Last Game: Saturday, Jan. 18 – Minnesota 98, Utah 72

Nikola Pekovic registered 27 points and a season-high 14 rebounds, and the Timberwolves took advantage of Utah's historically-poor shooting night to post a comfortable 98-72 victory on Saturday night at Target Center. Consecutive jumpers from Kevin Martin triggered an early 9-0 burst and Minnesota went on to open a 23-14 lead after one period. The Wolves connected on just two of their first eight attempts in the second quarter before finishing with a 22-4 barrage, capped by Martin's 3-pointer with 2.6 seconds left, to push the margin to 51-23 at halftime. Pekovic and Kevin Love then teamed up to score the first seven points of the third period as the lead ballooned to 35. Trey Burke ignited an 11-0 response that narrowed the gap to 60-36, but the Jazz could get no closer the rest of the way. Pekovic collected 14 points in the quarter and Ricky Rubio's layup in the final minute gave Minnesota its largest lead of the night at 79-43. Martin tallied 20 points and Love added 18 with 13 rebounds for the Wolves. Alec Burks (18 points) was the only double-figure scorer for Utah, which set a franchise record low by shooting 28.8% from the floor.

Previous Game: Friday, Jan. 17 – Toronto 94, Minnesota 89

Kyle Lowry hit six 3-pointers as part of a game-high 24-point night and Toronto continued its decade-long Air Canada Centre mastery over the Timberwolves with a 94-89 victory on Friday night. The Raptors never trailed, bolting to a 12-2 lead as Minnesota misfired on nine of its first 10 shots. Dante Cunningham's dunk brought the Wolves to within three early in the second period before back-to-back triples from Lowry rebuilt Toronto's advantage to 44-31 at the 3:42 mark. However, Kevin Love's basket in the closing seconds capped a 9-0 response that narrowed the deficit to four at intermission, and Love opened the second half with a long-range strike to cut it to 44-43. Lowry sank another pair of 3-pointers to give the Raptors their largest lead of the night at 67-53 with 3:06 to play and Toronto took an eight-point lead into the fourth. Minnesota cut it to 85-83 on Kevin Martin's trey with 1:27 left, but DeMar DeRozan responded with a basket and Lowry sealed it by sinking a 3-pointer with 14.9 seconds remaining. Amir Johnson contributed 19 points for the Raptors, while Martin led Minnesota with 18 points and Love added 16 points and 12 rebounds.

WOLF TRACKS: Minnesota snapped its three-game losing streak by downing Utah, 98-72, on Saturday; the final 26-point margin represents the Wolves' largest ever in the series... It was the second time this season they'd dropped three in a row (also Nov. 23-25-27); at 19-21, they're four games behind 8th-place Dallas (24-18) in the Western Conference playoff race... Minnesota enjoyed the lead for just 4:15 of 144 total minutes during its three-game drought (1:58 at San Antonio on Jan. 12, 2:17 vs. Sacramento on Jan. 15, 0:00 at Toronto)... The Raptors dealt Minnesota a 94-89 setback on Friday, the Wolves' 10th loss in a row at the Air Canada Centre dating to Jan. 21, 2004... Sacramento handed the Wolves a 111-108 defeat; five of their past seven losses (dating to the 120-116 OT setback at the Clippers on Dec. 22) have been by four points or fewer... They slip to 0-11 in that category this season and have dropped 19 of their last 20 in games decided by four or less, dating to January 2013... Minnesota fell below the .500 mark with the 104-86 setback at San Antonio on Jan. 12, its second loss at the AT&T Center in the past month... The final 18-point spread represents the Wolves' biggest road loss of the season and second-largest overall (103-82 vs. Miami, Dec. 7)... The Wolves earned a split of their two-game homestand with the 119-92 triumph over Charlotte on Jan. 10; they began the homestand by falling 104-103 to Phoenix on Jan. 8...

