Forward Chase Budinger: Returned Mar. 21 at Sacramento, having been sidelined for 59 games after suffering a lateral meniscus tear in his left knee on Nov. 10 at Chicago.

Forward Dante Cunningham: Returned to the lineup Friday at Utah, after missing Wednesday's game at the L.A. Clippers due to a sore right hamstring.

Guard Malcolm Lee: Underwent surgery on his right knee on Jan. 14 and right hip on Jan. 16, has missed the last 60 games and will miss the remainder of the season.

Forward Kevin Love: Underwent surgery to repair the third and fourth metacarpals in his right hand on Jan. 15. Also underwent arthroscopic surgery to remove scar tissue in his left knee on Wednesday. He's missed the past 50 games and will be sidelined for the rest of the season.

Last Game: Friday, Apr. 12 – Utah 107, Minnesota 100

Al Jefferson scored 29 of his career-high 40 points in the second half and added 13 rebounds and six assists as Utah rallied for a 107-100 victory over the Timberwolves on Friday night at EnergySolutions Arena. Gordon Hayward's 3-pointer at the buzzer staked the Jazz to a 30-22 lead after one quarter, but J.J. Barea scored all of Minnesota's points in a game-tying 10-2 start to the second. After Jefferson gave Utah its biggest lead of the night at 51-42 with 4:29 left in the half, Chase Budinger sparked a 12-2 finish that put the Wolves on top 54-53 at intermission. Minnesota's advantage grew to seven midway through the third before a late jumper by Jefferson sent the Jazz into the fourth quarter clinging to an 82-81 lead. Trailing by seven with 5:00 to play, the Wolves used back-to-back 3-pointers by Ricky Rubio to edge ahead 98-97. However, Jefferson reclaimed the lead for Utah, and later sank a key jumper with 39.3 seconds left for a 101-98 lead. Mo Williams then added six free throws to seal the win. Williams and Randy Foye tallied 16 points apiece for the Jazz. Barea led Minnesota with a season-high 23 points and Rubio chipped in 13.

Previous Game: Wednesday, Apr. 10 – L.A. Clippers 111, Minnesota 95

Chris Paul and Blake Griffin scored 19 points apiece and Los Angeles set a franchise record with its 31st home victory by cruising past the Timberwolves, 111-95, on Wednesday night at Staples Center. The Clippers scored the game's first eight points and never trailed, settling for a 26-20 lead after one quarter behind 10 points from Griffin. Minnesota narrowed the deficit to two points on five occasions in the second, the final time when J.J. Barea's trey made it 42-40 with 4:29 left. However, Paul beat the halftime buzzer with a 3-pointer to cap a 7-0 burst and stretch L.A.'s lead to 58-46. The Wolves again chiseled it down to three on a Luke Ridnour jumper midway through the third, only to see Los Angeles closed the quarter with nine unanswered points for an 88-72 cushion. The Clippers opened their largest lead when Matt Barnes made it 104-81 with 4:43 to play and went on to complete the sweep of the four-game season series. Paul added 11 assists and four steals for Los Angeles, while Willie Green scored 15 points and Barnes tallied 14. Nikola Pekovic's 20 points led Minnesota, with Derrick Williams chipping in 13 points and 10 rebounds.

Andrei Kirilenko tallied 20 points and Alexey Shved dished 10 assists for Minnesota, while Luis Scola led the Suns with 33 points, Shannon Brown added 21 and Goran Dragic handed out 12 assists.

Second Meeting: Marcin Gortat forced OT with a late basket as Phoenix squandered an 18-point lead before edging the Wolves, 84-83, on Feb. 26 at the US Airways Center. Derrick Williams led Minnesota with 21 points and 12 rebounds while Nikola Pekovic put in 18 points and 12 boards.

Third Meeting: Andrei Kirilenko's 20 points led seven double-figure scorers and the Timberwolves posted the second-biggest road win in club history with a 117-86 triumph over Phoenix on Mar. 22 at US Airways Center. Ricky Rubio finished with 12 points, eight assists and five steals for Minnesota, while Luis Scola topped the Suns with 17 points and 12 rebounds.

