Last Game: Saturday, Jan. 31 – Cleveland 106, Minnesota 90

LeBron James pumped in 36 points, including 13 in a row during a game-closing 23-5 flurry to lift Cleveland to its 10th consecutive victory, 106-90 over the Timberwolves on Saturday night at Target Center. Ten points from Timofey Mozgov helped stake the Cavs to a 30-21 lead after one quarter, but Nikola Pekovic keyed an 11-3 rally that brought Minnesota to within five midway through the second period and Andrew Wiggins' steal and dunk tied it at 47-47 with 1:51 left in the half. James responded with a 3-pointer and Cleveland took a 52-49 lead at halftime, only to see the Wolves edge ahead 73-70 on a Thaddeus Young basket with 2:58 to play in the third quarter. Minnesota took its biggest lead when Wiggins made it 83-78 early in the fourth, but then managed just two field goals over the final 10 minutes and James' trey at the 8:09 mark put the Cavs in front to stay. Kevin Love collected 14 points and 17 rebounds for Cleveland. Wiggins finished with a season-high 33 points for Minnesota, which drew a standing-room-only crowd of 19,562, while Young chipped in 19 points and Pekovic tallied 14 points and 12 rebounds.

Michael Carter-Williams posted his fifth career triple-double (17 points, 10 rebounds, 10 assists) and Nerlens Noel added 14 points, six blocks and four steals as Philadelphia completed a sweep of its two-game season series with the Timberwolves by winning, 103-94, on Friday night at the Wells Fargo Center. Minnesota led 28-26 after one quarter, setting up a second period that featured 11 lead changes and ended with the Sixers on top, 61-59, when Carter-Williams beat the buzzer with a driving layup. Kevin Martin's 3-pointer triggered a 7-0 burst that put the Wolves ahead 77-74 late in the third, but two Jerami Grant free throws sent Philadelphia into the fourth quarter clinging to a 78-77 lead and Robert Covington's trey capped the 14-1 uprising that made it 88-78 with 8:20 to play. Andrew Wiggins netted the game's next five points and Martin cut the deficit to three at the 6:46 mark, but Minnesota's rally stalled when the Sixers held them scoreless on six straight possessions down the stretch. Luc Richard Mbah a Mouté led Philadelphia with 18 points, while Martin's 19 points topped Minnesota and Nikola Pekovic put in 18.

Second Meeting: Chandler Parsons scored 19 of his 22 points in the first half and Dirk Nowitzki added 16 points and nine rebounds as Dallas rolled to a 98-75 victory over the Timberwolves on Jan. 21 at Target Center. J.J. Barea handed out 10 assists for the Mavericks. Andrew Wiggins led Minnesota with 18 points while Thaddeus Young had 14 points, 11 rebounds and six assists.

Raduljica was initially signed to a 10-day contract on Jan. 8 and inked a second 10-day deal on Jan. 19... On Jan. 7, Minnesota waived forward Jeff Adrien; he'd originally been signed on Nov. 29 with a hardship exception granted by the NBA... On Dec. 19, the Wolves acquired guard Troy Daniels, two 2nd-round draft picks and cash considerations from Houston in a three-team transaction that saw Minnesota send forward Corey Brewer to the Rockets and center Ronny Turiaf to Philadelphia... To complete the trade, the 76ers conveyed guard Alexey Shved to Houston in exchange for Houston's 2nd-round pick in the 2015 NBA Draft and the rights to center Serhiy Lishchuk... Details on the 2nd-round selections heading to Minnesota are as follows: Sacramento's 2015 choice (protected for picks 50-60), previously acquired by the Rockets on Sept. 17, and Houston's own 2016 choice (protected for picks 31-45).

