Last Game: Friday, Feb. 7 – New Orleans 98, Minnesota 91

Anthony Davis tallied 26 points and 10 rebounds, while Eric Gordon and Anthony Morrow keyed a fourth-quarter comeback as New Orleans downed the Wolves, 98-91, on Friday night at the Smoothie King Center. Minnesota led 26-25 after one quarter behind nine points from Corey Brewer, and pushed its advantage to 44-35 late in the second period when Kevin Love converted a three-point play. Tyreke Evans' last-second layup pulled the Pelicans to within five at the break, but Minnesota remained in front throughout the third and ended the quarter with a 10-2 spurt to lead 71-61. Following a J.J. Barea basket that kept the Wolves on top by nine with 10:00 to play, New Orleans responded with a 16-2 barrage – capped by Davis' jumper at the 5:12 mark – to overtake Minnesota, 82-77. Jumpers by Morrow and Brian Roberts pushed the margin to seven, and after the Wolves rallied to within 94-91 in the final minute, Roberts beat the shot-clock buzzer to seal the win for New Orleans. Gordon finished with 20 points and Roberts added 16 for the Pelicans. Love paced Minnesota with 26 points and 19 rebounds while Brewer tacked on 16 points.

Previous Game: Wednesday, Feb. 5 – Oklahoma City 106, Minnesota 97

Kevin Durant scored 26 points and Reggie Jackson added 20 points and nine assists as Oklahoma City pulled away in the fourth quarter for a 106-97 victory over the Timberwolves on Wednesday night at Chesapeake Energy Arena. Jackson's 3-pointer ignited a 12-0 burst that put the Thunder up by seven, but Dante Cunningham helped Minnesota rally to within 26-25 after one quarter. The Wolves grabbed their biggest lead when J.J. Barea made it 39-33 midway through the second, only to see Durant beat the buzzer with a trey to put Oklahoma City in front 56-54 at halftime. Neither team led by more than four in the third period, which ended with Derek Fisher's 3-pointer as time expired for an 80-77 Thunder advantage. Oklahoma City then outscored the Wolves 13-4 to begin the fourth to extend the margin to a dozen. Robbie Hummel's long-range strike brought Minnesota to within 95-89 at the 3:45 mark, but the Wolves misfired on two chances to narrow the gap further in suffering their ninth straight loss in Oklahoma City. Ricky Rubio led Minnesota with 19 points, eight rebounds and five assists, while Cunningham had 18 points and eight boards.

WOLF TRACKS: Minnesota suffered its fourth setback in five starts with Friday's 98-91 loss at New Orleans, missing a chance to complete a sweep of the three-game season series... The defeat drops the Wolves two games below .500 on the season (24-26) and 5.5 behind 8th-place Dallas (30-21) in the Western Conference playoff race... Minnesota began the two-game trip with Wednesday's 106-97 defeat at Oklahoma City, its ninth straight loss at Chesapeake Energy Arena... Minnesota stopped its brief two-game losing streak with Tuesday's 109-99 decision vs. Los Angeles, its first home win over the Lakers since a 117-107 double-OT victory on Mar. 6, 2007... Minnesota opened February with last Saturday's 120-113 loss in Atlanta; one night earlier, Memphis dealt the Wolves a 94-90 setback... Minnesota began the homestand with a 88-77 win vs. New Orleans on Jan. 29; they'd completed a 3-1 road trip with the 95-86 triumph at Chicago on Jan. 27... It's the first time they've picked up three victories on one trip since a 4-0 swing in December 2005... Portland ended Minnesota's three-game winning streak with the 115-104 verdict on Jan. 25; it's the second time this season they've put together three consecutive wins, having opened 3-0 (Oct. 30-Nov. 3)... The Wolves claimed a 121-120 victory at Golden State on Jan. 24 -- their first this season in a game decided by four points or less, halting a 14-game losing streak in that category which dated to 2012-13 (11 this year)... The Wolves completed a sweep of their home-and-home set with Utah by winning 112-97 on Jan. 21 in Salt Lake City... Minnesota fell 104-86 at San Antonio on Jan. 12, its biggest road loss of the season and second-largest overall (having suffered a 103-82 defeat vs. Miami, Dec. 7)... Six of the Wolves' ensuing seven losses have been by single-digit spreads...

