Last Game: Wednesday, Nov. 14 – Charlotte 89, Minnesota 87

Kemba Walker scored 22 points, including the game-winning jumper with 0.7 seconds remaining, as Charlotte turned back a furious Timberwolves rally to win its third consecutive game, 89-87, on Wednesday night at Target Center. The Bobcats led by seven in the opening quarter before Andrei Kirilenko's 3-pointer at the buzzer cut the margin to 28-24. However, Ramon Sessions' three-point play capped a 12-2 second-quarter burst and Charlotte went into halftime with a 51-38 advantage. Luke Ridnour brought Minnesota to within seven midway through the third, only to see the Bobcats score the final eight points of the period and grab their biggest lead when Tyrus Thomas' last-second jumper made it 69-53. Minnesota still trailed by 14 following a Walker trey with 4:22 remaining, but Kirilenko's 3-pointer started a 16-2 comeback and Derrick Williams sank a free throw with 12.3 seconds left to knot the score at 87-87, setting the stage for Walker's heroics. Sessions tallied 18 points and Byron Mullens added 12 with 15 rebounds for Charlotte. Kirilenko led Minnesota with 26 points and 12 rebounds, while Ridnour chipped in 16 points and 10 assists.

Previous Game: Monday, Nov. 12 – Minnesota 90, Dallas 82

Nikola Pekovic scored 20 points and Andrei Kirilenko added 16 with 11 rebounds as the shorthanded Timberwolves rolled to a 90-82 victory over Dallas on Monday night at American Airlines Center. The Mavericks took their only lead when O.J. Mayo made it 5-3, but Pekovic and Kirilenko combined for Minnesota's next 11 points and the Wolves led 25-17 after one quarter. Dallas whittled a 12-point deficit to 43-39 on a late jumper from Chris Kaman before two Luke Ridnour free throws gave Minnesota a six-point halftime cushion. Kirilenko's dunk stretched the margin to 64-51 midway through the third, but Pekovic left shortly thereafter with a sprained left ankle. The Mavericks shaved the deficit to 66-58 by quarter's end and Darren Collison's three-point play kept Dallas within eight with 6:04 to play, but 3-pointers from Alexey Shved and Ridnour gave the Wolves their largest lead of the night at 85-72 at the 3:23 mark. A late push got Dallas as close as six before Dante Cunningham and Ridnour sealed it with free throws. Ridnour totaled 15 points, eight rebounds and seven assists for Minnesota, while Collison's 21 points led the Mavericks.

First Meeting: Kevin Love registered 36 points and 17 rebounds, and the Timberwolves snapped their three-game losing streak with a 97-93 victory over Golden State on Mar. 19 at Oracle Arena. José Barea and Luke Ridnour handed out 10 assists apiece for Minnesota, while David Lee had 25 points and nine rebounds for the Warriors and Richard Jefferson added 19 points.

Second Meeting: David Lee tallied 31 points and Charles Jenkins chipped in 19, including the go-ahead basket with 20.4 seconds to play, as Golden State rallied from a 20-point deficit to beat the Wolves, 97-94, on Apr. 4 at Target Center. Kevin Love finished with 29 points and 12 rebounds for Minnesota, while Wayne Ellington scored 17 points and José Barea handed out eight assists.

Third Meeting: Charles Jenkins tallied 24 points and nine assists, and Brandon Rush scored 10 of his 19 points in the fourth quarter to help Golden State overcome a 21-point deficit and edge the Timberwolves, 93-88, on Apr. 22 at Target Center. Nikola Pekovic finished with 19 points and a career-high 16 rebounds for Minnesota, while José Barea handed out 12 assists.

Minnesota's Mar. 25 victory was just its second in the past 21 meetings overall vs. Denver, and its first at Target Center since Feb. 14, 2007.