ROSTER NOTES: On Oct. 27, the Timberwolves announced their 15-man Opening Night roster, having reached the limit by waiving guard J.J. Barea... Anthony Bennett, Andrew Wiggins and Thaddeus Young were acquired in a three-team trade involving Cleveland and Philadelphia on Aug. 23... Three rookies are on the roster; Wiggins was chosen 1st overall by the Cavaliers in the 2014 NBA Draft, while Minnesota used its own selections to tab Zach LaVine (1st round, 13th overall) and Glenn Robinson III (2nd round, 40th overall)... Of the 15 players who finished 2013-14 on Minnesota's roster, seven remain this year... The current roster averages 3.1 years of NBA experience and has an average age of 25.0 years; last year's group was at 3.7 and 26.0, respectively (3.6 and 26.5 in 2012-13)... Mo Williams (32) and Kevin Martin (31) are the oldest Timberwolves players while LaVine (19) and Wiggins (19) are the youngest... Nikola Pekovic moves atop the seniority list, playing his fifth season in Minnesota, while Ricky Rubio is in year number four.

WILLIAMS WEEK'S BEST IN WEST: On Jan. 19, Wolves guard Mo Williams was named the NBA's Western Conference Player of the Week for games played Jan. 12-18. Williams helped Minnesota to a 2-1 record for the week, averaging 30.3 ppg and 6.3 apg while hitting 50.7% from the floor, 40.0% from three-point range and 84.6% from the FT line. He tallied a career-high and franchise-record 52 points in the 110-101 win at Indiana on Jan. 13, while tying club single-game marks for FGs made (19) and attempted (33). He followed up with a game-high 26 points in the 110-99 loss at Phoenix on Jan. 16, and rounded out the week by netting seven of his 13 points in the final 3:00 of the 113-105 victory at Denver on Jan. 17. It's the first weekly honor of Williams' 12-year NBA career; he becomes the seventh player in Timberwolves history to win the award, joining Kevin Garnett (15 times), Kevin Love (twice), Al Jefferson (twice), Stephon Marbury (Feb. 21, 1999), Sam Cassell (Dec. 28, 2003) and Nikola Pekovic (Apr. 8, 2013).

EYES ON THE RISE: A record four Timberwolves players have been chosen to participate in the 2015 BBVA Rising Stars Challenge, to be held as part of All-Star Weekend on Feb. 13 at the Barclays Center in Brooklyn. Andrew Wiggins (Canada) and Gorgui Dieng (Sénégal) will represent the World team at the annual showcase of first- and second-year players, while Shabazz Muhammad and Zach LaVine – who will also take part in the 2015 Sprite Slam Dunk the following evening -- were named to the U.S. squad. Twelve previous Wolves have appeared in the contest (in its various formats), highlighted by Wally Szczerbiak winning game MVP honors in 2001:

WIGGINS REPEATS AS TOP ROOKIE: On Jan. 5, Timberwolves forward Andrew Wiggins was named the NBA's Western Conference Rookie of the Month for December, his second straight monthly honor. Wiggins, the 1st overall pick in the 2014 NBA Draft, led all rookies in scoring (14.6 ppg) and minutes played (33.9 mpg) while ranking 2nd among Western Conference rookies in blocked shots (0.60 bpg), 3rd in rebounding (4.1 rpg), and 4th in steals (0.87 spg). He tallied 20+ points five times and was the Wolves' top scorer on four occasions, and tallied 20.0 ppg (50.8%) on the month-closing four-game road trip (Dec. 23-30). Wiggins posted his first double-double with 23 points and 10 rebounds in the Dec. 10 win vs. Portland, and netted a team-high 27 points at Cleveland on Dec. 23. Wiggins is the sixth rookie in franchise history to earn the monthly award, joining Stephon Marbury (January 1997), Randy Foye (December 2006), Kevin Love (March 2009), Ricky Rubio (January 2012) and Gorgui Dieng (March 2014).