MARGINAL INFORMATION: Minnesota's 88 points vs. New Orleans on Jan. 29 are the fewest they've scored in a victory this season and mark just the second time they've won in the past 30 when tallying fewer than 90... The Wolves have won three of their past six contests when being held below 100; the 98-72 victory over Utah on Jan. 18 halted an 18-game losing streak in that category (0-10 this year)... Minnesota recorded its league-leading ninth 20-point win with the Jan. 18 decision vs. Utah; the Wolves have now built leads of 30+ points in 10 of their 50 games to date (also a league high)... Minnesota posted a 126-95 win at Philadelphia on Jan. 6; the 31-point spread equals the 2nd-largest road win in club history... The Wolves suffered a 115-111 home loss to Oklahoma City on Jan. 4... They built a 13-point, 4th-quarter advantage on the Thunder before faltering; they've let double-figure leads slip away on five occasions... Minnesota overcame a 19-point, 2nd-quarter deficit to beat Philadelphia, 106-99, on Dec. 11, its lone double-digit comeback this year...

SCHEDULE NOTES: Tonight's game wraps up the 14th of 21 back-to-back sets for the Wolves this season; they're 9-5 in the openers and 4-9 on the tail ends of back-to-backs thus far... It also completes the second of two four-games-in-five-nights grinds for Minnesota; they finished 1-3 in the previous quartet (Nov. 19-23)... The Wolves concluded their first four-game road trip of the season Jan. 27 at Chicago; they'll begin the first of two four-game homestands tonight vs. Portland... Beginning Jan. 24 at Golden State and running through the end of February, 11 of Minnesota's 16 games are vs. teams currently at .500+ on the season... The Dec. 7 loss to Miami completed a run of six consecutive games vs. teams with .500+ records... The Dec. 11 victory over Philadelphia capped a string of three in a row vs. Eastern Conference opponents for Minnesota; 10 of their past 19 wins have come against Eastern foes...

ON TARGET: Utah's 28.8% outing on Jan. 18 marks the 2nd-lowest percentage ever by a Wolves opponent (Toronto shot 27.5% on Nov. 1, 2003)... Minnesota shot a season-high 55.7% on Jan. 1 vs. New Orleans, the first of three 50%+ nights in January (five total); they hit 50.0% Jan. 24 at Golden State... The Wolves have seen their accuracy climb to 45.4% (while averaging 105.9 ppg) in the past 23 games, after hitting just 40.9% in the previous 15... Minnesota finished at 29.3% in the Dec. 7 loss to Miami, the lowest single-game percentage in franchise history... Overall, the Wolves rank 26th in the NBA at 43.7% but 3rd in scoring (105.5 ppg); the club single-season record for scoring average is 101.1 ppg, set in 1997-98... At the other end, San Antonio's 56.8% effort on Jan. 12 marks the top percentage by a Wolves opponent this season; Minnesota's defensive percentage has jumped to 47.6% over the past 36 games...

THIEVERY CORPORATION: The season-high 16-steal effort Jan. 12 at San Antonio is one of 20 times in 50 games the Wolves have reached double digits; they had 29 such games a year ago, which was their top single-season total since 2000-01... Ricky Rubio and Corey Brewer have combined for 205 steals, the most-prolific duo in the NBA this year (Michael Carter-Williams/Thaddeus Young rank 2nd with 187)... Philadelphia's 26 TOs on Dec. 11 are the most the Wolves have forced this year and one of 15 times they've generated 20+... Minnesota is 6th in the NBA in steals (8.80 spg), but has dipped to 7.50 spg in the past 16... The Wolves committed a season-low 5 TOs Dec. 27 vs. Washington; they've sliced their TOs to 13.2 per game in the last 30, including a seven-TO night on Dec. 16 at Boston and a nine-TO outing Jan. 21 at Utah... Minnesota ranks 7th in fewest TOs (13.9 per game) and 4th in TOs forced (16.3)...