First Meeting: Al Harrington scored a season-high 31 points and Arron Afflalo added 20 – including the go-ahead basket with 33.7 seconds left in OT -- as Denver rallied for a 103-101 victory over the Timberwolves on Feb. 20 at the Pepsi Center. Kevin Love topped Minnesota with 22 points and 13 rebounds, while Michael Beasley chipped in 17 points and Ricky Rubio had 16.

Second Meeting: Kevin Love collected 30 points and 21 rebounds, and the Wolves used a big first half to roll past Denver, 117-100, on Mar. 25 at Target Center. Luke Ridnour tallied 25 points and Wayne Ellington added 17 for Minnesota. The Nuggets were led by 17 points from Kenneth Faried.

Third Meeting: Ty Lawson scored 24 points and Arron Afflalo added 21, and Denver squandered a 24-point lead before recovering to hand the Timberwolves a 113-107 defeat on Apr. 11 at the Pepsi Center. Anthony Randolph finished with a season-high 28 points for Minnesota, while Derrick Williams added 27 and José Barea dished out a career-high 15 assists.

Fourth Meeting: JaVale McGee's 19 points led seven double-digit scorers and Denver shot 63 percent from the floor in routing the Timberwolves, 131-102, in both teams' regular season finales on Apr. 26 at Target Center. Arron Afflalo tallied 18 points and Danilo Gallinari had 17 for the Nuggets, while José Barea led Minnesota with 20 points and five assists.

ROSTER NOTES: On Friday, the Wolves signed free-agent forward Josh Howard to a one-year contract, replacing guard Will Conroy, who was waived on Thursday... Of the 15 players who ended 2011-12 with the Timberwolves, only seven are back this season... Eight new faces dot Minnesota's roster, including free-agent signees Andrei Kirilenko, Brandon Roy, Greg Stiemsma, Alexey Shved, Lou Amundson and Howard... Chase Budinger (Houston) and Dante Cunningham (Memphis) were picked up via trade over the summer... Shved is the lone NBA rookie on the Timberwolves' Opening Night roster, down from three in each of the previous two seasons... Last December, the Wolves returned 10 of 13 players from their 2010-11 roster; they kept just five of 15 players from 2009-10 to the next season and five from 2008-09 to 2009-10... The current roster averages 4.1 years of NBA experience and has an average age of 26.7 years; last year's Opening Night group was at 3.7 and 25.3, respectively (2.7 and 24.2 in 2010-11)... Kevin Love remains Minnesota's longest-tenured player, entering his fifth season in a Timberwolves uniform; Howard is now the oldest at age 32 years, seven months...

WOLF TRACKS: Charlotte handed the Wolves their first home loss of the season with Wednesday's last-second, 89-87 decision... Minnesota trailed by 14 points with 4:22 to play before rallying to tie the Bobcats with 12.3 seconds left... Despite the loss, the Wolves' 5-3 record is their best through eight games since 2004-05, when they also opened 5-3... Minnesota capped a two-game trip with Monday's 90-82 win at Dallas; it's their 20th road victory all-time in the series, the most vs. any opponent... Minnesota has won three of its past four vs. the Mavericks, after dropping 18 of the previous 19 meetings... Chicago ended the Wolves' three-game winning streak with last Saturday's 87-80 decision at the United Center... They put together three straight victories on four occasions last year; their most recent four-game run was Jan. 29-Feb. 6, 2010... Minnesota slipped past Indiana, 96-94, on Chase Budinger's last-second basket Nov. 9 at Target Center... The Wolves began the homestand by downing Orlando, 90-75, on Nov. 7; that win ended a seven-game drought overall against the Magic, and was their first home victory vs. Orlando since Mar. 29, 2006... Minnesota completed its first road trip of the season by rallying from 22 points back to defeat Brooklyn, 107-96, on Nov. 5; it's the 10th time in franchise history the Wolves have overcome a deficit of 20+ points to win... Minnesota kicked off the Eastern swing with a 105-86 defeat on Nov. 4 in Toronto; it's their 9th straight loss at the Air Canada Centre and their 15th in the last 16 overall vs. Toronto... Each of the Wolves' last four games have been decided by single-figure spreads; they finished 13-24 a year ago when the final margin was less than 10 points...

