Last Game: Monday, Mar. 16 – Brooklyn 122, Minnesota 106

Joe Johnson scored 22 points, Bojan Bogdanovic added 21 and Brooklyn set a franchise record with 78 points in the paint en route to dispatching the Timberwolves, 122-106, on Monday night at Target Center. Johnson 11 points in the opening quarter to help stake the Nets to a 33-29 lead, but Adreian Payne capped a 9-2 rally that gave Minnesota its only lead of the night at 51-50 with 4:37 left in the second. Bogdanovic reclaimed the lead for Brooklyn, which later closed the half with nine unanswered points to build a 67-55 cushion. Kevin Martin pumped in 14 third-quarter points to keep the Wolves within reach, but Brooklyn's frontcourt of Johnson, Brook López and Thaddeus Young countered with 27 and the Nets outscored Minnesota 24-2 in the paint to stretch the lead to 98-79 entering the fourth. Brooklyn grabbed its largest lead of the contest when Bogdanovic's dunk made it 115-94 with 4:56 remaining, then fended off a late 8-0 push by the Wolves to improve to 2-1 on its current road trip. Young finished with 19 points for the Nets, while Martin led Minnesota with 23 points and six assists, Zach LaVine added 20 points and Chase Budinger chipped in 18.

Previous Game: Sunday, Mar. 15 – San Antonio 123, Minnesota 97

Kawhi Leonard's 15 points led eight double-figure scorers and San Antonio shot 58 percent while handing out 38 assists in routing the Timberwolves, 123-97, on Sunday night at the AT&T Center. The Spurs never trailed, riding a pair of Marco Belinelli 3-pointers to a 22-12 start. Kevin Martin helped Minnesota pull to within six after one quarter, then sank a 3-pointer to narrow the gap to 42-39 midway through the second. However, consecutive three-point plays by Tony Parker and Manu Ginobili in the final minute rebuilt the Spurs' lead to 60-50 at halftime. San Antonio put the game out of reach by blitzing the Wolves with a 21-4 start to the third quarter, ending when Tiago Splitter made it 81-54 at the 5:59 mark, and the margin didn't stray below 25 the rest of the evening. The Spurs carried a 93-63 advantage into the fourth quarter and took their largest lead when Patty Mills' 3-pointer made it 111-72 with 7:09 left. Belinelli and Danny Green netted 13 points apiece while Parker had 11 points and eight assists for the Spurs. Martin's 19 points led Minnesota, with Zach LaVine adding 18 and Justin Hamilton chipping in 10 rebounds and six assists.

TRANSACTION NOTES: On Mar. 5, Minnesota was awarded center Justin Hamilton on a waiver claim from New Orleans and waived forward Glenn Robinson III... On Feb. 19, the Wolves signed guard Lorenzo Brown for the rest of the season... He was initially signed to the first of two 10-day contracts on Jan. 28, with Minnesota waiving center Miroslav Raduljica from his second 10-day deal... Earlier on Feb. 19, the Wolves acquired forward Kevin Garnett from Brooklyn in exchange for forward Thaddeus Young... On Feb. 10, the Wolves acquired forward Adreian Payne from Atlanta in return for a conditional draft choice... Details are as follows: Minnesota's own 1st-round selection no earlier than 2017, protected for picks 1-14 through 2020; if not conveyed by 2020, then Minnesota's own 2nd-round picks in 2020 and 2021... Earlier on Feb. 10, the Wolves acquired guard Gary Neal and a 2nd-round pick (originally belonging to Miami) in the 2019 NBA Draft in exchange for guard Mo Williams, guard Troy Daniels and cash considerations... The Wolves signed Miroslav Raduljica to a 10-day contract on Jan. 8, then inked him to a second 10-day deal on Jan. 19... On Jan. 7, Minnesota waived forward Jeff Adrien; he'd been signed on Nov. 29 with a hardship exception granted by the NBA... On Dec. 19, the Wolves acquired guard Troy Daniels, two 2nd-round draft picks and cash considerations from Houston in a three-team transaction that saw Minnesota send forward Corey Brewer to the Rockets and center Ronny Turiaf to Philadelphia... To complete the trade, the 76ers conveyed guard Alexey Shved to Houston in exchange for Houston's 2nd-round pick in the 2015 NBA Draft and the rights to center Serhiy Lishchuk... Details on the 2nd-round selections heading to Minnesota are as follows: Sacramento's 2015 choice (protected for picks 50-60), previously acquired by the Rockets on Sept. 17, and Houston's own 2016 choice (protected for picks 31-45).