WOLF TRACKS: Cleveland extended its winning streak to 10 with Saturday's 106-90 decision vs. Minnesota at Target Center... Philadelphia completed a season sweep of the Wolves by winning 103-94 last Friday at the Wells Fargo Center, having registered an 85-77 victory on Dec. 3... Minnesota halted its five-game losing streak with the 110-98 triumph over Boston on Jan. 28; the final 12-point spread represents just its second double-digit win of the season (115-99 vs. New York, Nov. 19)... The win was the Wolves' first at Target Center since beating Portland, 90-82, on Dec. 10; the 10-game drought is Minnesota's longest at home since losing 10 in a row in 2010 (Feb. 10-Mar. 28)... Oklahoma City sent the Wolves to a 92-84 defeat on Jan. 26, Minnesota's 10th straight road loss in the series; one night earlier, Atlanta's 112-100 triumph marked the Wolves' 12th consecutive loss at Philips Arena dating to 2002... New Orleans halted a four-game drought at Target Center with the 92-84 victory on Jan. 23... Minnesota reached the season's midpoint with the 98-75 home loss to Dallas on Jan. 21; the final 23-point spread marks the Wolves' seventh loss by 20+ this season... Minnesota completed its four-game trip at 2-2 following the 105-80 loss at Charlotte on Jan. 19... The trip began on Jan. 13 at Indiana, where Minnesota ended its 15-game losing streak with a 110-101 decision... The drought lasted 34 days, dating to the Dec. 10 home win vs. Portland; it equaled the 5th-longest losing streak in club history... The road trip also featured stops in Phoenix (a 110-99 loss on Jan. 16) and Denver (a 113-105 win on Jan. 17)... Prior to the Indiana victory, Minnesota had suffered 10 consecutive road losses since claiming a 120-119 win at the Lakers on Nov. 28... San Antonio beat the Wolves for the third time this year with the 108-93 verdict on Jan. 10... The Wolves closed a winless four-game homestand with the Jan. 7 loss to Phoenix... The stand began with a 110-107 loss to Sacramento on Jan. 1 and continued with setbacks vs. Utah (101-89 on Jan. 3) and Denver (110-101 on Jan. 5...

SCHEDULE NOTES: Saturday's game concluded a five-games-in-seven-nights slog for the Wolves, the second of four such stretches this year (Nov. 30-Dec. 6, Mar. 13-19, Apr. 7-13)... Saturday also wrapped up the 11th of 19 sets of back-to-back games in 2014-15; the Wolves are 2-9 on the back ends (beating Detroit on Oct. 30 and Denver on Jan. 17)... The Jan. 26 game at Oklahoma City capped a two-week run that saw them play six of eight on the road; after tonight, 10 of the Wolves' next 13 games (through Mar. 7) will be at Target Center... The Jan. 19 loss at Charlotte completed an 11-game run that saw Minnesota face seven sub-.500 teams; during the recent 15-game skid, nine of Minnesota's losses were to sub-.500 opponents... The Jan. 10 loss to San Antonio ended a seven-game stretch in which five of Minnesota's opponents were on the tail end of back-to-back sets; they catch a total of 25 teams in that scenario this year, including 20 at Target Center... The Jan. 25 loss in Atlanta completed the road portion of the Wolves' 2014-15 slate vs. Southeast foes (finishing 0-5); tonight continues a 16-day run (through Feb. 9 vs. Atlanta) in which Minnesota plays seven of 10 vs. the East... The Wolves are 5-14 all-time on Groundhog Day (1-6 on the road), most recently beating New Orleans, 115-86, in 2013...

OFF TARGET: Minnesota was held to a season-low 34.1% by Oklahoma City on Jan. 26, its 10th sub-40% outing of 2014-15 and third in the last eight games... The Wolves' 75 points vs. Dallas on Jan. 21 represent their single-game low since scoring 72 vs. Milwaukee on Nov. 6, 2009... The previous season lows were 77 points and 35.7% vs. Philly on Dec. 3; they're 6-11 when hitting 45%+ (2-28 when falling short)... Minnesota hit 53.8% in the Jan. 17 victory at Denver, one of four 50%+ efforts on the year but first since shooting a season-best 57.0% on Nov. 28 at the Lakers... The run of 24 consecutive sub-50% outings is the 2nd-longest in franchise history; the Wolves endured a 26-game drought in 1991... Minnesota's 37 assists in the Nov. 28 win at the Lakers tie their highest total ever in a road game (Jan. 9, 2000 at Philadelphia)... The Wolves went 11-for-22 from long distance in the Nov. 19 win over New York, a season high for made treys; they went 10-for-20 Jan. 13 at Indiana... Minnesota has seen its three-point accuracy slip to 32.9% (70-for-213) over the last 13, on the heels of a 10-game run at 37.4% (64-for-171)... On the year, Minnesota ranks 25th in the NBA in FG accuracy (43.5%) and 22nd in scoring (97.3 ppg), but last in both defensive FG percentage (49.3%) and scoring defense (106.9 ppg)...

