Last Game: Friday, Mar. 26 – Orlando 106, Minnesota 97

Dwight Howard collected 24 points, 19 rebounds and four blocks, and Orlando sank 13 treys en route to handing the Timberwolves their 15th consecutive loss, 106-97, on Friday night at Amway Arena. Minnesota opened its biggest lead of the contest at 23-16 on a Darko Milicic hook before the Magic cut that to 29-27 after one quarter. The lead changed hands 11 times in the second period, but Howard's three-point play with 2:11 put Orlando in front by four and a late 3-pointer from Matt Barnes made it 59-54 at halftime. Back-to-back treys from Jameer Nelson and Vince Carter capped a 13-2 surge midway through the third that widened the Magic's advantage to 15 before the Wolves battled back to within 82-73 entering the fourth. However, J.J. Redick opened with a pair of long-distance strikes and later sank two free throws that stretched Orlando's lead to 100-79 with 5:20 remaining. Minnesota outscored the Magic 18-6 the rest of the way to bring the final margin down to single figures. Ryan Anderson tallied 19 points and nine rebounds off the bench for Orlando, while Al Jefferson topped the Wolves with 18 points, 13 rebounds and three steals.

Previous Game: Wednesday, Mar. 24 – Charlotte 108, Minnesota 95

Stephen Jackson poured in 37 points and Gerald Wallace tallied the final 10 of a 20-0 second-quarter barrage as Charlotte rolled to a 108-95 victory over the Timberwolves on Wednesday night at Time Warner Cable Arena. Jackson had 17 in the opening period, but Al Jefferson countered with 11 to help Minnesota open a 33-30 lead. Wayne Ellington's 3-pointer extended that to 43-34 with 7:21 left in the second before the Bobcats peeled off the game's next 20 points to take the lead for good. The Wolves missed 11 consecutive shots and committed six turnovers during the drought, which finally ended with Ramon Sessions' basket at the :49.4 mark. Trailing 55-45 at halftime, Minnesota rallied to within three on a Ryan Gomes layup midway through the third, but Boris Diaw's 3-pointer slowed the comeback and Charlotte rebuilt its margin to 85-76 entering the fourth quarter. Back-to-back treys from D.J. Augustin and Jackson pushed it to 15 with six minutes left, and the Wolves went on to suffer their 14th straight loss. Wallace ended with 23 points and Raymond Felton dished eight assists for the Bobcats. Jefferson's 21 points led Minnesota.

First Meeting: Channing Frye sank six 3-pointers and Steve Nash dished 14 assists as Phoenix outran the Timberwolves, 120-112, on Nov. 1 at US Airways Center. Frye's 25 points led the Suns, with Grant Hill and Jason Richardson adding 23 apiece. Ryan Gomes collected 23 points and 15 rebounds for Minnesota, while Al Jefferson tacked on 21 points and Corey Brewer scored 19.

Second Meeting: Jason Richardson tallied 22 points and Grant Hill had 17 as Phoenix pummeled the Timberwolves, 120-95, on Nov. 27 at Target Center. Minnesota was led by Ramon Sessions' season-high 23 points, with Al Jefferson adding 20 and Jonny Flynn netting 18 with six assists.

Third Meeting: Jason Richardson's 27 points led eight double-figure scorers, and Phoenix shot 67 percent in the first half en route to a record-setting 152-114 win over the Timberwolves on Mar. 16 at US Airways Center. Amar'e Stoudemire finished with 25 points, Louis Amundson added a career-high 20 and Steve Nash handed out 14 assists for the Suns, whose point total is the highest ever allowed by Minnesota. Corey Brewer's 21 points paced the Wolves, while Ryan Gomes chipped in 18.