MARGINAL INFORMATION: Minnesota recorded its league-leading ninth 20-point victory with Saturday's decision vs. Utah; the Wolves have now built leads of 30+ points in 10 of their 40 games to date (also a league high)... Minnesota registered a 126-95 win at Philadelphia on Jan. 6; the 31-point spread equals the 2nd-largest road win in club history... The Wolves wrapped their first three-game homestand of the season with the 115-111 loss to Oklahoma City on Jan. 4... They built a 13-point, 4th-quarter edge before faltering, the third time they've let a double-digit lead slip away... Minnesota overcame a 19-point, 2nd-quarter deficit to beat Philadelphia, 106-99, on Dec. 11, its lone double-digit comeback of the season... On the flipside, Oklahoma City made up an 11-point deficit to beat Minnesota, 113-103, on Dec. 1; the Wolves built a 16-point, 2nd-quarter advantage before falling, 104-100, on Nov. 19 at Washington...

SCHEDULE NOTES: Saturday's win over Utah wrapped up the 10th of 20 back-to-back sets this season for the Wolves; they're 7-3 in the openers and 4-6 on the tail ends of back-to-backs thus far... Minnesota kicks off its first four-game road trip of the season tonight; at the conclusion of this sojourn (Jan. 27 at Chicago), they'll play seven of their next 10 at home... The Dec. 7 loss to Miami concluded a run of six consecutive games vs. teams with .500+ records... The Dec. 11 victory over Philadelphia capped a string of three in a row vs. Eastern Conference opponents for Minnesota; nine of their past 14 wins have come against Eastern foes...

ON TARGET: Utah's 28.8% outing on Saturday marks the 2nd-lowest percentage ever by a Wolves opponent (Toronto shot 27.5% on Nov. 1, 2003)... Minnesota shot a season-high 55.7% on Jan. 1 vs. New Orleans, one of four 50%+ nights and its first since hitting 50.6% at Dallas on Nov. 30 (14 games)... The Wolves have seen their accuracy climb to 45.9% (while averaging 108.8 ppg) in the past 13 games, after hitting just 40.9% in the previous 15... Minnesota finished at 29.3% in the Dec. 7 loss to Miami, the lowest single-game percentage in franchise history... Overall, the Wolves rank 26th in the NBA at 43.4% but 2nd in scoring (106.4 ppg); the club single-season record for scoring average is 101.1 ppg, set in 1997-98... At the other end, San Antonio's 56.8% effort on Jan. 12 marks the top percentage by a Wolves opponent this season; Minnesota's defensive percentage has jumped to 48.3% over the past 26 games...

THIEVERY CORPORATION: The season-high 16-steal effort Jan. 12 at San Antonio is one of 20 times in 40 games the Wolves have reached double digits; they had 29 such games a year ago, which was their top single-season total since 2000-01... Ricky Rubio and Corey Brewer have combined for 168 steals, the most-prolific duo in the NBA this year (Michael Carter-Williams/Thaddeus Young rank 2nd with 141)... Philadelphia's 26 TOs on Dec. 11 are the most the Wolves have forced this year and one of 15 times they've generated 20+... Minnesota is 2nd in the NBA in steals (9.25 spg); the club record is 9.62 spg, set in 1989-90... The Wolves committed a season-low 5 TOs Dec. 27 vs. Washington; they've sliced their TOs to 13.2 per game in the last 20, including a seven-TO night on Dec. 16 at Boston and a nine-TO outing Dec. 15 at Memphis... Minnesota is 8th in fewest TOs (14.0 per game) and 2nd in TOs forced (16.9)...

THE BOARD REPORT: Minnesota outrebounded Utah 60-42 on Saturday, its 2nd-biggest margin of the season and fifth double-digit spread overall... The Wolves were on the short end of a 45-35 count Jan. 15 vs. Sacramento, tying the largest deficit they've faced this year... Oklahoma City posted a 45-40 advantage on Jan. 4, the first time Minnesota had come up short at home since Nov. 6 vs. Golden State and one of just five times in the past 25 games they've been outboarded... The recent surge has boosted the Wolves into 2nd place in total rebound pct (.525); they're also 3rd in offensive rebound pct (.290) and 5th in defensive rebound pct (.759)... The Wolves have compiled a +2.7 rpg edge for the year (46.2-43.5), but have bumped that to +4.7 rpg (46.7-42.0) in the past 25 games...

