C.J. Miles scored 19 points and Kyrie Irving added 15, and Cleveland built a 23-point, third-quarter lead before hanging on to beat the Timberwolves, 93-92, on Monday night at Quicken Loans Arena. Kevin Martin tallied 13 points in the opening period to keep Minnesota close, but Miles scored the Cavs' first 10 points of the second as part of a 14-4 blitz and Irving's jumper with 1:34 left in the half pushed Cleveland's lead to 55-36. The margin crested at 72-49 on an Alonzo Gee 3-pointer with 5:11 to play in the third, before Corey Brewer's three-point play capped a 12-2 rally that helped bring the Wolves to within 15 entering the fourth quarter. The Cavs still led 91-75 following a Miles trey at the 5:08 mark, but a three-point play by Kevin Love triggered a 17-2 race to the finish. Minnesota forced five Cleveland turnovers down the stretch, and Love pulled Minnesota to within one on a layup with 38.9 seconds left. However, Love misfired on the potential game-winning 3-pointer as time expired as the Wolves suffered their first loss of the season. Martin led Minnesota with 23 points and Love chipped in 17 points, 13 rebounds and five assists.

Previous Game: Sunday, Nov. 3 – Minnesota 109, New York 100

Kevin Love had 34 points, 15 rebounds and five assists, Kevin Martin added 30 points and the Timberwolves held off New York for a 109-100 victory on Sunday night at Madison Square Garden. Martin's 3-pointer triggered a 21-4 dash to the end of the first quarter that built a 40-19 lead. However, after an Alexey Shved trey early in the second, the Knicks held Minnesota to just one basket over the next five minutes and pulled within 47-33 on Carmelo Anthony's dunk at the 5:27 mark. Metta World Peace beat the halftime buzzer to keep the margin at 15, but the Wolves opened the third quarter with a 12-4 burst and took their largest lead when Corey Brewer made it 76-53 with 7:38 to play. Back-to-back treys from Martin helped Minnesota carry a 15-point cushion into the fourth, only to see New York rally to within 100-98 on 3-pointers from Anthony and Iman Shumpert. Martin answered with his fifth triple and Love tacked on a jumper to stem the comeback bid. Nikola Pekovic finished with 11 points and 12 rebounds for Minnesota, while Anthony's 22 points and 17 rebounds led the Knicks and Raymond Felton handed out 12 assists.

The Warriors are 19-5 in the past 24 overall and have won four in a row at Target Center since Minnesota's 126-123 victory on Feb. 27, 2011.

First Meeting: David Lee registered 18 points and 13 rebounds, and Harrison Barnes tacked on 18 points as Golden State rallied for a 106-98 victory on Nov. 16 at Target Center. Derrick Williams' 23 points led Minnesota, while Alexey Shved added a season-high 22 points and seven assists.

Second Meeting: Klay Thompson scored 24 points and Golden State held the Timberwolves to 11 points in the fourth quarter in rallying for a 96-85 victory on Nov. 24 at Oracle Arena. Stephen Curry finished with 20 points and Carl Landry added 18 for the Warriors, while Nikola Pekovic led Minnesota with 17 points and Kevin Love contributed 15 points and 15 rebounds.

Third Meeting: Jarrett Jack and Carl Landry combined for 42 points off the bench as Golden State overcame an early 16-point deficit to edge the Timberwolves, 100-99, on Feb. 24 at Target Center. Jack finished with 23 points and David Lee added 22 points and 13 rebounds for the Warriors, while Derrick Williams led Minnesota with 23 points and 12 boards.

Fourth Meeting: Klay Thompson scored 30 points and Stephen Curry added 24 points and 10 assists as Golden State clinched its first playoff berth since 2007 with a 105-89 victory over the Timberwolves on Apr. 9 at Oracle Arena. Andrew Bogut grabbed 14 rebounds for the Warriors, while Chase Budinger's 17 points led Minnesota and Andrei Kirilenko contributed 15.

Second Meeting: Nikola Pekovic's 21 points led six double-figure scorers and the Timberwolves celebrated Ricky Rubio's return with a 114-106 OT victory over Dallas on Dec. 15 at Target Center. Alexey Shved totaled 18 points and Rubio handed out a game-high nine assists for Minnesota, while Derek Fisher and O.J. Mayo scored 20 points apiece to lead the Mavericks.

