Last Game: Monday, Dec. 30 – Dallas 100, Minnesota 98

Shawn Marion tallied a season-high 32 points and blocked Kevin Love's game-tying effort as time expired to give Dallas a 100-98 victory over the Timberwolves on Monday night at Target Center. Marion had 10 first-quarter points to help stake the Mavericks to a 29-23 lead. Minnesota went more than four minutes without a field goal in the second period before Nikola Pekovic's strike at the 5:29 mark, but Dallas responded with a 23-10 flourish -- capped by Marion's buzzer-beater -- to hike the margin to 62-43 at halftime. Trailing by as many as 21 early in the third, the Wolves scored on 17 of their final 19 possessions and drew even at 81-81 on Corey Brewer's dunk. A 3-pointer from Kevin Love put Minnesota on top 86-85 and J.J. Barea added a layup at the 8:45 mark, but Dallas outscored the Wolves 12-2 over the next 5:00 and pulled ahead 97-90 on Dirk Nowitzki's jumper. Minnesota then rallied to within two on a Pekovic basket with 39.9 seconds left before coming up empty on its final trip. Love finished with 36 points and 11 rebounds for the Wolves, while Pekovic added 18 points and 10 boards, and Ricky Rubio handed out 13 assists.

Previous Game: Saturday, Dec. 28 – Minnesota 117, Milwaukee 95

Kevin Love collected 33 points and 15 rebounds as the Timberwolves rolled to a 117-95 victory over Milwaukee on Saturday night at the Bradley Center. The Bucks went in front 22-19 on a Brandon Knight three-point play, but Alexey Shved's go-ahead trey highlighted a 9-0 counter and Minnesota went on to take a 34-28 lead after one quarter. Dante Cunningham pushed the margin to 14 midway through the second, but Milwaukee rallied to within five before Love's 3-pointer helped the Wolves rebuild a 64-55 cushion at the half. Minnesota then opened the third with 14 unanswered points until an O.J. Mayo triple got the Bucks on the board at the 7:26 mark, and cracked the Century Mark on Love's basket with 1:47 left. Up 103-76 entering the fourth quarter, the Wolves misfired on 12 consecutive shots and Milwaukee crept as close as 107-93 with 3:30 to play. The comeback stalled at that point, however, and the Wolves went on to notch their sixth 20-point win of the season. Kevin Martin scored 20 points and Nikola Pekovic had 19 with 11 rebounds for Minnesota, while Khris Middleton netted 23 points and nine boards for the Bucks.

First Meeting: Nikola Pekovic scored a career-high 31 points and Andrei Kirilenko chipped in 21 points and 11 rebounds in the Wolves' 113-102 triumph on Dec. 14 at the New Orleans Arena. Luke Ridnour added 15 points and 10 assists for Minnesota, while Austin Rivers led the Hornets with a season-high 27 points and Greivis Vásquez handed out a career-high 17 assists.

Second Meeting: Greivis Vásquez had 18 points and 13 assists, and New Orleans scrambled back from an early 18-point deficit to beat the Wolves, 104-92, on Jan. 11 at the New Orleans Arena. Eric Gordon tallied 16 points and Al-Farouq Aminu had 13 boards for the Hornets. Luke Ridnour's 20 points led Minnesota while Nikola Pekovic added 18 points and Andrei Kirilenko chipped in 17.

Third Meeting: Dante Cunningham's 18 points featured a club-record 9-for-9 shooting performance and topped a 68-point bench contribution as the Timberwolves snapped their six-game losing streak by routing New Orleans, 115-86, on Feb. 2 at Target Center. Anthony Davis led the Hornets with 18 points and Robin López finished with 16.

Fourth Meeting: Derrick Williams scored a career-high 28 points and Andrei Kirilenko blocked New Orleans' final two attempts as the Timberwolves held on for a 97-95 victory on Mar. 17 at Target Center. Minnesota received 16 points from Ricky Rubio, while Greivis Vásquez led the Hornets with 24 points and Robin López added 20 points and 11 rebounds.

