Last Game: Wednesday, Dec. 9 – New Orleans 97, Minnesota 96

Chris Paul totaled 15 points and 14 assists, capped off by scoring the game-winning layup with 1.4 seconds to play as New Orleans rallied past the Timberwolves, 97-96, on Wednesday night at Target Center. Tied 29-29 after one quarter, Minnesota ran off nine unanswered points early in the second, capped by Ryan Hollins' three-point play. Ryan Gomes and Kevin Love hit 3-pointers during a late 12-3 push that extended the Wolves' lead to 64-53 at halftime, and Gomes gave Minnesota its biggest cushion of the night at 71-55 two minutes into the third period. A pair of long-range strikes from Peja Stojakovic helped the Hornets whittle their deficit to five entering the fourth, which New Orleans opened with a 13-4 burst to jump ahead by four. Al Jefferson's free throw at the 2:07 mark reclaimed the lead at 96-95 for Minnesota, setting the stage for Paul's last-second heroics. The Wolves' final opportunity went awry when Wayne Ellington's long 3-pointer misfired at the buzzer. Stojakovic finished with 21 points and Marcus Thornton added 20 for the Hornets. Gomes' 21 points led Minnesota, while Jefferson collected 17 points and 16 rebounds.

Previous Game: Tuesday, Dec. 8 – Toronto 94, Minnesota 88

Chris Bosh totaled 21 points and 16 rebounds, and Jarrett Jack filled in for the ailing José Calderón with 17 points, seven rebounds and eight assists as Toronto overcame cold shooting to edge the Timberwolves, 94-88, on Tuesday night at the Air Canada Centre. Trailing by three after one quarter, Minnesota went ahead 29-28 on a pair of Damien Wilkins free throws midway through the second. However, the Raptors countered with a 14-4 push to go ahead 43-35 at halftime and took their biggest lead of the night when Bosh's jumper made it 59-48 with 5:29 left in the third. Ramon Sessions' last-second jumper capped an 11-1 finish for the Wolves that cut the deficit to one, but Toronto never trailed following Jack's go-ahead layup with 10:03 left in the contest. Minnesota managed to pull even on three occasions, the final time when Kevin Love made it 84-84 at the 2:18 mark, but Hedo Turkoglu's steal and breakaway dunk was followed by an Antoine Wright 3-pointer as the Raptors beat Minnesota for the 11th consecutive time. Love's 18 points led the Wolves, while Jonny Flynn collected 17 points and eight assists, and Al Jefferson hauled down 11 rebounds.

Rubio, the fifth overall selection in the 2009 NBA Draft, has appeared in 17 games thus far with 16-1 Barcelona (ACB and Euroleague combined), averaging 4.9 ppg, 4.7 apg and 1.94 spg in 19.8 mpg. WOLF TRACKS: The Hornets overcame a 16-point, 3rd-quarter deficit to edge Minnesota, 97-96, on Wednesday, their second victory over the Wolves in six nights (98-89 on Dec. 4 in New Orleans)... Toronto continued its mastery vs. Minnesota with Tuesday's 94-88 decision, the Raptors' 11th straight win in the series dating to January 2004... The Wolves halted their nine-game Target Center losing streak with last Saturday's 108-101 victory over Utah, the first of three meetings with the Jazz this month... The drought extended to Minnesota's 95-93 Opening Night (Oct. 28) triumph vs. New Jersey, and equaled the 4th-longest home skid in franchise history... The Wolves are now 2-4 in their past six contests, having ended a 15-game losing streak overall (one short of the club record) by notching a 106-100 victory on Nov. 29 at Denver... Minnesota is now 3-19 on the season, matching its slowest-ever start through 22 games; the 2007-08 edition did not record its fourth victory until Game 25, finishing 22-60 overall...