Third Meeting: Darren Collison's 23 points and nine assists led six double-figure scorers as Dallas posted a 113-98 victory over the Timberwolves on Jan. 14 at American Airlines Center. O.J. Mayo finished with 20 points, seven rebounds and nine assists for the Mavericks. J.J. Barea's 21 points led Minnesota, while Nikola Pekovic registered 20 points and 12 rebounds.

LOVE WEEK'S BEST IN WEST: On Monday, Timberwolves forward Kevin Love was named the NBA's Western Conference Player of the Week for games played Oct. 29-Nov. 3. Love led Minnesota to a 3-0 record for the week, averaging a league-best 29.7 ppg, 14.7 rpg and 3.7 apg while shooting 50.0% from the floor, 38.1% from three-point range and 79.5% from the FT line. He tallied 31 points and 17 rebounds in the 120-115 OT victory over Orlando on Opening Night (Oct. 30), sinking the game-tying trey with 10.1 seconds left in regulation. He put up a 24-point, 12-rebound effort as the Wolves routed Oklahoma City, 100-81, on Nov. 1, then capped the week by pouring in 34 points with 15 rebounds and five assists in Minnesota's 109-100 triumph at New York on Nov. 3. It's the first weekly honor of Love's career; he becomes the sixth player in franchise history to win the award, joining Kevin Garnett (15 times), Al Jefferson (twice), Stephon Marbury (Feb. 21, 1999), Sam Cassell (Dec. 28, 2003) and Nikola Pekovic (Apr. 8, 2013).

WOLF TRACKS: Cleveland handed the Wolves their first loss of 2013-14 with Monday's 93-92 decision; the teams will round out their two-game season set when the Cavs visit Target Center next Wednesday (Nov. 13)... The contest wrapped up the first of 20 back-to-back sets for Minnesota in 2013-14; they had 22 such pairings a year ago, going 8-22 on the tail ends... Minnesota began the Eastern trip with Sunday's 109-100 win at New York, ending a four-game series losing streak vs. the Knicks as well as a five-year drought at Madison Square Garden... It's just the second time in franchise history the Wolves have won their first three contests; the franchise record for most consecutive wins to begin a season is six, set in 2001-02 en route to a 30-10 start... Minnesota capped a season-opening two-game homestand by defeating Oklahoma City 100-81 last Friday... The Wolves have now beaten the Thunder in three of the past five overall, having snapped a 12-game series losing streak with a 99-93 win last Dec. 20 at Target Center... The 81 points are the second-fewest Minnesota has ever allowed in the 95-game series (they won 88-77 at Seattle on Mar. 7, 1999), while the 34.9% accuracy is the lowest percentage shot by the Sonics/Thunder vs. Minnesota (previously 35.2% on Dec. 29, 2006 at Target Center)...

THREES & FREES: Minnesota finished 29-for-38 from the FT line on Sunday, its third consecutive game with 30+ trips; the Wolves currently rank 3rd in the NBA by averaging 32.3 FTAs per contest, trailing only Houston (38.3) and the L.A. Clippers (33.8)... They also rank 3rd in FTs made per game (25.5), 7th in FT accuracy (79.1%) and 2nd in fouls drawn (26.8 per contest)... Through four games, 46.3% of the Wolves' scoring (195 of 421 total points) has come via three-pointers and FTs, the 9th-highest ratio in the NBA... A year ago, that figure was 36.5% (2865 of 7851), which ranked 23rd; the league average was 38.9%... Minnesota went 10-for-27 from beyond the arc Sunday at New York, highlighted by Kevin Martin's 5-for-5 night which was one short of the club single-game record for treys made without a miss (Chuck Person, Feb. 10, 1993 vs. Miami)... In 2012-13, the Wolves averaged 5.5 made threes per game at a 30.5% clip, the lowest percentage in the NBA; they've boosted those figures to 7.8 per game and 31.0% this season...

