Last Game: Tuesday, Dec. 10 – Minnesota 121, Detroit 94

Kevin Love registered 26 points, 16 rebounds and seven assists as the Timberwolves rolled to a 121-94 victory over Detroit on Tuesday night at The Palace of Auburn Hills. Minnesota led 33-32 after one quarter, with the teams combining to shoot 63 percent from the floor. The Pistons took their only lead of the night when Andre Drummond's dunk put them on top, 42-41, with 7:11 left in the second period. However, Kevin Martin tallied 10 points during a 23-9 finish to the half that left the Wolves holding a 64-51 advantage. Detroit got as close as 11 when Chauncey Billups' 3-pointer cut it to 86-75 at the 2:11 mark of the third, but Martin countered with back-to-back treys and Nikola Pekovic's basket sent Minnesota into the fourth quarter with a 96-77 cushion. The Wolves pushed the margin to 30 on an A.J. Price 3-pointer in the final minute and went on to post their largest winning margin ever vs. Detroit. Martin and Pekovic finished with 18 points apiece for Minnesota, while Ricky Rubio added 15 points and nine assists. The Pistons were led by 20 points and seven assists from Brandon Jennings, with Josh Smith netting 17 points.

Previous Game: Saturday, Dec. 7 – Miami 103, Minnesota 82

LeBron James tallied 21 points, a season-high 14 rebounds and eight assists as Miami ended its brief two-game losing streak with a 103-82 victory over the Timberwolves on Saturday night at Target Center. Corey Brewer gave Minnesota its largest lead of the night at 25-19 late in the first quarter, but the Heat used a 16-2 burst over the next six minutes to take control. James extended the margin to 17 with 2:37 left in the half and a basket by Chris Bosh in the closing seconds kept Miami in front 55-42 at intermission. Brewer and Nikola Pekovic teamed up to pull the Wolves to within five midway through the third period, but Rashard Lewis' 3-pointer capped a 15-1 blitz that enabled the Heat to carry a 76-60 advantage into the fourth. Minnesota could get no closer than 14 the rest of the way and Dwyane Wade's dunk gave Miami its biggest lead at 94-70 with 5:22 remaining. Wade netted 19 points and Bosh pulled in nine rebounds for the Heat, which won for the sixth consecutive time at Target Center. Minnesota, shooting a club-record low 29.3% from the field, was led by 19 points from Kevin Martin while Pekovic added 18 with 12 rebounds.

HIT THE GROUND RUNNING: Minnesota outscored the Lakers 47-23 in the opening 12 minutes on Nov. 10, marking the highest-scoring quarter in franchise history. The Wolves lead the NBA in 1st-quarter scoring, tallying 30.3 points (49.3%) through 21 starts; Dallas (27.9 points) and Houston (27.6) rank 2nd and 3rd, respectively. A quarter-by-quarter look at 2013-14 to date for Minnesota:

LOVE WEEK'S BEST IN WEST: On Nov. 4, Timberwolves forward Kevin Love was named the NBA's Western Conference Player of the Week for games played Oct. 29-Nov. 3. Love led Minnesota to a 3-0 record for the week, averaging a league-best 29.7 ppg, 14.7 rpg and 3.7 apg while shooting 50.0% from the floor, 38.1% from three-point range and 79.5% from the FT line. He tallied 31 points and 17 rebounds in the 120-115 OT victory over Orlando on Opening Night (Oct. 30), sinking the game-tying trey with 10.1 seconds left in regulation. He put up a 24-point, 12-rebound effort as the Wolves routed Oklahoma City, 100-81, on Nov. 1, then capped the week by pouring in 34 points with 15 rebounds and five assists in Minnesota's 109-100 triumph at New York on Nov. 3. It's the first weekly honor of Love's career; he becomes the sixth player in franchise history to win the award, joining Kevin Garnett (15 times), Al Jefferson (twice), Stephon Marbury (Feb. 21, 1999), Sam Cassell (Dec. 28, 2003) and Nikola Pekovic (Apr. 8, 2013).