HIT THE GROUND RUNNING: Minnesota outscored the Lakers 47-23 in the opening 12 minutes on Nov. 10, marking the highest-scoring quarter in franchise history. The Wolves lead the NBA in 1st-quarter scoring, tallying 28.9 points (47.3%) through 31 starts; Dallas (27.7 points) and Houston (27.2) rank 2nd and 3rd, respectively. A quarter-by-quarter look at 2013-14 to date for Minnesota:

LOVE WEEK'S BEST IN WEST: On Nov. 4, Timberwolves forward Kevin Love was named the NBA's Western Conference Player of the Week for games played Oct. 29-Nov. 3. Love led Minnesota to a 3-0 record for the week, averaging a league-best 29.7 ppg, 14.7 rpg and 3.7 apg while shooting 50.0% from the floor, 38.1% from three-point range and 79.5% from the FT line. He tallied 31 points and 17 rebounds in the 120-115 OT victory over Orlando on Opening Night (Oct. 30), sinking the game-tying trey with 10.1 seconds left in regulation. He put up a 24-point, 12-rebound effort as the Wolves routed Oklahoma City, 100-81, on Nov. 1, then capped the week by pouring in 34 points with 15 rebounds and five assists in Minnesota's 109-100 triumph at New York on Nov. 3. It's the first weekly honor of Love's career; he becomes the sixth player in franchise history to win the award, joining Kevin Garnett (15 times), Al Jefferson (twice), Stephon Marbury (Feb. 21, 1999), Sam Cassell (Dec. 28, 2003) and Nikola Pekovic (Apr. 8, 2013).

BREWER'S BLEND: Corey Brewer currently ranks 7th in the NBA in fast break scoring by tallying 5.1 ppg in that category. Meanwhile, Nikola Pekovic (5.2 ppg) and Kevin Love (5.2 ppg) rank 1-2 in second-chance scoring, and Kevin Martin is 4th on the league leader board for points off TOs (4.6 ppg). WOLF TRACKS: Minnesota kicked off its first three-game homestand of the season with Monday's 100-98 loss to Dallas... It's their first setback in three outings this year vs. Dallas, and drops them three games behind the 8th-place Mavericks (18-13) in the Western Conference playoff chase... Minnesota posted its second 22-point victory in as many nights with last Saturday's 117-95 verdict at Milwaukee... They notched a 120-98 triumph over Washington on Dec. 27, gaining a split of the season series after falling 104-100 on Nov. 19 at the Verizon Center... The Wolves have won a league-leading six games by 20+ points this year (Indiana and Oklahoma City have five such wins)... Minnesota completed a winless weekend in Los Angeles with the 120-116 OT loss at the Clippers on Dec. 22... L.A. has now beaten the Wolves eight straight times overall, including three (by a combined 10 points) this season... Minnesota began the trip with a 104-91 loss to the Lakers on Dec. 20... The Wolves posted a 120-109 triumph over Portland on Dec. 18, beating the Blazers for only the third time in their past 24 meetings (dating to 2007)... Minnesota completed its first three-game trip of the season with the 101-97 loss at Boston on Dec. 16; the swing began with a 117-110 defeat in San Antonio on Dec. 13 and continued with a 101-93 win at Memphis on Dec. 15... The Wolves took a nine-point lead into the 4th quarter at San Antonio before falling; they've now lost five games this year when leading or tied after three... Minnesota overcame a 19-point, 2nd-quarter deficit to beat Philadelphia, 106-99, on Dec. 11, its lone double-digit comeback of the year... Oklahoma City made up an 11-point deficit to beat Minnesota, 113-103, on Dec. 1, the second time this season the Wolves have let a double-digit lead slip away; they built a 16-point, 2nd-quarter advantage before faltering Nov. 19 at Washington... Minnesota ended its season-high three-game losing streak with a 112-106 triumph at Dallas on Nov. 30... Minnesota fell 93-92 at Cleveland on Nov. 4 and is now 0-8 in games decided by four points or fewer...

SCHEDULE NOTES: Minnesota is 4-3 all-time on New Year's Day, winning its past two outings (99-82 vs. Dallas in 2012, 103-88 vs. New Jersey in 2011)... Tonight's contest is the second in a 12-day stretch that sees the Wolves play five of six at Target Center; six of their previous eight games were on the road... Minnesota's January slate features 15 games, 10 of which are vs. teams currently below .500... The Dec. 7 loss to Miami concluded a run of six straight games vs. teams with .500+ records; Minnesota went 1-5 in that stretch, with four of the losses by double-figure spreads... The Dec. 28 win at Milwaukee wrapped up the ninth of 20 back-to-back sets this year... They're 3-6 on the tail ends of back-to-backs; the next one isn't until Jan. 17-18... The Dec. 11 win over Philadelphia capped a string of three in a row vs. Eastern Conference opponents for Minnesota; seven of their past 10 wins have come against Eastern foes...