THREES & FREES: The Wolves went 16-for-26 from long range Jan. 6 at Philadelphia, a season high for makes; Minnesota is 17-8 when hitting 7+ three-pointers (2-13 when fewer than seven)... They've boosted their three-point accuracy to 37.2% (157-for-422) over the past 20 games, after hitting at a 32.3% clip (155-for-480) in the first 20 contests... The Wolves rank 15th in three-pointers made (7.8 per game) and 21st in three-point accuracy (34.6%)... At the other end, San Antonio's 9-for-13 (69.2%) effort on Jan. 12 is a season high percentage vs. Minnesota; they're allowing 39.7% from long range in January (33.2% in December)... Minnesota went 31-for-38 from the line Dec. 27 vs. Washington, setting a season high for makes; the Wolves are 3rd by averaging 27.1 FTAs per night... They also rank 3rd in the NBA in FTs made per game (21.2), 5th in FT accuracy (78.2%) and 3rd in fouls drawn (22.8 per game)... At the other end, Minnesota's opponents are attempting just 18.3 FTs per night, the fewest in the NBA (San Antonio is 2nd at 18.5)...

ONE FOR THE BOOKS: The Wolves erupted for 47 points in the 1st quarter of the Nov. 10 win over the Lakers, the highest-scoring quarter in franchise history... Previously, Minnesota had scored 46 on two occasions: Dec. 26, 1997 vs. New Jersey (4th quarter) and Apr. 19, 1992 vs. Charlotte (2nd quarter)... It's the 28th time in NBA history that a team has scored 47+ points in a 1st quarter, and the first since Denver poured in 48 vs. Seattle (en route to a 168-116 victory) on Mar. 16, 2008... The 24-point lead enjoyed by the Wolves after 12 minutes equals the 2nd-most-lopsided quarter in franchise annals; the top performance in that category occurred on Feb. 7, 2001 at Target Center, when Minnesota led Sacramento 41-10 at the end of one period (a 117-88 victory)...

IT TAKES A THIEF: Ricky Rubio finished the season ranked 2nd in the NBA in steals per game (2.40), breaking the club single-season record (2.17) previously set by Micheal Williams in 1992-93. As a team, the Wolves collected 700 steals overall (8.54 spg), their highest total since swiping 789 and 712 steals in their first two years (1989-90 and 1990-91). WOLF TRACKS: Minnesota ended 2012-13 with a 31-51 record, its highest victory total since finishing 32-50 in 2006-07; this year's winning percentage (.378) fell short of the .394 (26-40) mark the Wolves compiled a season ago... Minnesota's season was highlighted by two wins apiece vs. San Antonio, Oklahoma City and Denver, the Western Conference's top three teams record-wise... Minnesota has now missed the postseason in nine straight seasons, after advancing to the playoffs every year from 1996-97 through 2003-04 (eight)... The current absence is the longest active postseason drought; Sacramento (seven), Toronto (five) and Washington (five) are next on that list... The Wolves began the season 16-15 (through Jan. 8), then endured a 7-28 stretch (Jan. 9-Mar. 21) before splitting their final 16 contests... The 107-101 home win over Detroit on Apr. 6 marked Rick Adelman's 1000th victory as an NBA head coach... Minnesota closed with four wins in its final seven away from Target Center, including a season-high three-game road winning streak (Mar. 22-26-Apr. 3)... The wins at Detroit (105-82 on Mar. 26) and Phoenix (117-86 on Mar. 22) marked the first time in club history that the Wolves have registered 20-point victories in consecutive road games... The final 31-point spread at Phoenix equals the second-largest road win in franchise history (and ties the 10th-largest overall); they won by 35 at Philadelphia (119-84) on Dec. 8, 2004... Prior to the three-game road winning streak, Minnesota had suffered through an 11-week stretch that saw them drop 17 of 18 road games; the Feb. 11 victory at Cleveland bisected droughts of eight (Jan. 9-Feb. 10) and nine games (Feb. 22-Mar. 21)... Memphis pulled away for a 99-86 win on Mar. 30 at Target Center... Minnesota took a 67-65 lead into the fourth period before being outscored 34-19 by the Grizzlies; they dropped 13 games when leading after three (second behind Cleveland's 14) and lost 18 games after building leads of 10+ points...
