Last Game: Tuesday, Mar. 12 – Minnesota 107, San Antonio 83

Ricky Rubio collected his first career triple-double -- 21 points, 12 assists and a career-high 13 rebounds -- as the Timberwolves routed San Antonio, 107-83, on Tuesday night at Target Center. The Spurs rolled to a 21-9 lead by hitting eight of their first 10 shots, but Minnesota responded with a 19-2 blitz spanning the first and second quarters to forge an eight-point advantage. The surge was capped by two 3-pointers apiece from Alexey Shved and J.J. Barea, and the margin reached 53-38 when Rubio beat the halftime buzzer. Mickaël Gelabale's trey extended that to 25 points midway through the third period before San Antonio chipped the deficit down to 77-60 on a last-second layup by Nando De Colo. However, Minnesota held the Spurs scoreless for the opening five minutes of the fourth quarter, using three consecutive Barea 3-pointers to open their largest lead of the night at 89-60 with 7:30 remaining. Barea finished with 17 points and Shved added 16 for the Wolves, who matched their biggest winning margin ever vs. San Antonio. The Spurs were paced by 15 points from Cory Joseph while Stephen Jackson chipped in 14.

Previous Game: Sunday, Mar. 10 – Dallas 100, Minnesota 77

Vince Carter's 22 points and nine rebounds led a 58-point bench contribution as Dallas routed the Timberwolves, 100-77, on Sunday night at Target Center. Minnesota led for much of the first quarter thanks to nine points from Derrick Williams, but the Mavericks closed on top 21-20 and then began the second period with 14 unanswered points to break the game open. Carter sank a pair of 3-pointers during the barrage, and two straight Dirk Nowitzki jumpers pushed Dallas' lead to 45-27. Mickaël Gelabale beat the buzzer to bring the Wolves to within 56-44 at halftime, but Minnesota could get no closer than 10 following intermission. Holding a 17-point cushion entering the fourth, the Mavericks increased that to 84-62 on a Nowitzki basket at the 9:13 mark and took their biggest lead of the night when Jae Crowder's 3-pointer made it 96-72 with 2:44 remaining. Nowitzki finished with 16 points and nine rebounds, and Elton Brand chipped in 10 points and 12 boards for Dallas, which piled up a 37-15 rebounding edge in the second half. Williams' 18 points and nine rebounds led Minnesota, while J.J. Barea added 16 points and Gelabale put in 13.

WOLF TRACKS: Minnesota posted its 2nd-largest winning margin of the season with Tuesday's 107-83 victory over San Antonio; the final spread equals the Wolves' biggest win ever in the series... Dallas handed Minnesota its second 23-point defeat in as many nights with Sunday's 100-77 verdict; the Wolves suffered their fifth straight road defeat with last Saturday's 111-88 loss at Denver... Minnesota snapped its six-game losing streak with the 87-82 victory over Washington on Mar. 6... The homestand began with a 97-81 loss to Miami on Mar. 4; the six-game drought tied the Wolves' longest of the season (also Jan. 21-Feb. 1, which was halted by beating New Orleans, 115-86, on Feb. 2)... Prior to last Wednesday, Minnesota's most recent win had been a 94-87 decision vs. Philly on Feb. 20; the Wolves are 6-24 in their past 30 starts, having opened the season 16-15 through Jan. 8... Minnesota wrapped an 0-3 West Coast trip with the 109-94 loss in Portland on Mar. 2... They suffered a 116-94 loss in L.A. on Feb. 28, the Lakers' 21st consecutive win in the series; the Wolves began the trip with an 84-83 OT loss in Phoenix on Feb. 26, falling to 1-1 in extra sessions... Golden State rallied for a 100-99 triumph on Feb. 24 at Target Center; combined with the Phoenix defeat, it's the first time in club history that the Wolves have suffered one-point losses in consecutive games... Oklahoma City dealt Minnesota a 127-111 loss on Feb. 22; the Wolves haven't won back-to-back contests since putting together a four-game winning streak Dec. 7-15... Minnesota halted an eight-game road losing streak with the 100-92 win at Cleveland on Feb. 11; prior to that, the Wolves' most recent road victory was a 101-97 decision at Denver on Jan. 3... Minnesota capped a 1-5 homestand with the 100-94 loss to New York on Feb. 8; the Knicks made up an 11-point deficit in the final 7:00, one of 14 games the Wolves have lost after building a lead of 10+... Minnesota has lost a league-high 10 games when taking a lead into the 4th quarter (most recently falling Feb. 24 vs. Golden State), having suffered only four such losses a year ago...