WIGGINS REPEATS AS TOP ROOKIE: On Mar. 4, Wolves forward Andrew Wiggins was named the NBA's Western Conference Rookie of the Month for February, his fourth consecutive monthly honor. Wiggins, the 1st overall pick in the 2014 NBA Draft, led all rookies in scoring (16.8 ppg) and minutes played (a league-best 38.7 mpg) while ranking 4th in FG accuracy (45.7%), 3rd in FT accuracy (76.3%), 8th in rebounding (4.8 rpg) and 3rd in blocks (0.82 bpg). He was also named MVP of the BBVA Rising Stars Challenge on Feb. 13, as part of All-Star Weekend in New York, after garnering 22 points, six rebounds and four assists. Wiggins tallied 30 points Feb. 23 at Houston, his third 30+ performance of the year, and netted a team-high 25 points vs. Memphis on Feb. 28. Wiggins is the sixth rookie in franchise history to earn the monthly award, joining Stephon Marbury (January 1997), Randy Foye (December 2006), Kevin Love (March 2009), Ricky Rubio (January 2012) and Gorgui Dieng (March 2014).

THE BIG TICKET: Newly-(re)acquired forward Kevin Garnett remains the Wolves' all-time leader in myriad categories, including points scored, rebounds, assists, steals, blocks, games played and minutes played. He returns to Minnesota as one of only three players in NBA history (joining Kareem Abdul-Jabbar and Karl Malone) to register at least 20,000 points, 10,000 rebounds and 5,000 assists in his career, and as just the fourth to play 20+ seasons. WOLF TRACKS: Brooklyn handed the Wolves their fifth consecutive loss, 122-106, on Monday, gaining a split of the season series... Minnesota completed its four-game Western swing with Sunday's 123-97 loss in San Antonio... The road trip began with an 89-76 setback vs. the Clippers on Mar. 9 and continued with losses at Phoenix (106-97 on Mar. 11) and Oklahoma City (113-99 on Mar. 13)... The Wolves have now dropped nine of their last 10 overall, on the heels of an eight-game run in which they went 5-3... Minnesota completed its final four-game homestand with a 121-113 win over Portland on Mar. 7, halting a four-game losing streak; the point total is a season high (eclipsing the 120 scored on Nov. 28 at the Lakers)... The homestand began with a 101-97 loss to Memphis on Feb. 28, and also included losses to the Clippers (110-105 on Mar. 2) and Denver (100-85 on Mar. 4)... Chicago held off Minnesota, 96-89, on Feb. 27 at the United Center, completing a sweep of the season set... The Wolves routed Washington, 97-77, on Feb. 25; the 20-point spread is Minnesota's largest win of the season, while the 77 points are the fewest they've allowed... Houston posted its third win over the Wolves (in three different venues) with the 113-102 verdict on Feb. 23 at the Toyota Center... Minnesota returned from the All-Star Break with a 111-109 victory over Phoenix on Feb. 20... The homestand began with a 117-105 loss to Atlanta on Feb. 9 and continued with a 94-91 loss to Golden State on Feb. 11; the Atlanta setback halted the Wolves' three-game winning streak...

SCHEDULE NOTES: Tonight continues a four-games-in-five-nights run for the Wolves, the first of two such stretches this season (also Apr. 7-11)... It also kicks off the 15th of 19 sets of back-to-back games in 2014-15; Minnesota is 2-12 on the back ends (beating Detroit on Oct. 30 and Denver on Jan. 17)... Sunday's loss at San Antonio concluded a 14-game stretch (Feb. 9-Mar. 15) during which the Wolves faced 13 teams with .500+ records (including eight at .600+); the combined winning percentage of those 14 teams is .618 (578-358)... Beginning Monday vs. Brooklyn, nine of Minnesota's next 14 foes are below .500, including five teams with sub-.350 records... The Mar. 9 game at the Clippers capped a seven-game stretch in which five of Minnesota's opponents were on the tail end of back-to-back sets; they catch a total of 25 teams in that scenario this year (20 at Target Center)... The Mar. 7 win over Portland ended a month-long stretch that saw the Wolves play 10 of 13 at Target Center... Tonight continues a string of four in a row vs. Eastern Conference opponents; Minnesota's only road games remaining vs. the East are tonight in Toronto and Thursday in New York...

OFF TARGET: Minnesota was held to 33.3% at Houston on Feb. 23, one of 15 sub-40% performances in 2014-15 and its lowest figure since shooting a club-record-low 29.3% vs. Miami on Dec. 7, 2013... Minnesota shot 54.1% in the Mar. 7 win over Portland, its seventh 50%+ effort this year (second at Target Center)... The Wolves shot 53.8% in the Jan. 17 win at Denver, ending a run of 24 consecutive sub-50% outings that was the 2nd-longest in team history... Minnesota's 37 assists in the Nov. 28 win at the Lakers tied its highest total ever in a road game (Jan. 9, 2000 at Philadelphia)... The Wolves' 75 points vs. Dallas on Jan. 21 represent their single-game low since scoring 72 vs. Milwaukee on Nov. 6, 2009... The Wolves went 11-for-22 from long distance in the Nov. 19 win over New York, a season high for made treys; they shot 10-for-20 Jan. 13 at Indiana... Minnesota has connected on 16-for-30 (53.3%) from beyond the arc in its last two outings, on the heels of a 25-game drought at 29.4% (103-for-350)... On the year, Minnesota is 25th in the NBA in FG accuracy (43.5%) and 21st in scoring (97.7 ppg), but last in both defensive FG percentage (48.8%) and scoring defense (106.0 ppg)...

