**Forward Chase Budinger:** Returned to action Thursday at Sacramento, having been sidelined for 59 games after suffering a lateral meniscus tear in his left knee on Nov. 10 at Chicago.

**Forward Andrei Kirilenko:** Returned to the lineup Mar. 17 vs. New Orleans, after being sidelined for the previous nine games due to a strained left calf suffered Feb. 26 at Phoenix.

**Guard Malcolm Lee:** Underwent surgery on his right knee on Jan. 14 and right hip on Jan. 16, has missed the last 48 games and is expected to miss the remainder of the season.

**Forward Kevin Love:** Underwent surgery to repair the third and fourth metacarpals in his right hand on Jan. 15, has missed 38 games and will be sidelined indefinitely.

**Last Game: Friday, Mar. 22 – Minnesota 117, Phoenix 86**

Andrei Kirilenko's 20 points led seven double-figure scorers and the Timberwolves posted the second-biggest road win in franchise history with a 117-86 triumph over Phoenix on Friday night at US Airways Center. Kirilenko tallied 11 first-quarter points to help Minnesota build a 31-18 lead, and Chase Budinger opened the second period with three consecutive jumpers to hike the margin to 20. Nikola Pekovic capped an 8-0 burst that made it 60-34 with 3:21 to play in the half, and Ricky Rubio's three-point play in the final minute gave the Wolves a 67-39 advantage at intermission. The Suns didn't threaten in the second half, with Dante Cunningham netting 12 third-quarter points (on 5-for-5 shooting) to keep Minnesota on top by 26 entering the fourth. Luke Ridnour topped off a 10-0 burst before Marcus Morris scored Phoenix' first points of the quarter at the 8:18 mark, and the Wolves took their biggest lead of the night with Chris Johnson's dunk with 2:17 left made it 115-80. Cunningham finished with 18 points and Rubio had 12 points, eight assists and five steals for Minnesota. Luis Scola topped the Suns with 17 points and 12 rebounds.

**Previous Game: Thursday, Mar. 21 – Sacramento 101, Minnesota 98**

Isaiah Thomas tallied 24 points and six assists, and Tyreke Evans scored 19 of his 21 points in the second half as Sacramento edged the Timberwolves, 101-98, on Thursday night at Sleep Train Arena. Minnesota led 26-25 after one quarter behind 11 points from Nikola Pekovic, and took control with a 7-0 burst early in the second. Derrick Williams gave the Wolves their largest lead of the night at 55-43 with 1:29 left before halftime, but Patrick Patterson's 3-pointer beat the buzzer to cap a 10-2 Kings finish that shaved the deficit to 57-53. Minnesota rebuilt its lead to nine midway through the third period before Sacramento rallied ahead 79-77 thanks to Evans' layup in the closing seconds. Evans had seven points during a 9-0 spurt that pushed the Kings' lead to 10 with 5:32 left, but Ricky Rubio keyed a 10-2 rally that brought the Wolves to within 99-97 at the 1:36 mark. Evans countered with a jumper, and after a Pekovic free throw, Minnesota's chance to force overtime came up empty as time expired. DeMarcus Cousins totaled 15 points and 14 rebounds for the Kings, while Pekovic led Minnesota with 18 points and 12 boards.

**WOLF TRACKS:** Minnesota snapped its nine-game road losing streak with Friday's 117-86 victory at Phoenix; it's the Wolves' first win away from Target Center since Feb. 11 at Cleveland and just their second in 19 road starts since the Jan. 3 triumph in Denver... The final 31-point spread at Phoenix equals the second-largest road win in franchise history (and ties the 10th-largest victory overall); they won by 35 at Philadelphia (119-84) on Dec. 8, 2004... Minnesota began its three-game road trip with Monday's 92-77 loss in Memphis, then suffered a 101-98 setback on Thursday at Sacramento... The Wolves won for the third time in their last four Target Center starts with last Sunday's 97-95 victory over New Orleans... Houston spotted Minnesota a 20-point, 3rd-quarter advantage before rallying to win 108-100 on Mar. 15; it's the biggest lead the Wolves have let slip away this season and the 13th time in franchise history they've lost after building a lead of 20+... The Wolves have now lost a league-high 11 games when taking a lead into the 4th quarter (having suffered four such losses a year ago) and have lost 16 games after leading by 10+... Minnesota's two-game trip began with a 107-91 defeat at Indiana on Mar. 13... The Wolves posted a 107-83 victory over San Antonio on Mar. 12; the spread ties their biggest win ever in the series... Dallas handed Minnesota its second 23-point loss in as many nights with the 100-77 verdict on Mar. 10; they'd suffered a 111-88 loss Mar. 9 at Denver... Minnesota halted its six-game losing streak with the 87-82 win over Washington on Mar. 6; the drought tied the Wolves' longest of the season (also Jan. 21-Feb. 1)... The Wolves are 8-28 in their past 36 starts, having opened the season 16-15 through Jan. 8... Minnesota suffered a 116-94 loss in L.A. on Feb. 28, the Lakers' 21st consecutive win in the series; the Wolves began the trip with an 84-83 OT loss in Phoenix on Feb. 26... Golden State rallied for a 100-99 triumph on Feb. 24; combined with the Phoenix defeat, it's the first time in franchise history they've suffered one-point losses in consecutive games...

