Forward Chase Budinger: Suffered a lateral meniscus tear in his left knee Nov. 10 at Chicago. He underwent surgery on Nov. 13, has missed 33 games and will be sidelined indefinitely.

Forward Dante Cunningham: Returned Monday at Atlanta, having missed last Saturday's game vs. Houston due to illness.

Guard Malcolm Lee: Underwent surgery on his right knee (Jan. 14) and right hip (Jan. 16) last week, and is expected to miss the remainder of the season.

Forward Kevin Love: Underwent surgery to repair the third and fourth metacarpals in his right hand on Jan. 15, and is expected to be sidelined for 8-10 weeks.

Last Game: Wednesday, Jan. 23 – Brooklyn 91, Minnesota 83

Brook López scored 22 points and Deron Williams added 18 with eight assists as Brooklyn won for the 12th time in 14 games under interim coach P.J. Carlesimo with a 91-83 victory over the Timberwolves on Wednesday night at Target Center. The Nets never trailed, bolting to a 14-2 lead behind eight points from López. Minnesota cut the gap to seven by the end of the quarter and pulled to within 26-25 on a Chris Johnson basket early in the second. However, Williams tallied nine points in the final three minutes to rebuild Brooklyn's lead to 53-42 at halftime. Luke Ridnour keyed a 10-1 burst that brought the Wolves to within 57-52 in the third period, and Dante Cunningham's jumper with 10:05 remaining in the contest made it 70-68. However, C.J. Watson scored the game's next seven points, and Joe Johnson and Williams drilled 3-pointers to keep the Nets in front down the stretch en route to their first Target Center win since 2002. Johnson collected 18 points and Watson chipped in 14 for Brooklyn. Andrei Kirilenko's 15 points and six rebounds led Minnesota, while Cunningham scored 14 points and Barea had 11 with eight assists.

Previous Game: Monday, Jan. 21 – Atlanta 104, Minnesota 96

Al Horford tallied 28 points and 10 rebounds, and Jannero Pargo scored 14 of his 16 points in the fourth quarter as Atlanta rallied for a 104-96 victory over the Timberwolves on Monday afternoon at Philips Arena. Minnesota took advantage of eight Hawks miscues to build a 31-18 lead after one quarter, and the margin swelled to 18 on Andrei Kirilenko's three-point play with 4:49 left in the second. Derrick Williams beat the halftime buzzer with a breakaway dunk to keep the Wolves in front by 58-44, but Kyle Korver drained back-to-back 3-pointers to cap a 10-0 start to the third quarter for Atlanta. The Hawks pulled even when Mike Scott made it 69-69 at the 3:18 mark, only to see Minnesota score the next eight and take a 77-70 lead into the fourth. Pargo's 3-pointer with 5:26 to play put Atlanta on top to stay at 92-89, and after Kirilenko converted a four-point play to keep the Wolves within one, Pargo kick-started a 7-0 burst in the other direction to squelch Minnesota's comeback bid. Jeff Teague dished 10 assists for the Hawks, while Williams' 17 points led the Wolves and J.J. Barea chipped in 14 points and seven assists.

INSIDE THE BOX SCORE: Brooklyn outscored the Wolves 16-6 in second-chance points on Wednesday, Minnesota's 2nd-lowest total of the season. Over the past eight contests (going 1-7), they're averaging just 11.9 ppg in that category; they'd tallied 20.1 ppg in the previous 12, scoring 20+ points on seven occasions. A look at some of Minnesota's key figures to date (through Jan. 23):