PEKOVIC WEEK'S BEST IN WEST: On Monday, Timberwolves center Nikola Pekovic was named the NBA's Western Conference Player of the Week for games played Apr. 1-7. Pekovic led Minnesota to a 3-1 record for the week, averaging 25.0 ppg and 8.5 rpg while shooting 58.9% from the floor and 81.0% from the FT line. He scored 29 points in the 110-100 victory over Boston on Apr. 1, and put up a 27-point, eight-rebound effort as the Wolves downed Milwaukee, 107-98, on Apr. 3 for their third consecutive road win. He capped the week by netting 20 points and 13 rebounds in Minnesota's 107-101 triumph over Detroit on Apr. 6, a result that marked Rick Adelman's 1000th career victory as an NBA head coach. *It's the first weekly honor of his career*, and the first for any Wolves player since Al Jefferson was tabbed on Jan. 5, 2009. He becomes the fifth player in franchise history to win the award, joining Kevin Garnett (15 times), Jefferson (twice), Stephon Marbury (Feb. 21, 1999) and Sam Cassell (Dec. 28, 2003).

INSIDE THE BOX SCORE: The Wolves generated 23 points from 18 Utah TOs on Friday, *marking the 22nd time in the last 28 games they've forced more TOs than they've committed* (three ties). WOLF TRACKS: Minnesota completed an 0-3 Western swing with Friday's 107-100 defeat at Utah; the Jazz will visit Target Center on Monday to round out the season series... The Wolves suffered a 111-95 setback on Wednesday in L.A., enabling the Clippers to sweep the four-game season set for the first time since 1992-93... Golden State halted Minnesota's three-game road winning streak with Tuesday's 105-89 verdict... The loss was the Wolves' first away from Target Center since a 101-98 defeat at Sacramento on Mar. 21; they beat Phoenix (117-86 on Mar. 22), Detroit (105-82 on Mar. 26) and Milwaukee (107-98 on Apr. 3) during the run, their longest of the season... Overall, Minnesota is 6-7 in its past 13 starts, most recently winning 107-101 vs. Detroit last Saturday; that victory marked Rick Adelman's 1000th career win as an NBA head coach... Toronto ended Minnesota's brief two-game winning streak with the 95-93 decision on Apr. 5, the Raptors' 16th win in their last 17 series meetings... The Wolves completed a 2-2 homestand by beating Boston, 110-100, on Apr. 1; Memphis pulled away for a 99-86 win two nights earlier... Minnesota took a 67-65 lead into the fourth period before being outscored 34-19 by the Grizzlies; they've now dropped a league-high 13 games when leading after three (four such losses a year ago) and have lost 18 games after building leads of 10+... Minnesota posted a 101-93 win over Oklahoma City on Mar. 29; the Wolves began the homestand with a 120-117 loss to L.A. on Mar. 27, the Lakers' 22nd consecutive win in the series... The wins at Detroit (Mar. 26) and Phoenix (Mar. 22) mark the first time in franchise history that the Wolves have registered 20-point victories in consecutive road games... Minnesota snapped a nine-game road skid with the Phoenix win, their first since Feb. 11 at Cleveland... The final 31-point spread at Phoenix equals the second-largest road win in club history (and ties the 10th-largest overall); they won by 35 at Philadelphia (119-84) on Dec. 8, 2004... Houston spotted the Wolves a 20-point, 3rd-quarter cushion before rallying to win 108-100 on Mar. 15; it's the biggest lead Minnesota has let slip away this year and the 13th time in franchise history they've lost after building a lead of 20+...

NUMEROLOGY: The Wolves tied their season high by scoring 117 points vs. the L.A. Lakers on Mar. 27 (also Mar. 22 at Phoenix)... Minnesota has boosted its scoring to 101.8 ppg (46.1%) over the past 13 contests, after netting just 90.3 ppg in the previous 13... The Wolves were held to a season-low-tying 77 points Mar. 18 at Memphis (also Mar. 10 vs. Dallas and Jan. 17 vs. the L.A. Clippers)... Minnesota collected 114 points Dec. 15 vs. Dallas, its third straight game with a season-high total; the Wolves are 17-7 this year when scoring 100+... At the other end, Minnesota has permitted 100+ points in 30 of its last 50 starts; Oklahoma City's 127 points on Feb. 22 are the most by a Wolves foe this season... THE BOARD REPORT: The Wolves posted a 49-39 edge on the glass Mar. 12 vs. San Antonio, their 18th double-digit advantage this year (10 such games in 2011-12); the franchise record is 23, set in 2001-02... Still, Minnesota has been outrebounded in 35 of its past 49 games, after holding the edge in 22 of the first 30; they're facing an average deficit of -3.7 rpg (39.6-43.3) over the last 49 contests... Chicago piled up a 52-32 board advantage on Mar. 24, Minnesota's largest deficit this season... Golden State enjoyed a 60-44 spread on Tuesday, one of 12 times the Wolves have been outrebounded by 10+; the 60 boards represent the most vs. Minnesota since 2003... The Wolves outboarded Miami by a 53-24 count on Dec. 18, the largest single-game margin (+29) in club history... On the year, Minnesota ranks 12th in offensive rebound pct (.277), 16th in defensive rebound pct (.734) and 11th in total rebound pct (.506)...