THE 30-30 CLUB: Kevin Love poured in 32 points with 15 rebounds and eight assists, and Kevin Martin added 32 points in the 116-108 win over Dallas on Nov. 8. It's the 19th time in franchise history (17th in a regular-season game) -- including the second this season -- that two Wolves players have tallied 30+ points in the same contest (Love/Martin on Nov. 3 at New York): (^Playoff game)

WOLF TRACKS: Minnesota picked up its second win in its last three road starts with Tuesday's 121-94 triumph at Detroit... The final 27-point spread represents the Wolves' largest ever vs. Detroit and equals the 6th-biggest winning margin all-time in a road game... Miami handed the Wolves their fifth loss in six starts with Saturday's 103-82 decision, the Heat's sixth straight victory in Minnesota... The Dec. 4 game vs. San Antonio, originally set for Arena Ciudad de México, was postponed and will instead be played at Target Center on a date to be determined... Oklahoma City made up an 11-point deficit to beat Minnesota, 113-103, on Dec. 1... It's the second time this season the Wolves have let a double-digit lead slip away; they built a 16-point, 2nd-quarter advantage before faltering Nov. 19 at Washington... On the flipside, the largest deficit Minnesota has overcome to win this year has been five points (four times)... The Wolves ended their three-game losing streak with a 112-106 triumph at Dallas on Nov. 30, beating the Mavericks for the second time this season (116-108 on Nov. 8)... The win also halted a five-game road drought for the Wolves and was their first win away from Target Center since beating the Lakers 113-90 on Nov. 10... They suffered defeats at the Clippers, Denver, Washington, Houston and Indiana during the skid... Denver beat the Wolves for the second time in two weeks with the 117-110 verdict on Nov. 27, having also notched a 117-113 win on Nov. 15... Indiana handed the Wolves a 98-84 setback on Nov. 25, holding Minnesota to a season-low point total... Minnesota rang up a 111-81 win over Brooklyn on Nov. 22; the final margin is the largest ever vs. the Nets and marks the 13th victory of 30+ points in club history... The 102-98 loss to the Clippers on Nov. 20 ended Minnesota's three-game Target Center winning streak... The Wolves notched a 106-88 triumph over Boston on Nov. 16; they'd ended an 11-game, five-year drought vs. the Celtics last Apr. 1... Minnesota fell 93-92 at Cleveland on Nov. 4 and is now 2-5 in two-possession games (decided by six points or fewer)...

SCHEDULE NOTES: Tonight's game caps a string of three in a row vs. Eastern Conference opponents for Minnesota; four of their past five wins have come against Eastern foes... It also wraps up the seventh of 20 back-to-back sets this season; the Wolves are 1-5 on the tail ends of back-to-backs thus far... Beginning Tuesday at Detroit, Minnesota plays eight times in 13 nights; with last Wednesday's postponement vs. San Antonio, they entered Tuesday having played just once in the previous eight days... The Wolves are in the midst of a three-week stretch in which eight of 11 games are away from Target Center... Saturday's loss to Miami concluded a run of six consecutive games vs. teams with .500+ records; Minnesota went 1-5 in that stretch, with four of the losses by double-figure spreads...

OFF TARGET: Minnesota finished at 29.3% from the floor (24-for-82) in Saturday's loss to Miami, the lowest single-game percentage in franchise history... The previous mark (and the only other sub-30% effort) was 29.6%, set vs. Dallas on Feb. 27, 2007; the four lowest percentages ever for the Wolves (and eight of the lowest 11) have come at home... Minnesota has seen its accuracy tumble to 40.7% over the past nine games, after hitting 44.0% through the first 12; overall, the Wolves rank 27th in the NBA at 42.6%... At the other end, Miami's 55.1% effort on Saturday comes on the heels of a 56.3% night by Oklahoma City on Dec. 1 (the top percentage vs. Minnesota this year)... The Wolves have allowed 50%+ in five of their past seven starts; Minnesota's defensive percentage has ballooned to 51.4% in those seven... They rank 28th in the NBA in defensive FG pct (47.2%), as well as 23rd in scoring defense (101.5 ppg)...