WOLF TRACKS: Brooklyn notched a 91-83 victory over the Wolves on Wednesday, the Nets' first win at Target Center since 2002... Minnesota saw its road losing streak reach five games with Monday's 104-96 setback in Atlanta... The Hawks spotted Minnesota an 18-point, 2nd-quarter lead before rallying, equaling the biggest margin the Wolves have let slip away this year (Jan. 11 at New Orleans)... The Wolves stopped a five-game losing streak with last Saturday's 92-79 triumph over Houston... The drought equaled their longest of the year (also Nov. 14-24); Minnesota opened its two-game homestand with a 90-77 loss to the L.A. Clippers on Jan. 17... The Wolves completed a four-game swing with the 113-98 loss in Dallas on Jan. 14; one night earlier, they suffered a 106-88 setback in San Antonio... Minnesota kicked off its trip with the 106-84 loss in Oklahoma City on Jan. 9; the final 22-point spread equals its biggest losing margin of the year... At 17-22, Minnesota stands 10th in the West, 2.5 games in back of 8th-place Portland (21-21) and Houston (22-22)... The Blazers held off Minnesota, 102-97, on Jan. 5; two nights earlier, the Wolves snapped a four-game road skid with the 101-97 win at Denver... Houston eked out an 87-84 victory on Dec. 26, halting Minnesota's five-game home winning streak; they've lost a league-high seven games when taking a lead into the 4th quarter (most recently on Monday afternoon in Atlanta)... Minnesota edged Oklahoma City, 99-93, on Dec. 20, ending the Thunder's 12-game winning streak overall and a 12-game run in the head-to-head series... The Wolves suffered a 103-92 loss in Miami on Dec. 18; one night earlier, Orlando halted their four-game winning streak with a 102-93 verdict... Minnesota posted its biggest winning margin of the year by routing Cleveland 91-73 on Dec. 7...

NUMEROLOGY: The Wolves finished with 77 points vs. the Clippers on Jan. 17, their lowest total since a 100-77 loss at Golden State on Mar. 13, 2011... Minnesota tallied 108 points in the Jan. 8 home victory over Atlanta, but has slipped to 88.8 ppg in eight ensuing contests (going 1-7)... The Wolves have also been outrebounded in eight of their past nine games, after holding the edge in 16 of the previous 18... Minnesota tallied 114 points Dec. 15 vs. Dallas, its third straight game with a season-high total; the Wolves are 8-0 this year when cracking the Century Mark... At the other end, Minnesota has permitted 100+ points in seven of the past 10 games; Dallas' 113 points on Jan. 14 are the most by a Wolves foe this year... They're allowing 100.0 ppg in the last 21, having surrendered just 91.9 ppg in their first 18 starts... Minnesota was held to 35.7% by the Clippers on Jan. 17, its 11th sub-40% night of the season (third in January)... The Wolves shot 50.6% Dec. 29 vs. Phoenix, their fifth 50%+ night; they hit a season-high 53.4% Dec. 14 at New Orleans... Minnesota ranks 20th in defensive FG pct (45.6%), 10th in scoring defense (96.3 ppg) and 12th in blocks (5.36 bpg); they blocked a season-high 12 shots Jan. 2 at Utah, and had a season-high 15 steals Dec. 15 vs. Dallas... The Wolves posted a 46-33 edge on the glass Jan. 14 at Dallas, their 14th double-digit margin this season (10 in 2011-12); the club single-season best is 23... Minnesota ranks 3rd in offensive rebound pct (.306), 5th in defensive rebound pct (.748) and 2nd in total rebound pct (.527)...

NO THREES, PLEASE: The Wolves finished 3-for-15 from beyond the arc Wednesday vs. Brooklyn, dropping their season three-point accuracy to 29.2%... Over the past 10 NBA seasons, only one team has finished below 30% from long distance; Charlotte hit 29.5% a year ago... Minnesota shot 13-for-25 from three-point range Dec. 4 at Philadelphia, one of two games with double-digit makes; they finished 10-for-28 vs. Denver on Nov. 21... The Wolves' 8-for-15 (53.3%) effort Jan. 8 vs. Atlanta is their best percentage of the year... Meanwhile, Portland went 16-for-24 (66.7%) from long distance on Jan. 5, beginning a string of three consecutive games in which Minnesota surrendered 10+ treys... Wolves opponents have combined to shoot 43.6% (88-for-202) from beyond the arc over the last 10 games; Minnesota had limited teams to just 25.0% (32-for-128) from three-point distance in its previous six contests...