NO THREES, PLEASE: The Wolves went 14-for-26 from beyond the arc in the Mar. 26 win at Detroit, hitting a club-record 12 treys in the 2nd half... Their season three-point accuracy stands at 30.4%, but has climbed to 37.1% (78-for-210) over the past 12 games; the overall percentage will be the Wolves' lowest since finishing at 29.8% (122-for-410) in the abbreviated 1998-99 campaign... Minnesota shot 13-for-25 from three-point range Dec. 4 at Philadelphia, one of six games with 10+ makes; they finished 12-for-20 vs. San Antonio on Mar. 12... Meanwhile, Portland went 16-for-24 (66.7%) on Jan. 5, the single-game season high in both treys made and three-point accuracy vs. Minnesota... Wolves opponents have combined to shoot 39.0% (374-for-958) from beyond the arc in the last 50 games; Minnesota had limited teams to just 33.1% (183-for-553) from three-point distance in its first 29 contests this season...

SCHEDULE NOTES: Minnesota is off to a 3-4 start this month, after compiling a 1-26 record in its previous three Aprils... Tonight's game concludes the Wolves' last four-games-in-five-nights set; they've faced four such groupings overall, including three in the final five weeks (Mar. 9-13, Mar. 26-30, Apr. 9-13)... The Mar. 30 game vs. Memphis completed Minnesota's second seven-games-in-10-nights run in March (Mar. 9-18, Mar. 21-30); they have 22 back-to-backs this year (three in April)... The Apr. 6 game vs. Detroit completed an 11-day run with six of seven at Target Center; the Wolves need a 2-0 homestand to finish with their first .500+ home record since 2005-06... CRUNCH TIME: Minnesota limited Memphis to 17.4% shooting (4-for-23) in the 4th period on Apr. 17, and finished 13th in the NBA in 4th-quarter FG pct. defense (42.9%) as well as 17th in scoring defense (23.7 points). WOLF TRACKS: Minnesota finished the 2011-12 season at 26-40 (.394), a nine-win improvement over 2010-11 and marking their best single-season victory total since compiling a 32-50 record in 2006-07... It's also the Wolves' top winning percentage for a season since 2005-06, when they went 33-49 (.402); Minnesota has now missed the postseason in eight consecutive seasons (beginning with 2004-05), after advancing to the playoffs every year from 1996-97 through 2003-04 (eight)... The current absence is the NBA's longest active postseason drought; Sacramento (six seasons), Golden State (five) and New Jersey (five) are next on that list... Prior to the Mar. 30 home loss to Boston, the Wolves stood 25-27 and were within 2.5 games of a playoff berth; Minnesota was officially eliminated from postseason contention with the Apr. 12 setback vs. the L.A. Clippers... The Wolves were above .500 as late as Mar. 12, when the 127-124 victory at Phoenix hiked their record to 22-21; however, they won just four of their final 23 starts... The Wolves closed with eight consecutive home losses to go 13-20... On the flipside, they put together a matching 13-20 road record, their best since a 20-21 mark in 2004-05; Minnesota had won a total of 10 road games in its previous two seasons (going 5-36 in both 2009-10 and 2010-11)...

MARGINAL INFORMATION: The 131-102 loss to Denver on Apr. 26 was Minnesota's largest of the year; previously, they'd dropped a 114-90 decision to Phoenix on Apr. 9... Eleven of the Wolves' final 26 games were decided by six points or less; they suffered 17 losses in two-possession games (one behind Toronto's league-leading total)... Minnesota spotted Utah an 18-point lead before rallying to win at the buzzer on Feb. 22, and held on to beat Phoenix 127-124 on Mar. 12... The Wolves ranked 4th with seven one-possession victories (decided by three points or less), and played the 3rd-most such games in the NBA (14)... Half of the Wolves' 26 wins were by double-digit spreads -- their highest single-season total since winning 16 games by 10+ points in 2005-06 -- Including five of nine since All-Star Weekend (109-97 at the Clippers, 122-110 at Portland, 106-94 vs. Portland, 117-100 vs. Denver, 91-80 at Detroit); they lost 16 games by 10+ points (four by 20+)... Last season, Minnesota was 11-32 in games decided by 10+ points and 4-20 in two-possession games... They suffered 10 defeats by 20+ points, including a franchise-record 128-86 setback in Orlando on Nov. 3, 2010...

