Last Game: Friday, Dec. 11 – L.A. Lakers 104, Minnesota 92

Pau Gasol finished with 17 points, a career-high 20 rebounds and seven assists, and Kobe Bryant overcame a broken index finger to score 20 points as Los Angeles downed the Timberwolves, 104-92, on Friday night at Staples Center. Consecutive dunks by Bryant and Gasol sprung the Lakers to a 26-16 lead late in the opening stanza, but Ramon Sessions spearheaded a second-quarter charge that put Minnesota in front briefly 44-42 at the 5:08 mark. Leading by just two at intermission, L.A. outscored the Wolves 11-3 to open the third quarter, then tallied the final 12 points of the period -- capped by Lamar Odom's late 3-pointer -- as the margin swelled to 86-68. Minnesota managed to shave seven points off that deficit on several occasions in the fourth, but a long-range strike from Ron Artest was followed by Odom's layup as Los Angeles put the game out of reach at 99-83 with 4:22 remaining, securing its 11th straight win and improving to 18-3 overall. Artest chipped in 16 points for the Lakers, while Minnesota was led by 24 points and 13 rebounds from Al Jefferson, with Sessions adding 15 points and Kevin Love hauling in a career-high 19 rebounds.

Previous Game: Wednesday, Dec. 9 – New Orleans 97, Minnesota 96

Chris Paul totaled 15 points and 14 assists, capped off by scoring the game-winning layup with 1.4 seconds to play as New Orleans rallied past the Timberwolves, 97-96, on Wednesday night at Target Center. Tied 29-29 after one quarter, Minnesota ran off nine unanswered points early in the second, capped by Ryan Hollins' three-point play. Ryan Gomes and Kevin Love hit 3-pointers during a late 12-3 push that extended the Wolves' lead to 64-53 at halftime, and Gomes gave Minnesota its biggest cushion of the night at 71-55 two minutes into the third period. A pair of long-range strikes from Peja Stojakovic helped the Hornets whittle their deficit to five entering the fourth, which New Orleans opened with a 13-4 burst to jump ahead by four. Al Jefferson's free throw at the 2:07 mark reclaimed the lead at 96-95 for Minnesota, setting the stage for Paul's last-second heroics. The Wolves' final opportunity went awry when Wayne Ellington's long 3-pointer misfired at the buzzer. Stojakovic finished with 21 points and Marcus Thornton added 20 for the Hornets. Gomes' 21 points led Minnesota, while Jefferson collected 17 points and 16 rebounds.

Fourth Meeting: Ike Diogu registered 28 points and 13 rebounds as Sacramento turned back the Timberwolves, 97-90, on Apr. 15 at Target Center. Andres Nocioni chipped in 17 points for the Kings, while Craig Smith topped Minnesota with 18 points and Ryan Gomes added 17.

WOLF TRACKS: Los Angeles beat the Wolves for the ninth straight time with Friday's 104-92 decision; the clubs don't meet again until Mar. 19 at Staples Center... New Orleans overcame a 16-point, 3rd-quarter deficit to edge Minnesota, 97-96, on Wednesday at Target Center, their second victory over the Wolves in six nights (98-89 on Dec. 4 in Louisiana)... Toronto continued its mastery vs. Minnesota with Tuesday's 94-88 decision, the Raptors' 11th straight win in the series dating to January 2004... The Wolves halted their nine-game Target Center losing streak with last Saturday's 108-101 victory over Utah, the first of three meetings with the Jazz this month... The drought extended to Minnesota's 95-93 Opening Night (Oct. 28) triumph vs. New Jersey, and equaled the 4th-longest home skid in franchise history... The Wolves are now 2-5 in their past seven starts, having ended a 15-game losing streak overall (one short of the club record) by notching a 106-100 victory on Nov. 29 at Denver... Minnesota is now 3-20 on the season, matching its slowest-ever start through 23 games; the 2007-08 edition did not record its fourth victory until Game 25, finishing 22-60 overall...

DOUBLING DOWN: Wednesday's setback vs. New Orleans marked the third time in six December outings that Minnesota has let a double-digit lead slip away, having squandered 11-point advantages vs. Memphis (a 97-95 loss on Dec. 2) and at New Orleans (a 98-89 defeat on Dec. 4)... On the flipside, the Wolves have rallied from deficits of at least 14 points in all three of their victories to date... The Nuggets led by as many as 17 points and enjoyed a 64-50 halftime cushion before the Wolves rallied on Nov. 29; that equals the largest halftime deficit Minnesota has overcome since beating the Lakers 113-108 on Dec. 2, 2005 at Staples Center (trailed 60-45 at the break)... Six of Minnesota's past seven games have been decided by single-digit margins (including four by six points or less); that's on the heels of an 11-game stretch that saw the Wolves suffer 10 double-figure losses (five by 20+)...