AT THE OTHER END: San Antonio's 58.3% shooting night on Sunday is the 3rd-highest percentage allowed by the Wolves this year... They followed up by permitting Brooklyn to hit 57.8% on Monday; it's just the second time in franchise history that Minnesota has given up 55% shooting and 120 points in consecutive games... The Wolves have surrendered 50%+ in four of their past nine, beginning with a 59.4% showing by Memphis on Feb. 28; they're allowing a combined 50.3% in those nine, after whittling their defensive percentage to 41.4% in the previous five... San Antonio's 38 assists on Sunday are the most by a Wolves opponent in a regulation game since Dallas dealt 39 on Mar. 30, 2003... The Wolves limited Washington to 37.9% on Feb. 25, their best defensive percentage of the year; they kept Chicago to 38.5% two nights later... For the season, Minnesota has permitted 50%+ a league-high 29 times (New York 21, Orlando 21, Dallas 17, Denver 16, L.A. Lakers 16); opponents shot 50% or better 24 times a year ago... New Orleans shot 66.7% on Nov. 14, equaling the highest FG percentage ever vs. Minnesota (Detroit also hit 66.7% on Nov. 8, 1994) and the top percentage by any NBA team this year... The Pelicans' 15-for-20 showing from long range in that game is also a league season best for accuracy...

THE BOARD REPORT: Phoenix piled up a 45-34 rebounding spread on Mar. 11... Minnesota has now faced double-digit deficits 13 times, including San Antonio's +19 (53-34) margin on Nov. 21 and the Clippers' +18 (50-32) spread on Dec. 1... Over the last eight seasons, Minnesota is just 8-97 when being outrebounded by 10+... Minnesota outrebounded Washington 53-43 on Feb. 25, its fifth double-digit spread of the year; the Wolves held a 43-30 advantage vs. Memphis on Feb. 6... They've outboarded 20 of their last 34 opponents, after coming up short in 15 of their previous 22 (by an average of -5.3 rpg)... The Wolves snagged a season-high 23 offensive rebounds Feb. 9 vs. Atlanta, helping lead to a 26-18 edge in 2nd-chance points... Minnesota ranks 4th in the NBA in 2nd-chance points scored (14.8 ppg) and 5th in offensive rebounding pct (.276) but is currently 23rd in 2nd-chance points allowed (13.9 ppg) and just 29th in defensive rebounding pct (.724)... Minnesota outrebounded the Nuggets 43-39 on Jan. 17, including 17-5 in the 4th quarter... In the Wolves' prior visit to the Pepsi Center (Dec. 26), Denver racked up a 62-44 advantage; the 62 total boards are the 5th-highest total ever by a Wolves opponent and the most since the Nuggets grabbed 64 in an OT game on Feb. 5, 2000...

DOUBLE VISION: Three different Wolves players notched double-doubles in the Feb. 20 win over Phoenix: Nikola Pekovic (16 pts/11 reb), Gorgui Dieng (15 pts/12 reb) and Ricky Rubio (10 pts/14 ast), the second time this year that's occurred (Nov. 5 at Brooklyn)... Minnesota never trailed in the Feb. 8 win at Detroit, building a 19-point, 3rd-quarter lead that was its largest in any game since opening a 20-point cushion vs. Portland on Dec. 10... The Wolves have enjoyed double-figure leads in only 13 of 66 starts; on the flipside, Monday's loss to Brooklyn was the 56th game in which Minnesota has fallen behind by 10+... Miami's Hassan Whiteside totaled 24 points and 20 rebounds on Feb. 4, the second 20/20 effort by a Wolves opponent this year (18th all-time); Kenneth Faried had 26 pts/25 reb on Dec. 26 in Denver... The Wolves went 26-for-26 from the line vs. San Antonio on Jan. 10, setting a club record for most FTs made without a miss, and followed with an 18-for-19 night (94.7%) Jan. 13 at Indiana... Minnesota ranks 2nd in FTAs per game (25.5) and 11th in FT accuracy (76.7%); they've risen to 81.0% (712-for-879) since Jan. 1, good for 2nd in the NBA behind Portland... The Wolves have swiped 10+ steals 21 times (most recently pilfering 12 on Mar. 9 at the Clippers) and rank 9th in steals (8.30 spg)...