DOUBLING DOWN: Wednesday's setback vs. New Orleans marked the third time in five December outings that Minnesota has let a double-digit lead slip away, having squandered 11-point advantages vs. Memphis (a 97-95 loss on Dec. 2) and at New Orleans (a 98-89 defeat on Dec. 4)... On the flipside, the Wolves have rallied from deficits of at least 14 points in all three of their victories to date... The Nuggets led by as many as 17 points and enjoyed a 64-50 halftime cushion before the Wolves rallied on Nov. 29; that equals the largest halftime deficit Minnesota has overcome since beating the Lakers 113-108 on Dec. 2, 2005 at Staples Center (trailed 60-45 at the break)... Each of Minnesota's past six games have been decided by single-digit margins (including four by six points or less); that's on the heels of an 11-game stretch that saw the Wolves suffer 10 double-figure losses (five by 20+)...

FINDING THE RANGE: Minnesota shot 57.1% in the Dec. 5 win over Utah, their highest percentage since hitting 59.0% vs. Phoenix on Jan. 29, 2007 (a 121-112 victory)... The Wolves have cleared 50% in four of their past six starts, including Wednesday's 52.6% effort vs. New Orleans; they'd hit 50%+ just once in their first 16 outings (52.0% vs. Boston, Nov. 2)... A year ago, Minnesota put together back-to-back 50%+ nights twice; the last time they topped that mark in three straight games was Mar. 14-15-17, 2008... The Wolves shot a season-low 32.6% vs. Dallas on Nov. 13, one of five sub-40% outings to date; a year ago, they finished below 40% on 11 occasions, finishing 0-11... The last time Minnesota won a game when shooting below 40% from the floor was Mar. 19, 2008 vs. Memphis (39.3% in a 98-94 victory)... The Wolves currently stand 24th in FG accuracy (44.1%) and 27th in scoring (92.2 ppg)...

SCHEDULE NOTES: Tonight's contest kicks off the sixth of 20 sets of back-to-back outings scheduled in 2009-10 for Minnesota... The Wolves are 1-4 on the tail end of back-to-back sets, the lone victory coming last Saturday vs. Utah... Tonight's game also continues the Wolves' first four-games-in-five-nights set this year; Minnesota has three such groupings slated in 2009-10, up from one a year ago... Tuesday's outing at Toronto ended a string of 14 consecutive vs. Western foes, and represented the Timberwolves' first road game vs. an Eastern Conference opponent this season... Minnesota is now in the midst of another string of six in a row vs. the West, capped by a visit from Sacramento on Dec. 18; at that point the Wolves will have played 20 of 21 within the Western Conference...

NO FREE LUNCH: Toronto's 40-for-48 effort on Tuesday marks the most prolific night by a Wolves opponent in nearly 10 years (since Phoenix went 43-for-49 on Mar. 14, 2000) and just the 9th time an opponent has converted 40+ FTs vs. Minnesota... At the other end, the Wolves have boosted their frequency to 23.6 attempts per game over the past eight, after averaging just 16.4 in their previous 11 starts... Minnesota sank all 18 of its FT attempts Nov. 21 at Portland, the 17th perfect night in franchise annals; the club record for most FTs made without a miss is 24 (at Phoenix, Apr. 5, 2003)... The Wolves were a season-low 6-for-9 from the line Nov. 14 at Memphis... Overall, Minnesota is receiving 15.8% of its scoring (321 of 2029) from free throws during the regular season (ranking 29th; league average is 18.9%)... That figure was an NBA-best 29.8% (240 of 805) in eight preseason starts... The Wolves are 28th in FT accuracy (72.3%) and 29th in FTs attempted (20.2 per game); a year ago, they ranked 15th (76.9%) and 19th (23.9 per game), respectively...