ON TARGET: Minnesota finished at 29.3% in the Dec. 7 loss to Miami, the lowest single-game percentage in franchise history... The previous mark (and the only other sub-30% effort) was 29.6%, set vs. Dallas on Feb. 27, 2007... However, Minnesota has seen its accuracy climb to 47.4% in the past four games, after hitting just 40.9% in the previous 15... Overall, the Wolves rank 26th in the NBA at 42.9% but 2nd in scoring (106.2 ppg) behind Portland; they're tallying 112.8 ppg in the last four contests... At the other end, Miami's 55.1% effort on Dec. 7 was on the heels of a 56.3% night by Oklahoma City on Dec. 1 (the top percentage vs. Minnesota this year)... The Wolves have allowed 50%+ in eight of their past 17 starts (two in the first 14); Minnesota's defensive percentage has jumped to 49.2% in those 17... They rank last in the NBA in defensive FG percentage (47.4%), as well as 23rd in scoring defense (102.2 ppg)...

THIEVERY CORPORATION: The 14-steal effort Saturday at Milwaukee marks the 14th time in 31 games the Wolves have reached double digits; they registered 29 such games a year ago, which was their top single-season total since 2000-01... Ricky Rubio and Corey Brewer have combined for 137 steals, the most-prolific duo in the NBA this year (Chris Paul/Blake Griffin are 2nd with 116)... Philadelphia's 26 TOs on Dec. 11 are the most the Wolves have forced this year and one of 11 times they've generated 20+... Minnesota is 3rd in the NBA in steals (9.19 spg); the club record is 9.62 spg, set in 1989-90... The Wolves committed a season-low 5 TOs Dec. 27 vs. Washington; they've sliced their TOs to 13.2 per game in the last nine, including a seven-TO night on Dec. 16 at Boston and a nine-TO outing Dec. 15 at Memphis... Minnesota is 7th in fewest TOs (14.3 per game) and 3rd in TOs forced (16.9)...

THE BOARD REPORT: The Wolves outboarded Dallas 46-39 on Monday, the seventh consecutive game (and 14th in the last 16) they've held the edge... The recent surge has boosted Minnesota into 3rd place in the NBA in total rebound pct (.524); they're also 2nd in offensive rebound pct (.297) and 10th in defensive rebound pct (.750)... The Wolves were on the short end of a 54-44 count on Nov. 23 at Houston, the largest deficit they've faced this season; the most recent time they've been outboarded was Dec. 15 at Memphis... Minnesota posted a 46-36 margin Nov. 27 vs. Denver, its second double-digit edge this season (49-37 vs. Cleveland, Nov. 13)... The Wolves have compiled a +2.4 rpg edge for the year (46.2-43.9), but have bumped that to +5.2 rpg (47.1-41.9) in the past 16 games...

THREES & FREES: Minnesota went 31-for-38 from the line Dec. 27 vs. Washington, setting a season high for makes; the Wolves rank 3rd by averaging 27.2 FTAs per night... They also rank 2nd in the NBA in FTs made per game (21.6), 4th in FT accuracy (79.6%) and 4th in fouls drawn (22.6)... At the other end, Minnesota's opponents are attempting just 17.6 FTs per night, the fewest in the NBA (San Antonio is 2nd at 18.9)... The Wolves went 12-for-26 from long range Dec. 15 at Memphis, a season high for makes; Minnesota is 14-6 when hitting 7+ three-pointers (1-10 when making fewer than seven)... They've hiked their three-point accuracy to 36.0% (89-for-247) over the past 11 games (going 6-5), after slipping to 28.5% (57-for-200) in the previous eight... The Wolves rank 12th in three-pointers made (7.9 per game) and 25th in three-point accuracy (33.6%)... At the other end, Houston's 17 treys made on Nov. 23 equal the 3rd-highest total ever vs. Minnesota; however, they're allowing just 32.3% from long range in the last 12 (45.6% in the previous eight)...

ONE FOR THE BOOKS: The Wolves erupted for 47 points in the 1st quarter of the Nov. 10 win over the Lakers, the highest-scoring quarter in franchise history... Previously, Minnesota had scored 46 on two occasions: Dec. 26, 1997 vs. New Jersey (4th quarter) and Apr. 19, 1992 vs. Charlotte (2nd quarter)... It's the 28th time in NBA history that a team has scored 47+ points in a 1st quarter, and the first since Denver poured in 48 vs. Seattle (en route to a 168-116 victory) on Mar. 16, 2008... The 24-point lead enjoyed by the Wolves after 12 minutes equals the 2nd-most-lopsided quarter in franchise annals; the top performance in that category occurred on Feb. 7, 2001 at Target Center, when Minnesota led Sacramento 41-10 at the end of one period (a 117-88 victory)...

