oleksiy Pecherov were acquired in trades with Dallas (Oct. 20), Oklahoma City (July 27) and Washington (June 24), respectively; guard Ramon Sessions (Milwaukee) and center Ryan Hollins (Dallas) were signed as restricted free agents, and forward Sasha Pavlovic (Phoenix) was signed as an unrestricted free agent... Last October, Minnesota returned nine of 14 players from its 2007-08 roster; they kept only five of 14 players from 2006-07 to the next year and 11 of 14 from 2005-06... The current roster averages 3.8 years of NBA experience and has an average age of 25.9 years; last year's Opening Night group was at 4.8 and 27.1, respectively (4.4 and 26.4 in 2007-08)... Corey Brewer now becomes Minnesota's longest-tenured player; Al Jefferson and Ryan Gomes are also entering their third seasons in a Timberwolves uniform... Only three players on the 2009-10 roster were originally drafted by Minnesota (Brewer, Flynn, Ellington)...

MARGINAL DATA: The Wolves opened the 2009 preseason with a 117-103 triumph vs. Milwaukee on Oct. 4 in Mankato, fueled by a 50-for-56 performance from the line and a 49-24 rebounding advantage... They followed by outboarding Toronto 45-36 on Oct. 9, before coming up short in five of their final six appearances; the Wolves faced a -5.5 rpg (40.8-46.3) deficit during that stretch, but still ranked 9th overall in rebound percentage (.512)... Minnesota was 6th on the offensive glass (.273), and led all teams in second-chance points (16.0 ppg) while ranking 6th in fast-break scoring (16.4 ppg)... Meanwhile, they finished 2nd in the NBA in FTs made (30.0 per game) and attempted (39.0), trailing just Denver (30.4 and 42.4) in both categories... The Wolves have now missed the postseason in five consecutive seasons, after advancing to the NBA Playoffs every year from 1996-97 through 2003-04 (eight)... *The current absence matches Charlotte and New York for the longest active playoff drought;* Portland had sat out five straight years before qualifying last spring... Minnesota opened 4-15 before Randy Wittman was relieved of his coaching duties on Dec. 8, then went 20-43 under Kevin McHale... Following the Opening Night win over Sacramento, the Wolves dropped their next eight starts; they endured four separate losing streaks of 7+ games last winter, including a 10-game drought from Feb. 20-Mar. 9... The coaching change occurred in the midst of a season-high 13-game losing streak (Nov. 29-Dec. 23) that dropped the Wolves' overall record to 4-23...