AT THE OTHER END: The Wolves surrendered 50%+ accuracy in nine of 17 January starts, the top percentage being Atlanta's 56.3% effort on Jan. 25... For the year, Minnesota has allowed 50%+ a league-high 23 times (Orlando 17, New York 16, Utah 14, Dallas 13); opponents shot 50% or better on 24 occasions a year ago... The Wolves are permitting 50.5% (and 110.3 ppg) in 24 road games this year; teams are also dishing 25.1 apg in Minnesota's road outings, including seven games with 30+ (with a high of 33 by the L.A. Clippers on Dec. 1)... The Wolves limited Portland to 38.8% shooting on Dec. 10, their best defensive percentage of the year; they kept Philadelphia to 39.0% on Dec. 3, and are 3-5 when holding the opposition below 45% (1-22 when allowing 50%+)... New Orleans shot 66.7% on Nov. 14, equaling the highest FG percentage ever vs. Minnesota (Detroit also hit 66.7% on Nov. 8, 1994) and marking the top percentage by any NBA team this year... The Pelicans' 15-for-20 showing from long range in that game is also a league season best...

THE BOARD REPORT: Cleveland piled up a 52-35 rebounding advantage on Saturday... Minnesota has faced double-digit deficits 11 times, including San Antonio's +19 (53-34) margin on Nov. 21 and the Clippers' +18 (50-32) spread on Dec. 1... In the last eight years, Minnesota is just 7-96 when being outrebounded by 10+... The Wolves have outrebounded six of their past nine opponents and nine of the last 15 overall, after coming up short in 15 of their previous 22 contests (by an average of -5.3 rpg)... Minnesota outrebounded the Nuggets 43-39 on Jan. 17, including 17-5 in the 4th quarter... In the Wolves' prior visit to the Pepsi Center (Dec. 26), Denver racked up a 62-44 advantage; the 62 total boards are the 5th-highest total ever by a Wolves foe and the most since the Nuggets grabbed 64 in an OT game on Feb. 5, 2000... Minnesota outboarded Portland 56-38 on Dec. 10, its second double-digit spread of the year (47-33 at Memphis, Oct. 29)... The Wolves piled up a season-high 20 offensive rebounds vs. Portland on Dec. 10, helping lead to a 15-11 edge in 2nd-chance points... Minnesota ranks 2nd in the NBA in 2nd-chance points scored (15.1 ppg) and 8th in offensive rebounding pct (.273), but is currently 14th in 2nd-chance points allowed (13.0 ppg) and just 26th in defensive rebounding pct (.726)...

MARGINAL INFO: The Jan. 7 loss to Phoenix dropped the Wolves to 2-9 in two-possession games (decided by six points or fewer)... Last year, Minnesota went 8-15 in that category, winning six of its last nine after a 2-12 open... Fifteen of the Wolves' last 31 games have ended with single-digit spreads, following an 11-game stretch (Nov. 8-Dec. 1) that saw 10 decided by 10+... San Antonio handed Minnesota a 121-92 defeat on Nov. 21 tying their 6th-biggest home loss of all-time... The Nov. 19 win over New York was Minnesota's first game at Target Center since Nov. 1 vs. Chicago... At 18 days, it's the longest in-season gap between true home games in club history; the six-game international sojourn featured more than 5600 air miles... Dallas dealt the Wolves a 131-117 loss on Nov. 15, one night after New Orleans walloped Minnesota, 139-91... The final 48-point spread in the latter game is the Wolves' largest losing margin of all-time; they'd suffered a 42-point loss (128-86) at Orlando on Nov. 3, 2010... Houston dealt Minnesota a 113-101 loss on Nov. 12 in México City; the Wolves began the extended trip with a 97-91 victory over Brooklyn on Nov. 5, their first road triumph of the year...