DOUBLE-DOUBLE DUO: Wolves center Al Jefferson hauled down a franchise-record 26 rebounds in the triple-OT loss at Houston on Jan. 13, part of his fifth career 20/20 effort. His 23 defensive rebounds are the most by any NBA player since Kevin Garnett grabbed 23 for Minnesota vs. Orlando on Jan. 12, 2005. Jefferson also becomes just the ninth player in the past 15 years to collect 25+ points and 25+ rebounds in the same game. Meanwhile, forward Kevin Love totaled 19 points and 11 rebounds Mar. 19 at the Lakers; he's grabbed 10+ boards in 34 of his 51 outings this year (including 31 point/rebound double-doubles):

JEFFERSON, LOVE TO DON RED, WHITE & BLUE: USA Basketball announced on Feb. 10 that forwards Al Jefferson and Kevin Love are among 27 NBA players named to the 2010-2012 Men's National Team Program. Players from the program will be selected to represent the United States in international basketball competitions over the next three summers, including the 2010 FIBA World Championships in Turkey and the 2012 Summer Olympics in London. The Timberwolves are one of six teams to place two players on the preliminary roster, along with Denver (Carmelo Anthony, Chauncey Billups), the L.A. Lakers (Kobe Bryant, Lamar Odom), Memphis (Rudy Gay, O.J. Mayo), Oklahoma City (Kevin Durant, Russell Westbrook) and Utah (Carlos Boozer, Deron Williams).

INSIDE THE BOX SCORE: The Wolves racked up 28 fast-break points Feb. 24 in Atlanta, their second-best total this year and one of 21 times they've amassed 20+. Minnesota is 7th in the NBA in fast-break scoring (15.4 ppg), but ranks last by allowing 18.5 fast-break points per contest (including 24.1 ppg over the past 10). TWICE OVER: Friday's loss in Orlando was the Wolves' 15th in a row, one shy of the franchise record (set on two previous occasions: Feb. 29-Mar. 29, 1992 and Apr. 8-Nov. 12, 1994). Minnesota becomes the seventh team in NBA history to endure at least two separate losing streaks of 15+ games in the same season, and the first since the 1997-98 Denver Nuggets. SOMETHING'S BREWING: Corey Brewer went 0-for-3 from beyond the arc Mar. 19 at the Lakers, halting his club-record string of consecutive games with a made three-pointer at 33. Isaiah Rider held the previous mark with 21 (set Dec. 20, 1994-Feb. 3, 1995), which Brewer surpassed in the Feb. 23 victory at Miami. He shot 41.8% (59-for-141) from long distance during the streak; 19 of those featured two or more treys, including a 4-for-5 performance at New York on Jan. 26. The NBA's longest such streak this season belongs to Houston guard Aaron Brooks, whose 39-game run also came to an end on Mar. 19 (vs. Boston).

WOLF TRACKS: Orlando completed a sweep of its two-game season set with the Wolves by notching a 106-97 victory on Friday at Amway Arena; the Magic also won 106-94 on New Year's Day at Target Center... The loss was Minnesota's 15th in a row since posting a 91-88 triumph on Feb. 23 at Miami... The two-game trip began with a 108-95 defeat on Wednesday in Charlotte; Toronto handed the Wolves a 106-100 setback on Monday, running its series winning streak vs. Minnesota to 12... Minnesota completed a winless four-game West Coast trip with the 104-96 loss to the Lakers on Mar. 19... Utah salvaged a split of its season series with Minnesota by notching a 122-100 victory on Mar. 17; they're one of two teams the Wolves have beaten twice this year, along with New Jersey... Phoenix exploded for a 152-114 win on Mar. 16, its biggest win ever vs. Minnesota; the Suns have won all three meetings this year, and close out the season set tonight at Target Center... The Wolves kicked off the four-game road trip with a 114-100 defeat Mar. 14 in Sacramento; the Kings repay the visit on Wednesday... The Wolves have suffered nine straight losses at home since beating Memphis 109-102 on Feb. 6, equaling their fourth-longest Target Center skid ever; Minnesota is now 1-21 in its past 22 starts...

SCHEDULE NOTES: Friday's loss at Orlando was the Wolves' final road game vs. the East for 2009-10; they have two remaining at home (Apr. 3 vs. Miami, Apr. 14 vs. Detroit)... Beginning tonight vs. Phoenix, Minnesota plays five of its next six games (and six of its final nine) at Target Center... The Mar. 17 loss at Utah completed the 18th of 20 sets of back-to-backs for the Wolves this year; the next one begins Apr. 3 vs. Miami... Minnesota is 3-15 on the tail end of back-to-backs, beating Utah (Dec. 5), New Jersey (Dec. 23) and Memphis (Feb. 6); they finished 6-16 a year ago... Tonight's game continues a five-week grind that sees Minnesota play 19 of 20 vs. teams with .500+ records, a run that began Feb. 19 vs. Chicago... The Feb. 27 game vs. Portland rounded out their third (and final) four-games-in-five-nights set that began with the Feb. 23 win in Miami... The 117-108 win in Dallas on Feb. 5 ended a nine-game road losing streak, dating to the win at New Jersey (the current drought has reached nine games)... It was also the Wolves' first victory vs. a .500+ team since beating Utah 110-108 on Dec. 14; all three of Minnesota's February wins were against teams with winning records...