NUMEROLOGY: The Wolves tallied a season-high 115 points Feb. 2 vs. New Orleans, their fourth Century effort in a five-game stretch (101.4 ppg)... However, Minnesota has tallied 100+ just three times in 17 ensuing starts, averaging 93.1 ppg in those 17 (including 88.9 ppg in the last eight)... The Wolves were held to a season-low-tying 77 points Sunday vs. Dallas (also Jan. 17 vs. the L.A. Clippers)... Minnesota collected 114 points Dec. 15 vs. Dallas, its third consecutive game with a season-high total; the Wolves are 11-4 this year when scoring 100+... At the other end, Minnesota has permitted 100+ in 20 of its last 32 starts; Oklahoma City's 127 points on Feb. 22 are the most by a Wolves foe this year... They're allowing 100.1 ppg in the last 43, having surrendered 91.9 ppg in their first 18 starts... The Wolves were a season-high 33-for-44 from the line Feb. 20 vs. Philly, one of 20 times they've attempted 30+ FTs; San Antonio's 16-for-18 night on Tuesday marks the 24th time an opponent has taken fewer than 20 trips... On the year, Minnesota ranks 4th in the NBA in FT attempts per game (25.3) and 5th in fewest FT attempts allowed per game (20.3)... The Wolves are currently last in the league in three-point accuracy (29.9%), 28th in FG accuracy (43.3%), 24th in FT accuracy (72.8%) and 21st in scoring (94.6 ppg)...

PLAYING THE PERCENTAGES: Minnesota was limited to 36.4% by Dallas on Sunday, its 16th sub-40% night this season (fifth in the last 12 games)... The Wolves bounced back to shoot 53.7% vs. San Antonio on Tuesday, their best percentage since hitting a season-high 58.4% vs. New Orleans on Feb. 2... They've shot 50%+ on eight occasions overall; however, they're hitting a combined 41.0% (412-for-1004) in the last 12, after shooting 47.3% in their prior 13 starts... The Wolves kept Houston to 32.1% from the floor on Jan. 19, their best defensive percentage since Indiana hit 29.6% on Mar. 9, 2011 (12th-best in club history)... Dallas shot 59.7% on Jan. 14, the top figure by a Minnesota foe this year and the third in a run of nine consecutive road starts they'd allowed 50%+; opponents shot a combined 54.3% (426-for-785) over those nine games, a streak that ended with Phoenix' 40.7% effort on Feb. 26... Minnesota ranks 23rd in defensive FG pct (46.3%), 14th in scoring defense (97.7 ppg), 6th in TOs forced (15.5 per game) and has risen to 12th in steals (8.23 spg); they blocked a season-high 12 shots Jan. 2 at Utah, and picked off a season-high 15 steals Dec. 15 vs. Dallas...

THE BOARD REPORT: The Wolves posted a 49-39 edge on the glass Tuesday vs. San Antonio, their league-leading 18th double-digit advantage this year (10 such games in 2011-12); the franchise record is 23, set in 2001-02... Still, Minnesota has been outrebounded in 24 of its past 31 games, after holding the edge in 22 of the first 30; they're facing an average deficit of -3.2 rpg (39.9-43.1) in the last 31... Dallas piled up a 59-40 board advantage on Sunday, Minnesota's largest deficit of the season; Washington enjoyed a 44-34 edge last Wednesday, one of seven times the Wolves have been outrebounded by 10+... Minnesota outboarded Miami by a 53-24 count on Dec. 18, the largest single-game advantage (+29) in franchise history; the Heat's 24 rebounds equal the third-lowest total ever vs. the Wolves... Minnesota is 9th in offensive rebound pct (.286), 9th in defensive rebound pct (.743) and 5th in total rebound pct (.515)...

NO THREES, PLEASE: The Wolves finished 12-for-20 (a season-best 60.0%) from beyond the arc in Tuesday's win over San Antonio; their season three-point accuracy stands at 29.9%... Over the past 10 NBA seasons, only one team has finished below 30% from long distance; Charlotte shot 29.5% a year ago... Minnesota shot 13-for-25 from three-point range Dec. 4 at Philadelphia, one of five games with double-digit makes; they finished 10-for-22 vs. the Lakers on Feb. 1 and converted 10-for-20 at Charlotte on Jan. 26... Meanwhile, Portland went 16-for-24 (66.7%) from long distance on Jan. 5, beginning a string of three consecutive games in which Minnesota surrendered 10+ treys... Wolves opponents have combined to shoot 39.5% (242-for-612) from beyond the arc over the last 32 games; Minnesota had limited teams to just 33.1% (183-for-553) from three-point distance in its first 29 contests this season...