ALL YOU NEED IS...: The Wolves outrebounded New Orleans 49-29 on Wednesday, their second straight double-digit cushion vs. the Hornets (50-40 on Dec. 4) and third of the season overall... Minnesota has held the board edge in five of the past seven games, compiling a +5.7 rpg (46.6-40.9) margin in that span; the Wolves had come up short in nine of their previous 11 starts... Phoenix outrebounded Minnesota 45-35 on Nov. 27, the seventh time they've faced a double-digit deficit... The Wolves collected three offensive rebounds vs. Portland on Nov. 11, tying a club record low (ninth time total, most recently Nov. 26, 2007 at New Orleans)... Minnesota ranks 18th in the NBA in offensive rebound percentage (.265) and 18th in total rebound percentage (.497), after finishing 10th and 3rd, respectively, a season ago... The Wolves swiped 15 steals Oct. 28 vs. New Jersey, the 15th time in club history (second in the last six years) they've come up with 15+; the franchise single-game mark is 17, set most recently at New Jersey on Mar. 24, 2000... Minnesota currently ranks 7th in steals (8.30 spg); however, they're last in blocked shots (3.39 bpg) and 29th in turnovers (16.5 per game)...

SCHEDULE NOTES: Tonight's contest wraps up the sixth of 20 sets of back-to-back outings scheduled in 2009-10 for Minnesota... The Wolves are 1-4 on the tail end of back-to-backs, the lone win coming last Saturday vs. Utah... Tonight's game also concludes the Wolves' first four-games-in-five-nights set this year; Minnesota has three such groupings slated in 2009-10, up from one a year ago... Tuesday's outing at Toronto ended a string of 14 consecutive vs. Western foes, and represented the Timberwolves' first road game vs. an Eastern Conference opponent this season... Minnesota is now in the midst of another string of six in a row vs. the West, capped by a visit from Sacramento on Dec. 18; at that point the Wolves will have played 20 of 21 within the Western Conference...

FINDING THE RANGE: Minnesota shot 57.1% in the Dec. 5 win over Utah, their highest percentage since hitting 59.0% vs. Phoenix on Jan. 29, 2007 (a 121-112 victory)... The Wolves have cleared 50% in four of their past seven starts, including Wednesday's 52.6% effort vs. New Orleans; they'd hit 50%+ just once in their first 16 outings (52.0% vs. Boston, Nov. 2)... A year ago, Minnesota put together back-to-back 50%+ nights twice; the last time they topped that mark in three straight games was Mar. 14-15-17, 2008... The Wolves shot a season-low 32.6% vs. Dallas on Nov. 13, one of five sub-40% outings to date; a year ago, they finished below 40% on 11 occasions, finishing 0-11... The last time Minnesota won a game when shooting below 40% from the floor was Mar. 19, 2008 vs. Memphis (39.3% in a 98-94 victory)... The Wolves currently stand 24th in FG accuracy (44.1%) and 27th in scoring (92.2 ppg)...

NO FREE LUNCH: Toronto's 40-for-48 effort on Tuesday marks the most prolific night by a Wolves opponent in nearly 10 years (since Phoenix went 43-for-49 on Mar. 14, 2000) and just the 9th time an opponent has converted 40+ FTs vs. Minnesota... At the other end, the Wolves have boosted their frequency to 22.8 attempts per game over the past nine, after averaging just 16.4 in their previous 11 starts... Minnesota sank all 18 of its FT attempts Nov. 21 at Portland, the 17th perfect night in franchise annals; the club record for most FTs made without a miss is 24 (at Phoenix, Apr. 5, 2003)... The Wolves were a season-low 6-for-9 from the line Nov. 14 at Memphis... Overall, Minnesota is receiving 15.7% of its scoring (333 of 2121) from free throws during the regular season (ranking 29th; league average is 18.9%)... That figure was an NBA-best 29.8% (240 of 805) in eight preseason starts... The Wolves are 26th in FT accuracy (72.4%) and 29th in FTs attempted (20.0 per game); a year ago, they ranked 15th (76.9%) and 19th (23.9 per game), respectively...

LONG-RANGE PLANS: The Wolves went 7-for-14 from three-point distance Dec. 4 at New Orleans, tying season bests for both treys made and accuracy... They've boosted their percentage to 36.8% (25-for-68) in six December outings, after converting on just 26.0% from beyond the arc through November... Meanwhile, Phoenix finished 14-for-26 on Nov. 1, equaling the 6th-highest total of three-pointers ever allowed by Minnesota; the Suns have also authored two of the top five (16, Mar. 20, 2007; 15, Jan. 29, 2007)... Through the season's first 23 games, the Wolves are 29th in three-point accuracy (28.4%) and 27th in treys made (3.74 per game)... Meanwhile, they're limiting the opposition to a combined 35.3% from beyond the arc, good for 15th in the NBA...