THE IRON RANGE: Denver shot 62.9% in the Apr. 26 finale, the 3rd-highest percentage ever by a Wolves opponent (Detroit 66.7%, Nov. 8, 1994; L.A. Lakers 64.2%, Mar. 20, 1992); Minnesota allowed 50%+ in five April starts and seven of the last 18... Detroit's 80 points on Apr. 29 were the fewest allowed by Minnesota since the 87-79 win over San Antonio on Jan. 27, and the Wolves' 10th sub-90 defensive effort last year... The 149-140 double-OT loss at Oklahoma City on Mar. 23 marked the NBA's 5th-highest scoring game in the past 15 years, and the top aggregate since Seattle beat Denver 151-147 in two OTs on Apr. 6, 2008... The Wolves tallied 127 points in the Mar. 12 win at Phoenix, the most they've ever scored in a non-OT road game; the Suns' 124 points are the most allowed by Minnesota in a win... However, the Wolves saw their scoring dip to 93.3 ppg (42.0%) over the final 16 games... The Mar. 30 loss to Boston produced a season-low 79 points, one of 17 sub-90 outings for the Wolves... The 34.7% accuracy was their lowest since mid-January; Minnesota shot a season-high 58.1% on Jan. 30 at Houston... Washington's 34.5% effort on Jan. 8 was the Wolves' best defensive showing in 2011-12... Minnesota ranked 25th in scoring defense (100.1 ppg) and 22nd in defensive FG pct. (45.5%)...

TURNOVER TROUBLE: Minnesota coughed up 28 TOs in the Feb. 10 loss to Dallas, one shy of the franchise single-game record and one of seven 20+ outings last year... The Wolves saw their TOs rise to 14.5 per night in 25 games following Ricky Rubio's injury, after committing 13.1 per night in their previous 10 starts... Minnesota tied the franchise record low by committing only four TOs vs. the L.A. Lakers on Jan. 29, one of three single-digit outings last season... The Wolves finished 21st in TOs (15.2 per game) and 26th in steals allowed (8.32 per game)... Meanwhile, they ended 27th in TOs forced (13.3 per game) and 26th in steals (6.61 per game), swiping a season-high 12 steals Mar. 1 at Phoenix... Those figures contributed to a league-high -4.3 ppg deficit in points off TOs for the Wolves, who ranked last in points allowed (18.4 per game) and 29th in points scored (14.1 per game)... Atlanta outscored the Wolves 26-6 in fast-break points on Jan. 14, Dallas rang up a 24-4 margin on Jan. 1, and Denver enjoyed a 29-2 advantage on Mar. 25... For the year, the Wolves ranked 26th in the NBA in fast-break scoring (10.3 ppg) and 28th in fast-break points allowed (15.8 per game)...

BOARD REPORT: Minnesota outboarded Golden State 49-37 on Apr. 4, its 10th double-digit margin last season... Meanwhile, Denver piled up a 48-29 edge in the Apr. 26 finale Minnesota's largest deficit of the year... The Wolves came up short 17 times in 32 games after All-Star Weekend, and were outrebounded by 10+ spreads on 11 occasions... Minnesota faced a -2.1 rpg deficit since the Break, after posting a +2.5 rpg advantage in the season's first half; during its 11-game April losing streak, Minnesota was outboarded by a -4.2 rpg (40.5-44.7) margin... Memphis outrebounded the Wolves 59-47 on Feb. 8; the Grizzlies' 59 boards are the most vs. Minnesota since Dallas totaled 60 on Nov. 29, 2003... Minnesota pulled down 24 offensive boards Jan. 29 vs. the Lakers... The Wolves ended 5th in the NBA in second-chance scoring (14.7 points per game)... Minnesota ranked 15th in total rebounding pct. (.503), 14th in offensive rebound pct. (.275) and 16th in defensive rebound pct. (.730)... Last year, the Wolves finished the season 3rd in total rebound pct. (.517) and 2nd in offensive rebound pct. (.296), holding the edge 49 times in 82 games and enjoying 20+ board margins on six occasions (14 double-figure advantages)... Minnesota also led the NBA in second-chance points in 2010-11, netting 16.2 ppg...

Named head coach on Sept. 28, 2011, becoming the 10th coach in Timberwolves history... Minnesota is his fifth stop in an NBA coaching career that began in 1983 as an assistant to Jack Ramsay with Portland...