PLAYING THE PERCENTAGES: The Wolves kept Orlando to 35.0% shooting on Nov. 7, their best defensive percentage in any game since holding Washington to 34.5% last Jan. 8... The Magic's 75 points represent the fewest allowed by Minnesota since that same game (a 93-72 home win vs. the Wizards)... The Wolves are 2nd in the NBA in both defensive FG percentage (41.4%) and scoring defense (88.5 ppg) as well as 4th in blocked shots (7.50 bpg)... Minnesota shot a season-high 50.0% Nov. 7 vs. Orlando, including 63.2% (12-for-19) in the 4th quarter... They dished 30 assists (against a season-low 11 TOs) Nov. 5 at Brooklyn, equaling their highest total since dealing 31 vs. Utah on Dec. 30, 2009... The Wolves posted a 53-43 edge on the glass Wednesday vs. Charlotte, their fourth double-digit margin this year (10 times in 2011-12); Minnesota ranks 6th in offensive rebound pct (.302) and 4th in total rebound pct (.524)... The Wolves led the NBA in both scoring defense (80.9 ppg) and FG percentage defense (38.3%) this preseason... They were credited with 13 blocks on Oct. 12 at Indiana (six by Dante Cunningham), tying their highest total in any game (regular or preseason) since swatting 14 vs. Cleveland on Feb. 17, 2005... Meanwhile, the Wolves had 13 steals Oct. 26 vs. Milwaukee, with Andrei Kirilenko registering six of those; they ranked 5th in the NBA in that category (10.14 spg) as well as 5th in TOs forced (19.3 per game)...

FOR OPENERS: The Wolves began 2012-13 with a 92-80 victory over Sacramento on Nov. 2, the 12th straight year they've started at home... It was also the fourth time in seven years that Minnesota has opened against the Kings (sixth overall)... The Wolves have sold out nine of 24 home openers, including the capacity crowd of 19,356 on Nov. 2; an SRO 19,406 were on hand for last year's 104-100 loss to Oklahoma City (Dec. 26)... All-time, Minnesota is 14-10 on Opening Night, having started 13 of the last 17 seasons with victories; they're 16-8 in home openers... The Nov. 10 loss in Chicago wrapped up the second of four back-to-back sets in November (22 overall) for the Wolves, and capped a busy six-games-in-nine-nights sprint out of the gates... The Chicago outing also ended a run of five straight games for Minnesota vs. Eastern Conference opponents... They continue a three-game homestand tonight vs. Golden State, then embark on a four-games-in-six-nights West Coast trip that includes stops in Portland, Golden State, Sacramento and the Clippers (Nov. 23-28)... Of the 15 games on Minnesota's November schedule, nine are against teams that missed the 2012 Playoffs...

PRESEASON NOTES: Minnesota wrapped up its 2012 preseason with a 5-2 record following the 100-76 triumph over Milwaukee on Oct. 26 in Green Bay... It's the Wolves' third consecutive winning preseason; they're now 92-81 all-time in exhibition outings, winning 15 of their last 19 starts... Minnesota began the week by handing Detroit a 95-76 setback on Oct. 24 in Winnipeg... Five nights earlier, the Wolves suffered a 92-81 defeat in Chicago to settle for a split of the two-game preseason series; Minnesota had notched an 82-75 win on Oct. 13 at Target Center... The Wolves capped their two-game homestand by routing Israeli club Maccabi Haifa, 114-81, on Oct. 16; it's just the second time in franchise history they've faced a non-NBA opponent in the preseason, having beaten Efes Pilsen on Oct. 6, 2007 in Istanbul... Minnesota kicked off the month with consecutive games vs. Indiana, winning 84-70 on Oct. 10 in Fargo before dropping a 96-91 decision two nights later at Bankers Life Fieldhouse; the 96 points were the most they allowed in October...