THIEVERY CORPORATION: Ricky Rubio and Corey Brewer have combined for 99 steals, the most-prolific duo in the NBA this season (Washington's John Wall and Trevor Ariza rank second with 78)... Tuesday's 12-steal effort at Detroit represents the 11th time in 21 games the Wolves have reached double digits; they registered 29 such games a year ago, which was their top single-season total since 2000-01... Minnesota leads the NBA in steals (9.62 spg), overtaking the Pistons (9.55) on Tuesday; the club record is 9.62 spg, set in 1989-90... Houston's 24 miscues on Nov. 23 equal the most the Wolves have forced this year (also Nov. 4 vs. Cleveland) and one of nine times they've generated 20+... Minnesota committed a season-low eight TOs on Nov. 22, outscoring Brooklyn 22-5 in points off... The Wolves have sliced their TOs to 13.7 per game over the last 14, after averaging 16.7 TOs in their first seven (including a season-high 21 in the Nov. 10 win at the Lakers)... Minnesota ranks 11th in fewest TOs (14.7 per game) and 2nd in TOs forced (17.7)...

THE BOARD REPORT: Minnesota outrebounded Detroit 46-39 on Tuesday, the sixth consecutive game the Wolves have held the edge... They were on the short end of a 54-44 count on Nov. 23 at Houston, the largest deficit Minnesota has faced this season as well as the most recent time they've been outboarded... The recent surge has boosted the Wolves into 5th place in the NBA in total rebound pct (.516); they're also 7th in offensive rebound pct (.284) and 14th in defensive rebound pct (.749)... Minnesota posted a 46-36 margin Nov. 27 vs. Denver, its second double-digit advantage this year (49-37 vs. Cleveland, Nov. 13)... The Wolves have put together a +1.0 rpg edge for the year (45.4-44.5), but have bumped that to +2.7 rpg (45.9-43.2) in the past 16 games...

THREES & FREES: Minnesota finished 29-for-39 from the line Saturday vs. Miami, setting season highs in both categories; the Wolves rank 4th by averaging 27.1 FTAs per contest... They also stand 3rd in FTs made per game (21.8), 4th in FT accuracy (80.3%) and 3rd in fouls drawn (22.8 per game)... Meanwhile, at the other end, Minnesota's opponents are attempting just 17.4 FTs per night, the 2nd-fewest in the NBA (San Antonio 17.3); they set a franchise single-game record low with nine fouls Nov. 30 at Dallas... The Wolves went 11-for-24 from beyond the arc Tuesday at Detroit, tying their season high for makes; Minnesota is 10-4 when hitting 7+ three-pointers (0-7 when less than seven)... The Wolves tied a club single-game record by hoisting 36 trey attempts Nov. 22 vs. Brooklyn; they rank 12th in three-pointers made (7.9 per game) and 24th in three-point accuracy (32.9%)... At the other end, Houston's 17 treys made on Nov. 23 equal the 3rd-highest total ever vs. Minnesota; they're allowing 41.3% (85-for-206) from three-point range in the last 10...

ONE FOR THE BOOKS: The Wolves erupted for 47 points in the 1st quarter of the Nov. 10 win over the Lakers, the highest-scoring quarter in franchise history... Previously, Minnesota had scored 46 on two occasions: Dec. 26, 1997 vs. New Jersey (4th quarter) and Apr. 19, 1992 vs. Charlotte (2nd quarter)... It's the 28th time in NBA history that a team has scored 47+ points in a 1st quarter, and the first since Denver poured in 48 vs. Seattle (en route to a 168-116 victory) on Mar. 16, 2008... The 24-point lead enjoyed by the Wolves after 12 minutes equals the 2nd-most-lopsided quarter in franchise annals; the top performance in that category occurred on Feb. 7, 2001 at Target Center, when Minnesota led Sacramento 41-10 at the end of one period (a 117-88 victory)...

