Last Game: Friday, Nov. 2 – Minnesota 92, Sacramento 80

José Barea's game-high 21 points led a 46-point bench contribution as the Timberwolves opened their 2012-13 regular season with a 92-80 victory over Sacramento on Friday night at Target Center. Andrei Kirilenko's dunk capped an 18-8 start for Minnesota, and Greg Stiemsma beat the first-quarter buzzer to keep the Wolves in front by 10. Barea had six points during a 10-2 push that extended the margin to 15, and Luke Ridnour gave Minnesota its largest lead of the night at 45-27 with 3:57 left in the second. Marcus Thornton sparked a Kings rally that shaved the deficit to nine by halftime, and Sacramento opened the third quarter with a 20-6 barrage to go up 61-56 on Isaiah Thomas' 3-pointer at the 5:26 mark. However, the Wolves responded by scoring the game's next 12 and rebuilt their margin to 70-62 when Barea scored with 1:12 remaining. The Kings pulled to within three midway through the fourth period, but came up empty on their next five possessions as Minnesota pulled away. Kirilenko and Brandon Roy tallied 10 points apiece in their Timberwolves debuts, while Thomas' 20 points led the Kings and Thornton chipped in 15.

Previous Game: Friday, Oct. 26 – Minnesota 100, Milwaukee 76

Chase Budinger scored 20 points and Nikola Pekovic added 19 with nine rebounds as the Timberwolves closed out the preseason portion of their schedule with a 100-76 victory over Milwaukee on Oct. 26 at the Resch Center in Green Bay. Back-to-back 3-pointers from Budinger and Brandon Roy keyed a 10-0 burst midway through the first period that put Minnesota in front to stay. The margin swelled to 24-15 by quarter's end, then Derrick Williams kick-started a run of nine consecutive points to give the Wolves a 17-point lead early in the second. Alexey Shved opened the second-half scoring with a four-point play and two Pekovic free throws extended Minnesota's lead to 66-45 with 5:40 left in the third. Brandon Jennings helped the Bucks rally to within 13 three minutes later, but Pekovic halted the brief Wolves drought and Minnesota took its largest advantage of the night when Malcolm Lee made it 90-66 with 6:48 remaining in the contest. Williams finished with 13 points while Andrei Kirilenko registered eight points, 10 rebounds and six steals for the Wolves, who went 5-2 in the preseason. Jennings' 19 points led Milwaukee, with Doron Lamb chipping in 12.

WOLVES ON OPENING NIGHT: Minnesota began 2012-13 with Friday's 92-80 victory over Sacramento, the 12th straight year they've started at home... The Wolves saw their 12-game winning streak in home openers halted by Denver on Nov. 2, 2007; that string dated to a 115-85 setback vs. Houston on Nov. 5, 1994... Friday's game marked the first time in five years that Minnesota played its season opener in November; they began on Dec. 26 a year ago, on the heels of three consecutive October starts... The Wolves have sold out nine of 24 home openers, including Friday's capacity crowd of 19,356 vs. Sacramento; an SRO 19,406 were on hand for last year's 104-100 setback vs. Oklahoma City (Dec. 26)... They drew 18,358 for the buzzer-beating 95-93 win over New Jersey on Oct. 28, 2009 and had an SRO 19,443 on hand for the 99-91 loss to Denver on Nov. 2, 2007... All-time, Minnesota is 14-10 on Opening Night, having started 13 of the last 17 seasons with wins (the Denver setback ended a seven-game winning streak in that category); they're 16-8 in home openers... Friday's game marked the fourth time in seven years that Minnesota has opened against Sacramento (sixth overall); the Wolves lost in 1995 at ARCO Arena and 1999 at Tokyo Dome, but won in 2006, 2008 and 2010 (all at Target Center)...

CENTRALLY LOCATED: Six of the Wolves' seven preseason contests were against Central Division opponents (two each vs. Indiana and Chicago, one each vs. Detroit and Milwaukee)... The Oct. 24 win over Detroit in Winnipeg represented Minnesota's second visit to Manitoba (first since 1991) and its eighth preseason game played in Canada (four in Toronto, one each in Vancouver and Hamilton)... Minnesota faced one set of back-to-back contests last month (Oct. 12-13), losing at Indiana but beating Chicago at Target Center on the tail end... The Wolves will play back-to-back four times in November, with the first set beginning this evening in Toronto; they'll make their first-ever visit to Brooklyn's Barclays Center on Monday night to round out the trip... Overall, Minnesota begins 2012-13 by playing six of its first 10 games at Target Center, before embarking on a four-games-in-six-nights West Coast trip that includes stops in Portland, Golden State, Sacramento and the L.A. Clippers (Nov. 23-28)... Of the 15 games on Minnesota's November slate, nine will be against teams that missed the 2012 Playoffs; on the flipside, eight of the Wolves' 12 December games are against playoff opponents...

