Last Game: Friday, Apr. 10 – L.A. Lakers 106, Minnesota 98

Ryan Kelly sank five 3-pointers en route to a season-high 21-point night, and Jordan Clarkson added 18 points and nine assists as Los Angeles took down the Timberwolves, 106-98, on Friday night at Staples Center. Clarkson tallied six points during a 10-0 first-quarter burst that put the Lakers in control. Trailing 30-21 entering the second, Minnesota pulled even at 43-43 when Justin Hamilton capped an 8-1 rally. However, baskets by Jabari Brown and Kelly helped L.A. reopen a five-point cushion by halftime, and back-to-back 3-pointers from Wes Johnson topped off a 15-3 start to the third period that swelled the lead to 67-50. Andrew Wiggins helped the Wolves trim an 18-point deficit to 80-71 by quarter's end, but Minnesota managed just two baskets in the opening four minutes of the final stanza while L.A.'s advantage increased to 92-75. Zach LaVine and Wiggins keyed a final comeback that pulled the Wolves to within six with 1:34 to play, but consecutive dunks by Tarik Black sealed the verdict. Brown finished with 20 points for the Lakers, while Wiggins led Minnesota with 29 points, 10 rebounds and six assists, and LaVine chipped in 18 points.

Previous Game: Wednesday, Apr. 8 – Portland 116, Minnesota 91

LaMarcus Aldridge collected 24 points and 13 rebounds in three quarters, and Portland racked up a 53-35 rebounding advantage in cruising to a 116-91 victory over the Timberwolves on Wednesday night at Moda Center. The Blazers never trailed, with treys from Damian Lillard and Nicolas Batum highlighting a 12-3 start and Aldridge tallying 15 points to help build a 29-19 lead after one quarter. Chase Budinger's 3-pointer trimmed the deficit to seven midway through the second period, but Portland outscored the Wolves 12-2 over the final four minutes to widen its lead to 55-36 at halftime. Minnesota could get no closer than 16 after intermission, with the Blazers using a 13-2 burst to extend the advantage to 75-48 on Robin López's layup at the 5:29 mark of the third. Portland took its biggest lead when Allen Crabbe's 3-pointer made it 102-74 with 6:03 remaining in the contest and went on to gain a split of the four-game season series. López finished with 18 points and Lillard had 17 for the Blazers. Andrew Wiggins scored 29 points and Zach LaVine added 18 points and six assists for Minnesota, which suffered its eighth consecutive loss.

First Meeting: Stephen Curry and Klay Thompson scored 21 points apiece and Golden State hiked its winning streak to 13 games with a 102-86 victory over the Timberwolves on Dec. 8 at Target Center. Andrew Wiggins led Minnesota with 21 points and Shabazz Muhammad tacked on 14.

Second Meeting: Stephen Curry tallied 25 points, Klay Thompson added 21 and Golden State led by as many as 27 before easing to a 110-97 victory over the Timberwolves on Dec. 27 at Oracle Arena. Thaddeus Young's 17 points led Minnesota while Troy Daniels added 14 (shooting 4-for-4 from long range) and Zach LaVine chipped in 12 points and a season-high 14 assists.

Third Meeting: Stephen Curry totaled 25 points and eight assists, and Golden State built a 14-point, fourth-quarter lead before hanging on to defeat the Timberwolves, 94-91, on Feb. 11 at Target Center. Kevin Martin led Minnesota with 21 points while Ricky Rubio added 18 points and nine rebounds, and Nikola Pekovic had 17 points with 13 boards.

First Meeting: Jrue Holiday totaled 24 points and nine assists, Anthony Davis added 22 points and New Orleans set multiple records in routing the Timberwolves, 139-91, on Nov. 14 at the Smoothie King Center. The Pelicans shot 66.7% from the floor, including a 15-for-20 effort from three-point range. Andrew Wiggins finished with 20 points for Minnesota while Corey Brewer added 18.

Second Meeting: Anthony Davis totaled 21 points and 12 rebounds, and Eric Gordon added 20 points to lift New Orleans to a 92-84 victory over the Timberwolves on Jan. 23 at Target Center. Tyreke Evans finished with 17 points and eight assists for the Pelicans, while Thaddeus Young's 15 points led Minnesota and Gorgui Dieng contributed 14 points and 15 rebounds.

Third Meeting: Anthony Davis totaled 28 points and nine rebounds as New Orleans continued its playoff push by routing the Timberwolves, 110-88, on Mar. 29 at Smoothie King Center. Omer Asik scored 15 points for the Pelicans while Andrew Wiggins led Minnesota with 20, Zach LaVine chipped in 17 and Andreian Payne contributed 14 points and 11 rebounds.