IT TAKES A THIEF: Ricky Rubio finished the season ranked 2nd in the NBA in steals per game (2.40), breaking the club single-season record (2.17) previously set by Micheal Williams in 1992-93. As a team, the Wolves collected 700 steals overall (8.54 spg), their highest total since swiping 789 and 712 steals in their first two years (1989-90 and 1990-91). BOARD BLITZ: The Wolves outrebounded Miami 53-24 on Dec. 18, the largest single-game margin in franchise history. The 29-board advantage is the largest compiled by any team in a loss since Jan. 6, 1994, when Golden State was outrebounded by 35 but defeated San Antonio, 102-98. Minnesota also piled up a club-record 34 second-chance points vs. the Heat:

WOLF TRACKS: Minnesota ended 2012-13 with a 31-51 record, its highest victory total since finishing 32-50 in 2006-07; this year's winning percentage (.378) fell short of the .394 (26-40) mark the Wolves compiled a season ago... Minnesota's season was highlighted by two wins apiece vs. San Antonio, Oklahoma City and Denver, the Western Conference's top three teams record-wise... Minnesota has now missed the postseason in nine straight seasons, after advancing to the playoffs every year from 1996-97 through 2003-04 (eight)... The current absence is the longest active postseason drought; Sacramento (seven), Toronto (five) and Washington (five) are next on that list... The Wolves began the season 16-15 (through Jan. 8), then endured a 7-28 stretch (Jan. 9-Mar. 21) before splitting their final 16 contests... The 107-101 home win over Detroit on Apr. 6 marked Rick Adelman's 1000th victory as an NBA head coach... Minnesota closed with four wins in its final seven away from Target Center, including a season-high three-game road winning streak (Mar. 22-26-Apr. 3)... The wins at Detroit (105-82 on Mar. 26) and Phoenix (117-86 on Mar. 22) marked the first time in club history that the Wolves have registered 20-point victories in consecutive road games... The final 31-point spread at Phoenix equals the second-largest road win in franchise history (and ties the 10th-largest overall); they won by 35 at Philadelphia (119-84) on Dec. 8, 2004... Prior to the three-game road winning streak, Minnesota had suffered through an 11-week stretch that saw them drop 17 of 18 road games; the Feb. 11 victory at Cleveland bisected droughts of eight (Jan. 9-Feb. 10) and nine games (Feb. 22-Mar. 21)... Memphis pulled away for a 99-86 win on Mar. 30 at Target Center... Minnesota took a 67-65 lead into the fourth period before being outscored 34-19 by the Grizzlies; they dropped 13 games when leading after three (second behind Cleveland's 14) and lost 18 games after building leads of 10+ points... Houston spotted the Wolves a 20-point, 3rd-quarter cushion before rallying to win 108-100 on Mar. 15; it's the biggest lead Minnesota let slip away this year and the 13th time in franchise history they've lost after building a lead of 20+ points...

NUMEROLOGY: The Wolves tied their season high by scoring 117 points vs. the L.A. Lakers on Mar. 27 (also Mar. 22 at Phoenix)... Minnesota boosted its scoring to 101.1 ppg (46.1%) over the final 16 contests, after netting just 90.3 ppg in its previous 13 games... The Wolves were held to a season-low-tying 77 points Mar. 18 at Memphis (also Mar. 10 vs. Dallas and Jan. 17 vs. the L.A. Clippers)... Minnesota collected 114 points Dec. 15 vs. Dallas, its third straight game with a season-high total; the Wolves went 19-7 this year when scoring 100+... At the other end, Minnesota permitted 100+ points in 30 of its final 53 starts; Oklahoma City's 127 points on Feb. 22 were the most by a Wolves foe this season... They allowed 98.1 ppg on the year, their best figure since limiting opponents to 93.6 ppg in 2005-06... The Wolves were a season-high 33-for-44 from the FT line Feb. 20 vs. Philadelphia, one of 25 times they attempted 30+; Phoenix' 10-for-14 night on Apr. 13 was the 37th time an opponent took fewer than 20 trips... On the season, Minnesota ranked 6th in the NBA in FT attempts per game (24.9) and 5th in fewest FT attempts allowed per game (20.1)... The Wolves ended last in the league in three-point accuracy (30.5%), 24th in FG accuracy (43.9%), 21st in FT accuracy (74.2%) and 20th in scoring (95.7 ppg)...