RUBIO EARNS ROOKIE HONOR: On Feb. 1, Timberwolves guard Ricky Rubio was named the NBA's Western Conference Rookie of the Month for games played from the start of the season (Dec. 25) through January. Rubio, the 5th overall pick in the 2009 NBA Draft, led all rookies in assists (8.9 apg), steals (2.24 spg) and minutes played (34.4 mpg), while ranking 4th in scoring (11.4 ppg), 5th in rebounding (4.7 rpg) and 3rd in FT accuracy (81.7%). He notched a league-best nine point/assist double-doubles in 21 games (11 starts), highlighted by a season-high 14-assist performance Jan. 8 at Washington and capped by an 18-point, 11-assist, eight-rebound effort in the Jan. 30 victory at Houston. He swiped 3+ steals on 11 occasions, topped by a six-steal outing on Jan. 18 vs. Detroit, and logged a season-high 46:27 in the Jan. 25 win at Dallas. He becomes the fourth rookie in franchise history to earn the monthly award, joining Stephon Marbury (January 1997), Randy Foye (December 2006) and Kevin Love (March 2009).

WOLF TRACKS: Minnesota finished the 2011-12 season at 26-40 (.394), a nine-win improvement over 2010-11 and marking their best single-season victory total since compiling a 32-50 record in 2006-07... It's also the Wolves' top winning percentage for a season since 2005-06, when they went 33-49 (.402); Minnesota has now missed the postseason in eight consecutive seasons (beginning with 2004-05), after advancing to the playoffs every year from 1996-97 through 2003-04 (eight)... The current absence is the NBA's longest active postseason drought; Sacramento (six seasons), Golden State (five) and New Jersey (five) are next on that list... Prior to the Mar. 30 home loss to Boston, the Wolves stood 25-27 and were within 2.5 games of a playoff berth; Minnesota was officially eliminated from postseason contention with the Apr. 12 setback vs. the L.A. Clippers... The Wolves were above .500 as late as Mar. 12, when the 127-124 victory at Phoenix hiked their record to 22-21; however, they won just four of their final 23 starts... The Wolves closed with eight consecutive home losses to go 13-20... On the flipside, they put together a matching 13-20 road record, their best since a 20-21 mark in 2004-05; Minnesota had won a total of 10 road games in its previous two seasons (going 5-36 in both 2009-10 and 2010-11)...

MARGINAL INFORMATION: The 131-102 loss to Denver on Apr. 26 was Minnesota's largest of the year; previously, they'd dropped a 114-90 decision to Phoenix on Apr. 9... Eleven of the Wolves' final 26 games were decided by six points or less; they suffered 17 losses in two-possession games (one behind Toronto's league-leading total)... Minnesota spotted Utah an 18-point lead before rallying to win at the buzzer on Feb. 22, and held on to beat Phoenix 127-124 on Mar. 12... The Wolves ranked 4th with seven one-possession victories (decided by three points or less), and played the 3rd-most such games in the NBA (14)... Half of the Wolves' 26 wins were by double-digit spreads -- their highest single-season total since winning 16 games by 10+ points in 2005-06 -- Including five of nine since All-Star Weekend (109-97 at the Clippers, 122-110 at Portland, 106-94 vs. Portland, 117-100 vs. Denver, 91-80 at Detroit); they lost 16 games by 10+ points (four by 20+)... Last season, Minnesota was 11-32 in games decided by 10+ points and 4-20 in two-possession games... They suffered 10 defeats by 20+ points, including a franchise-record 128-86 setback in Orlando on Nov. 3, 2010...