CRUNCH TIME: Minnesota limited Memphis to 17.4% shooting (4-for-23) in the 4th period on Apr. 17, and finished 13th in the NBA in 4th-quarter FG pct. defense (42.9%) as well as 17th in scoring defense (23.7 points). WOLF TRACKS: Minnesota finished the 2011-12 season at 26-40 (.394), a nine-win improvement over 2010-11 and marking their best single-season victory total since compiling a 32-50 record in 2006-07... It's also the Wolves' top winning percentage for a season since 2005-06, when they went 33-49 (.402); Minnesota has now missed the postseason in eight consecutive seasons (beginning with 2004-05), after advancing to the playoffs every year from 1996-97 through 2003-04 (eight)... The current absence is the NBA's longest active postseason drought; Sacramento (six seasons), Golden State (five) and New Jersey (five) are next on that list... Prior to the Mar. 30 home loss to Boston, the Wolves stood 25-27 and were within 2.5 games of a playoff berth; Minnesota was officially eliminated from postseason contention with the Apr. 12 setback vs. the L.A. Clippers... The Wolves were above .500 as late as Mar. 12, when the 127-124 victory at Phoenix hiked their record to 22-21; however, they won just four of their final 23 starts... The Wolves closed with eight consecutive home losses to go 13-20... On the flipside, they put together a matching 13-20 road record, their best since a 20-21 mark in 2004-05; Minnesota had won a total of 10 road games in its previous two seasons (going 5-36 in both 2009-10 and 2010-11)...

MARGINAL INFORMATION: The 131-102 loss to Denver on Apr. 26 was Minnesota's largest of the year; previously, they'd dropped a 114-90 decision to Phoenix on Apr. 9... Eleven of the Wolves' final 26 games were decided by six points or less; they suffered 17 losses in two-possession games (one behind Toronto's league-leading total)... Minnesota spotted Utah an 18-point lead before rallying to win at the buzzer on Feb. 22, and held on to beat Phoenix 127-124 on Mar. 12... The Wolves ranked 4th with seven one-possession victories (decided by three points or less), and played the 3rd-most such games in the NBA (14)... Half of the Wolves' 26 wins were by double-digit spreads -- their highest single-season total since winning 16 games by 10+ points in 2005-06 -- Including five of nine since All-Star Weekend (109-97 at the Clippers, 122-110 at Portland, 106-94 vs. Portland, 117-100 vs. Denver, 91-80 at Detroit); they lost 16 games by 10+ points (four by 20+)... Last season, Minnesota was 11-32 in games decided by 10+ points and 4-20 in two-possession games... They suffered 10 defeats by 20+ points, including a franchise-record 128-86 setback in Orlando on Nov. 3, 2010...

THE IRON RANGE: Denver shot 62.9% in the Apr. 26 finale, the 3rd-highest percentage ever by a Wolves opponent (Detroit 66.7%, Nov. 8, 1994; L.A. Lakers 64.2%, Mar. 20, 1992); Minnesota allowed 50%+ in five April starts and seven of the last 18... Detroit's 80 points on Apr. 29 were the fewest allowed by Minnesota since the 87-79 win over San Antonio on Jan. 27, and the Wolves' 10th sub-90 defensive effort last year... The 149-140 double-OT loss at Oklahoma City on Mar. 23 marked the NBA's 5th-highest scoring game in the past 15 years, and the top aggregate since Seattle beat Denver 151-147 in two OTs on Apr. 6, 2008... The Wolves tallied 127 points in the Mar. 12 win at Phoenix, the most they've ever scored in a non-OT road game; the Suns' 124 points are the most allowed by Minnesota in a win... However, the Wolves saw their scoring dip to 93.3 ppg (42.0%) over the final 16 games... The Mar. 30 loss to Boston produced a season-low 79 points, one of 17 sub-90 outings for the Wolves... The 34.7% accuracy was their lowest since mid-January; Minnesota shot a season-high 58.1% on Jan. 30 at Houston... Washington's 34.5% effort on Jan. 8 was the Wolves' best defensive showing in 2011-12... Minnesota ranked 25th in scoring defense (100.1 ppg) and 22nd in defensive FG pct. (45.5%)...