On **Mar. 5**, Minnesota was awarded center Justin Hamilton on a waiver claim from New Orleans and waived forward Glenn Robinson III... On **Feb. 19**, the Wolves signed guard Lorenzo Brown for the rest of the season; he was initially signed to the first of two 10-day contracts on Jan. 28... Earlier on **Feb. 19**, the Wolves acquired forward Kevin Garnett from Brooklyn in exchange for forward Thaddeus Young... On **Feb. 10**, the Wolves acquired forward Adreian Payne from Atlanta in return for a conditional draft choice... Details are as follows: Minnesota's own 1st-round selection no earlier than 2017, protected for picks 1-14 through 2020; if not conveyed by 2020, then Minnesota's own 2nd-round picks in 2020 and 2021... WIGGINS REPEATS AS TOP ROOKIE: On Mar. 4, Wolves forward Andrew Wiggins was named the NBA's Western Conference Rookie of the Month for February, *his fourth consecutive monthly honor*. Wiggins, the 1st overall pick in the 2014 NBA Draft, led all rookies in scoring (16.8 ppg) and minutes played (a league-best 38.7 mpg) while ranking 4th in FG accuracy (45.7%), 3rd in FT accuracy (76.3%), 8th in rebounding (4.8 rpg) and 3rd in blocks (0.82 bpg). He was also named MVP of the BBVA Rising Stars Challenge on Feb. 13, as part of All-Star Weekend in New York, after garnering 22 points, six rebounds and four assists. *Wiggins tallied 30 points Feb. 23 at Houston*, his third 30+ performance of the year, and netted a team-high 25 points vs. Memphis on Feb. 28. Wiggins is the sixth rookie in franchise history to earn the monthly award, joining Stephon Marbury (January 1997), Randy Foye (December 2006), Kevin Love (March 2009), Ricky Rubio (January 2012) and Gorgui Dieng (March 2014).

THE BIG TICKET: Newly-(re)acquired forward Kevin Garnett remains the Wolves' all-time leader in myriad categories, including points scored, rebounds, assists, steals, blocks, games played and minutes played. He returns to Minnesota as one of only three players in NBA history (joining Kareem Abdul-Jabbar and Karl Malone) to register at least 20,000 points, 10,000 rebounds and 5,000 assists in his career, and as just the fourth to play 20+ seasons. WOLF TRACKS: Minnesota continued its final road trip of 2014-15 with Friday's 106-98 loss to the Lakers; L.A. takes the season set, 3-1, with the four games being decided by a total of 17 points... *The Wolves have lost their last nine since a 106-104 OT win at Utah on Mar. 23* and are 2-16 in their past 18 games; they'd enjoyed a 6-7 stretch in the previous 13... The current trip began with a 116-111 loss in Sacramento on Tuesday, and continued with Wednesday's 116-91 defeat in Portland; the latter is Minnesota's sixth loss by 25+ points this season... The Wolves completed a three-game homestand with the 97-84 loss to Orlando on Apr. 3... They began the stand with a 104-84 loss vs. Utah on Mar. 30 and followed up with a 113-99 loss to Toronto on Apr. 1... *Minnesota ended its final Southwest Division swing with the 110-88 loss Mar. 29 at New Orleans*; the trip began with a 120-110 loss at Houston on Mar. 25... Minnesota played its third OT game in seven nights with the 101-99 loss to the Lakers on Mar. 25... The Wolves grabbed their second straight road victory with the OT decision at Utah on Mar. 23; they'd registered a 95-92 OT win at New York on Mar. 19... Charlotte dealt the Wolves a 109-98 loss on Mar. 22... Minnesota halted a six-game losing streak with the Mar. 19 win at New York; *the victory was its first since beating Portland on Mar. 7, and its first away from home since Feb. 8 at Detroit* (ending a seven-game road slide)... Minnesota began the two-night Eastern swing by falling, 105-100, on Mar. 18 in Toronto, its 11th consecutive loss at the Air Canada Centre...

SCHEDULE NOTES: Tonight concludes the Wolves' second four-games-in-five-nights run of the season (also Mar. 15-19)... It also wraps up the last of 19 sets of back-to-back games in 2014-15; Minnesota is 4-14 on the back ends (beating Detroit on Oct. 30, Denver on Jan. 17, New York on Mar. 19 and Utah on Mar. 23)... Friday's loss in L.A. ended a 12-game run in which eight of the Wolves' foes carried sub-.500 records; those 12 teams are a combined 408-540 (.430) on the year... Starting tonight at Golden State, Minnesota's final three opponents are sporting a cumulative 150-87 (.633) record... The Apr. 3 loss to Orlando capped the Eastern portion of the Wolves' 2014-15 schedule; they finished 9-21 (.300) vs. the East, having put together a 17-13 (.567) record last year and a 14-16 (.467) mark in 2012-13... The Orlando loss was also Minnesota's 60th of the year, marking the ninth time they've suffered 60+ defeats in a season... The Mar. 9 game at the L.A. Clippers completed a seven-game stretch in which five of Minnesota's opponents were on the tail end of back-to-back sets; they catch a total of 25 teams in that scenario this year, the final one coming Monday vs. New Orleans...