DOUBLE VISION: The Dec. 27 loss at Golden State marked the eighth straight game (one of 38 total) that Minnesota had fallen behind by 10+ points... On the flipside, the Wolves have built double-figure leads in only nine of 47 starts, most recently enjoying a 13-point edge in the Jan. 28 win over Boston... The Wolves went 26-for-26 from the FT line vs. San Antonio on Jan. 10, setting a club record for most FTs made without a miss, and followed up with an 18-for-19 performance (94.7%) in the Jan. 13 win at Indiana... Minnesota ranks 5th in FTAs per game (24.8) but 17th in FT accuracy (75.0%); however, they rose to an NBA-best 81.9% (294-for-359) in January... The Wolves picked off 11 steals vs. Oklahoma City on Dec. 12, the fifth straight game they'd hit double digits in that category... WOLF TRACKS: Minnesota ended 2013-14 with a 40-42 record, its best since finishing 44-38 in 2004-05; it's the fourth straight season the Wolves have improved on their previous year's victory total, having posted a 31-51 mark a year ago... Minnesota's season was highlighted by overtime victories at Dallas (123-122 on Mar. 19) and Miami (122-121 in double-OT on Apr. 4), as well as a late win at Golden State (121-120 on Jan. 24)... The Wolves finished 16-25 away from Target Center, their highest road victory total since going 20-21 in 2004-05... Minnesota has now missed the postseason in 10 straight seasons, after advancing to the playoffs every year from 1996-97 through 2003-04 (eight)... The current absence is the longest active postseason drought; Sacramento (eight) and Detroit (five) are next on that list... Minnesota's entire 2013-14 campaign was spent within four games of the .500 mark; they opened the season with three straight wins and were at 7-4 later in November, while the low-water mark came at 24-28 on Feb. 10... The Wolves put together three-game winning streaks on four occasions (Oct. 30-Nov. 3, Jan. 18-24, Feb. 12-22, Feb. 25-Mar. 3) with one four-game skid (Feb. 5-10)... Minnesota finished April with a 4-5 mark, but the four victories were against teams (Memphis, Miami, San Antonio, Houston) with a combined record of 220-108 (.671)... The Apr. 4 victory at Miami was the 800th in club history, while the Apr. 13 game at Sacramento marked the Wolves' 2000th regular-season contest... Minnesota capped a 4-1 West Coast swing with the 132-128 win at Denver on Mar. 3; it's the sixth time in franchise history they've won four games on a single trip, the first since December 2005...

MARGINAL INFORMATION: Minnesota recorded its franchise-record 12th 20-point victory with the Mar. 28 decision vs. Los Angeles; the Wolves also built leads of 30+ points in 13 of their 82 games, the top single-season total in the NBA since Utah had 14 such games in 1996-97... The 23-point defeat Mar. 20 at Houston represented the Wolves' largest of the season; they lost by 21 vs. Miami on Dec. 7... Minnesota's 88 points vs. New Orleans on Jan. 29 were the fewest they scored in a victory last year and marked just the second time they've won in the past 30 when tallying fewer than 90... The Wolves claimed a 121-120 victory at Golden State on Jan. 24 -- their first of the season in a game decided by four points or less, snapping a 14-game losing streak in that category; they finished 6-13 when the final margin was four or less, including 5-1 since Mar. 1... The Wolves won just three times a year ago when being held below 100 points (3-20 overall); the 98-72 victory over Utah on Jan. 18 halted an 18-game losing streak that dated to March 2013...

SCHEDULE NOTES: Minnesota dropped 10 of its final 16 starts (beginning with the Mar. 20 loss at Houston), after enjoying a six-week stretch at 10-4 that was highlighted by victories over Indiana (Feb. 19) and Dallas (Mar. 19)... The Wolves finished 4-17 on the tail ends of back-to-back sets last year, ending with an 11-game losing streak in that category... Minnesota went 17-13 vs. Eastern opponents, its first winning record against either conference since going 30-22 vs. the West in 2004-05... The Feb. 8 game vs. Portland finished the second of two four-games-in-five-nights grinds for Minnesota (also Nov. 19-23)... Starting with the Mar. 19 overtime win in Dallas, 12 of Minnesota's final 16 contests were against teams sporting winning records...