**NUMEROLOGY:** The Wolves scored a season-high 117 points in Friday's victory at Phoenix, eclipsing the 115 they rang up vs. New Orleans on Feb. 2... Minnesota has boosted its scoring to 98.1 ppg over the last seven (going 3-4), after netting just 86.3 ppg in the previous seven... The Wolves were held to a season-low-tying 77 points Monday at Memphis (also Mar. 10 vs. Dallas and Jan. 17 vs. the Clippers)... Minnesota collected 114 points Dec. 15 vs. Dallas, its third straight game with a season-high total; the Wolves are 12-5 this year when scoring 100+... At the other end, Minnesota has permitted 100+ in 23 of its last 38 starts; Oklahoma City's 127 points on Feb. 22 are the most by a Wolves foe this year... They're allowing 99.8 ppg in the last 49, having given up 91.9 ppg in their first 18 starts... The Wolves were a season-high 33-for-44 from the FT line Feb. 20 vs. Philly, one of 21 times they've taken 30+; Sacramento's 15-for-18 night on Thursday marks the 29th time an opponent has taken fewer than 20 trips... On the year, Minnesota is 6th in the NBA in FT attempts per game (25.2) and 5th in fewest FT attempts allowed per game (20.3)... The Wolves are currently last in the league in three-point accuracy (29.2%), 27th in FG accuracy (43.5%), 24th in FT accuracy (73.2%) and 20th in scoring (94.8 ppg)...

**PLAYING THE PERCENTAGES:** Minnesota shot 56.3% last Sunday vs. New Orleans, its best percentage since hitting a season-high 58.4% vs. the Hornets on Feb. 2... The Wolves finished at 53.2% in beating Phoenix on Friday; they're shooting a combined 46.7% (266-for-570) over the past seven games... Minnesota was limited to a season-low 33.7% on Monday at Memphis, its 17th sub-40% night of the year; the Wolves have cleared 50% on 10 occasions... Minnesota held Houston to 32.1% from the floor on Jan. 19, its best defensive percentage since Indiana hit 29.6% on Mar. 9, 2011 (12th-best in club history)... Dallas shot 59.7% on Jan. 14, the top figure by a Minnesota foe this year and the third in a run of nine consecutive road starts they'd allowed 50%+; opponents shot a combined 54.3% (426-for-785) over those nine games, a streak that ended with Phoenix' 40.7% effort on Feb. 26... Minnesota ranks 23rd in defensive FG pct (46.4%), 15th in scoring defense (97.7 ppg), 6th in TOs forced (15.6 per game) and has risen to 13th in steals (8.12 spg); they blocked a season-high 12 shots Jan. 2 at Utah, and picked off a season-high 15 steals Dec. 15 vs. Dallas...

**THE BOARD REPORT:** The Wolves posted a 49-39 edge on the glass Mar. 12 vs. San Antonio, their league-leading 18th double-digit advantage this year (10 such games in 2011-12); the franchise record is 23, set in 2001-02... Still, Minnesota has been outrebounded in 28 of its past 37 games, after holding the edge in 22 of the first 30; they're facing an average deficit of -3.6 rpg (39.9-43.5) in the last 37... Dallas piled up a 59-40 board advantage on Mar. 10, Minnesota's largest deficit of the season; New Orleans posted a 41-27 edge last Sunday, the ninth time the Wolves have been outrebounded by 10+... Minnesota outboarded Miami by a 53-24 count on Dec. 18, the largest single-game advantage (+29) in club history; the Heat's 24 rebounds equal the third-lowest total ever vs. the Wolves... On the year, Minnesota is 10th in offensive rebound pct (.284), 15th in defensive rebound pct (.738) and 8th in total rebound pct (.511)...