LONG-RANGE PLANS: The Wolves went 7-for-14 from three-point distance Dec. 4 at New Orleans, tying season bests for both treys made and accuracy... They've boosted their percentage to 36.2% (21-for-58) in five December outings, after converting on just 26.0% from beyond the arc through November... Meanwhile, Phoenix finished 14-for-26 on Nov. 1, equaling the 6th-highest total of three-pointers ever allowed by Minnesota; the Suns have also authored two of the top five (16, Mar. 20, 2007; 15, Jan. 29, 2007)... Through the season's first 22 games, the Wolves are 29th in three-point accuracy (28.0%) and 27th in treys made (3.73 per game)... Meanwhile, they're limiting the opposition to a combined 34.5% from beyond the arc, good for 12th in the NBA...

ALL YOU NEED IS...: The Wolves outrebounded New Orleans 49-29 on Wednesday, their second straight double-digit cushion vs. the Hornets (50-40 on Dec. 4) and third of the season overall... Minnesota has held the board edge in five of the past six games, compiling a +7.0 rpg (46.3-39.3) margin in that span; the Wolves had come up short in nine of their previous 11 starts... Phoenix outrebounded Minnesota 45-35 on Nov. 27, the seventh time they've faced a double-digit deficit... The Wolves collected three offensive rebounds vs. Portland on Nov. 11, tying a club record low (ninth time total, most recently Nov. 26, 2007 at New Orleans)... Minnesota ranks 18th in the NBA in offensive rebound percentage (.265) and 17th in total rebound percentage (.498), after finishing 10th and 3rd, respectively, a season ago... The Wolves swiped 15 steals Oct. 28 vs. New Jersey, the 15th time in club history (second in the last six years) they've come up with 15+; the franchise single-game mark is 17, set most recently at New Jersey on Mar. 24, 2000... Minnesota currently ranks 5th in steals (8.41 spg); however, they're last in blocked shots (3.41 bpg) and 29th in turnovers (16.5 per game)...

OPENING ACT: The Wolves began the 2009-10 regular season by slipping past New Jersey, 95-93, on Oct. 28... New Jersey built a 19-point lead (72-53) midway through the third period before Minnesota rallied; it's the 8th-biggest comeback in franchise history, and the largest 2nd-half deficit the Wolves have overcome since spotting Dallas a 24-point advantage before roaring back to win 113-110 in overtime on Jan. 17, 1998 at Reunion Arena... They've now won 14 of their past 15 home openers, having a 12-game winning streak in that category snapped with a 99-91 loss to Denver on Nov. 2, 2007... All-time, Minnesota improves to 13-8 on Opening Night, having started 12 of the past 14 seasons with wins (also losing 100-95 in 1999 vs. Sacramento in Tokyo); they're 15-6 in home openers...

ONE FOR THE BOOKS: Golden State's 146-point explosion on Nov. 9 equaled the top single-game total ever by a Wolves opponent; the Warriors posted a 146-109 victory on Apr. 1, 1994 in Oakland... The final 41-point spread also matches the biggest losing margin in club history; Minnesota suffered a 113-72 defeat at Miami on Mar. 5, 1996... The Wolves committed 28 turnovers at Golden State, one short of the franchise single-game record; they coughed it up 29 times at New Jersey on Nov. 4, 2002... Meanwhile, the Warriors' 22 steals on Nov. 9 mark the highest total in an NBA game in over 12 years, since Atlanta swiped 23 at Philadelphia on Apr. 9, 1997...

BOARD PRODIGY: Timberwolves forward Kevin Love finished 2008-09 as only the fifth rookie in NBA history to collect in excess of 20 percent of all rebounds available during his minutes on the floor. MARGINAL DATA: The Wolves opened the 2009 preseason with a 117-103 triumph vs. Milwaukee on Oct. 4 in Mankato, fueled by a 50-for-56 performance from the line and a 49-24 rebounding advantage... They followed by outboarding Toronto 45-36 on Oct. 9, before coming up short in five of their final six appearances; the Wolves faced a -5.5 rpg (40.8-46.3) deficit during that stretch, but still ranked 9th overall in rebound percentage (.512)... Minnesota was 6th on the offensive glass (.273), and led all teams in second-chance points (16.0 ppg) while ranking 6th in fast-break scoring (16.4 ppg)...
