Nikola Pekovic returned from a six-game absence to score 26 points and Kevin Love netted his second triple-double of the season (22 points, 10 rebounds, 10 assists) as the Timberwolves posted a record-setting 143-107 win over Los Angeles on Friday night at Target Center. Minnesota never trailed, bolting to a 20-4 lead and expanding that to 41-24 after one quarter as Pekovic and Love combined for 27 points. Pekovic's three-point play made it 69-32 late in the second before the Lakers closed to within 31 by halftime. The Wolves reached triple digits on Pekovic's basket at the 4:54 mark of the third quarter and Los Angeles could get no closer than 30 the rest of the way, with Minnesota taking its largest lead of the night when Chase Budinger made it 132-91 with 4:06 remaining in the contest. Gorgui Dieng's dunk at the 2:12 mark set a new franchise single-game record for points, and the Wolves also broke their previous best for field-goal percentage by shooting 67.1% for the contest. Kevin Martin collected 17 points and Dieng added 14 with nine rebounds for Minnesota. Kent Bazemore's 21 points led the Lakers with Jodie Meeks chipping in 19.

Previous Game: Wednesday, Mar. 26 – Minnesota 107, Atlanta 83

Gorgui Dieng picked up his fifth double-double (15 points, 15 rebounds) in six games as the Timberwolves snapped a three-game losing streak by routing Atlanta, 107-83, on Wednesday night at Target Center. Corey Brewer beat the first-quarter buzzer to provide Minnesota with a 20-19 lead that they never relinquished. Chase Budinger ignited an 8-0 spurt that pushed the Wolves' advantage to 11 midway through the second, and after Mike Scott's 3-pointer pulled the Hawks to within five, Brewer again scored as time expired to send Minnesota into halftime with a 48-41 lead. Back-to-back dunks from Brewer and Kevin Love highlighted a 14-4 burst that put the Wolves on top 74-57 late in the third period, and Atlanta could get no closer than 14 the rest of the way. Treys by J.J. Barea and Budinger bookended an 11-0 uprising that gave Minnesota its largest lead of the night at 99-71 with 4:23 remaining and the Wolves went on to beat the Hawks for just the second time in their past 15 meetings. Brewer and Kevin Martin finished with 18 points apiece for Minnesota while Ricky Rubio contributed 10 assists and six steals. Scott's 15 points topped Atlanta.

Kevin Martin led Minnesota with 30 points, while Nikola Pekovic had a season-high 23 points and 10 rebounds, and Kevin Love contributed 23 points, 19 rebounds and seven assists.

Second Meeting: Chris Paul tallied 20 points and 11 assists – scoring 16 points in the final 5:08 – to lift Los Angeles to a 102-98 victory over the Timberwolves on Nov. 20 at Target Center. Blake Griffin contributed 20 points and 10 rebounds for the Clippers, while Kevin Martin led Minnesota with 28 points and a season-high 10 rebounds, and Nikola Pekovic chipped in 20 points.

Third Meeting: Chris Paul scored nine of his 19 points in overtime and added 13 assists as L.A. overcame a 45-point, 19-rebound effort from Kevin Love to edge the Timberwolves, 120-116, on Dec. 22 at Staples Center. Blake Griffin tallied 32 points for the Clippers, while Nikola Pekovic finished with a career-high 34 points and 14 rebounds for Minnesota.