OFF TARGET: Minnesota was held to 33.3% at Houston on Feb. 23, one of 17 sub-40% performances in 2014-15 and its lowest figure since shooting a club-record-low 29.3% vs. Miami on Dec. 7, 2013... Minnesota shot 53.2% on Apr. 1 vs. Toronto, its ninth 50%+ effort this year (fourth at Target Center)... The Wolves shot 53.8% in the Jan. 17 win at Denver, ending a run of 24 straight sub-50% outings that was the 2nd-longest in team history... Minnesota's 37 assists in the Nov. 28 win at the Lakers tied its highest total ever in a road game (Jan. 9, 2000 at Philadelphia)... The Wolves' 75 points vs. Dallas on Jan. 21 represent their single-game low since scoring 72 vs. Milwaukee on Nov. 6, 2009... The Wolves went 12-for-19 from long distance in the Mar. 23 OT victory at Utah, a season high for made threes; they shot 11-for-22 on Nov. 19 vs. New York... Minnesota has slipped to 26.5% (26-for-98) from beyond the arc in its last seven outings, on the heels of an eight-game run at 40.0% (50-for-125)... On the year, Minnesota is 24th in the NBA in FG accuracy (43.8%) and 23rd in scoring (97.6 ppg), but last in both defensive FG percentage (48.7%) and scoring defense (106.2 ppg)...

AT THE OTHER END: Houston went 20-for-44 from beyond the arc on Mar. 27, the highest single-game totals ever allowed by the Wolves... The Rockets finished at 53.0% overall; for the season, Minnesota has permitted 50%+ a league-high 34 times (New York 26, Orlando 22, Dallas 20, Denver 20, Lakers 20)... The Wolves have surrendered 55%+ in five of their last 22 – starting with a 59.4% showing by Memphis on Feb. 28 and including Toronto's 55.3% effort on Apr. 1 – after slicing their defensive pct to 41.4% in the prior five contests... San Antonio's 58.3% shooting night on Mar. 15 is the 3rd-highest percentage vs. the Wolves this year... They followed up by permitting Brooklyn to hit 57.8% on Mar. 16; it's just the second time in club history that Minnesota has given up 55% shooting and 120 points in consecutive games... San Antonio's 38 assists on Mar. 15 are the most by a Wolves opponent in a regulation game since Dallas dealt 39 on Mar. 30, 2003... Minnesota limited Washington to 37.9% on Feb. 25, its best defensive percentage of the year; the Wolves kept Chicago to 38.5% two nights later... New Orleans shot 66.7% (56-for-84) on Nov. 14, tying the highest FG percentage ever vs. Minnesota (Detroit also hit 66.7% on Nov. 8, 1994) and the top percentage by any NBA team this year...

THE BOARD REPORT: Orlando piled up a 53-30 rebounding spread on Apr. 3, equaling the Wolves' largest deficit since they were outboarded 57-27 at Boston on Mar. 4, 2007... Minnesota has now faced double-digit deficits 19 times, including San Antonio's +19 (53-34) margin on Nov. 21 and Portland's +18 (53-35) spread on Wednesday... They've come up short in 18 of the last 23 (by an average of -6.0 rpg), after holding the board edge in seven straight games (+6.9 rpg)... Minnesota outrebounded Washington 53-43 on Feb. 25, its fifth double-digit spread of the year; the Wolves held a 43-30 advantage vs. Memphis on Feb. 6... The Wolves snagged a season-high 23 offensive rebounds Feb. 9 vs. Atlanta, helping lead to a 26-18 edge in 2nd-chance points... Minnesota ranks 8th in the NBA in 2nd-chance points scored (14.2 ppg) and 9th in offensive rebounding pct (.267) but is currently last in both 2nd-chance points allowed (14.7 ppg) and defensive rebounding pct (.717)... Minnesota outrebounded the Nuggets 43-39 on Jan. 17, including 17-5 in the 4th quarter... In the Wolves' previous visit to the Pepsi Center (Dec. 26), Denver racked up a 62-44 advantage; the 62 total boards are the 5th-highest total ever by a Minnesota opponent and the most since the Nuggets grabbed 64 in an OT game on Feb. 5, 2000...