THE IRON RANGE: Minnesota hit 53.2% on Mar. 3 in Dallas, its highest percentage in a loss since shooting 56.1% on Mar. 21, 2008 at Indiana (a 124-113 defeat)... *It's the Wolves' only 50%+ outing since All-Star Weekend* (20 games); prior to that Minnesota shot 55.6% Feb. 6 vs. Memphis, its 2nd-best percentage this year and the franchise-record fourth straight 50%+ game (53.0% on Feb. 5 at Dallas, 50.0% on Jan. 31 vs. New York, 52.4% on Jan. 29 vs. the Clippers)... Minnesota had shot 45% or better in 13 straight home games (a combined 48.0%) prior to the 38.9% showing vs. Denver on Mar. 10... The Wolves shot 57.1% in the Dec. 5 triumph over Utah, their highest percentage since hitting 59.0% vs. Phoenix on Jan. 29, 2007... They hit a season-low 32.6% vs. Dallas on Nov. 13, one of 14 sub-40% nights; however, *they've finished shy of 40% only twice in the last 26 games*... The 37.4% effort vs. Washington on Dec. 26 marked the first time Minnesota has won with a sub-40% night since Mar. 19, 2008 vs. Memphis... The Wolves currently rank 24th in FG accuracy (44.7%) and 20th in scoring (98.0 ppg); they were 29th (44.1%) and 21st (97.8 ppg) last year...

AT THE OTHER END: Charlotte finished at 53.6% on Wednesday, the 12th time in 29 starts Minnesota has given up 50%+; seven of those have been 55%+ (including Phoenix' 56.1% effort on Mar. 16)... Opponents have cracked the Century Mark in each of the past 14; *Minnesota is permitting 113.8 ppg and 49.3% shooting in those 14*... Minnesota held Miami to 88 points on Feb. 23, their 2nd-best defensive total of the year (87 by Milwaukee, Nov. 6) and the first time they'd kept a team below 100 away from Target Center since the 103-99 victory at New Jersey on Dec. 23... Phoenix exploded for 152 points on Mar. 16, the most ever allowed by the Wolves; they've surrendered 146 twice, most recently at Golden State on Nov. 9... *It's just the fifth 150+ performance by an NBA team in a regulation game over the past 15 years*; the final 38-point spread equals the fourth-biggest loss ever suffered by Minnesota... The Wolves have allowed 120+ on 15 occasions, including Utah's 122-point flurry on Mar. 17, and have lost 12 games by 20+ points... Minnesota is 29th in scoring defense (107.6 ppg) and 25th in defensive FG pct. (47.7%); they were 22nd (102.7 ppg) and 26th (47.4%) a year ago...

ALL YOU NEED IS...: Orlando posted a 51-39 rebounding edge on Friday, the fifth double-figure deficit Minnesota has faced in the last eight games; San Antonio piled up a 48-38 advantage on Mar. 12, the Wolves' first 10+ deficit since Feb. 10 vs. Charlotte... *They're being outboarded by -8.0 rpg (39.3-47.3) in those eight*, after racking up margins of 10+ in three of their first four March starts (a +8.8 rpg advantage)... The Wolves outrebounded Dallas 54-39 on Mar. 8 and followed up by posting a 53-43 margin vs. Denver two nights later (10th and 11th double-digit advantages of the year)... They outrebounded New York 58-36 on Jan. 31, their third spread of 20+ (56-36 vs. Indiana, Jan. 8; 49-29 vs. New Orleans, Dec. 9)... The Wolves collected 65 rebounds in the triple-OT game at Houston on Jan. 15, tying the franchise single-game record set vs. Philadelphia on Feb. 3, 1991 (double-OT)... *Minnesota is 13th in the NBA in offensive rebound percentage (.269) and 17th in total rebound percentage (.503)*, having crested at 7th and 7th, respectively, in January... Minnesota ranks 4th in the NBA in second-chance points (14.3 ppg); they finished 3rd in that category last year (14.6 ppg)...