OPENING ACT: The Wolves began the 2009-10 regular season by slipping past New Jersey, 95-93, on Oct. 28... New Jersey built a 19-point lead (72-53) midway through the third period before Minnesota rallied; it's the 8th-biggest comeback in franchise history, and the largest 2nd-half deficit the Wolves have overcome since spotting Dallas a 24-point advantage before roaring back to win 113-110 in overtime on Jan. 17, 1998 at Reunion Arena... They've now won 14 of their past 15 home openers, having a 12-game winning streak in that category snapped with a 99-91 loss to Denver on Nov. 2, 2007... All-time, Minnesota improves to 13-8 on Opening Night, having started 12 of the past 14 seasons with wins (also losing 100-95 in 1999 vs. Sacramento in Tokyo); they're 15-6 in home openers...

ONE FOR THE BOOKS: Golden State's 146-point explosion on Nov. 9 equaled the top single-game total ever by a Wolves opponent; the Warriors posted a 146-109 victory on Apr. 1, 1994 in Oakland... The final 41-point spread also matches the biggest losing margin in club history; Minnesota suffered a 113-72 defeat at Miami on Mar. 5, 1996... The Wolves committed 28 turnovers at Golden State, one short of the franchise single-game record; they coughed it up 29 times at New Jersey on Nov. 4, 2002... Meanwhile, the Warriors' 22 steals on Nov. 9 mark the highest total in an NBA game in over 12 years, since Atlanta swiped 23 at Philadelphia on Apr. 9, 1997...

BOARD PRODIGY: Timberwolves forward Kevin Love finished 2008-09 as only the fifth rookie in NBA history to collect in excess of 20 percent of all rebounds available during his minutes on the floor. According to Basketball-Reference.com, Love's Rebound Percentage of 21.0% is the 7th-most-prolific single-season NBA figure ever among players 22 or younger (min. 50 Games Played):

The United Center loss wrapped up a home-and-home set between the Wolves and Bulls, who posted a 99-94 win on Oct. 14 at Target Center... MARGINAL DATA: The Wolves opened the 2009 preseason with a 117-103 triumph vs. Milwaukee on Oct. 4 in Mankato, fueled by a 50-for-56 performance from the line and a 49-24 rebounding advantage... They followed by outboarding Toronto 45-36 on Oct. 9, before coming up short in five of their final six appearances; the Wolves faced a -5.5 rpg (40.8-46.3) deficit during that stretch, but still ranked 9th overall in rebound percentage (.512)... Minnesota was 6th on the offensive glass (.273), and led all teams in second-chance points (16.0 ppg) while ranking 6th in fast-break scoring (16.4 ppg)... Meanwhile, they finished 2nd in the NBA in FTs made (30.0 per game) and attempted (39.0), trailing just Denver (30.4 and 42.4) in both categories... The Wolves have now missed the postseason in five consecutive seasons, after advancing to the NBA Playoffs every year from 1996-97 through 2003-04 (eight)... *The current absence matches Charlotte and New York for the longest active playoff drought;* Portland had sat out five straight years before qualifying last spring... Minnesota opened 4-15 before Randy Wittman was relieved of his coaching duties on Dec. 8, then went 20-43 under Kevin McHale... Following the Opening Night win over Sacramento, the Wolves dropped their next eight starts; they endured four separate losing streaks of 7+ games last winter, including a 10-game drought from Feb. 20-Mar. 9... The coaching change occurred in the midst of a season-high 13-game losing streak (Nov. 29-Dec. 23) that dropped the Wolves' overall record to 4-23... Served as an assistant coach with the Lakers for all or part of 11 seasons (1995-99 under Harris, 2001-04 for Phil Jackson, the end of 2004-05 with Frank Hamblen and 2005-09 under Jackson), and enjoyed two tours in the team's front office (1999-2001 as Assistant General Manager, 2004-05 as Vice President of Business and Basketball Integration)... Overall, L.A. won four NBA Championships during his 14 years in management (2000, 2001, 2002, 2009), following a 14-year playing career that saw him contribute to four Lakers titles (1982, 1985, 1987, 1988)... Appeared in 880 games during an NBA career that began in Los Angeles and also included stops in Charlotte, Phoenix and Sacramento; he averaged 5.2 ppg and 5.6 rpg (in 18.5 mpg) while shooting 53.4%...