IT TAKES A THIEF: Ricky Rubio finished the season ranked 2nd in the NBA in steals per game (2.40), breaking the club single-season record (2.17) previously set by Micheal Williams in 1992-93. As a team, the Wolves collected 700 steals overall (8.54 spg), their highest total since swiping 789 and 712 steals in their first two years (1989-90 and 1990-91). BULLSEYE: Dante Cunningham shot 9-for-9 from the floor en route to a game-high 18-point effort in the Feb. 2 win over New Orleans. It's the most FGs any Timberwolves player has ever made without missing in a game; Trenton Hassell held the previous mark with an 8-for-8 night at Denver on Nov. 4, 2004. Cunningham's performance topped a 68-point contribution by Minnesota's bench, which is the 5th-highest single-game total in franchise history; the Wolves finished at a season-best 58.4% from the floor vs. New Orleans:

WOLF TRACKS: Minnesota ended 2012-13 with a 31-51 record, its highest victory total since finishing 32-50 in 2006-07; this year's winning percentage (.378) fell short of the .394 (26-40) mark the Wolves compiled a season ago... Minnesota's season was highlighted by two wins apiece vs. San Antonio, Oklahoma City and Denver, the Western Conference's top three teams record-wise... Minnesota has now missed the postseason in nine straight seasons, after advancing to the playoffs every year from 1996-97 through 2003-04 (eight)... The current absence is the longest active postseason drought; Sacramento (seven), Toronto (five) and Washington (five) are next on that list... The Wolves began the season 16-15 (through Jan. 8), then endured a 7-28 stretch (Jan. 9-Mar. 21) before splitting their final 16 contests... The 107-101 home win over Detroit on Apr. 6 marked Rick Adelman's 1000th victory as an NBA head coach... Minnesota closed with four wins in its final seven away from Target Center, including a season-high three-game road winning streak (Mar. 22-26-Apr. 3)... The wins at Detroit (105-82 on Mar. 26) and Phoenix (117-86 on Mar. 22) marked the first time in club history that the Wolves have registered 20-point victories in consecutive road games... The final 31-point spread at Phoenix equals the second-largest road win in franchise history (and ties the 10th-largest overall); they won by 35 at Philadelphia (119-84) on Dec. 8, 2004... Prior to the three-game road winning streak, Minnesota had suffered through an 11-week stretch that saw them drop 17 of 18 road games; the Feb. 11 victory at Cleveland bisected droughts of eight (Jan. 9-Feb. 10) and nine games (Feb. 22-Mar. 21)... Memphis pulled away for a 99-86 win on Mar. 30 at Target Center... Minnesota took a 67-65 lead into the fourth period before being outscored 34-19 by the Grizzlies; they dropped 13 games when leading after three (second behind Cleveland's 14) and lost 18 games after building leads of 10+ points... Houston spotted the Wolves a 20-point, 3rd-quarter cushion before rallying to win 108-100 on Mar. 15; it's the biggest lead Minnesota let slip away this year and the 13th time in franchise history they've lost after building a lead of 20+ points...

NUMEROLOGY: The Wolves tied their season high by scoring 117 points vs. the L.A. Lakers on Mar. 27 (also Mar. 22 at Phoenix)... Minnesota boosted its scoring to 101.1 ppg (46.1%) over the final 16 contests, after netting just 90.3 ppg in its previous 13 games... The Wolves were held to a season-low-tying 77 points Mar. 18 at Memphis (also Mar. 10 vs. Dallas and Jan. 17 vs. the L.A. Clippers)... Minnesota collected 114 points Dec. 15 vs. Dallas, its third straight game with a season-high total; the Wolves went 19-7 this year when scoring 100+... At the other end, Minnesota permitted 100+ points in 30 of its final 53 starts; Oklahoma City's 127 points on Feb. 22 were the most by a Wolves foe this season... They allowed 98.1 ppg on the year, their best figure since limiting opponents to 93.6 ppg in 2005-06... The Wolves were a season-high 33-for-44 from the FT line Feb. 20 vs. Philadelphia, one of 25 times they attempted 30+; Phoenix' 10-for-14 night on Apr. 13 was the 37th time an opponent took fewer than 20 trips... On the season, Minnesota ranked 6th in the NBA in FT attempts per game (24.9) and 5th in fewest FT attempts allowed per game (20.1)... The Wolves ended last in the league in three-point accuracy (30.5%), 24th in FG accuracy (43.9%), 21st in FT accuracy (74.2%) and 20th in scoring (95.7 ppg)...