SCHEDULE NOTES: Tonight's game finishes the 15th of its 22 back-to-back sets for the Wolves; it's the second of six back-to-backs in the next three weeks... Tonight's contest also wraps up Minnesota's second four-games-in-five-nights run; they face four such sets overall, including three in the final five weeks (Mar. 9-13, Mar. 26-30, Apr. 9-13)... Tuesday's win over San Antonio capped off a nine-day stretch that saw them play four of five at Target Center; beginning tonight, the Wolves have six of their next eight on the road... Minnesota completed January with a 3-12 mark, equaling its lowest win total for the month in club history... The Wolves finished December at 7-5, their first winning December since going 8-6 in 2004 and the third-best percentage ever for the month (11-2 in 2003, 10-5 in 2001)... Minnesota closed November at 7-8, its most successful opening month since putting together a 7-6 record in November 2005... Minnesota drew an SRO 20,340 vs. Houston on Dec. 26, the third-largest crowd in Target Center history; they had 19,356 on hand Dec. 29 vs. Phoenix, their third full house of the year (also drawing a capacity 19,356 on Nov. 2 vs. Sacramento)...

CRUNCH TIME: Minnesota limited Memphis to 17.4% shooting (4-for-23) in the 4th period on Apr. 17, and finished 13th in the NBA in 4th-quarter FG pct. defense (42.9%) as well as 17th in scoring defense (23.7 points). WOLF TRACKS: Minnesota finished the 2011-12 season at 26-40 (.394), a nine-win improvement over 2010-11 and marking their best single-season victory total since compiling a 32-50 record in 2006-07... It's also the Wolves' top winning percentage for a season since 2005-06, when they went 33-49 (.402); Minnesota has now missed the postseason in eight consecutive seasons (beginning with 2004-05), after advancing to the playoffs every year from 1996-97 through 2003-04 (eight)... The current absence is the NBA's longest active postseason drought; Sacramento (six seasons), Golden State (five) and New Jersey (five) are next on that list... Prior to the Mar. 30 home loss to Boston, the Wolves stood 25-27 and were within 2.5 games of a playoff berth; Minnesota was officially eliminated from postseason contention with the Apr. 12 setback vs. the L.A. Clippers... The Wolves were above .500 as late as Mar. 12, when the 127-124 victory at Phoenix hiked their record to 22-21; however, they won just four of their final 23 starts... The Wolves closed with eight consecutive home losses to go 13-20... On the flipside, they put together a matching 13-20 road record, their best since a 20-21 mark in 2004-05; Minnesota had won a total of 10 road games in its previous two seasons (going 5-36 in both 2009-10 and 2010-11)...

MARGINAL INFORMATION: The 131-102 loss to Denver on Apr. 26 was Minnesota's largest of the year; previously, they'd dropped a 114-90 decision to Phoenix on Apr. 9... Eleven of the Wolves' final 26 games were decided by six points or less; they suffered 17 losses in two-possession games (one behind Toronto's league-leading total)... Minnesota spotted Utah an 18-point lead before rallying to win at the buzzer on Feb. 22, and held on to beat Phoenix 127-124 on Mar. 12... The Wolves ranked 4th with seven one-possession victories (decided by three points or less), and played the 3rd-most such games in the NBA (14)... Half of the Wolves' 26 wins were by double-digit spreads -- their highest single-season total since winning 16 games by 10+ points in 2005-06 -- Including five of nine since All-Star Weekend (109-97 at the Clippers, 122-110 at Portland, 106-94 vs. Portland, 117-100 vs. Denver, 91-80 at Detroit); they lost 16 games by 10+ points (four by 20+)... Last season, Minnesota was 11-32 in games decided by 10+ points and 4-20 in two-possession games... They suffered 10 defeats by 20+ points, including a franchise-record 128-86 setback in Orlando on Nov. 3, 2010...