PLAYING THE PERCENTAGES: Minnesota shot 56.3% Mar. 17 vs. New Orleans, its best percentage since shooting a season-high 58.4% vs. the Hornets on Feb. 2... The Wolves finished at 53.2% in beating Detroit on Mar. 26, their third straight 50%+ outing (13 total)... Minnesota was held to a season-low 33.7% on Mar. 18 at Memphis, one of 19 sub-40% nights this year... Phoenix' 50.7% effort on Apr. 13 marked the seventh time in the final 13 games the Wolves allowed 50%+; they permitted a combined 49.2% in the last 13 (including 58.3% by Utah on Apr. 12)... Minnesota kept Houston to 32.1% on Jan. 19, its best defensive pct. since Indiana hit 29.6% on Mar. 9, 2011 (12th-lowest in club history)... Dallas shot 59.7% on Jan. 14, the top figure by a Minnesota foe this season... The Wolves ranked 24th in defensive FG pct (46.8%), 15th in scoring defense (98.1 ppg), 4th in TOs forced (15.9 per game) and 5th in steals (8.54 spg)... The Wolves blocked a season-high 12 shots Jan. 2 at Utah, and picked off a club-record-tying 17 steals Apr. 13 vs. Phoenix... They collected 33 points off 28 Suns miscues in the latter game, matching their season best and top single-game total since 2002...

THE BOARD REPORT: The Wolves posted a 49-39 edge on the glass Mar. 12 vs. San Antonio, their 18th double-digit advantage this year (10 such games in 2011-12); the club record is 23, set in 2001-02... Still, Minnesota was outrebounded in 36 of its final 52 games, after holding the edge in 22 of the first 30; they faced an average deficit of -3.5 rpg (39.6-43.1) over the last 52 contests... Chicago piled up a 52-32 board advantage on Mar. 24, Minnesota's largest deficit this season... Golden State enjoyed a 60-44 spread on Apr. 9, one of 12 times the Wolves were outrebounded by 10+; the 60 boards are the most in a game vs. Minnesota since 2003... The Wolves outboarded Miami by a 53-24 count on Dec. 18, the largest single-game margin (+29) in club history... On the year, Minnesota ranked 12th in offensive rebound pct (.274), 11th in defensive rebound pct (.740) and 10th in total rebound pct (.507)...

NO THREES, PLEASE: The Wolves went 14-for-26 from beyond the arc in the Mar. 26 win at Detroit, hitting a club-record 12 treys in the 2nd half... Minnesota ended the season at 30.5% from three-point range; however, that figure climbed to 36.2% (98-for-271) over the final 15 games... The overall percentage is their lowest since shooting 29.8% (122-for-410) in the abbreviated 1998-99 campaign... Minnesota shot 13-for-25 from three-point range Dec. 4 at Philadelphia, one of seven games with 10+ makes; they hit 12-for-20 vs. San Antonio on Mar. 12... Meanwhile, Portland went 16-for-24 (66.7%) on Jan. 5, the single-game season high in both treys made and three-point accuracy vs. Minnesota... Wolves opponents combined to shoot 39.1% (393-for-1006) from beyond the arc over the final 53 games; Minnesota had limited teams to just 33.1% (183-for-553) from three-point distance in its first 29 contests this season...

SCHEDULE NOTES: Minnesota enjoyed a 5-5 final month, after compiling a 1-26 record over its previous three Aprils... The Apr. 17 triumph at San Antonio marked the Wolves' first victory in a season finale in five years (110-101 OT vs. Milwaukee, Apr. 16, 2008), and also halted a 16-game losing streak at the AT&T Center that dated to January 2004... Minnesota faced four groupings of four-games-in-five-nights this season, including three in the final five weeks (Mar. 9-13, Mar. 26-30, Apr. 9-13)... The Mar. 30 game vs. Memphis completed Minnesota's second seven-games-in-10-nights run in March (Mar. 9-18, Mar. 21-30); they went 8-14 on the tail end of back-to-back sets this season, after going 5-15 in those situations a year ago... The Wolves finished 20-21 for their best home record since going 20-21 in 2006-07... Minnesota drew an SRO 20,340 vs. Houston on Dec. 26, the third-largest crowd in Target Center history...