WOLF TRACKS: Minnesota completed a 2-0 homestand with Friday's 143-107 triumph over the Lakers; prior to going 3-1 vs. L.A. this year, the Wolves had dropped 22 consecutive games in the series... Minnesota halted its three-game losing streak with Wednesday's 107-83 triumph over Atlanta... The skid began with the 129-106 defeat at Houston on Mar. 20 and also included losses vs. Phoenix (127-120 on Mar. 23) and at Memphis (109-92 on Mar. 24); Phoenix spotted the Wolves a 22-point advantage before rallying to win... Minnesota kicked off its two-night Texas swing with a 123-122 OT win at Dallas on Mar. 19... Minnesota held on for a 104-102 home win over Sacramento on Mar. 16; two nights earlier, they suffered a 105-93 loss at Charlotte... The Wolves finished a 2-2 homestand by defeating Milwaukee 112-101 on Mar. 11... The stand began with a 118-106 loss to New York on Mar. 5, snapping the Wolves' three-game winning streak (all on the road), and continued with a 114-101 win over Detroit (Mar. 7) and a 111-104 loss to Toronto (Mar. 9)... Minnesota capped a 4-1 West Coast trip with the 132-128 win at Denver on Mar. 3; it's the sixth time in club history they've won four games on a single trip, the first since December 2005... Minnesota spotted Phoenix an 81-75 lead entering the fourth quarter on Feb. 25 before rallying to win 110-101, just their third victory this year when trailing after three... Minnesota returned from the All-Star Break with a 104-91 win over Indiana on Feb. 19; they'd snapped their four-game skid with the 117-90 rout of Denver on Feb. 12...

MARGINAL INFORMATION: Minnesota recorded its franchise-record 12th 20-point victory with Friday's decision vs. Los Angeles; the Wolves have also now built leads of 30+ points in 13 of their 71 games to date, the top single-season total in the NBA since Utah had 14 such games in 1996-97... The 23-point defeat Mar. 20 at Houston represents the Wolves' largest of the season; they lost by 21 vs. Miami on Dec. 7... Minnesota's 88 points vs. New Orleans on Jan. 29 are the fewest they've scored in a victory this season and mark just the second time they've won in the past 30 when tallying fewer than 90... The Wolves claimed a 121-120 victory at Golden State on Jan. 24 -- their first this season in a game decided by four points or less, snapping a 14-game losing streak in that category; they're now 4-12 when the final margin is four or less, including 3-0 in March... The Wolves have won three times this year when being held below 100 points; the 98-72 victory over Utah on Jan. 18 halted an 18-game losing streak in that category (0-10 this year)...

ON TARGET: The Wolves set franchise single-game records for points scored (143) and FG accuracy (67.1%) in Friday's win over the Lakers... Combined with Wednesday's 50.0% effort vs. Atlanta, it's the first time they've hit 50%+ in back-to-back games this season... On the other hand, Houston's 129 points and 57.6% accuracy on Mar. 20 are both season bests vs. the Wolves; prior to the win over Atlanta, they'd allowed 100+ points in 11 straight games, surrendering 113.9 ppg (50.8%) in that span... Minnesota shot 55.7% Jan. 1 vs. New Orleans, one of nine 50%+ nights overall... The Wolves have won 11 in a row (9-0 this season) and 21 of their last 22 when shooting 50%+; including Atlanta's 37.8% outing on Wednesday, Minnesota has also won its last 21 starts when holding the opponent below 40%... Minnesota finished at 29.3% in the Dec. 7 loss to Miami, the lowest single-game percentage in club history... Overall, the Wolves rank 22nd in the NBA at 44.3% but are 3rd in scoring (106.9 ppg)... At the other end, Minnesota has allowed 50%+ accuracy 20 times (going 5-15); they're last in the NBA in FG percentage defense (47.1%) and 24th in scoring defense (103.3 ppg)...

THREES & FREES: The Wolves' 52-for-64 effort Mar. 3 at Denver shattered the franchise single-game records for FTs made and attempted... Minnesota is 3rd by averaging 27.9 FTAs per night; they also lead the league in FTs made per game (21.8) and rank 7th in FT accuracy (78.1%) and 3rd in fouls drawn (23.6 per game)... At the other end, Minnesota's opponents are attempting just 19.7 FTs per night, the fewest in the NBA this season... The Wolves went 16-for-26 from three-point range Jan. 6 at Philadelphia, a season high for makes; Minnesota is 26-15 when hitting 7+ treys... They've climbed to 37.7% (81-for-215) over the past 10 starts, after shooting at just a 28.1% clip (36-for-128) in the previous six... The Wolves rank 17th in three-pointers made (7.5 per game) but 26th in three-point accuracy (34.4%)... At the other end, San Antonio's 9-for-13 (69.2%) effort Jan. 12 is a season high percentage vs. Minnesota...