DOUBLE VISION: Minnesota had seven players score 10+ points Mar. 22 vs. Charlotte, one short of the club single-game record... Three different Wolves players notched double-doubles in the Feb. 20 win over Phoenix: Pekovic (16 pts/11 reb), Dieng (15 pts/12 reb) and Rubio (10 pts/14 ast), the second time this year that's occurred (Nov. 5 at Brooklyn)... Minnesota never trailed in the Feb. 8 victory at Detroit, building a 19-point lead that was its largest in any game since opening a 20-point cushion vs. Portland on Dec. 10... The Wolves have enjoyed double-figure leads in only 15 of 79 starts; meanwhile, Wednesday's loss at Portland was the 26th game in which Minnesota has fallen behind by 20+... Miami's Hassan Whiteside totaled 24 points and 20 rebounds on Feb. 4, the second 20/20 effort by a Wolves opponent this year (18th all-time); Kenneth Faried had 26 pts/25 reb on Dec. 26 in Denver... The Wolves went 26-for-26 from the line vs. San Antonio on Jan. 10, setting a club record for most FTs made without a miss... Minnesota ranks 2nd in the NBA in FTAs per game (25.6) and 6th in FT accuracy (77.5%); they've risen to an NBA-best 81.2% (987-for-1215) since Jan. 1... The Wolves have swiped 10+ steals 24 times (most recently pilfering 12 on Wednesday at Portland) and rank 8th in steals (8.15 spg)...

MARGINAL INFO: Tuesday's loss at Sacramento dropped the Wolves' record to 7-16 in two-possession games (decided by six points or fewer); they went 8-15 in that category last year (9-15 in 2012-13)... WOLF TRACKS: Minnesota ended 2013-14 with a 40-42 record, its best since finishing 44-38 in 2004-05; it's the fourth straight season the Wolves have improved on their previous year's victory total, having posted a 31-51 mark a year ago... Minnesota's season was highlighted by overtime victories at Dallas (123-122 on Mar. 19) and Miami (122-121 in double-OT on Apr. 4), as well as a late win at Golden State (121-120 on Jan. 24)... The Wolves finished 16-25 away from Target Center, their highest road victory total since going 20-21 in 2004-05... Minnesota has now missed the postseason in 10 straight seasons, after advancing to the playoffs every year from 1996-97 through 2003-04 (eight)... The current absence is the longest active postseason drought; Sacramento (eight) and Detroit (five) are next on that list... Minnesota's entire 2013-14 campaign was spent within four games of the .500 mark; they opened the season with three straight wins and were at 7-4 later in November, while the low-water mark came at 24-28 on Feb. 10... The Wolves put together three-game winning streaks on four occasions (Oct. 30-Nov. 3, Jan. 18-24, Feb. 12-22, Feb. 25-Mar. 3) with one four-game skid (Feb. 5-10)... Minnesota finished April with a 4-5 mark, but the four victories were against teams (Memphis, Miami, San Antonio, Houston) with a combined record of 220-108 (.671)... The Apr. 4 victory at Miami was the 800th in club history, while the Apr. 13 game at Sacramento marked the Wolves' 2000th regular-season contest... Minnesota capped a 4-1 West Coast swing with the 132-128 win at Denver on Mar. 3; it's the sixth time in franchise history they've won four games on a single trip, the first since December 2005...

MARGINAL INFORMATION: Minnesota recorded its franchise-record 12th 20-point victory with the Mar. 28 decision vs. Los Angeles; the Wolves also built leads of 30+ points in 13 of their 82 games, the top single-season total in the NBA since Utah had 14 such games in 1996-97... The 23-point defeat Mar. 20 at Houston represented the Wolves' largest of the season; they lost by 21 vs. Miami on Dec. 7... Minnesota's 88 points vs. New Orleans on Jan. 29 were the fewest they scored in a victory last year and marked just the second time they've won in the past 30 when tallying fewer than 90... The Wolves claimed a 121-120 victory at Golden State on Jan. 24 -- their first of the season in a game decided by four points or less, snapping a 14-game losing streak in that category; they finished 6-13 when the final margin was four or less, including 5-1 since Mar. 1... The Wolves won just three times a year ago when being held below 100 points (3-20 overall); the 98-72 victory over Utah on Jan. 18 halted an 18-game losing streak that dated to March 2013...

SCHEDULE NOTES: Minnesota dropped 10 of its final 16 starts (beginning with the Mar. 20 loss at Houston), after enjoying a six-week stretch at 10-4 that was highlighted by victories over Indiana (Feb. 19) and Dallas (Mar. 19)... The Wolves finished 4-17 on the tail ends of back-to-back sets last year, ending with an 11-game losing streak in that category... Minnesota went 17-13 vs. Eastern opponents, its first winning record against either conference since going 30-22 vs. the West in 2004-05... The Feb. 8 game vs. Portland finished the second of two four-games-in-five-nights grinds for Minnesota (also Nov. 19-23)... Starting with the Mar. 19 overtime win in Dallas, 12 of Minnesota's final 16 contests were against teams sporting winning records...