PLAYING THE PERCENTAGES: Minnesota shot 56.3% Mar. 17 vs. New Orleans, its best percentage since shooting a season-high 58.4% vs. the Hornets on Feb. 2... The Wolves finished at 53.2% in beating Detroit on Mar. 26, their third straight 50%+ outing (13 total)... Minnesota was held to a season-low 33.7% on Mar. 18 at Memphis, one of 19 sub-40% nights this year... Phoenix' 50.7% effort on Apr. 13 marked the seventh time in the final 13 games the Wolves allowed 50%+; they permitted a combined 49.2% in the last 13 (including 58.3% by Utah on Apr. 12)... Minnesota kept Houston to 32.1% on Jan. 19, its best defensive pct. since Indiana hit 29.6% on Mar. 9, 2011 (12th-lowest in club history)... Dallas shot 59.7% on Jan. 14, the top figure by a Minnesota foe this season... The Wolves ranked 24th in defensive FG pct (46.8%), 15th in scoring defense (98.1 ppg), 4th in TOs forced (15.9 per game) and 5th in steals (8.54 spg)... The Wolves blocked a season-high 12 shots Jan. 2 at Utah, and picked off a club-record-tying 17 steals Apr. 13 vs. Phoenix... They collected 33 points off 28 Suns miscues in the latter game, matching their season best and top single-game total since 2002...

THE BOARD REPORT: The Wolves posted a 49-39 edge on the glass Mar. 12 vs. San Antonio, their 18th double-digit advantage this year (10 such games in 2011-12); the club record is 23, set in 2001-02... Still, Minnesota was outrebounded in 36 of its final 52 games, after holding the edge in 22 of the first 30; they faced an average deficit of -3.5 rpg (39.6-43.1) over the last 52 contests... Chicago piled up a 52-32 board advantage on Mar. 24, Minnesota's largest deficit this season... Golden State enjoyed a 60-44 spread on Apr. 9, one of 12 times the Wolves were outrebounded by 10+; the 60 boards are the most in a game vs. Minnesota since 2003... The Wolves outboarded Miami by a 53-24 count on Dec. 18, the largest single-game margin (+29) in club history... On the year, Minnesota ranked 12th in offensive rebound pct (.274), 11th in defensive rebound pct (.740) and 10th in total rebound pct (.507)...

NO THREES, PLEASE: The Wolves went 14-for-26 from beyond the arc in the Mar. 26 win at Detroit, hitting a club-record 12 treys in the 2nd half... Minnesota ended the season at 30.5% from three-point range; however, that figure climbed to 36.2% (98-for-271) over the final 15 games... The overall percentage is their lowest since shooting 29.8% (122-for-410) in the abbreviated 1998-99 campaign... Minnesota shot 13-for-25 from three-point range Dec. 4 at Philadelphia, one of seven games with 10+ makes; they hit 12-for-20 vs. San Antonio on Mar. 12... Meanwhile, Portland went 16-for-24 (66.7%) on Jan. 5, the single-game season high in both treys made and three-point accuracy vs. Minnesota... Wolves opponents combined to shoot 39.1% (393-for-1006) from beyond the arc over the final 53 games; Minnesota had limited teams to just 33.1% (183-for-553) from three-point distance in its first 29 contests this season...

SCHEDULE NOTES: Minnesota enjoyed a 5-5 final month, after compiling a 1-26 record over its previous three Aprils... The Apr. 17 triumph at San Antonio marked the Wolves' first victory in a season finale in five years (110-101 OT vs. Milwaukee, Apr. 16, 2008), and also halted a 16-game losing streak at the AT&T Center that dated to January 2004... Minnesota faced four groupings of four-games-in-five-nights this season, including three in the final five weeks (Mar. 9-13, Mar. 26-30, Apr. 9-13)... The Mar. 30 game vs. Memphis completed Minnesota's second seven-games-in-10-nights run in March (Mar. 9-18, Mar. 21-30); they went 8-14 on the tail end of back-to-back sets this season, after going 5-15 in those situations a year ago... The Wolves finished 20-21 for their best home record since going 20-21 in 2006-07... Minnesota drew an SRO 20,340 vs. Houston on Dec. 26, the third-largest crowd in Target Center history...