THE BOARD REPORT: Minnesota outrebounded the Lakers 49-26 on Friday, their largest margin of the season and seventh double-digit advantage overall; they enjoyed a 54-33 cushion vs. Charlotte on Jan. 10... On the flipside, the Bobcats posted a 54-35 edge on Mar. 14, the largest margin the Wolves have faced this year; they've come up short in 18 of the past 29 games... That stretch began with a 50-40 deficit at Portland on Jan. 25; before that, Minnesota had been outboarded in just seven of its previous 37... Oklahoma City posted a 45-40 edge on Jan. 4, the first time Minnesota had fallen short at home since Nov. 6 vs. Golden State... The Wolves rank 7th in total rebound pct (.513), 9th in offensive rebound pct (.274) and 12th in defensive rebound pct (.752)... They've compiled a +1.0 rpg advantage for the year (44.9-44.2), but are being outboarded by -4.5 rpg (41.1-45.5) in the past 11 contests...

THIEVERY CORPORATION: Minnesota tallied 32 points off 26 Atlanta TOs on Wednesday, the fifth time this year they've scored 30+ (season best is 37 at Houston on Nov. 23)... The Hawks' 26 TOs tie the most Minnesota has forced this season (the 18th time they've generated 20+)... The season-high 17-steal effort vs. Atlanta marks the 25th time the Wolves have reached double digits; they had 29 such games a year ago, which was their top total since 2000-01... Ricky Rubio and Corey Brewer have combined for 291 steals, the most-prolific duo in the NBA this year (Thaddeus Young/Michael Carter-Williams are 2nd with 265)... The Wolves committed a season-low five TOs Dec. 27 vs. Washington; however, they've committed 40 miscues in the past two games, after averaging just 11.3 TOs per contest in the previous 10... Minnesota ranks 4th in the NBA in fewest TOs (13.6 per game) and 3rd in TOs forced (16.3)...

THE NOISE IS WORKING: Tonight's game kicks off the 18th of 21 back-to-back sets for the Wolves in 2013-14; they're 11-6 in the openers and 4-13 on the tail ends of back-to-backs thus far... Minnesota concluded a five-game road trip Mar. 3 in Denver; starting Mar. 5 vs. New York, they're now in a four-week stretch that sees them play 10 of 15 at home... On the other hand, beginning with the Dec. 28 win at Milwaukee, the Wolves have gone 10-10 on the road but are 12-10 at Target Center... The Mar. 14 game at Charlotte capped a run of five straight vs. Eastern foes... The Feb. 8 game vs. Portland finished the second of two four-games-in-five-nights grinds for Minnesota (also Nov. 19-23)... Seven of the Wolves' first eight in March were vs. sub-.500 opponents; however, starting with the Mar. 19 victory in Dallas, 12 of Minnesota's final 16 contests will be against teams currently sporting winning records...