FOR OPENERS: Kevin Love poured in 31 points in the Oct. 30 victory over Orlando, the second-highest Opening Night total in franchise history. Meanwhile, Ricky Rubio registered the first point/assist double-double in a season opener since Sam Cassell had 19 points and 11 assists vs. New York in 2004. WOLVES ON OPENING NIGHT: Minnesota began 2013-14 with the 120-115 OT victory over Orlando on Oct. 30, the 13th straight year they've started at home... The Wolves saw their 12-game winning streak in home openers halted by Denver on Nov. 2, 2007; that string dated to a 115-85 setback vs. Houston on Nov. 5, 1994... The Orlando game marked the fourth time in six years that Minnesota has played its season opener in October; they began on Dec. 26 in 2011-12 and on Nov. 2 a year ago... The Wolves have sold out nine of 25 home openers, most recently drawing a capacity 19,356 for last year's 92-80 win over Sacramento; the 2011-12 season began with an SRO crowd of 19,406 vs. Oklahoma City (a 104-100 Boxing Day loss)... All-time, Minnesota is 15-10 on Opening Night, having started 14 of the past 18 seasons with wins (the Nov. 2, 2007 loss to Denver ended a seven-game winning streak in that category); they're 17-8 in home openers... Minnesota improves to 5-2 all-time vs. the Eastern Conference on Opening Night, and is riding a five-game winning streak in that category since dropping a 104-99 decision at Detroit 20 years ago (Nov. 5, 1993)...

ROSTER NOTES: On Monday, Oct. 28, the Timberwolves announced their 15-man Opening Night roster, having reached the limit by waiving center Chris Johnson on Oct. 26 and guards Lorenzo Brown and Othys Jeffers on Oct. 25... Of the 15 players who ended 2012-13 with the Timberwolves, nine are back this season... Six new faces dot Minnesota's roster, including free-agent signees Corey Brewer, Ronny Turiaf and A.J. Price... Kevin Martin was picked up from Oklahoma City in a three-team trade that also involved Milwaukee... Three rookies are on the roster; Robbie Hummel was selected by the Wolves in the 2012 NBA Draft, while Gorgui Dieng and Shabazz Muhammad were acquired from Utah in a Draft-night deal this summer... Last November, the Wolves returned only seven of 15 players from their 2011-12 roster; they kept 10 of 13 players from 2010-11 to 2011-12... The current roster averages 3.7 years of NBA experience and has an average age of 26.0 years; last year's Opening Night group was at 3.6 and 26.5, respectively (3.7 and 25.3 in 2011-12)... Kevin Love remains Minnesota's longest-tenured player, entering his sixth season in a Timberwolves uniform...

PRESEASON NOTES: Minnesota wrapped up its 2013 preseason schedule with a 4-3 record following the last-second 99-98 loss at Detroit on Oct. 24... It's the Wolves' fourth consecutive winning preseason (6-2 in 2010, 2-0 in 2011, 5-2 in 2012); they're now 96-84 all-time in exhibition outings, winning 19 of their last 26 starts... The Detroit stop concluded a three-game Eastern swing for Minnesota; the trip began with a 104-89 victory over Boston on Oct. 20 in Montréal and continued with a 125-102 triumph at Philadelphia on Oct. 23... Two of the Wolves' three losses came at Target Center, a 108-106 overtime setback vs. CSKA Moscow in the Oct. 7 preseason opener and a 104-97 defeat vs. Toronto on Oct. 12... The former contest marked just the third time in franchise history Minnesota has faced a non-NBA opponent in the preseason... The Wolves faced a pair of back-to-back outings in October, sweeping the first set (Oct. 9 at Toronto, Oct. 10 vs. Milwaukee in Sioux Falls) before splitting the Philadelphia and Detroit contests to round out the preseason...

MARGINAL INFORMATION: The 23-point victory in Philly on Oct. 23 represents Minnesota's winning margin in a true road preseason game since routing Milwaukee 117-79 on Oct. 6, 2008 at the Bradley Center... The 125 points scored also match the Wolves' third-best preseason total overall and their highest since a 127-101 home triumph over Chicago on Oct. 15, 2002... The record was set in a 129-111 win vs. Detroit on Oct. 23, 1993 in Sioux Falls... Overall, Minnesota registered three double-digit wins last month but lost both of its one-possession games (decided by three points or less)... The Wolves ranked 5th in the NBA in scoring margin (+7.0 ppg), having led the league in that category last preseason (+11.6 ppg)... Minnesota won all four games in which they outrebounded the opposition, but went 0-3 when coming up short; they held a +1.4 rpg edge and finished the preseason ranked 11th in total rebounding pct. (.520)...