THE IRON RANGE: Denver shot 62.9% in the Apr. 26 finale, the 3rd-highest percentage ever by a Wolves opponent (Detroit 66.7%, Nov. 8, 1994; L.A. Lakers 64.2%, Mar. 20, 1992); Minnesota allowed 50%+ in five April starts and seven of the last 18... Detroit's 80 points on Apr. 29 were the fewest allowed by Minnesota since the 87-79 win over San Antonio on Jan. 27, and the Wolves' 10th sub-90 defensive effort last year... The 149-140 double-OT loss at Oklahoma City on Mar. 23 marked the NBA's 5th-highest scoring game in the past 15 years, and the top aggregate since Seattle beat Denver 151-147 in two OTs on Apr. 6, 2008... The Wolves tallied 127 points in the Mar. 12 win at Phoenix, the most they've ever scored in a non-OT road game; the Suns' 124 points are the most allowed by Minnesota in a win... However, the Wolves saw their scoring dip to 93.3 ppg (42.0%) over the final 16 games... The Mar. 30 loss to Boston produced a season-low 79 points, one of 17 sub-90 outings for the Wolves... The 34.7% accuracy was their lowest since mid-January; Minnesota shot a season-high 58.1% on Jan. 30 at Houston... Washington's 34.5% effort on Jan. 8 was the Wolves' best defensive showing in 2011-12... Minnesota ranked 25th in scoring defense (100.1 ppg) and 22nd in defensive FG pct. (45.5%)...

TURNOVER TROUBLE: Minnesota coughed up 28 TOs in the Feb. 10 loss to Dallas, one shy of the franchise single-game record and one of seven 20+ outings last year... The Wolves saw their TOs rise to 14.5 per night in 25 games following Ricky Rubio's injury, after committing 13.1 per night in their previous 10 starts... Minnesota tied the franchise record low by committing only four TOs vs. the L.A. Lakers on Jan. 29, one of three single-digit outings last season... The Wolves finished 21st in TOs (15.2 per game) and 26th in steals allowed (8.32 per game)... Meanwhile, they ended 27th in TOs forced (13.3 per game) and 26th in steals (6.61 per game), swiping a season-high 12 steals Mar. 1 at Phoenix... Those figures contributed to a league-high -4.3 ppg deficit in points off TOs for the Wolves, who ranked last in points allowed (18.4 per game) and 29th in points scored (14.1 per game)... Atlanta outscored the Wolves 26-6 in fast-break points on Jan. 14, Dallas rang up a 24-4 margin on Jan. 1, and Denver enjoyed a 29-2 advantage on Mar. 25... For the year, the Wolves ranked 26th in the NBA in fast-break scoring (10.3 ppg) and 28th in fast-break points allowed (15.8 per game)...

BOARD REPORT: Minnesota outboarded Golden State 49-37 on Apr. 4, its 10th double-digit margin last season... Meanwhile, Denver piled up a 48-29 edge in the Apr. 26 finale Minnesota's largest deficit of the year... The Wolves came up short 17 times in 32 games after All-Star Weekend, and were outrebounded by 10+ spreads on 11 occasions... Minnesota faced a -2.1 rpg deficit since the Break, after posting a +2.5 rpg advantage in the season's first half; during its 11-game April losing streak, Minnesota was outboarded by a -4.2 rpg (40.5-44.7) margin... Memphis outrebounded the Wolves 59-47 on Feb. 8; the Grizzlies' 59 boards are the most vs. Minnesota since Dallas totaled 60 on Nov. 29, 2003... Minnesota pulled down 24 offensive boards Jan. 29 vs. the Lakers... The Wolves ended 5th in the NBA in second-chance scoring (14.7 points per game)... Minnesota ranked 15th in total rebounding pct. (.503), 14th in offensive rebound pct. (.275) and 16th in defensive rebound pct. (.730)... Last year, the Wolves finished the season 3rd in total rebound pct. (.517) and 2nd in offensive rebound pct. (.296), holding the edge 49 times in 82 games and enjoying 20+ board margins on six occasions (14 double-figure advantages)... Minnesota also led the NBA in second-chance points in 2010-11, netting 16.2 ppg...