TURNOVER TROUBLE: Minnesota coughed up 28 TOs in the Feb. 10 loss to Dallas, one shy of the franchise single-game record and one of seven 20+ outings last year... The Wolves saw their TOs rise to 14.5 per night in 25 games following Ricky Rubio's injury, after committing 13.1 per night in their previous 10 starts... Minnesota tied the franchise record low by committing only four TOs vs. the L.A. Lakers on Jan. 29, one of three single-digit outings last season... The Wolves finished 21st in TOs (15.2 per game) and 26th in steals allowed (8.32 per game)... Meanwhile, they ended 27th in TOs forced (13.3 per game) and 26th in steals (6.61 per game), swiping a season-high 12 steals Mar. 1 at Phoenix... Those figures contributed to a league-high -4.3 ppg deficit in points off TOs for the Wolves, who ranked last in points allowed (18.4 per game) and 29th in points scored (14.1 per game)... Atlanta outscored the Wolves 26-6 in fast-break points on Jan. 14, Dallas rang up a 24-4 margin on Jan. 1, and Denver enjoyed a 29-2 advantage on Mar. 25... For the year, the Wolves ranked 26th in the NBA in fast-break scoring (10.3 ppg) and 28th in fast-break points allowed (15.8 per game)...

BOARD REPORT: Minnesota outboarded Golden State 49-37 on Apr. 4, its 10th double-digit margin last season... Meanwhile, Denver piled up a 48-29 edge in the Apr. 26 finale Minnesota's largest deficit of the year... The Wolves came up short 17 times in 32 games after All-Star Weekend, and were outrebounded by 10+ spreads on 11 occasions... Minnesota faced a -2.1 rpg deficit since the Break, after posting a +2.5 rpg advantage in the season's first half; during its 11-game April losing streak, Minnesota was outboarded by a -4.2 rpg (40.5-44.7) margin... Memphis outrebounded the Wolves 59-47 on Feb. 8; the Grizzlies' 59 boards are the most vs. Minnesota since Dallas totaled 60 on Nov. 29, 2003... Minnesota pulled down 24 offensive boards Jan. 29 vs. the Lakers... The Wolves ended 5th in the NBA in second-chance scoring (14.7 points per game)... Minnesota ranked 15th in total rebounding pct. (.503), 14th in offensive rebound pct. (.275) and 16th in defensive rebound pct. (.730)... Last year, the Wolves finished the season 3rd in total rebound pct. (.517) and 2nd in offensive rebound pct. (.296), holding the edge 49 times in 82 games and enjoying 20+ board margins on six occasions (14 double-figure advantages)... Minnesota also led the NBA in second-chance points in 2010-11, netting 16.2 ppg...

Minnesota is his fifth stop in an NBA coaching career that began in 1983 as an assistant to Jack Ramsay with Portland... Became the Trail Blazers' head coach on Feb. 18, 1989; he led them to the NBA Finals twice in his five full seasons on the bench (1990 and 1992) and won a career-best 63 games in 1990-91... Spent two seasons (1995-96 and 1996-97) with the Golden State Warriors before moving on to Sacramento in 1998... Took the Kings to the NBA Playoffs in each of his eight seasons there, including a trip to the Western Conference Finals in 2002; he compiled a 395-229 record (.633) to become the winningest coach in franchise history... Born on June 16, 1946 in Lynwood, Calif., he earned a Master's degree in history from Loyola Marymount, where he was named MVP of the West Coast Athletic Conference as a senior in 1967-68... He and his wife Mary Kay have six children, Kathy, R.J., Laura, David, Caitlin and Patrick, along with seven grandchildren.