THE TRIPLE LINDY: The Wolves went 15-for-29 from beyond the arc in the Oct. 23 victory at Philadelphia, tying the second-highest single-game total for three-pointers made in the NBA this preseason as well as the second-highest total in any game (pre-, regular or postseason) in club history... Minnesota connected on 10+ treys in each of its final three outings, finishing October ranked 2nd in the league in three-pointers made (8.7 per game), 8th in attempts (23.1 per game) and 5th in three-point accuracy (37.7%)... The Wolves cleared the Century Mark four times in seven contests and ranked 2nd in the NBA in scoring (104.1 ppg) despite shooting just 41.8% from the floor (20th in the league)... However, they finished 2nd in both fewest TOs (14.6 per game) and most FT attempts (33.4 per game); in all, 48.4% of Minnesota's scoring -- 353 of 729 total points -- came via three-pointers (61) and free throws (170)... That was the second-highest ratio in the league this preseason, trailing only Houston's 49.1%... On the flipside, the Wolves finished 7th in lowest such ratio defensively, allowing 40.3% of its scoring -- 274 of 680 total points -- on three-pointers (46) and free throws (136)...

IT TAKES A THIEF: Ricky Rubio finished the season ranked 2nd in the NBA in steals per game (2.40), breaking the club single-season record (2.17) previously set by Micheal Williams in 1992-93. As a team, the Wolves collected 700 steals overall (8.54 spg), their highest total since swiping 789 and 712 steals in their first two years (1989-90 and 1990-91). WOLF TRACKS: Minnesota ended 2012-13 with a 31-51 record, its highest victory total since finishing 32-50 in 2006-07; this year's winning percentage (.378) fell short of the .394 (26-40) mark the Wolves compiled a season ago... Minnesota's season was highlighted by two wins apiece vs. San Antonio, Oklahoma City and Denver, the Western Conference's top three teams record-wise... Minnesota has now missed the postseason in nine straight seasons, after advancing to the playoffs every year from 1996-97 through 2003-04 (eight)... The current absence is the longest active postseason drought; Sacramento (seven), Toronto (five) and Washington (five) are next on that list... The Wolves began the season 16-15 (through Jan. 8), then endured a 7-28 stretch (Jan. 9-Mar. 21) before splitting their final 16 contests... The 107-101 home win over Detroit on Apr. 6 marked Rick Adelman's 1000th victory as an NBA head coach... Minnesota closed with four wins in its final seven away from Target Center, including a season-high three-game road winning streak (Mar. 22-26-Apr. 3)... The wins at Detroit (105-82 on Mar. 26) and Phoenix (117-86 on Mar. 22) marked the first time in club history that the Wolves have registered 20-point victories in consecutive road games... The final 31-point spread at Phoenix equals the second-largest road win in franchise history (and ties the 10th-largest overall); they won by 35 at Philadelphia (119-84) on Dec. 8, 2004... Prior to the three-game road winning streak, Minnesota had suffered through an 11-week stretch that saw them drop 17 of 18 road games; the Feb. 11 victory at Cleveland bisected droughts of eight (Jan. 9-Feb. 10) and nine games (Feb. 22-Mar. 21)... Memphis pulled away for a 99-86 win on Mar. 30 at Target Center... Minnesota took a 67-65 lead into the fourth period before being outscored 34-19 by the Grizzlies; they dropped 13 games when leading after three (second behind Cleveland's 14) and lost 18 games after building leads of 10+ points... Houston spotted the Wolves a 20-point, 3rd-quarter cushion before rallying to win 108-100 on Mar. 15; it's the biggest lead Minnesota let slip away this year and the 13th time in franchise history they've lost after building a lead of 20+ points...

NUMEROLOGY: The Wolves tied their season high by scoring 117 points vs. the L.A. Lakers on Mar. 27 (also Mar. 22 at Phoenix)... Minnesota boosted its scoring to 101.1 ppg (46.1%) over the final 16 contests, after netting just 90.3 ppg in its previous 13 games... The Wolves were held to a season-low-tying 77 points Mar. 18 at Memphis (also Mar. 10 vs. Dallas and Jan. 17 vs. the L.A. Clippers)... Minnesota collected 114 points Dec. 15 vs. Dallas, its third straight game with a season-high total; the Wolves went 19-7 this year when scoring 100+... At the other end, Minnesota permitted 100+ points in 30 of its final 53 starts; Oklahoma City's 127 points on Feb. 22 were the most by a Wolves foe this season... They allowed 98.1 ppg on the year, their best figure since limiting opponents to 93.6 ppg in 2005-06... The Wolves were a season-high 33-for-44 from the FT line Feb. 20 vs. Philadelphia, one of 25 times they attempted 30+; Phoenix' 10-for-14 night on Apr. 13 was the 37th time an opponent took fewer than 20 trips... On the season, Minnesota ranked 6th in the NBA in FT attempts per game (24.9) and 5th in fewest FT attempts allowed per game (20.1)... The Wolves ended last in the league in three-point accuracy (30.5%), 24th in FG accuracy (43.9%), 21st in FT accuracy (74.2%) and 20th in scoring (95.7 ppg)...