TURNOVER TROUBLE: Dallas converted 26 Timberwolves miscues into 32 points on Mar. 8, while committing just nine TOs of its own (leading to eight Minnesota points)... *Over their past 13 starts, the Wolves are facing a -9.9 ppg deficit (12.7-22.6) in points off TOs*... They're averaging 16.8 TOs in those 13, while forcing just 12.3 per contest (including a season-low seven Mar. 16 at Phoenix)... The Wolves committed 28 turnovers Nov. 9 at Golden State, one short of the franchise single-game record; they coughed it up 29 times at New Jersey on Nov. 4, 2002... Meanwhile, the Warriors' 22 steals on Nov. 9 mark the highest total in an NBA game in over 12 years, since Atlanta swiped 23 at Philadelphia on Apr. 9, 1997... The Wolves collected 15 steals Oct. 28 vs. New Jersey, the 15th time in club history they've come up with 15+; the franchise single-game mark is 17, set most recently at New Jersey on Mar. 24, 2000... *Minnesota ranks 12th in steals (7.36 spg)*; however, they're last in both blocked shots (3.60 bpg) and turnovers (16.2 per game)...

LONG-RANGE PLANS: New York finished 17-for-40 from beyond the arc on Jan. 26, equaling the highest total of three-pointers ever allowed by Minnesota (Golden State, Apr. 12, 1995); Orlando hit 15-for-37 on New Year's Day, while Indiana finished 16-for-32 a week later (Jan. 8)... The Knicks' 40 attempts are also the most ever by a Wolves opponent... *Minnesota has allowed 10+ three-pointers on 21 occasions* (most recently Orlando's 13-for-36 effort on Friday), permitting a league-leading average of 7.55 treys per night (6th-highest average in NBA history)... The Wolves sank a season-high 12 treys (in 22 attempts) Feb. 5 at Dallas, and hit a season-best 60.0% (9-for-15) from beyond the arc Mar. 14 at Sacramento... They're allowing a combined 36.1% (ranking 23rd), *but have cut that to 32.1% (70-for-218) over the last nine*; offensively, the Wolves have risen to 23rd in three-point accuracy (33.9%)...

NO FREE LUNCH: The Wolves finished 33-for-45 from the line Jan. 8 vs. Indiana, their busiest night in nearly four years (since a 40-for-51 outing vs. New York on Mar. 26, 2006) and just the third time in 10 years they've attempted 45+... *Minnesota has seen its FT frequency rise to 25.1 attempts per game in 12 March starts*, after averaging just 20.4 trips last month... Toronto's 40-for-48 effort on Dec. 8 marks the most prolific night by a Wolves opponent in nearly 10 years (since Phoenix went 43-for-49 on Mar. 14, 2000) and just the 9th time an opponent has converted 40+ FTs... Minnesota sank all 18 of its FT attempts Nov. 21 at Portland, the 17th perfect night in franchise annals; the club record for most FTs made without a miss is 24 (at Phoenix, Apr. 5, 2003)... *They rank 20th in FT accuracy (74.5%) and 24th in FTs attempted (23.2 per game)*; a year ago, Minnesota ended 15th (76.9%) and 19th (23.9 per game)...

WRITING IN THE MARGINS: The Jan. 29 win over the Clippers marked the second game this year in which the Wolves never trailed (also Dec. 18 vs. Sacramento), while their 23-point, 3rd-quarter lead represents the biggest they've enjoyed at any point this season... New York jumped to a 15-0 lead on Jan. 26, the most consecutive points allowed by the Wolves to start a game... Meanwhile, *the Kings ran off 23 unanswered points on Mar. 14* (from 56-49 in the late second to 79-49 in the mid-third quarter), the longest such string ever by a Minnesota opponent; Charlotte put together a 20-0 second-quarter blitz (from 34-43 to 54-43) on Wednesday... The 112-109 loss at Dallas on Mar. 3 dropped Minnesota's record to 3-9 in one-possession games (decided by three points or less); they finished 6-8 a year ago... The Jan. 18 home win vs. Philadelphia was Minnesota's second overtime game in six days and 100th all-time (44 wins, 56 losses)... Houston beat the Wolves 120-114 on Jan. 13 at the Toyota Center, the first triple-overtime game in franchise history...