**NO THREES, PLEASE:** The Wolves went 12-for-20 (a season-best 60.0%) from beyond the arc in the Mar. 12 win over San Antonio; their season three-point accuracy stands at 29.2%... Over the past 10 NBA seasons, only one team has finished below 30% from long distance; Charlotte shot 29.5% a year ago... Minnesota shot 13-for-25 from three-point range Dec. 4 at Philadelphia, one of five games with double-digit makes; they finished 10-for-22 vs. the Lakers on Feb. 1 and converted 10-for-20 at Charlotte on Jan. 26... Meanwhile, Portland went 16-for-24 (66.7%) from long distance on Jan. 5, beginning a string of three consecutive games in which Minnesota surrendered 10+ treys... Wolves opponents have combined to shoot 38.3% (282-for-737) from beyond the arc over the last 38 games; Minnesota had limited teams to just 33.1% (183-for-553) from three-point distance in its first 29 contests this season...

**SCHEDULE NOTES:** Tonight's game begins a two-week stretch that sees the Wolves play six of nine vs. Eastern opponents... This evening also continues Minnesota's second seven-games-in-10-nights run this month (Mar. 9-18, Mar. 21-30); they have six back-to-back sets in March... The Mar. 13 game at Indiana completed Minnesota's second four-games-in-five-nights run; they face four such sets overall, including three in the final five weeks (Mar. 9-13, Mar. 26-30, Apr. 9-13)... The Mar. 12 triumph over San Antonio capped off a nine-day stretch that saw them play four of five at Target Center; the Wolves are now in a two-week run with six of eight on the road... Minnesota finished December at 7-5, their first winning December since going 8-6 in 2004 and the third-best percentage ever for the month (11-2 in 2003, 10-5 in 2001)... Minnesota closed November at 7-8, its most successful opening month since putting together a 7-6 record in November 2005... Minnesota drew an SRO 20,340 vs. Houston on Dec. 26, the third-largest crowd in Target Center history; they had a capacity 19,356 on hand Dec. 29 vs. Phoenix, their third full house of the season (also Nov. 2 vs. Sacramento)...

**WOLF TRACKS:** Minnesota finished the 2011-12 season at 26-40 (.394), a nine-win improvement over 2010-11 and marking their best single-season victory total since compiling a 32-50 record in 2006-07... It's also the Wolves' top winning percentage for a season since 2005-06, when they went 33-49 (.402); Minnesota has now missed the postseason in eight consecutive seasons (beginning with 2004-05), after advancing to the playoffs every year from 1996-97 through 2003-04 (eight)... The current absence is the NBA's longest active postseason drought; Sacramento (six seasons), Golden State (five) and New Jersey (five) are next on that list... Prior to the Mar. 30 home loss to Boston, the Wolves stood 25-27 and were within 2.5 games of a playoff berth; Minnesota was officially eliminated from postseason contention with the Apr. 12 setback vs. the L.A. Clippers... The Wolves were above .500 as late as Mar. 12, when the 127-124 victory at Phoenix hiked their record to 22-21; however, they won just four of their final 23 starts... The Wolves closed with eight consecutive home losses to go 13-20... On the flipside, they put together a matching 13-20 road record, their best since a 20-21 mark in 2004-05; Minnesota had won a total of 10 road games in its previous two seasons (going 5-36 in both 2009-10 and 2010-11)...

**MARGINAL INFORMATION:** The 131-102 loss to Denver on Apr. 26 was Minnesota's largest of the year; previously, they'd dropped a 114-90 decision to Phoenix on Apr. 9... Minnesota spotted Utah an 18-point lead before rallying to win at the buzzer on Feb. 22, and held on to beat Phoenix 127-124 on Mar. 12... The Wolves ranked 4th with seven one-possession victories (decided by three points or less), and played the 3rd-most such games in the NBA (14)... Half of the Wolves' 26 wins were by double-digit spreads -- their highest single-season total since winning 16 games by 10+ points in 2005-06 -- Including five of nine since All-Star Weekend (109-97 at the Clippers, 122-110 at Portland, 106-94 vs. Portland, 117-100 vs. Denver, 91-80 at Detroit); they lost 16 games by 10+ points (four by 20+)...