PLAYING THE PERCENTAGES: The Wolves permitted just 36.0% shooting by Sacramento on Friday, their best defensive percentage in any game since holding Washington to 34.5% last Jan. 8 and the first time they've posted a sub-40% defensive effort on Opening Night since the Kings shot 34.8% on Nov. 1, 2006... In addition, Sacramento's 80 points represent the fewest allowed by Minnesota in an opener since an 83-77 triumph over Denver on Oct. 30, 2002... Minnesota limited Detroit to 32.9% on Oct. 24, and kept Milwaukee to 36.1% from the floor on Oct. 26; overall, the Wolves kept five of their seven preseason foes below 40%, with Indiana's 43.6% effort on Oct. 12 the highest percentage allowed... Minnesota led the NBA in both scoring defense (allowing 80.9 ppg) and FG percentage defense (38.3%) this preseason... They were credited with 13 blocked shots on Oct. 12 at Indiana, including six by Dante Cunningham; that equals their highest total in any game (regular or preseason) since swatting 14 vs. Cleveland on Feb. 17, 2005... Meanwhile, the Wolves swiped 13 steals in the Oct. 26 finale vs. Milwaukee in Green Bay, with Andrei Kirilenko registering six of those; they picked up 10+ steals on four occasions, and ranked 5th in the NBA in that category (10.14 spg) as well as 5th in TOs forced (19.3 per game)...

NEW-LOOK WOLVES: Two of Friday's starting five (Andrei Kirilenko and Brandon Roy) were making their debuts in a Timberwolves uniform, while Nikola Pekovic and Derrick Williams received their first Opening Night starting assignments. ELITE COMPANY: In 2011-12, Kevin Love became only the third player in NBA history to average 25+ ppg and 10+ rpg while also sinking at least 50 three-pointers. LIVING HISTORY: Kevin Love finished the 2011-12 season ranked 4th in the NBA in scoring (26.0 ppg) and 2nd in rebounding (13.3 rpg). *He's the sixth player in the past 36 years (since the NBA/ABA merger) to place among the league's top four in both categories in the same season.* Shaquille O'Neal accomplished that feat on four occasions while Moses Malone, Hakeem Olajuwon and Karl Malone did so twice apiece. RUBIO EARNS ROOKIE HONOR: On Feb. 1, Timberwolves guard Ricky Rubio was named the NBA's Western Conference Rookie of the Month for games played from the start of the season (Dec. 25) through January. Rubio, the 5th overall pick in the 2009 NBA Draft, led all rookies in assists (8.9 apg), steals (2.24 spg) and minutes played (34.4 mpg), while ranking 4th in scoring (11.4 ppg), 5th in rebounding (4.7 rpg) and 3rd in FT accuracy (81.7%). He notched a league-best nine point/assist double-doubles in 21 games (11 starts), highlighted by a season-high 14-assist performance Jan. 8 at Washington and capped by an 18-point, 11-assist, eight-rebound effort in the Jan. 30 victory at Houston. He swiped 3+ steals on 11 occasions, topped by a six-steal outing on Jan. 18 vs. Detroit, and logged a season-high 46:27 in the Jan. 25 win at Dallas. He becomes the fourth rookie in franchise history to earn the monthly award, joining Stephon Marbury (January 1997), Randy Foye (December 2006) and Kevin Love (March 2009).