THE BOARD REPORT: Minnesota outrebounded the Lakers 53-38 on Tuesday, its 3rd-biggest margin of the season and sixth double-digit spread overall... The Wolves were on the short end of a 49-39 count Wednesday at Oklahoma City, tying the largest deficit they've faced this year... The Thunder posted a 45-40 advantage on Jan. 4, the first time Minnesota had come up short at home since Nov. 6 vs. Golden State and one of just nine times in the past 35 games they've been outboarded... The recent surge has boosted the Wolves into 4th place in total rebound pct (.520); they're also 6th in offensive rebound pct (.280) and 5th in defensive rebound pct (.759)... The Wolves have compiled a +2.3 rpg edge for the year (45.8-43.5), but have bumped that to +3.6 rpg (46.0-42.4) in the past 35 games...

THREES & FREES: The Wolves went 16-for-26 from long range Jan. 6 at Philadelphia, a season high for makes; Minnesota is 20-9 when hitting 7+ three-pointers (4-17 when fewer than seven)... They've slipped to 30.0% (39-for-130) in their past seven outings, after hitting at a 39.9% clip (79-for-198) in the previous 10... The Wolves rank 16th in three-pointers made (7.5 per game) and 26th in three-point accuracy (34.4%)... At the other end, San Antonio's 9-for-13 (69.2%) effort Jan. 12 is a season high percentage vs. Minnesota; they're allowing 43.0% (37-for-86) from long range in February, after giving up just 28.5% in the previous seven... Minnesota went 33-for-39 from the line Feb. 1 at Atlanta, setting season highs in both categories; the Wolves stand 3rd by averaging 27.1 FTAs per night... They also rank 3rd in the NBA in FTs made per game (21.2), 4th in FT accuracy (78.4%) and 3rd in fouls drawn (22.9 per game)... At the other end, Minnesota's opponents are attempting just 18.5 FTs per night, the fewest in the NBA (San Antonio is 2nd at 19.5)...

IT TAKES A THIEF: Ricky Rubio finished the season ranked 2nd in the NBA in steals per game (2.40), breaking the club single-season record (2.17) previously set by Micheal Williams in 1992-93. As a team, the Wolves collected 700 steals overall (8.54 spg), their highest total since swiping 789 and 712 steals in their first two years (1989-90 and 1990-91). WOLF TRACKS: Minnesota ended 2012-13 with a 31-51 record, its highest victory total since finishing 32-50 in 2006-07; this year's winning percentage (.378) fell short of the .394 (26-40) mark the Wolves compiled a season ago... Minnesota's season was highlighted by two wins apiece vs. San Antonio, Oklahoma City and Denver, the Western Conference's top three teams record-wise... Minnesota has now missed the postseason in nine straight seasons, after advancing to the playoffs every year from 1996-97 through 2003-04 (eight)... The current absence is the longest active postseason drought; Sacramento (seven), Toronto (five) and Washington (five) are next on that list... The Wolves began the season 16-15 (through Jan. 8), then endured a 7-28 stretch (Jan. 9-Mar. 21) before splitting their final 16 contests... The 107-101 home win over Detroit on Apr. 6 marked Rick Adelman's 1000th victory as an NBA head coach... Minnesota closed with four wins in its final seven away from Target Center, including a season-high three-game road winning streak (Mar. 22-26-Apr. 3)... The wins at Detroit (105-82 on Mar. 26) and Phoenix (117-86 on Mar. 22) marked the first time in club history that the Wolves have registered 20-point victories in consecutive road games... The final 31-point spread at Phoenix equals the second-largest road win in franchise history (and ties the 10th-largest overall); they won by 35 at Philadelphia (119-84) on Dec. 8, 2004... Prior to the three-game road winning streak, Minnesota had suffered through an 11-week stretch that saw them drop 17 of 18 road games; the Feb. 11 victory at Cleveland bisected droughts of eight (Jan. 9-Feb. 10) and nine games (Feb. 22-Mar. 21)... Memphis pulled away for a 99-86 win on Mar. 30 at Target Center... Minnesota took a 67-65 lead into the fourth period before being outscored 34-19 by the Grizzlies; they dropped 13 games when leading after three (second behind Cleveland's 14) and lost 18 games after building leads of 10+ points... Houston spotted the Wolves a 20-point, 3rd-quarter cushion before rallying to win 108-100 on Mar. 15; it's the biggest lead Minnesota let slip away this year and the 13th time in franchise history they've lost after building a lead of 20+ points...

SCHEDULE NOTES: Minnesota enjoyed a 5-5 final month, after compiling a 1-26 record over its previous three Aprils...