WOLF TRACKS: Minnesota ended 2012-13 with a 31-51 record, its highest victory total since finishing 32-50 in 2006-07; this year's winning percentage (.378) fell short of the .394 (26-40) mark the Wolves compiled a season ago... Minnesota's season was highlighted by two wins apiece vs. San Antonio, Oklahoma City and Denver, the Western Conference's top three teams record-wise... Minnesota has now missed the postseason in nine straight seasons, after advancing to the playoffs every year from 1996-97 through 2003-04 (eight)... The current absence is the longest active postseason drought; Sacramento (seven), Toronto (five) and Washington (five) are next on that list... The Wolves began the season 16-15 (through Jan. 8), then endured a 7-28 stretch (Jan. 9-Mar. 21) before splitting their final 16 contests... The 107-101 home win over Detroit on Apr. 6 marked Rick Adelman's 1000th victory as an NBA head coach... Minnesota closed with four wins in its final seven away from Target Center, including a season-high three-game road winning streak (Mar. 22-26-Apr. 3)... The wins at Detroit (105-82 on Mar. 26) and Phoenix (117-86 on Mar. 22) marked the first time in club history that the Wolves have registered 20-point victories in consecutive road games... The final 31-point spread at Phoenix equals the second-largest road win in franchise history (and ties the 10th-largest overall); they won by 35 at Philadelphia (119-84) on Dec. 8, 2004... Prior to the three-game road winning streak, Minnesota had suffered through an 11-week stretch that saw them drop 17 of 18 road games; the Feb. 11 victory at Cleveland bisected droughts of eight (Jan. 9-Feb. 10) and nine games (Feb. 22-Mar. 21)... Memphis pulled away for a 99-86 win on Mar. 30 at Target Center... Minnesota took a 67-65 lead into the fourth period before being outscored 34-19 by the Grizzlies; they dropped 13 games when leading after three (second behind Cleveland's 14) and lost 18 games after building leads of 10+ points... Houston spotted the Wolves a 20-point, 3rd-quarter cushion before rallying to win 108-100 on Mar. 15; it's the biggest lead Minnesota let slip away this year and the 13th time in franchise history they've lost after building a lead of 20+ points...

SCHEDULE NOTES: Minnesota enjoyed a 5-5 final month, after compiling a 1-26 record over its previous three Aprils... The Apr. 17 triumph at San Antonio marked the Wolves' first victory in a season finale in five years (110-101 OT vs. Milwaukee, Apr. 16, 2008), and also halted a 16-game losing streak at the AT&T Center that dated to January 2004... Minnesota faced four groupings of four-games-in-five-nights this season, including three in the final five weeks (Mar. 9-13, Mar. 26-30, Apr. 9-13)... The Mar. 30 game vs. Memphis completed Minnesota's second seven-games-in-10-nights run in March (Mar. 9-18, Mar. 21-30); they went 8-14 on the tail end of back-to-back sets this season, after going 5-15 in those situations a year ago... The Wolves finished 20-21 for their best home record since going 20-21 in 2006-07... Minnesota drew an SRO 20,340 vs. Houston on Dec. 26, the third-largest crowd in Target Center history...

Became the Trail Blazers' head coach on Feb. 18, 1989; he led them to the NBA Finals twice in his five full seasons on the bench (1990 and 1992) and won a career-best 63 games in 1990-91... Spent two seasons (1995-96 and 1996-97) with the Golden State Warriors before moving on to Sacramento in 1998... Took the Kings to the NBA Playoffs in each of his eight seasons there, including a trip to the Western Conference Finals in 2002; he compiled a 395-229 record (.633) to become the winningest coach in franchise history... Most recently, he coached the past four seasons (2007-08 through 2010-11) in Houston, a stint highlighted by a 22-game winning streak (Jan. 29-Mar. 16, 2008) that's the second-longest in NBA history... *Became the eighth coach in NBA history to reach the 1000-victory mark with the Apr. 6, 2013 win over Detroit*; he now leads all active coaches in wins... Has also compiled a 79-78 postseason record; his teams have qualified for the playoffs 16 times in his 22 seasons as a head coach... Has been runner-up for NBA Coach of the Year honors four times (1990-91, 2000-01, 2001-02 and 2008-09), and has coached the West team in the NBA All-Star Game on three occasions (1991, 2001, 2003)... Appeared in 462 games during his seven-year NBA career, beginning in 1968-69 with the San Diego Rockets; he also played for Portland, Chicago, the New Orleans Jazz and the Kansas City-Omaha Kings... Chosen in the 7th round (79th overall) of the 1968 NBA Draft by San Diego, he finished with career averages of 7.7 ppg, 2.4 rpg and 3.5 apg...