MARGINAL INFO: The 110-105 loss to the Clippers on Mar. 2 dropped the Wolves to 5-13 in two-possession games (decided by six or fewer); they went 8-15 in that category last year... Five of Minnesota's last seven starts have ended with double-digit spreads, following a 12-game stretch (Feb. 2-Mar. 2) that saw eight decided by single figures... Minnesota backed up the 102-101 victory over Miami on Feb. 4 by beating Memphis, 90-89, on Feb. 6; it's the first time ever the Wolves have notched one-point wins in consecutive games... San Antonio handed Minnesota a 121-92 defeat on Nov. 21 tying their 6th-biggest home loss of all-time... The Nov. 19 win over New York was Minnesota's first game at Target Center since Nov. 1 vs. Chicago... At 18 days, it's the longest in-season gap between true home games in club history; the six-game international sojourn featured more than 5600 air miles... Dallas dealt the Wolves a 131-117 loss on Nov. 15, one night after New Orleans walloped Minnesota, 139-91... HIT THE GROUND RUNNING: Minnesota outscored the Lakers 47-23 in the opening 12 minutes on Nov. 10, the highest-scoring quarter in club history. WOLF TRACKS: Minnesota ended 2013-14 with a 40-42 record, its best since finishing 44-38 in 2004-05; it's the fourth straight season the Wolves have improved on their previous year's victory total, having posted a 31-51 mark a year ago... Minnesota's season was highlighted by overtime victories at Dallas (123-122 on Mar. 19) and Miami (122-121 in double-OT on Apr. 4), as well as a late win at Golden State (121-120 on Jan. 24)... The Wolves finished 16-25 away from Target Center, their highest road victory total since going 20-21 in 2004-05... Minnesota has now missed the postseason in 10 straight seasons, after advancing to the playoffs every year from 1996-97 through 2003-04 (eight)... The current absence is the longest active postseason drought; Sacramento (eight) and Detroit (five) are next on that list... Minnesota's entire 2013-14 campaign was spent within four games of the .500 mark; they opened the season with three straight wins and were at 7-4 later in November, while the low-water mark came at 24-28 on Feb. 10... The Wolves put together three-game winning streaks on four occasions (Oct. 30-Nov. 3, Jan. 18-24, Feb. 12-22, Feb. 25-Mar. 3) with one four-game skid (Feb. 5-10)... Minnesota finished April with a 4-5 mark, but the four victories were against teams (Memphis, Miami, San Antonio, Houston) with a combined record of 220-108 (.671)... The Apr. 4 victory at Miami was the 800th in club history, while the Apr. 13 game at Sacramento marked the Wolves' 2000th regular-season contest... Minnesota capped a 4-1 West Coast swing with the 132-128 win at Denver on Mar. 3; it's the sixth time in franchise history they've won four games on a single trip, the first since December 2005...

MARGINAL INFORMATION: Minnesota recorded its franchise-record 12th 20-point victory with the Mar. 28 decision vs. Los Angeles; the Wolves also built leads of 30+ points in 13 of their 82 games, the top single-season total in the NBA since Utah had 14 such games in 1996-97... The 23-point defeat Mar. 20 at Houston represented the Wolves' largest of the season; they lost by 21 vs. Miami on Dec. 7... Minnesota's 88 points vs. New Orleans on Jan. 29 were the fewest they scored in a victory last year and marked just the second time they've won in the past 30 when tallying fewer than 90... The Wolves claimed a 121-120 victory at Golden State on Jan. 24 -- their first of the season in a game decided by four points or less, snapping a 14-game losing streak in that category; they finished 6-13 when the final margin was four or less, including 5-1 since Mar. 1... The Wolves won just three times a year ago when being held below 100 points (3-20 overall); the 98-72 victory over Utah on Jan. 18 halted an 18-game losing streak that dated to March 2013...

SCHEDULE NOTES: Minnesota dropped 10 of its final 16 starts (beginning with the Mar. 20 loss at Houston), after enjoying a six-week stretch at 10-4 that was highlighted by victories over Indiana (Feb. 19) and Dallas (Mar. 19)... The Wolves finished 4-17 on the tail ends of back-to-back sets last year, ending with an 11-game losing streak in that category... Minnesota went 17-13 vs. Eastern opponents, its first winning record against either conference since going 30-22 vs. the West in 2004-05... The Feb. 8 game vs. Portland finished the second of two four-games-in-five-nights grinds for Minnesota (also Nov. 19-23)... Starting with the Mar. 19 overtime win in Dallas, 12 of Minnesota's final 16 contests were against teams sporting winning records...