THE IRON RANGE: Denver shot 62.9% in the Apr. 26 finale, the 3rd-highest percentage ever by a Wolves opponent (Detroit 66.7%, Nov. 8, 1994; L.A. Lakers 64.2%, Mar. 20, 1992); Minnesota allowed 50%+ in five April starts and seven of the last 18... Detroit's 80 points on Apr. 29 were the fewest allowed by Minnesota since the 87-79 win over San Antonio on Jan. 27, and the Wolves' 10th sub-90 defensive effort last year... The 149-140 double-OT loss at Oklahoma City on Mar. 23 marked the NBA's 5th-highest scoring game in the past 15 years, and the top aggregate since Seattle beat Denver 151-147 in two OTs on Apr. 6, 2008... The Wolves tallied 127 points in the Mar. 12 win at Phoenix, the most they've ever scored in a non-OT road game; the Suns' 124 points are the most allowed by Minnesota in a win... However, the Wolves saw their scoring dip to 93.3 ppg (42.0%) over the final 16 games... The Mar. 30 loss to Boston produced a season-low 79 points, one of 17 sub-90 outings for the Wolves... The 34.7% accuracy was their lowest since mid-January; Minnesota shot a season-high 58.1% on Jan. 30 at Houston... Washington's 34.5% effort on Jan. 8 was the Wolves' best defensive showing in 2011-12... Minnesota ranked 25th in scoring defense (100.1 ppg) and 22nd in defensive FG pct. (45.5%)...

TURNOVER TROUBLE: Minnesota coughed up 28 TOs in the Feb. 10 loss to Dallas, one shy of the franchise single-game record and one of seven 20+ outings last year... The Wolves saw their TOs rise to 14.5 per night in 25 games following Ricky Rubio's injury, after committing 13.1 per night in their previous 10 starts... Minnesota tied the franchise record low by committing only four TOs vs. the L.A. Lakers on Jan. 29, one of three single-digit outings last season... The Wolves finished 21st in TOs (15.2 per game) and 26th in steals allowed (8.32 per game)... Meanwhile, they ended 27th in TOs forced (13.3 per game) and 26th in steals (6.61 per game), swiping a season-high 12 steals Mar. 1 at Phoenix... Those figures contributed to a league-high -4.3 ppg deficit in points off TOs for the Wolves, who ranked last in points allowed (18.4 per game) and 29th in points scored (14.1 per game)... Atlanta outscored the Wolves 26-6 in fast-break points on Jan. 14, Dallas rang up a 24-4 margin on Jan. 1, and Denver enjoyed a 29-2 advantage on Mar. 25... For the year, the Wolves ranked 26th in the NBA in fast-break scoring (10.3 ppg) and 28th in fast-break points allowed (15.8 per game)...

BOARD REPORT: Minnesota outboarded Golden State 49-37 on Apr. 4, its 10th double-digit margin last season... Meanwhile, Denver piled up a 48-29 edge in the Apr. 26 finale Minnesota's largest deficit of the year... The Wolves came up short 17 times in 32 games after All-Star Weekend, and were outrebounded by 10+ spreads on 11 occasions... Minnesota faced a -2.1 rpg deficit since the Break, after posting a +2.5 rpg advantage in the season's first half; during its 11-game April losing streak, Minnesota was outboarded by a -4.2 rpg (40.5-44.7) margin... Memphis outrebounded the Wolves 59-47 on Feb. 8; the Grizzlies' 59 boards are the most vs. Minnesota since Dallas totaled 60 on Nov. 29, 2003... Minnesota pulled down 24 offensive boards Jan. 29 vs. the Lakers... The Wolves ended 5th in the NBA in second-chance scoring (14.7 points per game)... Minnesota ranked 15th in total rebounding pct. (.503), 14th in offensive rebound pct. (.275) and 16th in defensive rebound pct. (.730)... Last year, the Wolves finished the season 3rd in total rebound pct. (.517) and 2nd in offensive rebound pct. (.296), holding the edge 49 times in 82 games and enjoying 20+ board margins on six occasions (14 double-figure advantages)... Minnesota also led the NBA in second-chance points in 2010-11, netting 16.2 ppg...

Born on June 16, 1946 in Lynwood, Calif., he earned a Master's degree in history from Loyola Marymount, where he was named MVP of the West Coast Athletic Conference as a senior in 1967-68... He and his wife Mary Kay have six children, Kathy, R.J., Laura, David, Caitlin and Patrick, along with seven grandchildren.