PLAYING THE PERCENTAGES: Minnesota shot 56.3% Mar. 17 vs. New Orleans, its best percentage since shooting a season-high 58.4% vs. the Hornets on Feb. 2... The Wolves finished at 53.2% in beating Detroit on Mar. 26, their third straight 50%+ outing (13 total)... Minnesota was held to a season-low 33.7% on Mar. 18 at Memphis, one of 19 sub-40% nights this year... Phoenix' 50.7% effort on Apr. 13 marked the seventh time in the final 13 games the Wolves allowed 50%+; they permitted a combined 49.2% in the last 13 (including 58.3% by Utah on Apr. 12)... Minnesota kept Houston to 32.1% on Jan. 19, its best defensive pct. since Indiana hit 29.6% on Mar. 9, 2011 (12th-lowest in club history)... Dallas shot 59.7% on Jan. 14, the top figure by a Minnesota foe this season... The Wolves ranked 24th in defensive FG pct (46.8%), 15th in scoring defense (98.1 ppg), 4th in TOs forced (15.9 per game) and 5th in steals (8.54 spg)... The Wolves blocked a season-high 12 shots Jan. 2 at Utah, and picked off a club-record-tying 17 steals Apr. 13 vs. Phoenix... They collected 33 points off 28 Suns miscues in the latter game, matching their season best and top single-game total since 2002...

THE BOARD REPORT: The Wolves posted a 49-39 edge on the glass Mar. 12 vs. San Antonio, their 18th double-digit advantage this year (10 such games in 2011-12); the club record is 23, set in 2001-02... Still, Minnesota was outrebounded in 36 of its final 52 games, after holding the edge in 22 of the first 30; they faced an average deficit of -3.5 rpg (39.6-43.1) over the last 52 contests... Chicago piled up a 52-32 board advantage on Mar. 24, Minnesota's largest deficit this season... Golden State enjoyed a 60-44 spread on Apr. 9, one of 12 times the Wolves were outrebounded by 10+; the 60 boards are the most in a game vs. Minnesota since 2003... The Wolves outboarded Miami by a 53-24 count on Dec. 18, the largest single-game margin (+29) in club history... On the year, Minnesota ranked 12th in offensive rebound pct (.274), 11th in defensive rebound pct (.740) and 10th in total rebound pct (.507)...

NO THREES, PLEASE: The Wolves went 14-for-26 from beyond the arc in the Mar. 26 win at Detroit, hitting a club-record 12 treys in the 2nd half... Minnesota ended the season at 30.5% from three-point range; however, that figure climbed to 36.2% (98-for-271) over the final 15 games... The overall percentage is their lowest since shooting 29.8% (122-for-410) in the abbreviated 1998-99 campaign... Minnesota shot 13-for-25 from three-point range Dec. 4 at Philadelphia, one of seven games with 10+ makes; they hit 12-for-20 vs. San Antonio on Mar. 12... Meanwhile, Portland went 16-for-24 (66.7%) on Jan. 5, the single-game season high in both treys made and three-point accuracy vs. Minnesota... Wolves opponents combined to shoot 39.1% (393-for-1006) from beyond the arc over the final 53 games; Minnesota had limited teams to just 33.1% (183-for-553) from three-point distance in its first 29 contests this season...

SCHEDULE NOTES: Minnesota enjoyed a 5-5 final month, after compiling a 1-26 record over its previous three Aprils... The Apr. 17 triumph at San Antonio marked the Wolves' first victory in a season finale in five years (110-101 OT vs. Milwaukee, Apr. 16, 2008), and also halted a 16-game losing streak at the AT&T Center that dated to January 2004... Minnesota faced four groupings of four-games-in-five-nights this season, including three in the final five weeks (Mar. 9-13, Mar. 26-30, Apr. 9-13)... The Mar. 30 game vs. Memphis completed Minnesota's second seven-games-in-10-nights run in March (Mar. 9-18, Mar. 21-30); they went 8-14 on the tail end of back-to-back sets this season, after going 5-15 in those situations a year ago... The Wolves finished 20-21 for their best home record since going 20-21 in 2006-07... Minnesota drew an SRO 20,340 vs. Houston on Dec. 26, the third-largest crowd in Target Center history...