PLENTY IN RESERVE: Anthony Randolph (a game-high 28 points) and Derrick Williams (27) keyed a 60-27 edge in bench scoring for the Wolves on Apr. 18 in Denver. It's the second time in franchise history that Minnesota has received 25+ points from two non-starters in the same game, and one of four times last year that two players tallied 20+. WOLF TRACKS: Minnesota finished the 2011-12 season at 26-40 (.394), a nine-win improvement over 2010-11 and marking their best single-season victory total since compiling a 32-50 record in 2006-07... It's also the Wolves' top winning percentage for a season since 2005-06, when they went 33-49 (.402); Minnesota has now missed the postseason in eight consecutive seasons (beginning with 2004-05), after advancing to the playoffs every year from 1996-97 through 2003-04 (eight)... The current absence is the NBA's longest active postseason drought; Sacramento (six seasons), Golden State (five) and New Jersey (five) are next on that list... Minnesota closed the season by dropping 13 of its final 14 contests, halting an 11-game losing streak with the 91-80 victory at Detroit Apr. 19... Prior to the Mar. 30 home loss to Boston, the Wolves stood 25-27 and were within 2.5 games of a playoff berth; Minnesota was officially eliminated from postseason contention with the Apr. 12 setback vs. the L.A. Clippers... The Wolves were above .500 as late as Mar. 12, when the 127-124 victory at Phoenix hiked their record to 22-21; however, they won just four of their final 23 starts... The Wolves closed with eight consecutive home losses to go 13-20... On the flipside, they put together a matching 13-20 road record, their best since a 20-21 mark in 2004-05; Minnesota had won a total of 10 road games in its previous two seasons (going 5-36 in both 2009-10 and 2010-11)...

MARGINAL INFORMATION: The 131-102 loss to Denver on Apr. 26 was Minnesota's largest of the year; previously, they'd dropped a 114-90 decision to Phoenix on Apr. 9... Eleven of the Wolves' final 26 games were decided by six points or less; they suffered 17 losses in two-possession games (one behind Toronto's league-leading total)... Minnesota spotted Utah an 18-point lead before rallying to win at the buzzer on Feb. 22, and held on to beat Phoenix 127-124 on Mar. 12... The Wolves ranked 4th with seven one-possession victories (decided by three points or less), and played the 3rd-most such games in the NBA (14)... Half of the Wolves' 26 wins were by double-digit spreads -- their highest single-season total since winning 16 games by 10+ points in 2005-06 -- Including five of nine since All-Star Weekend (109-97 at the Clippers, 122-110 at Portland, 106-94 vs. Portland, 117-100 vs. Denver, 91-80 at Detroit); they lost 16 games by 10+ points (four by 20+)... Last season, Minnesota was 11-32 in games decided by 10+ points and 4-20 in two-possession games... They suffered 10 defeats by 20+ points, including a franchise-record 128-86 setback in Orlando on Nov. 3, 2010...

THE IRON RANGE: Denver shot 62.9% in the Apr. 26 finale, the 3rd-highest percentage ever by a Wolves opponent (Detroit 66.7%, Nov. 8, 1994; L.A. Lakers 64.2%, Mar. 20, 1992); Minnesota allowed 50%+ in five April starts and seven of the last 18... Detroit's 80 points on Apr. 29 were the fewest allowed by Minnesota since the 87-79 win over San Antonio on Jan. 27, and the Wolves' 10th sub-90 defensive effort last year... The 149-140 double-OT loss at Oklahoma City on Mar. 23 marked the NBA's 5th-highest scoring game in the past 15 years, and the top aggregate since Seattle beat Denver 151-147 in two OTs on Apr. 6, 2008... The Wolves tallied 127 points in the Mar. 12 win at Phoenix, the most they've ever scored in a non-OT road game; the Suns' 124 points are the most allowed by Minnesota in a win... However, the Wolves saw their scoring dip to 93.3 ppg (42.0%) over the final 16 games... The Mar. 30 loss to Boston produced a season-low 79 points, one of 17 sub-90 outings for the Wolves... The 34.7% accuracy was their lowest since mid-January; Minnesota shot a season-high 58.1% on Jan. 30 at Houston... Washington's 34.5% effort on Jan. 8 was the Wolves' best defensive showing in 2011-12... Minnesota ranked 25th in scoring defense (100.1 ppg) and 22nd in defensive FG pct. (45.5%)...

TURNOVER TROUBLE: Minnesota coughed up 28 TOs in the Feb. 10 loss to Dallas, one shy of the franchise single-game record and one of seven 20+ outings last year... The Wolves saw their TOs rise to 14.5 per night in 25 games following Ricky Rubio's injury, after committing 13.1 per night in their previous 10 starts... Minnesota tied the franchise record low by committing only four TOs vs. the L.A. Lakers on Jan. 29, one of three single-digit outings last season... The Wolves finished 21st in TOs (15.2 per game) and 26th in steals allowed (8.32 per game)... Meanwhile, they ended 27th in TOs forced (13.3 per game) and 26th in steals (6.61 per game), swiping a season-high 12 steals Mar. 1 at Phoenix... Those figures contributed to a league-high -4.3 ppg deficit in points off TOs for the Wolves, who ranked last in points allowed (18.4 per game) and 29th in points scored (14.1 per game)... Atlanta outscored the Wolves 26-6 in fast-break points on Jan. 14, Dallas rang up a 24-4 margin on Jan. 1, and Denver enjoyed a 29-2 advantage on Mar. 25... For the year, the Wolves ranked 26th in the NBA in fast-break scoring (10.3 ppg) and 28th in fast-break points allowed (15.8 per game)...

BOARD REPORT: Minnesota outboarded Golden State 49-37 on Apr. 4, its 10th double-digit margin last season... Meanwhile, Denver piled up a 48-29 edge in the Apr. 26 finale Minnesota's largest deficit of the year... The Wolves came up short 17 times in 32 games after All-Star Weekend, and were outrebounded by 10+ spreads on 11 occasions... Minnesota faced a -2.1 rpg deficit since the Break, after posting a +2.5 rpg advantage in the season's first half; during its 11-game April losing streak, Minnesota was outboarded by a -4.2 rpg (40.5-44.7) margin... Memphis outrebounded the Wolves 59-47 on Feb. 8; the Grizzlies' 59 boards are the most vs. Minnesota since Dallas totaled 60 on Nov. 29, 2003... Minnesota pulled down 24 offensive boards Jan. 29 vs. the Lakers... The Wolves ended 5th in the NBA in second-chance scoring (14.7 points per game)... Minnesota ranked 15th in total rebounding pct. (.503), 14th in offensive rebound pct. (.275) and 16th in defensive rebound pct. (.730)... Last year, the Wolves finished the season 3rd in total rebound pct. (.517) and 2nd in offensive rebound pct. (.296), holding the edge 49 times in 82 games and enjoying 20+ board margins on six occasions (14 double-figure advantages)... Minnesota also led the NBA in second-chance points in 2010-11, netting 16.2 ppg...

THREE-POINT PLAN: The Wolves hit a season-high 14 three-pointers (in a club-record 36 attempts) Mar. 23 at Oklahoma City, one of 15 games with 10+ makes a year ago... Minnesota was 6th in the NBA in three-point attempts, averaging 21.5 per game; the previous club single-season record of 19.1 was set in 2010-11... The Wolves tied a franchise record by hitting eight treys in the 1st quarter at Portland on Mar. 3... Minnesota ranked 23rd in three-point accuracy (33.2%) and 11th in treys made (7.17 per game); the Wolves had climbed to 5th in three-point accuracy (37.6%) last season, setting a club single-season record with 589 treys made... Minnesota sank 10+ three-pointers on 17 occasions a year ago, including a club-record 18 (in 26 attempts) in the Dec. 4 win over Cleveland... Anthony Morrow drilled eight three-pointers on Feb. 3 at New Jersey, the eighth time an opponent has made 8+ vs. Minnesota... The Wolves finished 7th in the NBA in three-point percentage defense (34.0%); that figure improved to 32.1% (207-for-644) over the final 35... Minnesota was 27th in defensive three-point percentage (37.4%) and 29th in treys allowed (7.79 per game) in 2010-11...

SCHEDULE NOTES: The Apr. 17 loss to Memphis ended a stretch of six in a row vs. teams with winning records... The Memphis game also wrapped up the final set of back-to-back games for Minnesota; they finished 5-15 on the tail ends last season... The Apr. 2 game at Sacramento concluded a three-week stretch that saw the Wolves play 11 of 13 away from Target Center; they closed the season by playing five of seven at home... The Mar. 23 loss at Oklahoma City completed a seven-game Western Conference trip for the Wolves... The Mar. 25 win over Denver was Minnesota's 19th vs. Western Conference opponents, their top total since finishing 20-32 in 2005-06; they won only 15 games against the West in the previous two seasons combined... The Mar. 1 loss at Phoenix ended Minnesota's second three-in-three-nights sets last season (also Jan. 8-9-10)... Minnesota drew an SRO 20,232 for the Feb. 11 game vs. New York, its largest home crowd since the 2003-04 season and the 4th-largest crowd all-time at Target Center... The full-house 19,356 for the Mar. 30 game vs. Boston was the Wolves' fourth straight capacity crowd (Mar. 9 vs. Lakers, Mar. 10 vs. New Orleans, Mar. 25 vs. Denver) and one of 11 overall, their highest total since drawing 15 sellout crowds in 2003-04...
